PU H.RAMMAWI : Mr Speaker Sir, Supplementary question -
On 30.8.1988 a Notification regarding acquisition of private lands was issued by the Mizoram Government. In spite of that, LSC was issued to 13 individuals in 1988 and one person in 1989. Such individuals are as follows; Zothanpari, Lalnunmawii, Lalmalsawmi, Zothanpuia, Vala, Denga, Zomawii, Denga, Zathuama, Chewngziki, Lalfakzuali, Thangthuama, Lalliansanga, and Rozami. The land measured about 30 Bighas. My question is why such LSC was issued after giving a Notification?

Similarly a Notification pertaining to acquisition of lands for the BSF was issued on 4th June 1990. However, LSC was issued for the same on 30th June 1990. If 23 lakhs is incurred by the government for lands measuring only to bighas, then a larger amount will be certainly required for 30 bighas. Besides, the Hrangchalkawn area was purchased for 30 lakhs while it could have be easily purchased for 2 lakhs. At the same time, an area was purchased for 14 lakhs for Silchar Bus Station while this could be acquired free of cost.

PU VANLALGENA : Mr Speaker Sir, regarding acquisition of private lands by the government, what I would like to know is whether land is acquired by the government on the basis of 30% solatium. Is there any land acquired without a solatium ?

PU LALRAWNLIANA : Mr Speaker S ir, regarding acquisition of land at Zemabawk, according to the statement of our hon'ble Minister, Pu Makkhama sanctioned his land in 1964 while he was a V.C.P. However in 1964, Pu Makkhama was a watchman at the Bung Bungalow and not a V.C.P. He became a V.C.P. only in 1968. Why a false information is given to the House by our Hon'ble Minister ? Moreover, Pu Makkhama personally informed me that land measuring 40X60 was allotted to Pu Zalawma. He further stated that Chaltlang and Zemabawk were protected areas then, and the V.C.P. had no authority to grant lands. In spite of that, house-site was allotted to Pu Zalawma against the rules due to his persuasion. As such, land acquired in this manner cannot be valid.

On the other hand, lands acquired by Pu Tlangchama and Pu Lalsiama are valid as they were granted by the District Council on 13.8. 1962. As a matter of facts I would like to give this document as a House property if this is agreed by the House. It was only in 1968 that our Hon'ble Minister obtained a House-pass (LSC) whereas the land owners obtained it in 1962. Hence, this document positively reveals that our Hon'ble Minister has the habit of stealing other's lands.

Regarding acquisition of Pu Chewngkhuma's land at Sesawng, our Hon'ble Minister stated that this was cancelled in 1988 while it was cancelled in 1989. I can provide the document if necessary. Hence, our Minister should resign as he furnished wrong information to the House. Above all, the Mizoram Government purchased 984 Acres of land

at Luangmual. However, on verification by the Mizoram District Revenue, the land measured only 768 Acres. So, a serious blunder is committed here.

PU ZALAWMA : Mr Speaker Sir, I will attempt to answer
MINISTER the question of Pu H.Rammawi. Among the
13 individuals, who were given LSC, I am
not aware whether such persons had extracted their lands to
their relatives. If so, then I do not possess the document,
and I will not be able to provide a definite answer. In any
case, the government has no intention of granting compensa-
tion to those who obtained LSC after issuing a Notification.
Previously, house-site allotment was made without proper
measurement, and sometimes, land allotted was wider than
intended. Similar is the case with Pu Lalnunmawia's land.
(Pu Tawnluia ; Can our Hon'ble Minister assure us that compen-
sation will not be provided after issuing a Notification for
40 Bighas of land at Sairang and Arbai area at Durtlang ?)
There is no need to give an assurance. I have stated definitely
that the government has no such intention.

Coming to Pu Ngena's question, solatium is
practiced only recently. Sometimes, it is necessary for the
government to seize lands without the consent of the owners.
However, if it is consented by the owners, assessment is
prepared without practicing a solatium.

S P E A K E R : Now, we will summon Pu H.Rammawi to raise
his question No. 76.

PU H.RAMMAWI : Mr Speaker Sir, I ask my question No. 76
(a) Is it a fact that the foreigners at Marpara
are issued a Ration Card ?
(b) If so, what is the reason behind ?

PU J.LALSANGZUALA 1/2 Mr Speaker Sir, the answers of question
MINISTER No. 76 are as follows;

- (a) I am not aware that the foreigners at
Marpara are issued a Ration Card.
- (b) There is no reason as no Ration Cards
are issued.

PU H.RAMMAWI : Mr Speaker Sir, the following 5 persons at
Marpara are issued a Ration Card;

I request the government to check this matter as there is possibility that the government I might be unaware of this fact.

Besides, it is learnt that many quintals of rice have been transported down to Marpara area for Santia-Bahini. So, I advice the government to look into this matter.

PU P.C.ZORAMSANGLIANA : Mr Speaker Sir, can our Hon'ble member provide a certificate to the House in order to prove that they are actually foreigners.

PU H.RAMMAWI : Mr Speaker Sir, it is not easy to detect the person who gave the authorisation. The truth will come out if this is properly investigated by the government.

PU VANLALNGHAKA: Mr Speaker Sir, since the House members are given, it is clear that they are not foreigners.

S P E A K E R : Now, we will summon Pu Lalrinchhana to raise his question No. 77.

PU LALRINCHHANA: Mr Speaker, Sir, I ask my question No. 77

The above mentioned posts are not yet filled up due to the following three reasons; (i) Absence of qualified personnel, (2) Shortage of fund and (3) Recruitment Rule is being framed now and to completion is awaited.

PU R.TLANGHMINGTHANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, supplementary question; it is learnt that the appointment of Health Worker is finalised. Why appointment is given to the new batch while there are 7 persons from the previous batch of 1989? Can the appointment of the said persons be considered now?

PU S.INGHAKA : Mr Speaker Sir, why is it that the DPC fails to include the Merit list topper of 1989 batch in the appointments of 21 persons now and in the appointment to be made in March?

PU T.C. PACHHUNGA, : Mr Speaker Sir, the required qualification for Health Worker is H.S.L.C. pass. But this is a problem for a group of minorities like Tuikuk, Riang etc. will it be possible for the Ministry to create some sort of relaxation for the minorities in our State?

PU ZOSIAMA PACHUAU : Mr Speaker Sir, we have four ladies who have completed a training course of BSC Nursing. Prior to their training, these ladies were requested to remain un-marræd for at least 3 years after completion of their training. In spite of that, they still remain un-employed till date. As such, the conditions of the said ladies namely Lalthapuii, Lalrinthangi, K.Rosangzuali and Ramteii is extremely pathetic. Since our Hon'ble Minister does not permit them to marry for three years, can they at least be compensated by offering them employments?

PU H.RAMMAWI : Mr Speaker Sir, in the field of Nursing, there are different categories like the A.N.M. and the Staff Nurse. Why is it that examination could not be completed all the training courses? Is holding of examination affected by the Nursing council bill? Can this matter be clarified?

PU P.C.ZORAMSANGLIANA: Mr Speaker, Sir, supplementary question, number of posts are created in the department, but from what our Hon'ble Minister had stated, majority of them are not yet filled up. Is it a fact that the appointment of 12 Health Secretaries within 6 years hamper the chance of any other new appointments?

PU LALRINCHHANA : Mr Speaker Sir, supplementary question, as we have learnt from our Hon'ble Minister, the reason for not filling up the vacant posts is due to financial difficulty. If so, how can there be shortage of fund if such posts are created with the agreement of the Finance Department?

Besides, while there are many qualified specialists for various disciplines, why is it that such posts are still lying vacant? Absence of proper Recruitment Rule cannot be the reason because even the vacant post of S.D.O. is immediately filled up. Therefore, why is it that the post of Dy. Director and Director cannot be filled up today?

PU S. HIATO
MINISTER

: Mr Speaker Sir, more than five questions are not suppose to be entertained, but here, there are 8 questions in a row--.

Coming to matters concerning Health Worker of '89 badge, some of them remained unemployed till today. When personal Interview was conducted by the DPC made selections on the basis of personal appearance, intelligence and efficiency. So, it is most natural that some of them are rejected. At the same time, I am not aware whether the Merit list is the criteria of selections. Hence, I am unable to provide a definite answer regarding the rejection of a Merit List topper.

Regarding relaxation for the minorities in our State, it is a fact that no one is willing to leave the towns and work in remote areas. Therefore, relaxation is being made for the minorities like Riang, Tuikuk and Chakma where unsuccessful candidates of HSLC will be eligible for Health Workers.

Emphasising on those ladies who have completed BSC Nursing, I am unaware if there is any governments order forbidding them to enter into a matrimonial alliances. Anyway, two posts have been created for them which can be filled up now, and the other two is being considered now.

The inability to conduct examination for the student-nurses who completed their training courses is deeply regretted. Firstly, we aimed at Constituting a Nursing council. Nevertheless, things cannot be done in a single day due to certain problems. In the meantime, question papers failed to arrive from Assam while training courses are already completed here, and new admission is to be started. Under such circumstances, we instructed them to leave and summon them back as soon as the questions arrive.

Moreover, the Secretary keeps changing, and during my period, we already have to different Secretaries. This certainly passes problems to some extent.

Regarding the questions raised by Pu Lalrinchhana, I believe that the DP & AR and the Finance Department are in a better position to provide a definite answer. In any case, whenever posts are created, firstly, clearance is to be obtained prior to filling up such posts. Besides, there is not any specialist who remained unemployed till today the present vacant post will be filled up on completion of their training.

Concerning the post of Directors as mentioned earlier, Recruitment Rule is being framed now and its completion is awaited.

S P E A K E R : Pu Tlanghmingthanga.

PU R. TLANGHMINGTHANGA: Mr Speaker Sir, I ask my starred question No. 78.

Will the Hon'ble Minister in-charge Transport Department be pleased to State -

- (a) Is inquiry taken by the government on MST Bus accident on Sialsuk road?
- (b) If so, what are the results ?

PU NIRUPAM CHAKMA : Mr Speaker Sir, the answers of MINISTER question No. 78 are as follows;

- (a) Inquiry on the MST Bus No. ZRX 187 (Medium Bus) accident on Sialsuk road had been carried out.
- (b) As per the inquiry reports, the Driver appeared to have drunk alcohol the night before the accident and in the morning near Changte river, which is not far from the place of accident. The accident appeared to have been due to drunken driving. Unfortunately both the driver Pu Sangzika and the conductor Pu H.C.Lahluna died on the spot of the accident.

PU R. TLANGHMINGTHANGA: Mr Speaker Sir, supplementary question. The answers provided by our Hon'ble Minister is quite satisfactory. It is obvious that the accident occurred due to drunken driving. Taking the responsibility, our Hon'ble Minister submitted his resignation which was not accepted. Anyway, what I would like to know is the number of drivers who consume alcohol while driving the State Transport Bus.

On 26th February, '91 all the passengers of ZRX 195 plying between Aizawl and Kolshib alighted from the Bus at Durtleng due to drunken driving. What action is taken against the Driver and is the government aware of the action taken against such irresponsible driver ?

PU NIRUPAM CHAKMA : Mr Speaker Sir, our Hon'ble Member
MINISTER Pu Tlanghmingthanga has questioned
about the number of drivers who
are indulge in drunken driving. As a matter of fact, it is
known to everyone that there is a great danger when the
drivers are not disciplined. Besides, drunken driving is
a risk not only for the drivers but for all the passengers
who are travelling with him. At this circumstances, it is
our duty to see that such irresponsible drivers should not
drive such responsible buses, where passengers safety is not
there. Now, the Department has constituted a screening
committee to identify those drivers who are still acting
with such behaviour. In fact, we had been advising them to
take rest if they are not fit medically, we will permit them
to take leave to go for a medical chek up, and the department
is willing to help them as far as possible.

Since the Screening Committee had
already been constituted, we will come to learn the truth
very shortly. It is very difficult to identify because they
may even drink at our workshop and we are unable to control
them. This is the reason why we are looking into this matter
confidentially, and appropriate action will be taken as soon
as possible.

In case of Kolasib buses, I cannot
provide ready references. In any case, a disciplinary action
might have been taken as the reference paper is not here
with me. I would be most grateful if our Hon'ble Members
obtain such papers from my office if they so desire. In
case appropriate action is not yet taken, then we will cer-
tainly do it.

At present, we are not in a position
to deploy more buses owing to certain technical problems and
the absence of certain spare parts. The matter is of course,
deeply regretted. Presently, only those buses that are
technically fit for long distances are servicing. The TELCO
Agents fail to supply the spare parts in time, and as a Con-
sequence, emergency purchase has to be made. Besides, the
buses are not totally fit without the spare parts we are
extremely sorry for what had happened and we do hope that
the same will not happen in future.

We would like to request the pas-
sengers not to feel uneasy for what had happened, when the
buses reach Aizawl, they will be immediately checked by the
Mechanic whether they are fit for the next time. If not,
then the Buses are not deployed.

Therefore, I do request our Hon'ble
Members to understand our situation and bear with us all the
problems and burden. Thank you.

PU TAWNLUIA : Mr Speaker Sir, supplementary question; the public is aware of the fact that there are many non-alcoholic drivers in the Transport department. My question is whether our Hon'ble Minister will pick out such drivers to drive the State Transport buses.

Further, the cause of the accidents should be detected more thoroughly. Will the government take action against these persons responsible for the accidents ?

PU LALRAWNLIANA : Mr Speaker Sir, our Hon'ble Minister gave his statements in English. As I am not very fluent in English, I failed to understand properly. So, I request him to speak in Mizo language. I hope you can do it. Can you ?

PU P.C.ZORAMANGLIANA: Mr Speaker Sir, it is a fact that the life of many depends upon the Transport department. It appears that the roads where the buses are plying are all metal roads. In spite of that, is the said department heading towards corruption as there was a loss of 2 crores rupees according to the reports of last year. So, what I would like to know is whether this department is proceeding with a profit or loss.

For instance, the private buses gain immense profit while the government buses gain nothing. Under such circumstances, is there any intention to set up a corporation as our neighbouring states are doing ?

PU ZOSIAMA PACHUAU : Mr Speaker Sir, while victims of the bomb-blasted bus are to receive Rs. 20,000/-, victims of the bus that ran off the road are to get only Rs. 10,000/- what is the reason ?

S P E A K E R : We will not continue, these question will remain unanswered.

: Mr Speaker Sir, total amount allotted for construction of Playground to the Villages between 1990-91 is Rs. 6,72,000.00

Dr.R.LALTHANGLIANA : Mr Speaker Sir, I ask my starred question No. 110.

Will the Hon'ble Minister in-charge Public Works Department be pleased to state -

Total expenditure incurred during the present Ministry for Mizawl-Thenzawl-Lunglei road.

PU LAL THANAWLA : Mr Speaker Sir, the total expenditure incurred during the present Ministry for Mizawl-Thenzawl-Lunglei road is Rs. 4,58,35,644/-

PU TAWNLUIA : Mr Speaker Sir, I would be most grateful if you could kindly allot me time to express my opinion during the zero hour.

Matters concerning Lengpui airfield is widely known and discussed. In fact, the need for an airfield in Mizoram is felt by every Ministry. When the P.C. Party was in power, an area about 5 Km away from Lengpui which was known as "Parchhingchheng tlang", was proposed for an airfield, aerial survey was conducted although there was no ground survey. The MNF Ministry, when it came into power, was fully aware of the need for an airfield in our state So, a thorough ground survey was conducted along with the Airport Authority of India, and the said area was declared as restricted area and no allotment was permitted by the Revenue department. While steps were being taken up enthusiastically, there was an unexpected proposal to shift the reserved area to an outskirts of Lengpui village, which created a lot of doubts and uneasiness in the minds of the people.

Soon after the acknowledgement of this proposal, the owners of the proposed land started fruit-plantation with the hope of gaining compensation. Besides, this particular land belongs to the Chief Minister, where he sets up a fishing pond. The surrounding areas are owned by the Government officials and persons favoured by the Ruling Party. In view of the lands at Sairang, where 20 Bighas is changed into 60 Bighas in the land's pass and issueing of L.S.C. after putting up Land Acquisition Notification, the minds of the people cannot be at rest. While

an Airfield could be easily set up without having to grant compensation, why a new decision is made so as to shift the previous area to the outskirts of Lengpui where compensation is necessary, In view of the present situation, there is a possibility that the allotted funds for Airfield will be diverted for compensation and an Airfield will exist only in name. So, it is important that our leaders should have a serious re-consideration of this matter.

While the government is incapable of granting D.A., will a huge amount of cash be wasted on the proposed airfield? There is a great danger that Mizoram will be devoid of Air-link. So, Mr Speaker Sir, is it possible to re-consider the previous proposed area for an airfield?

Besides, it is adviseable to review the technical reasons which make the previous proposed area unfit for an airfield. The question arises here is that will an airfield be set up only in areas belonging to the Chief Minister and his favourites? Therefore, today, Mr Speaker Sir, although our Hon'ble House Leader is not present, I gave my statement concerning the airfield in this august House as this is an important issue. Thank you.

S P E A K E R : Zero hour is quite popular with us although this is not found in the Rules of Conduct. However, this is often practised in certain conventions. You all have expressed your ideas and opinions, at the same time, you expect to spend the same duration of time during the question hour. Let us assume that whatever ideas and suggestions you have put forward had their effects on certain fields. Such freedom of expression is utilised by our Hon'ble Members here. We should not forget the fact that this is an august House, where the hope of the people rest. We are unable to have a group discussion as today is the last day of our session. Now, we will summon our Hon'ble Minister in-charge to provide answers for the above questions.

PU NIRUPAM CHAKMA : Mr Speaker Sir, although I would like to make my statements in Mizo, I would rather present them in English.
MINISTER

Mr Speaker Sir, Our Hon'ble Member Pu Tawnluia has brought out the issue about the Lengpui Airport. There has been much talks about the said Airport inside and outside the Assembly. The various sections of the people in Mizoram sincerely desire the setting up of an Airport within our State.

The previous Ministries have all tried their best, but although the proposal was there, no concrete survey was conducted untill we did it recently our Hon'ble Member had stated that the land has been earmarked for the proposed Airport, which is about 9 Kms away

from Lengpui Village. The said land had been surveyed by the Technical team of National Airport Authority. The representatives were taken both from the Mizoram Government and the Border Road organisation. The last survey was conducted between 29th to 31st May 1991 and the copies of the survey report, received from the National Airport Authority, were given to the Ministry of Civil Aviation, Union Government and also to the Department of Civil Aviation, Government Mizoram. The reports indicated that the proposed land is not suitable for construction of aerodrome fit for Boeing 737 and Air Bus 320.

After the last survey, when the Technical team found out that the land was unsuitable for bigger Aircraft, they returned with a very disheartened feelings. Knowing the attitude and the minds of the Technical teams, our officers indicated some other lands because, they feared that once the Technical team are convinced that the land is unsuitable, they might abandon the whole proposal.

Under such circumstances what our officers can do is merely to suggest an alternative Plot of land and requested the Technical team to kindly make a survey for the second time. The land was shown to them and the National Authority was finally asked the Border Road Organisation to conduct a thorough survey on the second proposed land. The said land was surveyed and the report was sent to the National Airport Authority with a copy to the Government of Mizoram and also to the Civil Aviation Ministry of Central Government. According to that report, Airport can be constructed, but they want more lands about 500 feet, and such land is being surveyed now, after which the reports will be sent to the National Airport Authority for their examination. Once the additional survey's report is sent to the National Airport Authority, spot verification will be taken up by the Technical team, which will decide whether the land is suitable for construction of an Airport.

Presently, the Government of Mizoram is willing to allot the land free of cost and to provide permanent electricity and water-supply, and such are the the authorities of the Mizoram Government, but construction of an Airport is beyond our power as it is solely the responsibility of the National Airport Authority to search for a suitable land and ask the Mizoram Government whether such lands could be allotted for an Airport. But so far, we have not yet received any such letters. So, this is our present position.

S P E A K E R : Issues concerning the construction of Airport is a general public interest and not only of the opposition party. We are all aware that Airport is badly needed in our State. After considering this issue for a long time, new proposals emerged and this created doubts and uncertainties. It is not wrong to raise questions or give suggestions on this matter, as this simply means that we want the best for our state. On the other hand, all our

plans and schemes cannot materialise within a day. It is the National Airport Authority (NAA) who will construct an Airport in our State.

When the NAA team conducted a spot verification, the previous choice was dropped as it was found unsuitable. The second proposed land was for more appropriate in terms of length and breadth. In the meantime, question on compensation was raised. Anyway, final selection is not yet made, and the government is fully aware of the uncertainties felt by the public. As such, this matter should not create any in differences among us. Instead, let us hope that one day, this Ministry will provide a world-class Airport.

PU R. TLANGHMINGTLANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, we have just learnt that the Mizoram government intended to allot the said land free of cost. In the present situation, it is incorrect to take away the lands without granting compensation to the owners. I presume that we will be more fortunate if we undertake a similar plantation of fruits. Will it be better if we give advise or suggestions to one another ?

S P E A K E R : This is enough as we have made many statements regarding this issue.

Today, we have to conduct an important elections of two financial committees namely; P.A.C. and the Estimate Committee.

In accordance with the List of Business, we will now summon Pu J.Lalsangzuala to lay on the table copies of C&A Report 1986-87, Appropriation Accounts 1986-87 and the Finance Accounts 1986-87.

PU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Speaker Sir, I beg to lay on the table of the House with your permission, (i) A copy of the Report of Controller & Auditor General of India, relating to the expenditure of the Government of Mizoram for the year 1986-87. (ii) Appropriation Accounts, 1986-87 and (iii) Finance Accounts, 1986-87, Thank you.

S P E A K E R : Our Hon'ble Minister Pu J.Lalsangzuala has laid on the table copies of C&A Report 1986-87, Appropriation Accounts 1986-87 and Finance Accounts 1986-87. Let the copies be distributed.

Nominations for elections of Public-Accounts Committee and the Estimate Committee were prepared. But since there was no contest, the following members are declared elected;

Besides, as announced in Bulletin No. 11, Deputy Speaker is to be elected. Nomination was opened till 3 P.M. Friday. There was only one Nomination so far, and that is Pu P.Lalbiaka Nominated by Pu T.C. Pachhunga. This nomination is second by Pu F.Sapa. Everything proceed according to Rules. In the absence of any other candidates, Pu P.Lalbiaka is declared elected. The seat No. 30 in this august House is reserved for the Hon'ble Deputy Speaker, beside him is the seat of our Opposition Leader. As our House Leader is not present today, The Deputy Leader Pu Vaivenga, the Opposition Group Leader Pu Zoramthanga and the Parliamentary Affairs Minister Dr.H.Thansanga will now lead our newly elected Deputy Speaker to his seat. Let us all stand up to witness this occasion.

As we all know, since before, the Speaker occupies a very important and responsible position. He is the representative of the people, who should sacrifice his life for the people if or when it is necessary so, a courageous person was usually elected. Even now, Pu P.Lalbiaka should stand in the Middle without any prejudices. He is the symbol of unity and impartiality in the administration of our state as well as this august House. Now, we will summon our Hon'ble Minister of Parliamentary Affairs Dr.H.Thansanga to convey a complementary messages.

Dr.H.THANSANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, our election today
MINISTER is very satisfactory in the sense
that Pu P.Lalbiaka was unanimously
elected as Deputy Spaker without any distinctions of the
opposition and the Ruling Parties. It is a matter of grati-
fication that the Deputy Speaker, who will be in charge of
the Speaker, whenever he is away, could be unanimously
elected.

Pu P.Lalbiaka is a member from Buarpui
constituency, and certain members from Lunglei are depended
on him. Particularly for the people of Lunglei constituency,
his new appointment is a great honour and satisfaction. I
have known him personally, The House as well as the public
are very fortunate to have a trustworthy and brave person
like him as our Deputy Speaker. Thank you.

PU ZORAMTHANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, there was no Deputy
Speaker during the current session
But now, Pu P.Lalbiaka has occupied
his seat as a Deputy Speaker, which is truely a pleasing
matter. As a person, Pu P.Lalbiaka is a faithful and stable
undividual, and such is the type of person we need for the
administration of this Assembly. In particular, we, the
opposition members are greatly depended on both the Speaker
and the Deputy Speaker since they always take care of our
welfare. We extended our full support right from the begin-
ning of the nomination. So, we hope that we will be able
to proceed smoothly under your guidance and leadership, and
at the sametime, we extend our best wished. Thank you.

PU ZOSIAMA PACHUAU : Mr Speaker Sir, I am very grateful
to have a new Deputy Speaker. Be-
sides, it is a matter of great
satisfaction as the Ruling Party's nominee is fully suppor-
ted and accepted by the opposition without nominating its
own candidate. On the other hand, I am afraid that like the
Health Department's Secretary, there might be constant
changes of Deputy Speaker. So, Mr Speaker Sir, let the new
Deputy Speaker occupy his seat throughout this term.
Thank you.

PU P.LALBIKA : Mr Speaker Sir, thank you for allo-
tting me time to express my grati-
tude. Indeed, I am honoured and
grateful that our leaders have awarded me such a presti-
geous task. When I decided to be a politician, my main
aim was merely to support our leaders and werve our country
and the people faithfully. So, today, I am truely grateful
to be an MLA and to occupy the honourable post of Deputy
Speaker. At the sametime, I would like to thank our
opposition members for accepting my appointment without
nominating its own members. Besides, I am certain that
the people of Lunglei will be very glad and grateful for
me.

I am extremely satisfied with this Session in the sense that the opposition leaders have given their full co-operation and put forth certain suggestions for the smooth running of the government. Hence, we should keep up this unity, which has raised me to a dignified position.

Our Hon'ble Member Pu Lalrawnliana has mentioned about the language problem. As I am not highly educated, I believe that it is a good idea to frame our Rules & Conducts of Business in our Mother-tongue in order to ensure better administration in our state as well as in this august House. As Pu Lalrawnliana had suggested I, too request our Hon'ble Minister to present his statements in Mizo.

Finally, I would like to point out the fact that I am not at all qualified or eligible for this post, and I am certain that you are all aware of that, and so, I extend my sincere gratitude to our leaders and members for your great favour. I do hope that we will all work together harmoniously for the development of our state. Thank you.

S P E A K E R : The task of a Speaker is not light as it appears to be. As a matter of fact, two of our ex-Speakers have passed away due to heart failure, and this confirms that the Speaker's job involves a great deal of physical and mental energy. Today, Pu Lalbiaka, the Ruling Party's nominee is declared elected as our Hon'ble Deputy Speaker, and we are all happy and grateful for him.

Now, we will invite our Hon'ble Minister Pu P.Siamliana to present his statement.

**PU P.SIAMLIANA
MINISTER** : Mr Speaker Sir, there are certain cases of untoward incidents, which is beyond our control in our state. Recently, our Hon'ble Home Minister had presented his statements. Since there was another request for the same, I will present a brief statement today.

On the 25th September, 1991, a serious calamity occurred at Nalboni near Chawngte. Here, land-slides swept away many residential houses and 6 persons were killed at the spot. As soon as the news was heard by our leaders, the S.D.O. at Chawngte was instructed to carry out a spot verification. Besides, immediate relief of Rs. 1,000/- to those killed and Rs. 500/- to the injured were sanctioned. It was learnt that 6 persons disappeared but none were injured. However, 3 bodies were discovered and the relief operation was discontinued on 28.9.91 due to heavy rain. Presently, a proposal is being made to provide Relief fund to the next of kin of the deceased after a detail report is received from the D.C. of Saiha

PU H.RAMMAWI : Mr Speaker Sir, I presume that copies of the statements we have just heard will be supplied to us. Few days back, our Hon'ble Revenue Minister made a statement According to our Rules, copies of lengthy statements should be given to the members. But no such copies are given to us till date.

S P E A K E R : Is it a fact that copies of lengthy statements should be supplied to each member ?

PU ZORAMTHANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, such copies should be distributed to the members one day in advance. (There was a murmur among the members). It is a statement concerning Rs. 23 lakhs. So, written-copies should be given to each member

PU H.RAMMAWI : Mr Speaker Sir, matter concerning 'lengthy statement' is clearly written in our Rules in the Third line on Page 339. Besides, failures to produce the copies hampers the dignity of the House as the statement was made in accordance with our rules.

S P E A K E R : Now, we will proceed to No. 6 we do make use of the Zero hour by presenting certain statements. However, I am afraid that I will have to turn down the request for group discussion as this is a personal matter. We have made enough statements, and as mentioned earlier, the politicians have the advantage of presenting statements from various forums. It is meaningless to simply argue with one another without achieving a fruitful outcome. Anyway, the conclusion of this discussion rests in the hands of the Speaker. Besides, as freedom of expression is the right of each member, it is difficult to impose restrictions on that. It is unfortunate to see the opposition members leave the House while we have to take up an important issue.

PU P.C.ZORAMSAINGLIANA : Mr Speaker Sir, although the next subject is an important one that concern us, I think it is better not to take up now.

PU VANLALNGENA : Mr Speaker Sir, this particular topic is already included in the list of business, and if we think that the amendment is necessary, then we should proceed according to the time fixed by our Hon'ble Speaker.

PU SAIKAPHTIANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, can amendments be
MINISTER made in such away that the new
amendment are availed by only those
members present at the time of passing the amendments ?
(Speaker : It is up to you whether to pass or not as the
opposition members will not be present).

Dr.H.THANSANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, our Rules does not
MINISTER say that the copies of such state-
ments should be distributed. So,
this is entirely your authority. Besides, if statement is
made publicly in the House, it is no longer a confidential
matter. Anyway, this statement will surely appear in our
proceeding, and the copies will be received by each member.
Mr Speaker Sir, I would like to suggest one thing. Since
we have a Bill to be considered, I request the presence of
our members who have left the House. Thank you.

PU P.C.BAWITLUANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, I would like to
make a brief statement. It appears
that our fellow members left the
House for small reason. As stated by our Hon'ble Parlia-
mentary Minister, we are guided and led by our Rules of
Procedure. And our fellow members have rejected the copies
which they had asked for by leaving the premises of this
august House. Hence, no such copies should be given to them.

As I listened to several statements
and speeches, I presume that the opposition members give
more importance to their political gains rather than the
upliftment of our state. Besides, they tried to create an
impression that the present Ministry is full of cuppurations.
In their speeches, there is no place for both the poorer
and upper sections.

Coming to matters concerning the
Mualpui and Hrangchalkawn areas our Hon'ble Home Minister
had already given an assurance regarding these matter.

Emphasizing on statements of Lengpui
airfield, it appears that they are more concerned with the
plantations done at the preposed airfield. Anyway we
acquired many imformative questions on the said topic, but
we did not have time to discuss such things due to limita-
tion of time.

It is unfortunate that our fellow
members have left this august House demanding the copies
of the said lengthy statement. Here, what I would like to
question is will the copies of lengthy statements made by
them be distributed to the other members.

Looking at our Rules 60 on 'State-
ment by a Minister' there is no mention that copies of
lengthy statements should be issued. As a matter of fact,
we have our own rules, and in this particular matter, we
should not fellow therules of the Parliament merely because
it is the statements of our Hon'ble Revenue Minister.

As suggested by our Hon'ble Parliamentary Affairs Minister, the amendments to be made is a crucial one involving finance, so the presence of our members who have left the House is highly appreciated. However, Mr Speaker Sir, even if they cannot be present, we should proceed without them. Thank you.

PU C.L.RUALA : Mr Speaker Sir, I would like to
MINISTER give a brief statement.

According to our Rules 60, our Hon'ble Revenue Minister was requested to present a statement, and our Rules 139 sub-section (5) permits the discussion of such statement. If we are going to follow the parliamentary practice and Procedure, several Ministers have presented statements, but copies of such statements have never been demanded nor issued. In my opinion, precedents should not be prepared nor issued. As a matter of fact, the Assembly of various states do not necessarily follow the Parliamentary Practice and Procedure but proceed in accordance with their own rules. I believe we should do the same thing as the other states, and it is not necessary to issue the precedents.

Finally I would like to suggest that lunch-break should be scheduled earlier, and the Bill should be taken up after the Lunch-break. Thank you.

PU T.C.PACHHUNGA : Mr Speaker Sir, several statements, have been made during the zero hour Today, I requested you to kindly allot metime to speak during the zero hour which you have turned down. But I thoroughly prepared myself and so, I decided to make certain statements. According to the Press-release made by our Hon'ble MNF President cum member from Champhai constituency on the 19th September, Mizoram is in an explosive situation. I think clarification of this statement should be given inside this august House. Besides, in the Indian Constitution Part II, between citizenship Article 5 and II, there is no mention of second class citizenship, I do not understand why they made such a statement after our Hon'ble House Leader cum Chief Minister stepped down in order to bring in peace and harmony in our state. Yet, they do not seem to be grateful nor show any respects to our Hon'ble Chief Minister. In my opinion, they intended to cover up their own image while they attempt to potray us as being selfish and corrupted. As a matter of fact, our Hon'ble Minister's statements gave no reason for them to leave this august House. If they disagree with the statements, they would have left the House then and there. Therefore, Mr Speaker Sir, we should proceed without them Thank you.

PU VANLALNGENA.

: Mr Speaker Sir, the Peace Accord was signed on 30th June, 1986 ushering in peace, harmony and

joy to Mizoram. For the past 20 years, we have been living under the shadow of violence and terrorism. Today, among the members inside this House, there are certain allegation, various opinions, ideas and intimidations. I am afraid that this peaceful atmosphere of our state might be at stake.

Besides, there are many incidents that threaten our security and safety. Here, what I would like to point out that is that if there happens to be a personal attack on me, it means that they are attacking the Congress I Party, which has the largest members, and this can lead to a serious problem.

Today, why am I being threatened and intimidated ? To this effect, what I would like to point out is that earlier, you the MNF had certain resolutions and instructions and claimed that you are not Indian citizens Hence you declared independence on your own which ultimately let you to take up arms. Later, the MNF wanted to join the main stream and signed the peace accord within the framework of Indian Constitution, and along with the Memorandum of Settlement, the MNF Surrendered and gave up their arms. We deeply honour the Agreement of 30th June, 1986 and regard the settlement as honourable. However, what I would like to say here is that you truly surrendered and gave up your policy of independence. The Chief of Army denied the surrender of your policy, if this is so, then you are violating the Peace Accord. Hence, he cannot be a member of this august House nor is he Indian Citizen. So, this matter should be clarified. They should not forget the oaths taken on becoming an MLA. We, the Legislators took vows to be true citizens of India. Here, what I would like to question is, are there any members who intend to take up arms again for the cause of independence while peace and harmony have just found its way in our state ? Will the acts of violence, that will destroy the newly found peace in our state, be still continued ? Let us not indulge ourselves in any acts of violence and disturbances nor instigate any forms of trouble, for this will hamper the progress of our state. On the other hand, our main objective should be to firmly plant the roots of peace and harmony in our state. Thank you.

S P E A K E R

: We have few minutes and now we will summon Dr.H.Thansanga to present his Bill.

Dr.H.THANSANGA
MINISTER

: Mr Speaker Sir, thank you for allotting me time to consider. First, let me make some clarifications. In the Bill, the amount is neither increased nor decreased. However, there is an alteration in the Members Amendment Bill concerning family.

Amendment is to be made in the 1987 definition of our existing Rules (d) I, Here, "The wife or husband residing with him or her" is amended to "his wife or her husband as the case may be", and "The children including legally adopted children residing with him" is amended to "Children, step children and widow daughters". Besides, the clause "Parents, minor brothers, handicapped adult brother, sisters and widow sisters wholly dependent on such members" is used as interpretation for the clause "family means a member of family" and so on. Another interpretation is sec. 2(g) Members means a member of the Assembly save as otherwise expressly provided in this Act but does not include" -. Besides, another clause "The Leader of the Opposition as defined in the Mizoram Salaries and Allowances of Leader of the Opposition Act, 1991" is added to No. 3. Moreover, the Chief Whip was not existed at the time of framing these rules, Hence, in No. 4, it is necessary to add clause like " The Government Chief Whip as defined in the Mizoram Salaries and Allowances of Government Chief Whip Act, 1991", which however include the Chief Minister, the Speaker, the Minister, the Minister of State, the Deputy Speaker, the Leader of Opposition and the Government Chief Whip, and the previous clause was amended to "for the purposes of grant of loans and advances under section 12 and of pension under section 14 and of death gratuity under Section 14A".

Besides, as the members include all the Ministers, Speaker etc. Section 11 and 12 have been deleted. I, therefore request this august House to pass the Amendment Bill.

S P E A K E R : Our Hon'ble Minister had clarified very clearly, and there is nothing to be added. Now, let our Hon'ble Minister request the House pass each Bill.

Dr.H.THANSANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, I, hereby request
MINISTER This august House to pass the
Mizoram Salaries, Allowances and
Pension of Members of the Legislative Assembly Amendment
Bill, 1991.

S P E A K E R : Now, those who agree to pass the
said Bill will say 'agree'.
(Members - Agreed). As you all
agreed, the "Mizoram Salaries, Allowances and Pension of
Members of the Legislative Assembly (Amendment) Bill, 1991,
is passed unanimously we will proceed to the Second Bill.

Dr.H.THANSANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, I request this
MINISTER august House to pass the Mizoram
Salaries and Allowances of the
Speaker and Deputy Speaker Amendment Bill, 1991.

S P E A K E R : Those who agree will say 'agree' (Members-Agree). Each member agreed and so the Mizoram Salaries and Allowances of the Speaker and the Deputy Speaker (Amendment) Bill, 1991 is passed by the House. We will move on to Bill No. 3

Dr.H.THANSANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, I request this
MINISTER august House to pass the Mizoram Salaries and Allowances of the Minister (Amendment) Bill, 1991.

S P E A K E R : Those who agree to pass will say 'agree' (Members-Agree). As each member agreed, the "Mizoram Salaries and Allowances of the Ministers (Amendment) Bill, 1991 is passed unanimously. We will move on to Bill No. 4.

Dr.H.THANSANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, I request this
MINISTER august House to pass the Mizoram Salaries and Allowances of the Government Chief Whip (Amendment) Bill, 1991.

S P E A K E R : Those who agree will say 'Agree' (Members-Agree). As each member agreed, the Mizoram Salaries and Allowances of the Government Chief Whip (Amendment) Bill, 1991 is passed unanimously.

In this Session, we have 3 Private Resolutions. Although, all were admitted, non were passed. And out of 129 Starred Questions, 127 were admitted while 2 questions were rejected. The answers of 8 questions were not received from the concerned department, while 110 answers are provided in the House, and detailed answers are here with us. Besides, we have 407 visitors. (Pu Lalsangzuala : Mr Speaker Sir, can you give a list of the departments who failed to produce the answers?). Yes, the concerned departments who failed to provide the answers are the following; P.W.D. - 2, L.A.D. - 1, Parliamentary Affairs - 1, Power & Electricity - 1, Agriculture department - 1, Health & Family Welfare - 1, A&H &Vety - 1, altogether they are 8.

In our Legislative Business, we accomplished a vital task, and that is the election of our Hon'ble Deputy Speaker, Tonight at 7:00 P.M., there will be a formal dinner at the MLA Hostel in honour of our newly elected Deputy Speaker, and each member is invited and expected to be there.

Emphasizing on our Rules of Procedure, our Parliamentary Practices have greatly improved. On the 23.3.91, a private Resolution concerning the inclusion of Mizo language in the 8th Schedule to the Constitution of India, presented by our Hon'ble Opposition Member Pu R. Romawia was passed unanimously. As this Resolution concerns the welfare of the entire Mizo people, it was passed without making any distinctions, of the different parties. Besides, this matter was forwarded to the Central Government, and at present, it is in the hands of the Legislative Secretariat.

Regarding our Hon'ble Minister's statement, we have to proceed in accordance with our conduct Rules. What we have to remember is that we are not abided by the Parliamentary practice as long as it is not adopted by our Rules.

In any case, all the Statements made, the voice raises in the House etc. are all Parliamentary practices. However, actions have to be taken against personal attacks or abuses. Moreover, if there is any grievances, our reasons for leaving the premises of this august House should be meaningful enough and should be in accordance with the rules. We should not forget the fact that we are representatives of the people, and whatever we say or do should be done with utmost care. Any suggestions or criticisms made should have a progressive effect on our State.

Finally, I would like to mention that our Session is very successful as we elected a new Speaker. Now, the House is adjourned. Thank you.
