RESOLUTION

No.J-12017/12/83-POL, the 22nd May, 1991. The Council of Ministers expressed their profound grief and sorrow at the barbaric assassination of Rajiv Gandhi, former Prime Minister and President, Indian National Congress (I) in a bomb blast on the night of 21st May, 1991 at Sriperumbudur near Madras while attending an election meeting.
