The Mizoram Act No. 2 of 1985

The Mizoram Appropriation (No. 2) Act, 1985
(Received the assent of the Lt. Governor (Administrator) of Mizoram on the 30th March, 1985.)

AN ACT

to authorise payment and appropriation of certain sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the Union Territory of Mizoram for the services of the financial year 1985—86.

BE it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of Mizoram in the Thirty Sixth Year of the Republic of India as follows :—

1. This Act may be called the Mizoram Appropriation (No. 2) Act, 1985. Short title.
2. From and out of the Consolidated Fund of the Union Territory of Mizoram, there may be paid and applied sums not exceeding those specified in column 3 of the Schedule amounting in the aggregate to the sums of one hundred and sixty seven crores twenty eight lakhs and fourteen thousand rupees towards defraying the several charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year 1985—86 in respect of the services specified in column 2 of the Schedule.
