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NOTIFICATIONS

No. B. 16011/1/89-RHS(RD), the 10th April, 1990. Whereas the Government deems it expedient to distribute Galvanised Corrugated Iron-Sheets to deserving rural poors in Mizoram with a view to providing decent dwelling places for those who cannot afford themselves to have tin-roofed houses and to facilitate proper harvesting of rain water for drinking purpose by such provision.

Now, therefore, the Governor of Mizoram is pleased to make the following rules for the distribution of Galvanised Corrugated Iron-Sheets to the deserving poors in Mizoram. namely:—

Short title extent and commencement

- (1) These rules may be called the Mizoram (Grant of Galvanised Corrugated Iron-Sheets for roofing to the Rural poors) Rules, 1990.
 - (2) They shall extent to the whole of the State of Mizoram.
 - (3) They shall be deemed to have come into force with effect from 1st May, 1989.

Definitions

- In these rules, unless the context other-wise requires:

 (1) "Administrative Officer" means Administrative Officer of the Government of Mizoram.
 - (2) "Block" means Rural Development Block.
 - (3) "Block Development Committee" means the Block Development Committee constituted by the Government in each Rural Development Block to screen and finalise various Block Schemes.
- (4) "Block Development Officers posted in various Rural Development Blocks in Mizoram and their substitutes appointed by the Government.

Criteria for selection

- 3 The following shall not be eligible for selection for the grant of Galvanised Corrugated Iron-Sheets under this rules, namely:-
 - (a) Families who already have possessed houses with Galvanised Corrugated Iron roofing;
 - (b) Families having stable and regular source of income, for example, Shopkeepers, Contractors, respires, Carpenters, etc.
 - (c) Families who already have possessed one house with Galvanised Corrugated Iron roofing: fix their second or third house, even when such houses are thatched roofing;
 - (d) Households having one or more members, employed in Government service on regular basis: however, in case of Group 'D' employees, their case could be considered depending on their actual economic condition;
 - (e) Temporary residents in a village;
 - (f) Families once assisted under Rural Housing Schemes.

Shelf of projects

4. There shall be granted to the deserving rural poor such bundles of Galvanised Corrugated from-Sheets as provided in rule 5 of these rules.

A shelf of projects for each Community Block covering all villages will be prepared by the Block Development Committee under the Chairmanship of the Block Development Office concerned. Name of the householder, occupation, size and dimension of the houses and present condition of the houses should be clearly indicated in the shelf of projects. Annual action Plan for each financial year will be prepared at the Government level. A periodic review of the families selected under the schemes should be done by the Plack Development officers in consultation with the concerned Administrative officers at the village level.

Type of houses

- 5. Houses to be covered under the scheme may be broadly classified into three types having different dimensions and it will be provided to the selected households according to their actual requirements based on the size and dimension of the existing buildings. The maximum will not exceed five bundles and requirements of the Gaivanised Corrugated from Sheets shall be strictly determined by the selection Committee.
- 1. Type 1 18'×12'
 Requirement of Galvanised Corrugated Iron Sheets 1990 bundles.
- 2, Type II 24' × 12'
 Requirement of Galvanised Corrugated Iron Sheet Four bundles.

3. Type - III - 24'×14'
Requirement of Galvanised Corrugated Iron Sheets - Five bundles.

Source of fund

6. Requirement of fund for purchase of Galvanised Corrugated Iron-Sheets under this scheme can be made available from the consolidated fund of the State incorporating the actual requirement in the Amual Budget/Revised Estimate stage as the case may be by debiting the fund under the head:

"C. Economic Services.
2515—Other Rural Development Programme
102—Community Development
102(5)—Rural Housing
102(3)(13)—Major Works".

Selection Committee.

7. The Block Development Committee constituted by the Goversment for this purpose shall select as many as deserving families in all the villages within the jurisdiction of each Rural Development Block. Selection shall be made on the bases of spot verification and care should be taken to select only genuin cases. After the village-wise list of beneficiaries is finalised, the Block Development Committee will prepare village-wise final list in order of priority clearly indicating the size and dimension of the houses. Thereafter, a list will be submitted to the Rural Development Department for final approval.

Transportation :

8. Transportation of Galvanised Corrugated Iron-Sheets to each Block Headquarters will be arranged by the Rural Development Department and further arrangement of transportation by vehicle to the concerned villages will be made to the extent possible after which it will be the responsibility of the beneficiaries to transport the Galvanised Corrugated Iron sheets to the actual site.

Supervision

9. The actual execution of the work will be left to the beneficiaries under the supervision and instruction of the Block Development Officer till completion of the work. Block Development Officers may further delegate the power of supervision to the Administrative Officers within the Block jurisdiction.

Penalty:

10. In case of mis-utilisation, the cost of Galvanised Corrugated Iron-sheets will be recovered from the concerned beneficiaries shall not be eligible for any Poverty Alleviation Schemes of the Government for the next five years.

Monitoring:

11. Quarterly report in respect of each village on the implementation of the scheme shall be submitted by Block Development Officers in a prescribed proforma to the nodal Department i.e. Rural Development Department.
