ORDERS BY THE ADMINISTRATOR NATIFICATIONS

No. MC. 4/15/72, the 1st March, 1980. In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of the Section 10 of the Criminal Law Amendment Act, 1932 (Act No. 23 of 1932), the Administrator of Mizoram is pleased to declare that all offences punishable under sections 186, 188, 189, 190, 228, 295-A, 298, 505, 506 and 507 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Act No. 45 of 1860), when committed in the area specified below, shall notwithstanding anything contained in the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (Act No. 2 of 1974), be cognizable.

This Notification shall remain in force for a period of six months.

AREA SPECIFIED The Whole of Union Territory of Mizoram

No. MC. 4/15/72: In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of Section 10 of the Criminal Law Amendment Act, 1932 (Act No. 23 of 1932), the Administrator of Mizoram is pleased to declare that in the Area specified below, offences punishable under sections 188 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Act No. 45 of 1860), shall notwithstanding anything contained in the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (Act No. 2 of 1974) be non-bailable.

This Notification shall remain in force for a period of six months.

The whole of Union Territory of Mizoram

Whereas the administrator of Mizoram, after careful consideration of all facts and circumstances, is of the opinion that the whole area of the Union Territory of Mizoram is in such disturbed and dangerous condition that the use of armed force in aid of the civil power is necessary;

Now, Therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 of the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, 1958, (Act No. 28 of 1958), the Administrator of Mizoram is pleased to declare the whole of Mizoram as disturbed are a within the meaning and for the purpose of the said Act for a period of six months with effect from the 20th March, 1980...

No. MC. 4/15/72, the 1st March, 1980. Whereas certain groups of persons are still actively involved in creating disorder and disturbance to peace and tranquility in Mizoram;

And, Whereas the Administrator of Mizoram after careful consideration of all facts and circumstances is satisfied that in order to make adequate provision for the suppression of the disorder and maintenance of the public order and communications in Mizoram and for the protection of life and property of the loyal citizens therein, it is necessary to declare the whole of the Union Territory of Mizoram as disturbed area;

Now, Therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 of the Assam Disturbed Areas Act, 1955 (Assam Act XIX of 1955), the Administrator of Mizoram is pleased to daclare the whole of the Union Territory of Mizoram as disturbed area under the said Act for a period of six months.
