LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY HELD AT THE ASSEMBLY HALL
FROM 22ND FEBRUARY, 1980 TO 29TH FEBRUARY, 1980.

Sixth Sitting on 29th February, 1980 at 10:30 a.m.

BUSINESS

1. Questions entered in separate list to be asked and answers given.

Lying of Papers

2. Pu F. Malsawma, Minister i/c Education etc. to lay on the Table a copy of "Rules for Mizo Students' Hostel at Shillong".

Statement by a Minister

3. Brig. Thenphunga Sailo, Chief Minister to make a statement in response to a call of Attention Notice of which given by Pu Joe Ngurdawla, MIA on 27.2.1980 on the relief Measures to be taken by the Government for drought victims in Mizoram.

Private Members' Business

4. Pu Ngurchhina, MLA to move -

"This Assembly is of the opinion that a separate Service to be known as Mizoram Police Service be created in Mizoram."

5. Pu C. Vulluaia, MLA to move -

"This Assembly recommends that the Community Hall now under construction on the site of the Aizawl Theatre Hall be called after Vana Pa, one of the most honoured heroes among Mizos and henceforward be named 'VANA PA HALL.'"

6. Pu J. Thankunga, MLA to move -

"This Assembly is of the opinion that Phailang Ram be taken up by Agriculture Department under Integrated Rural Development Scheme for permanent cultivation from 1980-1981 financial year."

7. Pu Lalthanzauva, MLA to move -

"This Assembly resolves that construction of Hospital Buildings be taken up with immediate effect at Kulikawn, Aizawl, on the site acquired for the purpose by the Government of Mizoram."

8. Pu C.Vulluaia, M.L.A. to move-

"This Assembly recomends that a special fund under a separate head be made available for meeting the requirements of youths, for example, recreational halls, purchase of musical instruments, Petromax, etc. so that their leisure may be utilised for creative in-door and out-door activities for the gifted youths to improve their talents further "

9. Pu L, Piandenga, to move-

"This Assembly is of the opinion that an appeal be made to the Government employees, great and small and at the same time impress them to work dutifully and honestly in their respective responsibilities so that the Developmental works proposed by the government may be done expeditiously "

10. Pu J. Thankunga, M.L.A. to move-

"This Assembly is of the opinion that whereas, under Article 46 of the Constitution of India, the State shall promote special care, among other matters, the economics interest of the weaker section of the people and in particular of the Scheduled Tribes;

And whereas, the Government of Assam had been allowing certain concessions in regard to the settlements of contracts, permits, fisheries, ferries, forest mahala, tolls supply of all materials and articles to Government etc, to safeguard the economic interests of the Scheduled Tribes;

And whereas, the Government of Mizoram has in their order No. IG.61/73/12 dt. 5th Decd 1973 continued such concessions with certain modifications;

And whereas, the said order is not very clear in certain respects;

Now, the refore, this House resolves that;

- 1) In respect of auction or tenders which are settled at the lowest bid the auction or tender may be settled on a Scheduled Tribe 12 percent above the lowest bid and
- 2) In the case of auctions or tender settled on the highest bid the auction or tender may be settled on Scheduled Tribes at 12percent below the highest bid.
- 3) Paragraph 3 of the said order relating to persons registered outside may be omitted .
