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NOTIFICATION

No. A. 12018/9/80-APT(B)/Vol-I, the 3rd April, 1995. In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India and in pursuance of Rule 7 of the Mizoram Police Service (Amendment) Rules, 1989, the Governor of Mizoram is pleased to make the following Regulations, namely—

1. Short title and commencement.
 - (1) These Regulations may be called the Mizoram Police Service (Competitive Examination) Regulations, 1995.
 - (2) They shall come into force on the date of publication in the Official Gazette.
2. Definitions

In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires :

 - (a) "Vacancies" means the vacancies in service which occur from time to time in the entry grade of the MPS and also as determined by the Government under Sub-rule (1) of Rules 5 of the Mizoram Police Service Rules, 1986 and Amendment, 1989.
 - (b) "Commission" means the Mizoram Public Service commission.
 - (c) "Examination" means a Competitive Examination for direct recruitment to the service held under sub-rule (1) of Rule 5 of the Mizoram Police Service Rules, 1986 and Amendment, 1989.
 - (d) "List" means a list of candidates prepared by the Mizoram Public Service Commission.

- (e) "Schedule" means a schedule appended to these Regulations.
- (f) "Scheduled Caste" and "Scheduled Tribes" shall have the same meaning as already assigned to them by Clauses (24) and (25) respectively of Article 366 of the Constitution of India.
- (g) "Service" means the Mizoram Police Service.

3. A candidate seeking admission to the Examination must apply to the Secretary, Mizoram Public Service Commission as per Standard Form in Part-III Schedule—III.
4. A candidate seeking admission to the Examination must pay to the Commission a sum of Rs.15/- as an application fee and an amount prescribed for admission fee in the event of his/her admission to the Examination. In the case of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe, the amount will be Rs. 5/-.
5. Eligibility.
- (i) For admission to the examination, a candidate must be a citizen of India (as defined in Article 5 to 7 of the Constitution of India).
- (ii) A candidate in whose case a certificate of eligibility is necessary, may be admitted to the examination but the offer of appointment will be made only after the necessary eligibility certificate has been issued to him by the State Government.
- (iii) In exceptional cases, the Commission may treat as qualified a candidate, who, though not possessing the qualification prescribed in this clause, passed examination conducted by other Institutions of Standard which, in the opinion of the Commission, justifies the admission of the candidate to the examination.
- (iv) Candidates who are otherwise qualified but have taken degree from foreign Universities, which are not approved by the Central Government, may also be admitted to the examination at the discretion of the Commission.
- (v) Unless covered by any of the exceptions that may, from time to time, be notified by the Governor of Mizoram in this behalf, he should not have competed more than three times at the examination held earlier.
- (vi) (A) Subject to the provision of sub regulation 5 (v) above, the decision of the Chairman, Mizoram Public Service Commission as to the eligibility or otherwise of a candidate for admission to the examination shall be final and no candidate to whom a certificate for admission has not been issued by the Mizoram Public Service Commission shall be admitted to the examination.

6. Candidate who is guilty of :

- (B) A candidate must have attained the age of 21 years and must not have attained the age of 28 years on the 1st day of January of the year in which examination is held.
- (C) The upper age limit prescribed above will be further relaxable :

Upto a maximum of 5 years for any of candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe.

- (vii) A candidate must hold a degree any of the Universities incorporated by an Act of the Central or State Legislature in India or other Educational Institutions established by an Act of Parliament or declared to be deemed as Universities under section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 or a foreign University approved by the Central Government from time to time. Knowledge of Mizo language at least upto Middle School Standard.

Note: Candidates, who have appeared at the examination, the passing of which would render them educationally qualified for the Commission's Examination but whose result has not been declared shall be eligible for admission to the examination on a provisional basis.

6. Candidate who is or has been declared by the Government of Mizoram to be guilty of :
- (i) obtaining support for his candidature by any means; or
 - (ii) impersonating, or
 - (iii) procuring impersonation by any person, or
 - (iv) submitting fabricated document or documents which have been tampered with, or
 - (v) making statements which are incorrect or false, or suppressing material information, or
 - (vi) resorting to any irregular or improper means in connection with his candidature for the examination, or
 - (vii) using unfair means during the examination, or
 - (viii) writing irrelevant matter, including obscene language or pornographic matter, in the script(s), or
 - (ix) misbehaving in any other manner in the Examination Hall, or

- (x) harrassing or doing bodily harm to the staff employed by the Government of Mizoram or that of the Commission for the conduct of this examination, or
- (ix) attempting or committing or, as the case may be, abetting the Government of Mizoram of all or any of the acts specified in the foregoing clauses may, in addition to rendering himself liable to criminal prosecution shall be liable—
- (a) to be disqualified by the Government of Mizoram or by the Commission for the examination for which he is a candidate, or
- (b) to be debarred either permanently or for a specified period—
- (i) by the Govt. of Mizoram from any examination or selection held by them;
- (ii) by the Governor from any employment under him; and
- (e) If he is already in service under Government to disciplinary action under appropriate rules.

7. The Competitive Examination shall comprise—

(A) Written Examination in—

(i) three compulsory subjects—

Essay, General English, General Knowledge each with the maximum of marks as shown in Part-I of Schedule-I.

(ii) Two optional subjects, set out in Part-II of Schedule-I.

(B) Interview for personality test of such candidates as may be called by the Commission carrying maximum of 100 marks.

(C) Physical Test of such candidates as may be called by the Commission, comprising of "Physical Efficiency Test" and "Medical Examination" as per Schedule-II. The physical test shall be qualifying in nature.

8. Candidates who obtained such minimum qualifying marks as may be fixed by the Commission in their discretion, in the written examination and physical test shall be summoned by the Commission for a personality test:

Provided that candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes may be summoned for an interview for a personality test by the Commission by applying relaxed standard if the Commission is of the opinion that sufficient number of candidates from these communities are not likely to be summoned for interview for a personality test on the basis of general standard in order to fill up the vacancies which occur for them and also subject to physical fitness.

9. After the written examination, physical test and interview for personality test, the Commission will arrange the aggregate marks obtained by each candidate and in that order so many candidates as are found by the Commission to be qualified in the examination shall be recommended for appointment up to the number of vacancies decided to be filled on the results of the examination;

Provided that candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes may, to the extent the number of vacancies reserved for them cannot be filled on the basis of general standard, be recommended by the Commission by a relaxed standard to make up the deficiency in the reserved quota, subject to the physical fitness of these candidates for appointment to the service in the order of merit at the examination.

10. If any question arises as to the interpretation of these regulations, the same shall be decided by the Governor.

SCHEDULE—I PART--I

SYLLABUS:

1. COMPULSORY SUBJECTS—3 (Three).

- (i) An Essay to be written on one of several specified subject — 100 marks.
- (ii) General English to test comprehension and expression, Precis and unseen passages — 100 marks.
- (iii) General Knowledge — 100 marks.

Including knowledge of current events and of such matters of every day observation and experience in their scientific aspects as may be expected of an educated person who has not made a special study of any scientific subject. The paper will include questions on Freedom Movement of India and teachings of Mahatma Gandhi, Indian History including History of Mizoram and Geography.

OPTIONAL SUBJECTS—TWO:

Each Optional subject will have two papers carrying 100 marks each. The standard and Syllabus of each subject will be approximately those of the North-Eastern Hill University (NEHU) Degree Course Examination.

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SCHEDULE—II

TEST FOR PHYSICAL FITNESS FOR DIRECT RECRUITMENT TO THE JUNIOR GRADE POST OF MIZORAM POLICE SERVICE :

1. MEDICAL EXAMINATION:

To be qualified for appointment, a candidate must be in good physical and mental health and must be free from any physical defect likely to interfere with the efficient performance of the duties, on appointment.

2. The minimum standard of height and chest measurement will be as follows:-

	Height	Chest- girth (fully expanded)	Minimum
Men	— 165 cm	84 cm	79 cm
Women	— 152 cm	—	—

The minimum height prescribed is relaxable upto 2 inches (5 cm) in case of candidates belonging to tribal races, such as Gorkhas, Garhwalis, Assamese, Naga, Khasi, Garos and Mizos etc. whose average height is distinctly lower.

N.B. (1) The height and chest of the candidates will be measured twice before coming to a final decision.

(2) There will be no need of measuring chest-girth in case of women candidates.

3. The candidates will also be weighted and his weight recorded in Kilograms. Fraction of a half Kilogram should not be recorded.

4. The candidate's eye-sight will be tested properly with or without spectacles by the Medical Board and the Commission must be satisfied that the condition of the eye-sight of the candidates will, in no way, be an obstacle to the efficient performance of their duties. The decision of the Commission supported by Medical Certificate will be final and testing of colour vision will be essential.

(ii) Near vision (with or without spectacles).

- (c) that his heart and lungs are sound;
- (d) that there is no abnormal disease;
- (e) that he is not raptured;
- (f) that his limbs, hands and feet are well formed and developed and that there is free and perfect motion of all joints;
- (g) that he does not suffer from any inveterate skin disease;
- (h) that he bears marks of efficient Vaccinations and;
- (i) that he is free from communicable diseases.

Note: Candidates are warned that there is no right of appeal from a Medical Board, special or standing, appointed to determine their fitness for the above services. If, however, the Government is satisfied on the evidence produced, of the possibility of an error of judgement in the decision of the first board, it is open to the Government to allow an appeal to a second board. Such evidence should be submitted within one month of the date on which the decision of the first Medical Board is communicated to the candidate. No appeal against the judgement of the second medical board shall be allowed under any circumstances.

2. PHYSICAL EFFICIENCY TEST :

There will be a physical efficiency test, qualifying in nature, as per the guidelines issued by the Commission. It may include testing the physical efficiency of the candidates in events like short distance runs, Long jumps, High Jump, etc.
