NOTIFICATION

No. B. 14015/4/2000-TC, the 13th March, 2001. Whereas, the State Government invited objections and suggestions in regard to the declaration of Market areas within Aizawl town as per the provision of sub-section (1) of the Mizoram State Agricultural Produce Marketing (Regulation) Act, 1996 vide Mizoram Gazette issue No. 119 of 17.6.1998.

And whereas, no objection and suggestion to that effect has been received by the Government even after 45 days from the date of issue of the notification as per sub-section (2) of section 3 of the said Act.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the said Act, the Governor of Mizoram is pleased to declare Vaivakawn Market, Aizawl as Market area with the following boundary descriptions for the purpose of the said Act and also for the purpose of the Mizoram State Agricultural Produce Marketing Regulation (General) Rules, 1996.

Boundary description of Market Area of Vaivakawn Market, Aizawl.

- North :** Using Pu Rosawma's house in the North — West as the starting point, the boundary shall run along Vaivakawn—Chawnpui road towards the North East upto the junction of Aizawl—Chawnpui road and Aizawl—Luangmual road.
- East :** The boundary shall cross Kanan Veng approach road in South direction and then further run along Pu Sangchhunga's building upto Vaivakawn field.
- South :** The boundary shall thereafter run along Vaivakawn field towards the South West until it meets the wall below Dawa Tlangkunga's building on the fringe of Vaivakawn field.

West : From here, the boundary shall run along the nullah and cross Kanan Veng approach road, ending in front of Dr. R. Tlangkunga's building.

The boundary shall further run along Kanan Veng approach road upto the junction of Kanan Veng and Chawnpui Veng road in front of Pu Rosawma's house. The boundary shall then cross Chawnpui Veng road to meet the starting point.
