PU P.C.ZORAMSANGLIANA: Pu Speaker, my starred question No. 59.

Will the Hon'ble Minister in-charge Health & Family Welafre Department be pleased to state -

What criteria is to be applied for the selection of training centre for M.B.B.S. this year?

PU LALRINCHHANA: Pu Speaker, there is no criteria made MINISTER for that.

PU P.C.ZORAMSANGLIANA: Pu Speaker, Additional question.

I would like to state that our students who have gone for MBBS training to various states met difficulties. As we know, every year our Government sent out students who got the high marks were made to choose their training centre. Last year, a student who got the highest marks was not given the centre he wants. This year out of the best fifteen students chosen, the 9th was made to choose the best place as this student happens to be a close relative of one of our Ministers. Very often, these things happen to our students and greatly hampers their studies. Does our Government realise these difficulties met by our trainees and how far does it take steps to help them?

PU LALRINCHHANY. : Pu Speaker, the MBBS students have been MINISTER sent our according to the availability of seats for Mizoram. Students who got high marks were selected and were given College seat. If a student ask for a particular College the matter is considerd. That is the usual procedure.

The difficulties met by our students in Imphal had been mentioned by the Hon'ble Member. We are very sorry to hear that. But their difficulties and hardships had not reach our notice. We haven't got any report or Wireless/Telegraph about it. But only after these students left Imphal and reach Silchar that the Government noticed their difficulties. And the Government took action at once and arranged transportation for them. When these students arrived in Aizawl they came in contact with the Chief Minister and the latter at once sent a telegram to the Chief Minister of Manipur asking him to provide security to these students in future. This is how the Government took action regarding our MBBS students.

PU P.C.ZORAMSANGLIANA: Pu Speaker, it is unfair that some student can choose the College they want while some were not allowed to choose the College they would like to attend. I'm afraid this would discourage our bright students.

Pu Specker, the Hon ble Minister had mentioned about sonding Telegram to the Chief Minister of Manipun regarding the IBBS students. Have that Telegram been replied? If not, all we going to send a messenger?

PU LAIRINCHHANA: Pu Speaker, regarding the seat of the MINISTER MBBS Students all the students who asked to attend for a particular College were allowed except in special ceses.

Regarding the Telegram sent by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, it has not been regard yet according to my knowledge.

PU VANLAINGENA Pu Speaker, additional question. 23

persons have drawn the Medical reimbursement. The total amount drawn
by the 22 persons has come to Rs. 41,582 But the amount
drawn by Pu V.L. Sawma alone goes to Rs. 52,805.00 which
is mean higher than the total amount drawn by the 22 persons.
Will you please explain this?

PU AICHHINGA MINISTER : Fu Speaker, the Medical re-imbursement is dealt by the Directorate and the Department concerned dealt the metter without reaching the Ministry.

FU VANLALNGENA: Pu Speaker, I would important additional question. The Medical re-imbursement bill of V.L.

Sawma amounting to Rs. 52,805/- has been drawn by the name of Lalthlamuana, who is a close relative of the wife of the Yon'ble LAD Minister. And this Lalthlamuana is not an employee of the LAD Department, but an outsider. According to the rules, no outsider can draw a Medical re-imbursement lil. Therefore, this is illegal and there is corruption in this regard, So, I would like to ask the Hen'ble Health Minister that if this kind of thing is practise by others, will the House accept it?

PU LIANSUAMA: Pu Speaker, additional question. Regarding Medical Re-imbursement, I would like to ask one thing. Recently, the Hor ble MLA of Aizawl West was referred to have a Medical cleck-up in Delhi with his attendant. On their return while he was allowed to return by an aeroplane his attendant was idealed to go by train. But in the case of the Medical re-imbursement bill of V.L. Siama, he had drawn along the Medical re-imbursement of outsider. This is against the rules of the Government: Therefore, I would like to ask that if this is possible can you promise that I too, could be able to draw the Medical re-imbursement.

SPEAKER: The attendant of the Hon'ble MLA of Aizawl West is already allowed to travel by air.

PU LIANSUAMA: I am very happy to hear that. But, that is a must as the attendant was legally entitled to travel by air. What like to ask is why this illegal thing is practised in the Local Administration Department.

Pu F.LALRAMLIANA: Pu Speaker, the Hon'ble MLA of Saiha Constituency was referred to outside to have a medical check-up as he had kidney trouble. But he was not allowed to

trivel by air by the Government. Even the Directorate refused to recommend air travel him I feel this very regretable. In the meantime in the Department of LAD the Hon'ble Minister made money out of faul play. While our own Member's on genuine cases, I think it is wrong to play unfair means.

FULIANSWAMA: Pu Speaker, I too, am going to claim may

matter.

PU VANLALNGENA: Pu Speaker, now can the Hon'ble Health Minister be so blind in this misappropriation.

S P E A K B R : Let us cell now Pu Zosiame Pachuau.

PU ZOSIAMA PACHUAU: Pu Speaker, I would like to ask three questions related to the Budget.

Will the Hon'ble Minister of Environment and Forests Department be pleased to state

(1) How many hectares does the Mizoram Government intends to make afforestation for the year 1988-89 ?

- (2) How many hectares of afforestation are under progress by each Forest Division ?
- (3) How much will be required for these afforestation ?

PU H.LALRUATA: Pu Speaker, for answer to question No.
MINISTER

1 is that for the year 1988-89 our target under State Plan is 3100 hectares
and 4100 hectares under centre sponsor scheme totalling 4200.

For question No. 2, the Plantation work is divided in to Division-wise. Under Aizwel Division 300 hectares, under Central 700. Under Mamit Division 100 hectares under State and under Central 100 In Darlawn Division 100 hectares under state and 550 under the Central. In Kolasib Division 400 hectares under state and 550 under the central. In Kawrthah Division, 200 under the state and 400 hectares under the Central Sponsor Scheme. In Champhai, 300 under State Plan and 300 under the Central Sponsor Scheme. From Wild Life Division 100 heatares under the Central Sponsor Scheme. In Lunglei Division 500 under state plan and ...104/-

350 from central. From Tlabung Division, 500 under state and 250 under Central. Form N. Vanlaiphai Division 300 under State Plan and 400 under Central Sponsored Scheme.

The Financial outlay for the afforestition scheme is 175 lakhs. Besides this, the actual financial outlay from the Central Sponsored Scheme has not yet finalised by the Government of India.

PU ZOSIAMA PACHUAU: Pu Speaker, additional question. Are these clasification of forest into Reserved Forest, classicied Forest or waste land under afforestation scheme?

PU LIANSUAMA : Pu Speaker, during the Budget Session the Hon'ble Minister, of Forest had mentioned that the Plantation area under

Mamit Division is more than 10000 hectares. As the plantation area under Mamit Division is so vast the employees and the workers play an important role in it. Recently, a number of Range Officers under the Forest Department were transferred to various places. It seems that their transfer orders were possed from the Ministry itself. As some Range Officers were posted to unwanted the Forest Minister with money. These Range Officers were posted to where they wanted.

Pu Speaker, another thing is when the Han'ble Forest Minister was scheduled to have a tour to Lunglei, he asked the conservator of forest for a sum of Rs. 10000. But the conservator, on finding that he did not possess that much in cash sent a messenger to the P.A. of the Minister. As this is how the Hon'ble Minister had acted. It made me think how much he is going to demand from the Plantation Budget and Centrally Sponsored Scheme Budget. What I would like to ask is, Pu Speaker, is it possible to set up a commission of Enquiry Act to prove all these?

PU SMIKAPTHIANGA: Additional question, Pu Speaker, In the Newspaper of the MNF Party the Ministers statement has been clearly published stating that the Forest Minister has reserved 10% and not 25%. In this regard I would like to ask in what sanction coes the Minister usually make a reserve.

In Phairuangchhuah, one Forester, F. Lalthanliana had cleared the Plantation area where Teak and Thlanvawng tree had been planted. But no trees have been planted after that and the Plantation area was left untouched. Is this the way the Forest Department has done afforestation? Suppose this Forester was violating the law, how is the Department going to take actions against him?

PU P.C.ZOR/MSANGLIANA: Po speaker in the Newspaper of 'Zalenne Thangeu' the Minister's Statement was published in which he stated that 10% is for the Porest Minister. But in the 'Rewlther' Magazine in an interview to the Minister himself we find that the District Forest Officers have no share and 100% is for the Minister. I would like to ask which is the truth.

PU H.LALRUATA: Pu Speaker, as the Hon'ble MLA of Ngoba Constituency has asked the afforestation in Mizoram is meitly under the Waste

Regarding the transfer of the Officers of that.

Regarding the transfer of the Officers of that Department, the Government has no knowledge

Regarding Pu F. Laithanliana the Ministry did not get a report from the Department. I myself have
made enquiries about him. Laithandians was transferred to
pther place but not because of his elegaing of the Plantation
area.

Regarding the work contract published mistake. The truth is as the Department is my Department.

PL ZOSIAMA PACHUAU: Pu Speaker, my question regarding the afforestation has not been properly answered. So let to ask again. An analyth was made regarding these afforestation. But no result has come out. In 1987 the Senter Officers had made a report to higher authorities out no action had been taken. To take one example, In Mamit Division, 150 hectares are for out that only 20 hectares are afforested. In Phaizau out of the 178 hectares recorded only 100 was found afforested. For afforestation more than 300 lakes as spent every year. But the number of plantation is decreasing every year rather in this regard?

PU H.LAIRUATA MINISTER

Pu Speaker, the area of the afforestation would be investigated if it is submitted sto me in writing.

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PU LIANSUAMA : Pu Speaker, As the Hon'ble Chief Minister has just mentioned about 152 had been incurred for the Pawi District Council during 1987-88. During last year, the Budget had been wrongly used for Stationery alone 10,76,055 lakhs was used without calling the quotation. And also this are

vouchers produced which carried a large sum of money, but the purchased materials were no where to be seen. Will the Hon'ble Chief Minister pleased investigate this misappropriation?

Pu Speaker, the Hon ble Chief Minister has made an accord for the minorities for preservation of their rights and privileges. What I would like to state in this regard is that, we, the MLAs and the Members of District/Council are elected to execute the plan for development. If that is so, in the Block level the MLAs and the MDCs are supposed to make Plans. But the Government takes away our rights and privileges so as not to make plan. We, the MLAs elected from Lakher are the victims.

The Second thing is that the Lakher are deprived of their rights where making block and District Council. I find this very herd to understaid. I would like to ask whether our rights and privileges are really preserved?
