There is not much to discuss in this but I shall expand a few points as the mover of the Resolution. This has come about after the House of Parliament adopt d the amendment proposed by the Constituent Assembly. It has been included as Article 334 in the Constitution of India. This provide for the un-contested reservation of seat for sche uled tribes & casted in Parliament and the State Assembly. It is also a provision for Anglo-Indians and other minorities to have seats in Parlement and their respective State Assembling. It is therefore of utmost importance. The President of India cannot give assent before the State Assemblies ratify it. That is why we have to pass this resolution. I am sure we are all pleased with the resolution, I therefore move for the passing of the resolution.
