The Hon'ble Governor of Mizoram has addressed the House, and the speech may be distributed among the members. We shall now have a break for 10 minutes. ( After 10 minutes ). A motion of Thanks on the Governor's address will be moved by Pu F.Lalbiaka.

PU P.LALBIAKA : Pu Speaker, Under sub\_rule (3) of the Rule 16 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in Mizoram Legislative Assembly. I give notice of my intention to move the following motion of Thanks on the 22nd January, 1990.

That an Address be presented to the Governor of Mizoram in the following terms :- 'That the members of the Mizoram Legislative Assembly assembled in this Session are deeply grateful to the Governor for the Address which he has been pleased to deliver to the Assembly on the 22nd January 1990'.

S P E A K E R : This motion has to be seconded.

PU H.K.CHAKMA : Pu Sepaker, I second the motion.

S P E A K E R : The motion has been seconded by Pu Hari Kristo Cakma and it will be taken up tomorrow for discussion.

MINISTER : Pu Speaker, with your permission and with the permission of the House, I lay on the Table of the House, The Mizoram Sales Tax Rules, 1989.

S P E A K E R : Pu Rokamlova may now lay his Paper on the Table of the House, after which copies of both the Papers may be distributed among the members.

PU ROKAMLOVA  
MINISTER : Pu Speaker, with your permission and with the permission of the House I lay on the table of the House. a copy of 'The Mizoram Standard of Weights and Measures (Enforcement) Rules, 1988'.

I would also like to lay on the Table of the House, 'The Mizoram Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Rules 1989 (Third Amendment of 1989)'.

S P E A K E R : Copies of the Paper may be distributed among the members. The time table for the session scheduled by the BAC are as follows :- 22nd Monday (Today) - Governor's address, Motion of thanks, Official Resolution to be considered and passed if there is an Obituary reference tomorrow. Pu J.H.Rothuama BAC member may move it for adoption in the House and copies distributed to the members.

PU J.H.ROTHUAMA : Pu Speaker, I request the House to kindly adopt the Provisional Calendar scheduled by the BAC for the first session of the year 1990.

S P E A K E R : We now have a Report of the Assurance Committee to present to the House, Pu P.CBawitluanga Chairman, Assurance Committee may present the report to the House.

PU PC BAWITLUANGA : Pu Speaker, I the Chairman of the Committee on Government Assurances having been authorised by the Committee to submit the Report on their behalf, present the First Report of the Committee to this House.



S P E A K E R : Copies of the Committee Report may be distributed to the members. Meanwhile I shall read out the names of the Panel Chairmen for this session. 1. Pu Lalhuthanga, 2. Pu F.Manghnuna, 3. Dr. R.Lalthangliana 4. Pu Zosiamā Pachuau. The application of the MNF members for recognition as an Opposition Party was recieved. However, it has been returned to them for connection as it was not done in accordance with the Rules. Now that they have submitted their application in the proper form, I declare that Mizoram Assembly has accepted the MNF as an official opposition Party in the House. They have nominated Pu Laldinga as their Leader, and I know declare Pu Laldenga as the Leader of the Opposition Party. Pu J.Thanghuama is declared as the Deputy Leader during the absence of Pu Laldenga who is now in Delhi on Medical treatment. We have urgent business to attend to, therefore Dr. H.Thangsanga Minister i/c Parliamentary Affairs may move an official Resolution.

DR.H.THANSANGA : Pu Speaker, my resolution reads  
MINISTER as follows :-

That this House ratifies amendment of the constitution of India, falling within the purview of clause (6) of the proviso to clause (2) of Article 368 thereof, proposed to be made by the constitution ( sixty second amendment ) Bill, 1989 as passed by the House of Parliament.

There is not much to discuss in this but I shall expand a few points as the mover of the Resolution. This has come about after the House of Parliament adopted the amendment proposed by the Constituent Assembly. It has been included as Article 334 in the Constitution of India. This provides for the un-contested reservation of seat for scheduled tribes & castes in Parliament and the State Assembly. It is also a provision for Anglo-Indians and other minorities to have seats in Parliament and their respective State Assemblies. It is therefore of utmost importance. The President of India cannot give assent before the State Assemblies ratify it. That is why we have to pass this resolution. I am sure we are all pleased with the resolution, I therefore move for the passing of the resolution.

Thank you.

S P E A K E R : The mover have clarified the resolution and if there are any members who wish to discuss it, you may do so.

PU J. THANGHUAMA : Pu Speaker, I am indeed very glad that the Hon'ble Minister has moved this Resolution. I do not think there is any difficulty in passing the resolution. The Article 334 which provides for a span of 40 (forty) years for the development of scheduled castes and tribes has not been sufficient. We need more time and the addition of 10 years more has proved the Centre's concern for us. The only way to show our thankfulness is to pass this resolution unanimously. It is indeed a boon for them. Let us therefore pass this resolution unanimously.

PU LAL THANHAWLA : Pu Speaker, I think the Hon'ble Minister has moved a very good resolution. Our secret fears they the new government might not be concerned with the up-gradation of Tribals and other minorities has been thrown away. We are indeed very grateful to the Central government for their concern. Let us therefore pass this resolution unanimously. We have summomed this Emergent session to ratify the Act as notified by the Central Government, this ratification has to reach Delhi today itself. We are thankful to all the members for attending this Special emergent session. Thank you.

S P E A K E R : I am sure many of the Hon'ble Members will have plenty to say in this matter. However as time is extremely short we may now pass the resolution. (Pu Zosiama Pachuau : Pu Speaker, I am sure we will be able to despatch it today, I would like to say a few words). Yes, you may do so.

PU ZOSIAMA PACHUAU : Pu Speaker, thank you. We can say that this resolution is a heaven-sent opportunity for us. It shows that the Government of India cares for us. The forty years provided by Article 334 of the Constitution was not enough to uplift us and an addition of 10 more years has been passed by the Parliament. We have reached where we are now because of the help we received as scheduled tribes and Castes. We should be grateful for this provision, let us therefore pass this resolution.

S P E A K E R : I shall now read out the resolution "that this House ratifies the amendment to the Constitution of India falling within the purview of clause (d) of the Proviso to clause (2) of Article 368 thereof, proposed to be made by the Constitution (sixty second amendment) Bill, 1989 as passed by the House of Parliament".

We shall now take voice vote. (All agree to pass) All have agreed to pass the resolution I therefore declare that this House has passed the Resolution unanimously. Our business of today is now over, we shall resume tomorrow at 10:30 AM.
