ANNEXURE "B"

Terms and conditions as accepted in the Meeting of the Chief Executive Members of Chhimtuipui District, which was held in the Chamber of Chief Minister, Mizoram, on 21.7.1975 at 11. A.M

1. All Govt. L.P. Schools under the jurisdiction of the three District Councils shall stand transferred to the authorities of the District Councils with their buildings, furniture, teaching aids and equipments etc, with effect from the dates suiting their convenience. The Schools so transferred shall be run by them under their management and will, with effect from the date of transfer, be deemed to be recognised non-Government aided Primary Schools run under the management of the District Councils authorities who shall be bound to follow the general patterns of education in Primary Schools as laid down by the Government from time to time.
2. The Services of the existing Government teachers in these transferred Schools shall stand transferred as on deputation on foreign service without any deputation allowances with effect from the date of transfer until further order. During the period of their deputation they will be under the full administrative control of the concerned District Council authorities. They will, however, continue to retain their status as Government servant with all the benefits attached to such status subject to the condition that in respect of grant of leave admissible to such transferred Government servants, their transfer and posting from one school to another in their respective jurisdictions and initiation of disciplinary proceedings against any of the transferred staff, the concerned District Council authorities shall have full power. Release of recurring grant-in-aid to cover salaries and other admissible dues in respect of the teaching staff transferred to the District Council on deputation shall be made quarterly in advance by the Deputy Inspector of Schools, Chhimtuipui District to the District Council Authorities on production of proper utilisation certificates in respect of all previous grants made on this account.

In case the District Council authorities desire at any time to send back any of the staff transferred to their control, they will do so only by relinquishing the post against which the concerned staff is entertained.

They will also ensure that staff at present working in the existing schools in their respective jurisdictions with children belonging to minority communities therein, are not transferred there from without first making necessary alternative arrangement to meet their special need.

Any post vacated due to resignation, retirement, death, etc., of existing transferred teachers should be continued as a Government post. The concerned District Council authorities shall have the power to make their own selection to fill up the vacancy and made appointment of the selected persons subject to approval of Director of Education.

3. They shall be eligible for all types of grant-in-aid both recurring and non-recurring as permissible under Grants-in-aid Rules for other non-Government aided Primary Schools.
4. The District Councils, as the managing agency of these non-Government schools, shall have to observe prevailing grants-in-aid and recognition rules and regulations and instructions of the Education Department, Government of Mizoram.
5. The District Council authorities shall ensure regular disbursement of monthly salaries and other dues of the transferred teachers in their L.P. Schools from the funds made available to them by the Deputy Inspector of Schools for this purpose. In case it is found by their Education Department that regular monthly payment of salaries, etc. to the transferred teachers is not being made, the Government shall have the right to order direct payment of salaries, etc. to the transferred teachers by the Deputy Inspector of Schools, Chhimtuipui District or any other officer of the Education Department and to adjust the same against recurring grant-in-aid payable to the District Council authorities on this account.
6. The Education Department shall continue to be the appropriate authority for—
 - a) recognition of new Primary Schools in the D/C areas;
 - b) Prescription of academic and training qualification; of teachers in the Primary Schools in the D/C areas;
 - c) approval of syllabi, curricula and textbooks in the recognised L. P. Schools in the D/C areas;
 - d) approval of class promotion rules and conduct of scholarship examinations;

- (e) inspection of the L.P. Schools in the D/C areas. In addition, the District Council authorities may also have their own Inspecting Staff for the L.P. Schools in their respective areas. Copies of Inspection reports from Government Inspecting Staff should be endorsed to the respective District Council for their appraisal and appropriating action. Similarly copies of Inspection Reports of Inspecting Staff of the District Council shall also be endorsed by them to the Deputy Inspector of Schools, Chhimtuipui District.
7. Future maintenance of the transferred schools, furniture, equipments etc., therein shall be the responsibility of the District Council Authorities.
