Subject : Enhancement of daily wages under the Minimum Wages Act, 1948

Sir,

In enclosing herewith a copy of Notification issued under Memo No. B.11015/1/86-L&E dated 11th November, 1987 regarding refixation of daily wages under the Minimum Wages Act. 1948, I am directed to request you to work out the requirement of additional fund to meet the enhanced rates of minimum Wages and submit concrete proposal to the Finance Department for inclusion in the R.E. for 1987-19.8 and B.E. for 1988-1989 within 4 days.

You should also include this enhancement of wages in all your forecasts for presentation to the Finance Commission and Planning Commission without fail otherwise your department will face difficulties in regard to fund.

Please treat this as very urgent.

No. B. 11015/1/86-L&E, the 11th November, 1987. In exercise of the powers conferred under Section 3 read with Section 13 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Act No. XI of 1948), the Governor of Mizoram is pleased to refix the Minimum rates of wages for the workers employed in different Scheduled employments in the Govt. Departments, Semi-Government, private undertakings and on contract basis as mentioned in the schedule below. This will take effect from the 1st November, 1987.

THE SCHEDULE

Classification of Work

Minimum rates of wages per day

1

1. Unskilled

Mazdoor Male & Female), Chowkidar, Watchman, Khalasi, Cleaner, Loader, Cook helper, Sweeper, Breaker (using Manual appliances), Office boy, Peon, Massen; er, Waterman, Rs. 28/- per day Water-carrier, White washer, Mail Runner, Lampman and other categories by what ever name called which are unskilled.

2. Semi-skilled/unskilled supervisory

Breaker, Driller, Miner, Cook, Crecheayah, Head Chowkidar, Mate/muccadam (without competency certificate under Mattaliferous mines Regulations, 1961), Oil Man, pump khalasi, shot firer, Head-Mistiri, Boiler man, Thatcher, Tindles, Plumber, Trollyman, Jamadar, white washer, helper (loco, ciane, truck) Helper (blacksmith). Operator, Assistant Machanic, Butler-cum-cook, Caretaker, Hammerman, Mali and other categories by whatever name called which are semiskilled/unskilled supervisory.

3. Skilled Grade-II

> (Junior grade having less experiences) Blacksmith, Carpenter, Compounder, Electrician, White-washer, Foreman, Fitter, Mines supervisor, Tailor, Head-cook, Engineman, Welder, Blaster Mechanist, Head Mistiri, Sub-overseer (Unqualified) Rs. 40/- rer day surveyor, Operator, Boilerman, Compressor-Operator, Driver Tractor Driver, and any other categories by whatever name called which are of skilled nature.

4. SKILLED GRADE - 1

(Senior grade having more experience in the lines indicated above'.

CLERICAL 5.

> Accountant, Assistant, Clerk, Munshi, Typist, Stenographer, Tool Keeper, Computer, and other categories by whatever name called which are clerical nature.

EXPLANATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS NOTIFICATION :-"Unskilled Work" means work which involves simple operations requiring (1) little or no skill or experience on the job.

- (2) "Semi-skilled work" means work which involves some degree of skill of competance acquired through experience on the job and which is capable of being performed under the supervision or guidance of skilled employee, and includes unskilled supervisory work.
 - (3) "SKILLED" (Junior grade) means work which involves skill or competence acquired through experience on the job or through training as an apprentice in a technical or vocational institute and the performance of which calls for initiative and judgement.
 - (4) Skilled (Senior grade) means expert in the works requiring great skill.
 - (5) WORKING PERIODS

The number of working hours per day will be 8 hours approximately for technical works and the number of working hours like clerical, Peons, etc. per day will be as prescribed by the Employers.

(6) Workers other than the Clerks, Peons, etc working in the office, will enjoy the following paid holidays in addition to the sunday benefit as enjoyed by the workers provided they work continously for 6 days in a week.

-(7) Clerks, Peons, etc who are engaged in the Office will follow the Offices hours of the Office/Departments where they are employed.
 - (8) The minimum rate of wages for persons below 18 years of age shall be 80 percent of the rates payable to the adult workers of the appropriate category as specified in this Schedule.
 - (9) Women and disable persons, above 18 years will enjoy the same rates payable to the adult workers.
 - (10) Where the existing rate of wages of any employee based on contract or agreement or otherwise are higher than the rate notified herein, the higher rates shall be treated as the minimum rate of wages applicable for the purpose of this notification to such employees.
 - (11) This shall be applicable to all the Departments, Semi Government, Contractors and all private undertakings within the State of Mizoram.
