Therefore, I request you all to understand this. If we want to have more time for Question Hour we need to adjust ourselves to deliver obituary speech. Now, let us call upon Pu Zoramthanga, The leader of the House.

**PU ZORAMTHANGA
CHIEF MINISTER**

: Mr. Speaker Sir, Today, we cannot avoid to observe obituary on the sad demise of four important

persons. First of all, let me speak about Shri Krishan Kant, the Vice President of India, who passed away on July 27, 2002 at 8 : 45 at the Hospital of AIIMS. He was 75 years. He had two sons and one daughter.

Shri Krishan Kant, Son of Shri Lala Chind Ram, was born on February 8, 1927 at Kotmohammed, Amritsar District. He passed M.Sc. Technology from Banaras Hindi University. He was Scientist and Social Worker. In 1958, he married Smt. Sumani. Krishan Kant was a Freedom Fighter, he was imprisoned for 2 years during the Quit India Movement. He was the General Secretary of Secular Students Federation at Jhelum from 1940 - 1942. He had held a post of Vice President of Lahore students Congress in 1946. He was a member of Haryana Pradesh Congress Committee and All India Congress Committee He was also the Editor of Indian Parliamentary and Science Committee and Science in Parliament.

Shri Krishan Kant became a member of Rajya Sabha during 1966 - 1977 and a member of Lok Sabha in 1980. After expelling for Congress Party he joined Janata Party and he became Parliamentary Party Executive Member during 1977 - 1988. He had also been the Governor of Andhra Pradesh State before he became the Vice President of India. In 1997 he was elected to be the Vice President of India, he held this office till he passed away. Shri Krishan Kant worked very hard On 26th July, 2002, he worked till midnight. On the very next day on 27, July, 2002 he was admitted to AIIMS Hospital at 7 : 30 A.M. due to heart Disease. But he died of Heart attack at 8 : 45 A.M on the same day. We are sorry for his untimely death.

The next one is Shri Basappa Danappa Jatti, who was the former Vice President and acting President of India. Shri B.D. Jatti was born on 10.9.1912 at Saluaji Village in Bijapur District, Karnataka. He passed L.L.B. from Sykes Law College, Kolhapore. He married Smt. Sangamma B. Jatti and he had three sons and a daughter. He practiced. Law at Jamkhandi Village and he spent most of his time for Social Welfare. He was one of the most important fighter in the liberation movement of the Princely State of Jamkhandi. He became the Chief Minister under the Maharaja of Jamkhandi for 3 years. He was also the Member of Bombay State Legislative Assembly and became a Minister of Health and Labour Department. In 1956, he was elected to a member of Mysore State Legislative Assembly. In 1967 he was re-elected to the same Legislative Assembly.

He was the Lt. Governor of Pondicherry during 1968 - 1972. He became the Governor of Orissa in November 1972. He was elected to the Vice President of India on 31.8.1974. He became the Acting President of India during 12.2.1979 - 24.7.1979. Shri B.D. Jatti passed away on 7.6.2002 at the age of 90. We are sorry for his sad demise.

Thirdly, let me speak about Pu R. Thanhkira, Ex-M.P. who passed away on 2.8.2002 at 8:30 A.M. He was 81 years.

Pu Raymond Thanhkira, son of Pu Thangruma and Pi Thangluai was born on 4.4.1919 at Aizawl Thakthing Veng. He had three brothers and two sisters. In 1941, he passed B.A. from Calcutta University. Then he joined the British army and he fought in the Second World War. During the Second World War, he worked in the East African Countries. He won 4 medals. He retired from Army in 1946 and returned to Mizoram where he started a weekly Newspaper called 'MIZO' with his friends Pu R. Thangbuaia and Pu L.T. Muana. Soon after he returned back to Mizoram, Pu R. Thanhkira joined Mizo Union Party. He became the Vice President during 1947 - 1948. He was the President from 1953 to 1955. He was elected to the Member of Mizo District Advisory Council.

In 1952, he was elected to the Member of Legislative Assembly under the Assam State and to the Member of the First Mizo District Council. He was also elected to be the Member of Rajya Sabha from Assam State. He became the first member of Rajya Sabha among the tribals of N.E. India. Due to his effort the name of 'Lushai' was changed into 'Mizo'. In 1958, he joined EITU (Eastern India Tribal Union) Party and he was elected again to be an M.L.A for a period of 1962 - 64.

Pu R. Thanhkira was invited by the Government of Assam to be a member of Assam Public Service Commission. Then he became the Chairman during 1968-1974. Under his chairmanship many Mizo youths got Government jobs. He was also the Vice President of Central Y.M.A., from 1958-1963. On 27th January 1982 Association for Maternity and Social Health was established in which Pu R. Thanhkira became the first President. After seven years of untirely service he voluntarily abandoned his Presidentship. He was also the President of Mizoram State Scholarship Board during 1982-1988.

Pu R. Thanhkira was a healthy man and he did Physical exercise regularly. During his youthful ages he walked not less than 5 KMs every morning. He was a great writer too. One of his books became the Book of the year. When he became an old age he suffered from diabetes. He was on bed due to this disease since August 16, 2001. At last, he died on 2.8.2002 at 8:30 A.M. His death was a great loss for Mizoram.

Next, let me speak about Pu Saingura Sailo, Ex-Minister of Mizoram. He died of cancer at the age of 51. Pu Saingura Sailo son of Pu Lalthansanga Sailo and Pi Darkhumi was born on 25th April, 1955 at Tanhril Village. He has three sisters without brother. He passed HSLC from Shillong and B.A under Distinction from U.C.C., Borapani in 1977. He passed M.A. (History) and L.L.B from Guwahati University. Then he practised Law. He married Pi Saizami, he had two sons and four daughters.

In 1983 he enroll himself in the Supreme Court Bar Association. In July of the same year. Aizawl Law College was established under his guidance. He was the Founder President and the first Principal of this law College. He was also the First President of Trade Union of Mizoram. He had held the post of Vice President in P.U.C.L., Mizoram Branch during 1985-86 and became the Legal Adviser till he dead. Pu

Saingura Sailo was the legal Adviser of Voluntary Action Bureau and Social Welfare Board of Mizoram. He gave free 'Legal Education' to the poor people in his house.

With Pu H.K. Bawihchhuaka (L) he represent Mizoram in the Sub-Committee of the Planning Commission to draft an Act for N.E. India Tribal Area. Soon after peace agreement was signed by the Government of India and M.N.F. Pu Saingura Sailo joined M.N.F. Party. He was elected to the member of the first Mizoram State Legislative Assembly from Aizawl 'E'-I Constituency. He became a Minister under the Chief Ministership of Pu Laldenga (L). In January, 2002 he was found that he suffered from cancer. He got treatment at Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai. Thus, he died of cancer on 16th September 2002 at 2 : 25 P.M. His death was a great loss for Mizoram.
Mr. Speaker Sir.

S P E A K E R : The Leader of the House now mentioned about the passing away of great persons. Time is opened for every member to deliver speech too.

PU LALHMINGTHANGA : Mr. Speaker Sir. Thank you. Today, we need to have obituary on four great persons. First of all let me speak about Shri Krishan Kant, the Vice President of India. The detail has been mentioned by the leader of the House. He was a great Freedom Fighter, a great Parliamentarian and a great Social Worker. He spent most of his life time to serve for others. His death was a great loss for India. I wish his family to be relieved by the God.

Next, Shri B.D. Jaiti, who had held the office of the Vice President and President of India was also a great statesman. He originated from a poor family but his untirely efforts for the country made him great. I congratulate him for he could attain 90 years. This House is sorry for his death and we share the grievances of his left family.

Thirdly, let me speak about Pu R. Thanhlira. He was one of the most notable and experienced person among Mizos. I regard him with great respect. He was responsible to change the name of Lushai Hills to Mizo District. He made many remarkable achievements. Under his guidance Mizo High School was established at Shillong and I was appointed to be the Headmaster. He played countless role for the welfare of Mizo under the government of Assam. Therefore, we share the grievances of his family on his demise and we pray to God for them.

Lastly, I am sorry for observing obituary on the demise of our fellow legislator Pu Saingura Sailo, Ex-Minister of Mizoram. I am personally closed to him. He was a man who always ready to help others. While practicing Law he had helped many poor people. He had played valuable roles for our State. He died of cancer at the age of 51 only. We share the grievance of his family and relatives. This House also mourn his untimely demise.

S P E A K E R : Now let us call upon Pu Zakhu Hlychho.

PU ZAKHU HLYCHHO : Mr. Speaker Sir, Thank you. It is a sorrowful to have obituary on the sad demise of four notable persons. I know not much about Shri Krishan Kant and Shri B.D. Jatti, however we have listened from the leader of the House. I would like to mention about Pu R. Thanhlira and Pu Saingura Sailo. I know them personally and I opine that their demise is a great loss for Mizoram. They had made many contributions for the development of our State. They always kept Mizo identity wherever they were, I am proud of them. I and my fellow members of this House are deeply sorry that they left us untimely.

Thank you.

S P E A K E R : I think many other members too would like to speak about them, but there is no too much time. Now we shall observe One-Minute silence to show our respect to Shri Krishan Kant, former Vice President of India, Shri B.D. Jatti, former Vice President of India, Pu R. Thanhlira, Former M.P, Pu Saingura Sailo, former M.L.A. of Mizoram.

(One - Minute silence is observed)

Now, we shall go to the next business and we shall take questions. Let us call upon Pu R. Lalzirliana to ask starred question No. 1.

PU R. LALZIRLIANA : Mr. Speaker Sir, Thank you. Will the hon'ble Minister of P.H.F. Department be pleased to State.

- (a) Is the Greater Water Supply Scheme made for Mamit town ? If so, when will the work be started ?
- (b) What is the reason for not implementation of the previous proposal ?

**PU TAWNLUIA
MINISTER** : Mr. Speaker Sir, the following are the answer to questions asked by the hon'ble member from Saitual Constituency.

- (a) Yes, Greater Water Supply Scheme is made for Mamit town. The work will be started as soon as fund is there.
- (b) The previous proposal for Mamit Water Supply Scheme was not implemented due to the lack of fund at that time.

PU K.L. LIANCHIA : Mr. Speaker Sir, will the hon'ble Minister of Agriculture Department be pleased to State :

- (a) When will the financial aid be distributed to the beneficiaries of MIP (Mizoram Intodelhna Project) ?

(b) Will Rs.7500/- each be given to the beneficiaries for First Installment ?

**PU AICHHINGA
MINISTER**

: Mr. Speaker Sir, the following are the answer to questions asked by the hon'ble member Pu K.L. Lianchia.

(a) Financial Assistance will be given to the beneficiaries of M.I.P after getting approval from District Project Committee on the Annual Plan made by the Village level Committee. Financial assistance has been given to those who have completed the said annual Plan.

(b) Rs.7500/- each is given to each beneficiary in the First year Money will be issued twice a year. i.e. Rs.4000 + Rs.3500.

The beneficiaries of M.I.P are chosen by the Farmers Association of each Village.

PU LALHMINGTHANGA

: Mr. Speaker Sir, supplementary questions. I got an information that Zemabawk M.I.P Committee was

dissolved. What is the reason? It is further said that Adhoc body will be formed by the Unit of MNF Party. Is this true ?

Next, I am aware that Mel- 3 Village is not covered by M.I.P. But the Village Council of Mel-3 distributed lands to the people for M.I.P. before handing over charge to the newly elected Village Council. Is this not illegal ?

PU VANLALHLANA

: Mr. Speaker Sir, we have received a copy of selected Village to be covered by M.I.P. Is there any

proposal to change this list after publication of result of Village Council election ?

PU H. LALTANPUIA

: Mr. Speaker Sir, in which Villages has M.I.P. Fund been distributed now ?

PU R. LALZIRLIANA

: When we had Session in the month of March, we were told that M.I.P would be started during this year.

But it has not been started till date. In which Villages has that financial assistance been distributed ? The hon'ble Minister said that Rs.7500/- each will be issued for first installment but it would be given two times i.e. Rs.4000 + 3500/- What is the meaning of this ?

PU K.L. LIANCHIA

: Mr. Speaker Sir, there are 5 Villages selected to be covered in my

Constituency Therefore, I expect a detail answer. Who will make the Detail Plan or Annual Plan as said by the Minister. It is difficult for the farmers to do this. Besides, during 2002 no land is prepared for M.I.P., every cultivator engages in our traditional system of shifting cultivation. If fund has been distributed to the beneficiaries what will they do ? What area of land is allotted for each family ?

PU C. THANGHLUNA : Mr. Speaker Sir, The hon'ble Minister said that financial assistance has been distributed in some selected Villages. Can he tell me the name of such Villages? Are the Villages of South Mizoram included here ?

PU ZAKHU HLYCHHO : Mr. Speaker Sir, what official status is Given to the Vice Chairman of M.I.P ? Does he has financial power ? Secondly, this Ministry has changed Aizawl town in to a City. Can M.I.P be introduced in city area ? Thirdly, according to the guideline of M.I.P Farmers Association should be formed in every village. But such association led by non - M.N.F. Party were generally dissolved by the Government as we see in Zemabawk. Will the Leaders of farmer Association be M.N.F. Party only ? Will the government re-organised fresh election in such Villages ?

PU AICHHINGA MINISTER : Mr. Speaker Sir, regarding dissolution of Zemabawk Farmers Association Politic is not involved. As Zemabawk is a big village consisting of more than 700 houses one associations not enough for them. Besides, the leaders of the association tried to advantage during the Village Council election. Therefore, the farmer Association was dissolved before the election. Anyway, we never care whether they were MNF Party or not we made selection of villages without having political party mindedness.

PU LALHMINGTHANGA : Mr. Speaker Sir, Is there rule in the guideline of M.I.P not to allow the leaders of farmers association to contest in the village council election ? Does the government has clear evidence to dissolve the farmers association ?

PU AICHHINGA MINISTER : Mr. Speaker Sir, no specific Rule is there in this matter. We try our level best to avoid injustice. No party politics is involved. However, this seems to be a difficult task as there always tension among various political parties in many villages. At the same time, we told them that any member of village council is not appropriated to be the Office Bearer of Farmers Association.

There are many village which can receive M.I.P fund. But, we cannot give them at once due to the financial problem. Before the election of Village Council we have

released money for Hlmen village only. It has been distributing to the farmers by the Association.

In regard to the amount of money to be given to the beneficiaries. Rs.7500/- each is to be released in the first year which is not first installment. The money should be released twice a year i.e. Rs.4000 + 3500/- In this way, the financial assistance of this project should be used rightly by the beneficiaries.

S P E A K E R : Question hour is over now. Do we agree with him to continue his answer? Yes, you can continue.

PU AICHHINGA MINISTER : Mr. Speaker Sir, in regard to the question asked by Pu K.L. Lianchia, we agree the farmers to use MIP fund to look after their gardens or W.R.C lands as the project aims at self sufficiency. And regarding the question raised by Pu C. Thanghluna we have not distributed money in the southern part of Mizoram. Besides, the government officials are busy in their office. So, we appoint Pu Liandawla to be the Vice Chairman of M.I.P. Authority and Pu Lalnghinglova to be the Chairman of Marketing Board.

PU VANLALHLANA : My question is that do they have financial power? What is their official Status?

PU AICHHINGA MINISTER : Mr. Speaker Sir, they have no financial power, we have Project Director from the Department who executes financial matter. M.I.P. fund can be distributed to the farmers of Aizawl too.

S P E A K E R : Our next business is Presentation of Reports. We have three Reports to be presented today. First of all, I, my self, would like to present the Reports of Business Advisory Committee. Let the copy be distributed. As we see in the copy of the Reports we propose this current session to be held for 3 days. Can you all agree with our business? Yes, Thank you. Now, let us call upon Pu K.L. Lianchia, Chairman of Public Accounts Committee to present the 30th, 31st, 32nd, 33rd, 34th, and 35th Reports of Public Accounts Committee.

PU KL. LIANCHIA : Mr. Speaker Sir, Thank you. With your permission I hereby present the 30th, 31st, 32nd, 34th and 35th Reports of Public Accounts Committee in this August House.

S P E A K E R : Now, Pu K.L. Lianchia, Chairman, Public Accounts Committee presents the 30th, 31st, 32nd, 33rd, 34th and 35th Reports of Public Accounts Committee. Let the copies be distributed. Next, we shall call upon Dr. Lalzama, Chairman of Government Assurance Committee to present the 4th Report on Committee on Government Assurance.
