DEPUTY SPEAKER : "And in that region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. We shall take questions Dr. R.Lalthangliana to ask Starred Question No.60.

DR.R.LALTHANGLIANA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, I ask starred question No. 60. Will the Hon'ble Minister in-charge Transport Department be pleased to state - Has the Government any intention to provide free bus service to students in the main cities of Mizoram ?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Mr Zakhu Hlychho.

PU ZAKHU HLYCHHO : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, the answer to starred questions no.60 is that the Government has no such intention.

PU F.MALSAWMA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, a supplementary question please. Is the Government aware that Mizo students studying at Shillong have transportation problem ? Can the Government make special arrangement for these students ?

DR.R.LALTHANGLIANA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, I would like to know whether the Govt. has any consideration to provide free bus service for students of Lunglei and Aizawl town.

DR.T.V.HLUNA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, I would like to ask the Minister whether the students paid fare to the MST bus provided to them ?

PU F.LALREMSIAMA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, if the Govt. cannot provide free bus service for students, I would like to suggest that a concession be made for them.

PU ZAKHU HLYCHHO : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, in regard to the question asked by Pu F.Malsawma, the Govt. has already provided special bus for students studying at Shillong.

Dr.R.Lalthangliana has raised the question of free bus service for students of Lunglei and Aizawl. The Govt. has already considered this case and for this one bus permit has also been issued for Aizawl town.

Regarding the question raised by Dr.J.V.Hluna, the students of Central School have paid fare in their school bus.

The Govt. has also reflected on providing bus service for students on concession rate.

PU LALKHAMA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, does the Govt. has any negotiation with any private airlines to have Air Service from Tuirial to Silchar.

PU LAL THANHAWLA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, the Govt. has often contacted private airlines and some are willing to operate. However, there are no smaller airplanes which can operate in Tuirial airfield and the Govt. is now looking for airplanes which are suitable for Tuirial airfield.

As stated by the Members, the North East area has always been neglected by the Central Govt. This has always been mentioned at the Chief Ministers' meeting. The Civil Aviation Minister was also contacted to discuss this case. However, no improvement has been made so far.

PU H.THANGKIMA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, I would like to ask the Minister whether arrangement could be made for the service of MST bus from Sialsuk to Lunglei via Thenzawl as the road to the said route is fit for bus service.

PU LALKHAMA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, I am very glad about the replies made by the Hon'ble Chief Minister. However, due to the occasional strike of the Indian Airlines pilots, the flights to Silchar become very irregular. Therefore, I would like to urge the Govt. to arrange private airlines for Silchar airport so that, our problems could be partly solved.

PU K.ROKHA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, I would like to ask the Minister to arrange students bus for students of Chhimituipui District.

There is also only one bus service plying to Saiha and Tuibang. It will be appreciated. If the Govt. could arrange more buses to ply for these two places.

PU LAL THANHA VLA CHIEF MINISTER : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, I would like to clarify a few points in regard to private airplanes mentioned by Pu Lalkhama. Under NEPC Fokker Freindship, a small airplane has been operated in the route of Calcutta- Silchar -Guwahati. The NEPC is also willing to operate in Mizoram. However, lack of safety requirements makes it difficult

PU ZAKHU HLYCHHO MINISTER : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, I have often travelled to the route of Aizawl -Lunglei via Sialsuk road to study the condition of the said road. If the rainy season is over, the construction work could be improved. We are also awaiting for the clearance from the PWD.

The Govt. has no knowledge of the difficulty faced by the students of Chhimituipui District in regard to transportation. But, now, as mentioned by the member the Govt. will try to provide more buses for Chhimituipui District.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Pu F. Malsawma to ask starred question no.61.

PU F. MALSAWMA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, I ask starred question no.61 (a) who made the recommended list for the appointment of police constable ?

(b) I ask whether police personal are recruited without going through the interview

PU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, police const-
MINISTER : table are recruited according to
the merit list made by the Selection
Board. (b) The answer to starred question no.61 (b) is no.

PU F.MALSAWMA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, a supplementary
question please. The Minister
in-charge had stated that police
constable are recruited after going through the interview
Board. However, I would like to ask the Minister that If my
allegation is true will he be ready to step down.

PU F.LALREMSIAMA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, the question
first raised by the members.
Pu F.Malsawma has to be taken serious-
ly. We demand fair judgement and fair recruitment for police
constable.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Pu J.Lalsangzuala

PU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, in matter
MINISTER : the Selection of police
constable, there was complaint
regarding the merit list and after scrut nizing the matter
the list was edified. Regarding the interview, all the newly
recruited are taken through the interview. However, there are
persons who are selected on compassionate ground. Even these
persons also undergone the interview Board. Actually, the Ba-
ttalion Commandant and Superintendent pf police have the au-
thority for the recruitment of police constable.

Regarding justice the Govt.
tries to keep justice as far as possible.

Dr. J.V. HLUNA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, one question please. The Mizoram Govt. has re-instated a number of police personnel who were dismissed during the insurgency. However, there are some who are not yet re-instated by the Govt. How will the Govt. take the case of these persons ?

PU LALRIN CHHANA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, why is it necessary to submit the merit list made by the police Headquarters to the Govt. for its approval ?

PU F. MALSAWMA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, the Hon'ble Home Minister has not answered my question

PU J. LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, in the case of the question raised by Pu J.V. HLUNA, most of the police personnel suspended during the insurgency were reinstated. However, there are some persons who are not re-instated as they were convicted by the court.

In the case of the recruitment of police constable we have the authorised scale.

Regarding the list mentioned by Pu F. Malsawma, it will be checked and considered after he has presented the list.

Dr. J.V. HLUNA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, Pu Liandawla of Tanhril Village has applied for re-instatement. However, his application was lost in the Secretariat. If fresh application is submitted will it be considered specially.

PU ZORAMTHANGA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, in the case of the reinstatement of police personnel who were dismissed during the insurgency, while some are reinstated, some persons were not, even if they were charged with the same cases. The case if these persons who are left behind are being processed. Can the Govt. consider their cases ? and re-instate them ?

PU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, If those cases
MINISTER exist, it will be checked and the
case of all those who claimed for
reinstatement will be considered.

PU R.TLANGHMINGTHANGA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, regarding the
merit list of police constable
what are the terms for making a
complaint ? Why is the recruitment of police constable always
been delayed ?

PU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, If there is
MINISTER complaint from anyone the list will
be re-examined. Regarding the
delay of recruitment, due to financial constraint the recruit-
ment has been delayed.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Question No. 62

PU LAL THANHAWLA : Mr Dy.Speaker, let me say a few
CHIEF MINISTER points which I think is important.
Police Headquarters have the au-
thority in case of police recruitment. However, due to heavy
complaints from every corner the Govt. has to take up the
matter.

Regarding the re-instatement of
police personnel, certain cases are being considered on huma-
nitarian ground.

PU F.LALREMSIAMA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, after all the
vacancies have been filled up the
remainings should be listed as
panels. But due to the failure of administration in the police
department, there is no discipline and control. In fact, the
Govt. has not favoured the police personnel. It is high time
that better administration be adopted by this department.

PU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, Pu Remsiama has
MINISTER mentioned about the panel list out
of the 300 constable to be recruited
25% will be for panel list which will be valid for one year
whenever there is vacancy. It may be filled up from the panel
list.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Question no. 62 to be asked by
Pu Lalsawta.

PU LALSAWTA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, I ask starred
question no. 62 Will the Hon'ble
Minister in-charge Transport
Department be pleased to state -

(a) The number of drivers rated as category 'C' (drinking 24
hours a day) (b) Whether these category 'C' drivers are in
charge of vehicle.

PU ZAKHU HLYCHHO : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, the answer to
MINISTER starred question no.62 are as
follows :- (a) There is no
official classification of drivers. However there are some
drivers who are under surveillance. (b) Those who are under
surveillance have not handled any vehicle.

PU LALSAWTA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, a supplemen-
tary question please. The Hon'ble
Minister incharge Transport had
stated in the press conference called by him on the 26th July
that there are some drivers in the category 'C' who are intox-
icated 24-hours a day. However, on his replies to my starred
question he has denied that. Does this means that he had
given wrong information to the press or Vice Versa ?

PU ZAKHU HLYCHHO : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, the department
MINISTER of Transport does not make classi-
fication of its drivers. However,
as stated before, there are some drivers who are indulged in
intoxicating thing like liquor
Regarding the question of Pu Lalsawta
between the press conference called on the 26th of July and
today, a number of drivers who are grouped as category 'C'
have given up their drinking and are improving their character,
therefore, the number cannot remain constant.

PU LALSAWTA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, a supplementary
question please. Journalists are
the most important agents for the

Minister as the policies and decisions of their departments could be expressed through them. The press conference report published by 'Romei' newspaper had stated that " In the Transport department there are 37 drivers who are intoxicated 24-hours a day who are grouped as category 'C' " Vanglaini daily paper also mentioned the same report. And now the Hon'ble Minister has indirectly accusing the two newspaper. of publishing wrong report.

I would also like to mention another similar case on the 18th of January, the Hon'ble Education Minister had stated before the public at Vanapa Hall that School Teacher have only 181-working days within a year which disheartened the teachers. However, in replying yesterday's question the Minister has said that teachers have 219 working days in a year. In this regard I would like to ask the Minister to state the fact.

PU F.MALSA/MA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, I would like to ask the Minister whether he was trying to humiliate his department or to make a reform on his department.

PU ZOSIAMA PACHUAU : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, I will make clarification on the subject mentioned by Pu Lalsawta. I had stated in the meeting of teachers of Chaltlang High School that the effective teaching days was only 181 days after subtracting the days spent for examinations and sports.

Dr.J.V.HLJUNA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, the Hon'ble Transport Minister had given a statement that the Govt. has no responsibility for the accident of private Buses as private buses are not controlled by the Govt. In this regard, I opine that the Govt. is solely responsible for private buses as they are controlled by it. The Govt. has issued licence and permit to private buses and even the route of these private buses are controlled by the Govt. I do not understand how the Minister could say such a thing.

PU ZORAMTHANGA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, When Saiha bus met an accident the Hon'ble Minister had submitted his resignation feeling that he was responsible for it. Does this mean resigning from his ministership or from his portfolio ?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Let us now call upon Pu Zakhu Hlychho.

PU F.LALREMSIAMA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, I would like to repeat the case of transport drivers. If it is true that there are such drivers who are constantly drinking why does not the Minister dismiss them from their post?

PU ZAKHU HLYCHHO : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, I am not MINISTER accusing the press people for publishing wrong report. As stated by Pu F.Lalremsiama a number of drivers and conductors are under suspension due to thier indulgence in drinking. As this is the case, I have often visited Chaltlang workshop and gave speech to the drivers.

One of the members have enquired about my submission of resignation when passenger bus accidents became very frequent, I have submitted my resignation from my ministership as I have felt that those terrible accidents were indirectly my responsibility.

Regarding the category of drivers as I have stated before, the department has no category 'C' drivers at present.

PU LALSAITA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, supplementary question please. The Hon'ble Minister had stated before the press people that there were 37 drivers who were drinking 24 hours a day. But today, the Minister denied having said that. Hence what I would like to enquire is that which side has made false statement the Minister or the press?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Pu Lalrinchhana

PU LALRINCHHANA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, as a Govt. and as a public, we have faced problems from MST drivers. At the same time drivers and conductors have also difficulties. MST drivers and conductors worked full-time and do not enjoy holidays while other employees are given overtime allowances

the drivers and conductors of MST are not given any allowances even though they work during holidays. In this regard, I would like to ask the Minister in-charge whether allowances are to be given to them.

Dr.R.LALTHANGLIANA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, I think the Minister in-charge Transport has made a mistake by stating that he has no responsibility for private buses. Therefore, I demand clarification on this point.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : After the Minister has given his replies we shall go on to the next business.

PU ZAKHU WLYCHHO
MINISTER : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, in the case of Transport drivers and conductors, those who worked full-time are given honorarium every year. Overtime allowances are also given to those employees under Transport Department.

In the case of private bus, I have even submitted my resignation as I have felt that I bear responsible for private and MST buses.

PU LALSAVTA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, the Minister has not yet answered my question. The Minister has stated that drivers category is not officially made. If that is so, why did the Minister quoted unofficial matter before the press ?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : The Minister has clearly clarified his point regarding the categories of MST drivers. Therefore, we shall go on to the next question.

Dr.R.LALTHANGLIANA : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, I ask starred question no.63 (a) Amount of ex-gratia brought from the Central Govt. for the victims of landslide and flood in the Chhimituipui and Lunglei District.

(b) Amount of ex-gratia already received (c) Whether the Central Govt. will release ex-gratia during 1995-96 for the same.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : I shall call upon the House leader to give replies.

PU LAL THANHAULA
CHIEF MINISTER : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, the answer to starred question no. 63 (a) is 59.97 crore.

(b) The amount already released by the Central Government is 4.71 crores. (c) Regarding the third question, the State Govt. is pressing the Central Govt. to release ex-gratia besides the previous amount already sanctioned. I had even discussed this with the Prime Minister during my last visit to New Delhi. The Prime Minister has given me an assurance that the Central Govt. will consider sanctioning large amount of ex-gratia to the landslide victims.

Dr. J. V. HLUNA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, as I have mentioned during the monsoon session 24 houses and primary school at Hunthar veng were damaged by heavy rain and cyclone. Another 17-houses were also damaged at Tanhril due to forest clearing. I have sought relief and rehabilitations for these victims to the Govt. In this regard, I would like to ask the Minister in-charge how far actions has been taken for the relief of the victims.

PU H. THANGKIMA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, the 60-hectares wet rice cultivation at Thingfal has been terribly damaged by rain and cyclone. The irrigation system and Agriculture link road are also being damaged. However, the Govt. does not seem to give attention to this. It would be appreciated if the Govt. could pay attention to these damaged and take as priority.

PU LALSAWTA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, the Central Govt. accords priority to the tragedy be fallen on other States. But, in the case of Mizoram State, the Central Govt. seems to hesitate in releasing ex-gratia grant to the victims of landslide and other natural calamities. What is the reaction of the Minister concerned to this ?

PU RITLANGHIMINGTHANGA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, under the leadership of the opposition leader we have visited the landslide victims of Lunglei District and Chhimgtuipui District. After having on the spot verification what we have seen were reported to the Chairman of the Relief Committee and suggestion was also made for the rehabilitation of the victims. In this case, how far the Govt. has taken action ?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : question hour is over.

PU ZORAMTHANGA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, what is the total amount of Relief Fund already submitted to the Govt. from various sources to help the landslide victims of Chhimgtuipui District.

PU LAHMINGTHANGA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, the House Leader had stated that only an amount of Rs. 4.71 crores was allotted by the Central Govt. for the relief of the affected people of landslide at Chhimgtuipui District. When the Hon'ble Chief Minister has asked for more allotment the Prime Minister replied that the allotment for each state was made on the basis of the right ratio. However, he did not mention whether the population ratio or the land area ratio. In this regard, I would like to request the Hon'ble House Leader to make a clarification.

PU LAL THANGAWLA : Mr Dy. Speaker sir, the ratio was chalked out on the basis of the extend of damage and the number of the people as assessed by the Central team.

Regarding the point raised by Pu Lalsawta, the 9th and 10th Finance Commission has fixed the share of the State's and Central contributions of Natural calamity Relief Fund. As this is the case, the Central's share for this year is Rs. 90 lakhs while the share of Mizoram State being Rs. 1.25 crores.

Pu Zoramthanga has raised the question of the total amount of Relief fund received from various sources. So far the Govt. has received an amount of Rs. 10 lakhs from various sources for the relief and rehabilitation of the landslide affected people of Chhimgtuipui District.

Regarding the damage of wet rice cultivation at Thingfal area, the concerned department has completed the assessment and it will be processed accordingly.

Another point I would like to say is that at present the State Govt. is in a position to pay only an immediate relief to the affected people of the natural calamities. However, the Govt. will take utmost effort for the relief and rehabilitation of these victims.

PU H.THANGKIMA

Mr Dy.Speaker sir, I ask starred question no.64 will the Hon'ble Minister in-charge

Vide No. DLP - 57 of 1995. d) The sanction order for the cons-
truction of type III quarter is not diverted for the construction
of type IV quarters. As reported by the DHO Khawzawl the AEO
quarters was damaged by cyclone on the 3.9.95.

PU LALSAWTA

: Thank you, Mr. Speaker sir, for allowing me to utilize Zero Hour. What I would like to mention today is of public importance.

public importance.

In a democratic country, the Govt. is supposed to run the administration according to the will of the people. The elected representatives of the people like the MPs and MLAs should try to accomplish the will of the people. In a parliamentary Govt. like Mizoram, the Ministers have two main important tasks amongst others. One is to see whether the laws made by the legislators have been followed and the second is to check whether the existing rules in their respective departments are sufficient enough. I would like to emphasize these two points as the 'Rule of Law' are being by pass nowadays in administering the Govt.

In a Socialist country like India, cooperative sector has been given high priority. In Mizoram also, the Govt. has long been tried to introduce ICDP. The executive Agency for this programme is known as Programme Implementing Agency, that is the Mizoram Cooperative Apex Bank in Mizoram. This Agency cannot function properly, and therefore failed to achieve anything due to the pressure from the Minister. The Minister has even made up an "Administrator" instead of the Presiding Officer of the Board of Director of the Apex Bank. The name "Administrator" is not found in the contents of the By-law of the Agency. Even in appointing the staff and members of the Agency, the Minister is rather involved deeply. I have mentioned this point as I think the Minister has by pass the rule of Democracy. Of our Ministers have continued to operate according to their own ideas there would be obstacles for the people of Mizoram.

PU F.MALSAWMA

: Mr. Dy. Speaker Sir, I would like to state only one point. In our deteriorating economic condition of Mizoram, poverty has prevailed among the majority people, and therefore, life is very difficult especially for those who live in the remote areas. In this regard, I would like to make a request to the Govt. Firstly, to set up a Committee which will work for the removal of poverty among the people. Secondly, I would also like to request the Govt. to make emergency budget provisions and finance MIZOFED so as to seal its materials on the basis of no profit, no loss. Thirdly, the salary of the Muster Roll labourers may be raised. And fourthly, I would also like to request the Govt. to make bonus payment to Grade IV staff.

PU R.TLANGHMINGTHANGA

: Mr. Dy. Speaker Sir, I would like to raise only one point in regard to LPG connection. The connection charge for LPG has increased from Rs. 3500/- to Rs. 8000/- as seen in the Advertisement. In this regard, I would like to urge the

Govt. to examine and check the charge for gas connection.

PU LAL THANHAWLA : Mr. Dy. Speaker sir, regarding LPG
CHIEF MINISTER connection, I would like to state
that the representatives of LPG were
sent to discuss this matter and this problem will soon be solved.
I have also took note of the points
mentioned by Pu Lalsawta. Regarding the subject of inflation
and poverty raised by one of the members, the Govt. is also
aware of this problem and also has been taking necessary measures
to remove this problem.

PU H. THANGKIMA : Mr. Dy. Speaker, Sir, at Lunglei town,
J.B. College was established. Some
areas of the site occupied by this
college was given for the construction of Bazar Community Hall.
As this is the case, the college campus becomes very congested
and has to shift. During the visit of the Hon'ble Chief Minis-
ter to Lunglei last month the students of J.B. College had even
expressed their grievances to him. Therefore, I request the
Govt. to review this matter reallocate the site for J.B. College

DR. R. LALTHANGLIANA : Mr. Dy. Speaker Sir, I have heard that
the Govt. of Mizoram has received the
sanction for compensation of land rent
during the insurgency from the Central Govt. However, this has
not yet been distributed by the State Govt. In this case, I urge
the Govt. to make immediate payment of the same.

Secondly, within Lunglei town 18
Battalion Assam Rifles have occupied a vast area. For many times
the Civilians have had troubles with the Assam Rifles. It seems
that the Govt. is only aware of the presence of the Assam Rifles
within Aizawl town. The Assam Rifles of Lungled town also
create many problems for the people of Lunglei town. Therefore,
it would be appreciated if this Battalion could be shifted out
to some other place. Thank you.

PU LAL THANHAWLA : Mr. Dy. Speaker sir, efforts are being
CHIEF MINISTER made to shift Assam Rifles both from
Aizawl and Lunglei but we haven't
received the decision of Home Ministry. Regarding rent for the
land occupied by armies as there are many confusions and com-
plaints in the list of the recipients it is being revised, so
I am afraid it will take some more time though we are pressed
by the authority of the army.

Regarding the sites of J.B.College and Bazar Veng Community Hall, even Revenue Department had done verification. According to this verification, the claim made by J.B. College is not correct. However, site will be given for Bazar Veng Community Hall according to their population so that even for J.B.College it will be quite enough.

PU P.C.BAWITLUANGA MINISTER : Mr.Dy.Speaker sir, I would like to mention that Govr. is giving importance to J.B.College. We discussed this matter with the authority of J.B.College many times. When we study old files, there was no record to allot this site for J.B.College. However, as this site had been occupied by J.B.College for many years, they want to have it now and I told them that it will be settled when Polytechnic is shifted to Hrangchalkawn which had not been shifted till today. In the meantime as there is too much private pressure we decided that it is good to make pass for J.B.College whether Polytechnic is shifted or not, so the officers in-charge had surveyed the site and the file had been put up with proper procedure. Meanwhile, Bazar Veng YMA wanted this site for Community Hall and at the same time they want it for Anganwadi Hall, even Vety Dept. wants to have dispensary. As mentioned by the Hon'ble Leader, as there are many who applied for land/site for various purposes and since our lands/sites are very limited we proposed to divide this site and the students of J.B.College did not want our proposal so they had a procession. As that is the case, we had a meeting with the Principal of J.B.College and their representatives. Even the Hon'ble House Leader felt that this matter needs reconsideration so an order had been issued to reconsider this matter. So let us hope this matter will be settled soon.

Regarding rent of land occupied by armies it should be given by Home Department from 1966-1986, even Defence Ministry still has to give rent but it will take some times as spot verification has to be done by themselves. Anyway we are asking them to do as soon as possible.

PU F.LALREMSIAMA : Mr.Dy.Speaker sir, we have received a letter that we might be consulted regarding the list of the recipients of compensation but we were not consulted till the fixed date. Did our Officers do according to their own wishes ?

PU P.C.BAWITLUANGA MINISTER : Mr.Dy.Speaker Sir, it seems some of our learned persons are still confusing about compensation with rental charge. However, we are persuading Central Govt. to release rental charge as soon as possible. At the same time, we are facing some problems in the disbursement of compensation. When the lists of the

beneficiaries were notified there were many complaints. As that is the case, it was decided in the meeting of Council of Ministers that final decision will be made by MLAs but when we reconsidered this, we thought that it will degrade the status of our MLAs, so we put the matter in the hands of our officers so the list had been collected constituency-wise under the supervision of BDOs and the BDOs were told to consult their respective MLAs. It seems that some of the MLAs were not consulted in this regard. Therefore, there is fund for compensation and it had already been sanctioned by finance Dept. and we tried our best to disburse before Christmas. Regarding disbursement, it will be difficult for villagers to come to Aizawl, they will take from their respective Blocks but, there will be some problems for those who had moved from one place to another. So, what I can say now regarding compensation is efforts are being made to disburse but I cannot say the exact date. Regarding rental charge, let us hope that Defence Ministry will give us. And the case of J.B.College will be settled soon.

Thank you.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : As today is meant for private Members Resolution we spent just one hour for Zero Hour in which four members participated. We shall follow our List of Business and now we shall take up discussion for short duration which was submitted by Dr. J.V.Hluna and supported by Pu Lalhmingthanga MLA and Pu H.Thangkima MLA as required by our Rules no. 55 and its been admitted. As we have Bill which had been introduced, Private Members Bill and Resolutions to be considered it will be good if we can adjust our times, will it be enough 10 minutes for each members ? Then let me call upon Dr. J.V.Hluna to begin.

PU SAIKAPTHIANGA MINISTER : Mr Dy.Speaker sir, will it be good to be more specific in time allotment ?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Two hours will be allotted for short duration discussion so each member will be given 10 minutes each, however, if Dr.J.V.Hluna takes more than 10 minutes we can consider him as he is the mover. Now let me call Dr.J.V.Hluna.

Dr. J. V. HLUNA : Thank you Mr Deputy Speaker sir, for admitting the incident which took place at South West of Mizoram for short duration discussion. The incident had been mentioned by the hon'ble members Pu F. Malsawma and pu Thangkima and I too, had said during Zero Hour and the hon'ble House Leader also had answered our questions in brief so it may not be necessary to take such a long time.

In the statement made by the hon'ble Home Minister it was stated that a report had been received that 10 houses were set ablaze by some persons at Matesera and Samuksuri on 30th November and 13 persons were arrested on 5th December in this connection. It is heard that Lungson BDO Laizika said that those persons who burnt these houses were MZP. But MZP did not reach these two villages on 30th November but reached on 2nd Dec. and they were not 13 but 15. So they can not burn while they were not in the village and it is wrong to blame MZP. I therefore, would like to point out that the Culprits were not MZP.

It was also stated that at Deplubagh an old Chakma lady Pi Raja Lali was raped on 2nd December at 1 PM by MZPs but on this day MZPs went to Samuksuri and returned in the evening at Deplubagh and went to Tlabung after dinner by boat. As that was the case, it is clear that there was someone to instigate this old lady.

The hon'ble Home Minister also stated that 21 MZPs were arrested by BSF at Khojoisuri on 5th December. on this day 24 MZPs and 2 objectors went to Khojoisuri by bus singing happily. When the BSF heard them they came to enquire them but the MZPs told them politely that they were student that they came on duty for electoral roll hearing even the BSF were very polite. However, they were told to wait while they inform Tlabung O.C. Then the BSF robbed them off and made them stay that night in the kitchen of their camp without giving them nothing to eat. Tlabung OC Liantluanga S.I reached Khojoisuri the next day at 6 Am with 3 Mizo constables and 10 CRP and the 10 CRP started beating them. When the CRP started beating them even the BSF started beating them. At this moment Liantluanga went away. As the hon'ble Home Minister did not mention in his statement that they were beaten, I would like to mention this. It seems that the main objective of the beaters, Liantluanga and BDC was to prevent the MZPs and other objectors from their duties in the electoral roll hearing. After this, all the MZPs, even those who had minor injuries were taken to Tlabung just like animals. At Tlabung they had medical check up so Lalhmachhuana Zofa, Rodinga Hnahthial, Lalchhuanawma Tlabung, C.L.Chhunga Aizawl, Lalnunhlina Aizawl Hunthar Veng and F.C.Lalzuala Hnahthial were admitted in the hospital. Some of them were taken to Lunglei and here C.Lalbuatsaina Hnahthial, F.Laldingliana Saitual and

H.D.Lalthankima and Shakhthial were admitted at Lunglei Hospital. As we all know Lalhmachhuana and Lalnunhlina were taken to Aizawl by helicopter as they had serious injuries. Truly speaking MZPs went to various places on duty at summary revision of electoral roll to delete foreigners from Electoral Roll, they meant it to fulfil Government policy and as that was the case they even had done it peacefully. On the other hand they were charged that they carried explosive materials but it was heard that these were planned by someone else. It is sure that there is some one who instigate Liantluanga to behave like this. It was pointed out during our Monsoon Session that he had tortured MNT Block Vice President Pu H.Ngunkhupa still no action had been taken against him. Even the hon'ble Chief Minister said in this House that let no one tries to win foreigners votes, but his speech and his action is quite different. Who used to use force either in the preparation of Electoral Roll or in the Electoral Roll intensive revision? Why do our Government use BSF and CRP to include Chakmas in the Electoral Roll particularly in Chakma villages? Why did these innocent students were beaten up? I, therefore, would like to urge the Government to fulfill various demands made by MZP in this connection. Thank you.

PU LALSAWMA : Thank you Mr Dy.Speaker sir, first I would like to point out that the statement made by the hon'ble Home Minister was too bias, it is clear that he made the statement from inflated report. He stated that in one village 10 houses in another village had been burnt down. According to the report of Lunglei D.C stated by Pu P.Lalsawma one house each from these two villages had been burnt and these too were not occupied. Therefore, it can be said that the statement was meant to exaggerate the incident. Secondly, though we can not deny the report that an old lady had been raped.

According to the report there were no other persons in the village other than about 15 MZPs on that day, so it is clear that these MZPs were accused and this proves that the report is too bias.

Thirdly, the MZPs were accused and arrested by BSF for beating the Chakmas. But in 5 paragraph some of the injured persons were carried to Aizawl. The strange thing in this report is that those who were accused as the beaters got injured. Therefore, it can be said that there is partiality in this statement. I, therefore, would like to suggest to amend this statement.

Regarding revision of Electoral Roll every party is taking seriously and even Election Deptt. invited other organisations. So that we can have good Electoral Roll. Now those who responded this invitation are getting

injured. I am afraid this will leave bad precedent in future even if the Govt. invite other voluntary organisations on good grounds.

In the preparation of Electoral Roll objectors had been appointed from the parties and in some parts of Mizoram these objectors had no guts to object and that is the case the population of Chakmas had been increasing rapidly. At present according to A.N. Agarwal Mizoram is the second in India in the increment of population. As the number of Chakmas in Mizoram is rapidly increasing two objectors had been appointed from these constituency with the permission of Election Commission but they were beaten up. If we go on like this, the number of Chakmas will be increasing. Therefore, Mr Speaker sir, as the statement made by the Hon'ble Home Minister and the hon'ble member from Aizawl North Pu F. Palsawma are contradicting, I would like to urge you to form Joint Parliamentary Enquiry Committee to enquire this matter and to reveal the truth to the public. Thank you.

PU P.C. ZORAN SANGLIANA : Mr Speaker sir, in our Bulletin
MINISTER it is written 'this session for
short duration' Dr. J.V. Hluna
in relation of urgent public important for discussion under
Rules 56&55 would you please explain what are we going to
discuss ?

PU LALMINGTHANGA : Mr Speaker sir, It is clearly
written in the submission form
let me read it out subject. :
for short duration discussion on a matter of urgent public
importance Mr Speaker sir, on 6.12.95, a number of IZP member
along with 2 designated objectors for illegal entry into
Electoral Roll were severely tortured by the CRPF as ordered
by the police O/C Tlabung at Khojaisuri. Some of them were
admitted into the hospital and some sustained injury that could
make them physically handicapped for life while some of them
also have life threatening wounds. Hence, as provided by
Chapter X Rules 55 of Rules of procedure and conduct of Busi-
ness, I request that this matter be taken up in this session
for short duration discussion. Thank you.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Now we shall have break and resume
our sitting at 2.00 Pm. Those
papers will be sorted out by our
Secretary during our break.

2.00 P.M.

SPEAKER : We shall continue short duration discussion on a matter of urgent public important and each members will be given 10 minutes. Now I shall call upon Pu Lalhmingshanga.

PU LALHMINGSHANGA : Mr Speaker sir, today's short duration discussion is about the torture of a number of MZPs and two designated objectors of Electoral Roll by the CRPF as ordered by Tlabung Police O/C on 5.12.95 at 6.30 A.M. at Khojoisuri. The people of Mizoram wanted to know clearly about this.

Two of the injured persons namely Lalnunhlina and Lalhmachhuana were serious and had to undergo thorough investigations at Guwahati Neurological Research Centre. While others were admitted into various hospital in Mizoram. These MZP members did not go to Khojoisuri rather they went to check illegal entry into the electoral roll responding the invitation of the Govt. But as soon as these MZP members entered Khojoisuri. The BSF arrested them saying that they did not inform the BSF officer about their entrance and that is meaningless because the BSF do not have any power regarding Electoral Roll and summary revision both in the State and Central as well. Therefore, it is clear that the BSF and Tlabung O/C got green signal from higher level as some of our politicians consider the Chakma foreigners as their vote bank. Therefore, we can say from this incident that the Govt. is playing double role. The hon'ble Chief Minister often said that we must try to win in the election but without the votes of the foreigners but whenever a revision is made for electoral roll we try to include foreigners in the roll as much as we can. While we try to check the infiltrators why did the Govt. deploy CRPF in the most sensitive areas? Were they displayed to torture the innocent people? It is clear that our Govt. is playing double role. It is very unfortunate that our speech and action contradicts each other. Therefore, as the hon'ble member Pu Thangkima submitted Adjournment motion on 13th Dec. '95 to form Joint Parliamentary Committee to enquire this matter I do feel that it is necessary to take immediate steps to enquire this matter.

Another disgusting thing was that when these MZP members and 2 objectors entered Khojoisuri on the eve of 5th Dec. They were arrested by the BSF and were detained in their camp the whole night and all their belongings were checked by the BSF but found nothing illegal. When Tlabung O/C and 10 CRPF reached Khojoisuri at 6:30 A.M. the

next day they checked again and said that they found gellatine and other explosive materials. That was extremely disgusting because there was a plan to accuse the MZPs and the objectors. Secondly, they tortured them severely so that they could not do their duty. They were also accused for raping an old Chakma lady and forced them to do identification parade at the hospital compound. They were also accused for burning down some houses. We, therefore, want to know whether these accusations were right or wrong. Hence, Mr. Speaker Sir, I would like to support to form Joint Parliamentary Enquiry Commission in this regard. Thank you.

PU F.LALZUALA : Thank you Mr.Speaker Sir for giving me this opportunity. We can say that there is a change in every ten years since 1945. When peace accord was signed in 1978 and '79 there was nationalism in the minds of our younger generations and students. Meanwhile it is sad to know about the incident which we are discussing now. In my opinion let the innocent notion of nationalism be advocated. If that is the case, we shall not hate foreigners personally but they should be placed in their right place. Regarding the present situation, I appreciate the steps taken by the Government for taking those seriously injured to Guwahati by helicopter and for other efforts. I feel it is not good to take this situation as a political game. We should rather take steps together. Thank you.

PU F.LALREMSIAMA : Thank you Mr.Speaker Sir, in our current session our main subject is about the foreigners. As Chakma foreigners. As Chakma foreigners are considered as 'thorns' for Mizoram, we submitted a resolution in the last Monsoon Session which had been rejected. The present subject arose because of foreigners. Even the Centre is facing this problem and it came into the notice of Election Commission. As pointed out earlier it is dangerous to be an objector both in the preparation and revision of Electoral Roll. Since Election Commission allowed to designate objector in constituency way we can take more steps and as a result we could detect many Chakma foreigners. But according to Election Rules, those who had been deleted from Electoral Roll can have a chance to complain. Hence, while we expect to do things smoothly, it seems the Govt. is having two faces as pointed out by the hon'ble member from Aizawl North because most of our Ministers are absent today while we are discussing an important subject. In bad administration it is easy to break out insurgency. Therefore, Mr.Speaker Sir, we need a strong Govt. who dare to say foreigners are foreigners.

foreigner, why did the BSF detain these 26 NZPs in their camp for the whole night. Is there atrocity in a peaceful State? Did the Buddhist Association forget about Human Rights? During our short session what I would like to know is about the condition of B.Lalnunhlina why Health Minister is about today to inform the House about the condition of Lalnunhlina.

Secondly, the NZPs attack only one Police Officer but I feel it is not enough because even Home Minister is responsible in this issue as Police administration is under his portfolio. Since maintenance of Law and Order and Police Administration is very bad he must resign. I strongly demand his resignation as the proper and eminent citizens are not safe in our own State.

Besides these, as pointed out by other members I feel it is a must to form Joint Parliamentary Enquiry to enquire this matter.

PU P.C.ZORAM SANGLIANA :
MINISTER

Thank you Mr Speaker sir, while I was among the leaders of Student Union we were charged as antinational and the hon'ble member who submitted this subject for discussion was political secretary to Chief Minister at that time. As pointed out by the hon'ble member from Tawipui Constituency we should appreciate students' movement for nationalism. The present incident arose because we all want to have clean and right Electoral Roll and as a result there is a feeling that there are too many foreigners. Even in 1987 Students movement our slogan was nationalism. Whenever there is a movement among the students they have to be treated carefully as well as tactfully otherwise there may be non-violence. Today, I am glad that we could unanimously bespeak of our students. Regarding our present subject our House Leader had clearly told us about the steps taken by the Govt. According to my understanding of our Rules, its short duration and as it does not require to take decision, I think the discussion we have had is quite enough. And for the last I would like to point out that I do really suffer with the suffering of our NZPs and it is my prayers that they will recover as soon as possible; let us hope that there will be no more incident of this kind in future.

PU SAIKAPTHIANGA :
MINISTER

Thank you Mr Speaker sir, for this opportunity. Today I am glad that we could discuss about the sufferings of the NZPs which we could never done in the past.

First, I wish them all to recover immediately and also that let the Govt. tried to find out the culprit and notified to the public.

The hon'ble member from Aizawl North I Constituency had blamed our Chief Minister for not acting according to his speech in regard to Electoral Roll. But as far as my knowledge is concern our Chief Minister still stands firm in his position, it is clear from the deletion of 2400 Chakmas from Kawrthah Constituency alone.

In detecting foreigners I feel even our workers are working very hard. However, the so called foreigners have right to claim and object. Therefore, if any party or organisation forbid them to do so may curtail their rights and as a result we have to deploy CRP and MAP for this.

Truly speaking, we have to give the MZPs an advise and help them to fulfill their mission, otherwise they are easy to mislead.

Regarding the present incident I feel it is not good to blame our Officers, they have power to maintain law and order even without getting an order either from Chief Minister or Minister. However, we feel sad for the incident and we hope that this thing will not happen in future. Let us accept the Judicial Enquiry as we can review its report when submitted. It is not good to torture ourselves and we have suffered enough.

DR. R. LALTHANGLIANA

: Mr. Speaker Sir, a special Motion concerning this matter which I presented yesterday was rejected as a magisterial enquiry is going on at the moment. However, we have learnt many things from the statements of the hon'ble Home Minister as well as the Mover. As such, the setting up of Joint Parliamentary Committee who will carry out a spot verification is greatly needed here.

Further, matter concerning the Tlabung O/C had been widely discussed in the House. As stated earlier, Pu Ngunkhupa, the Vice President of MNF Block, Tlabung was cruelly assaulted by the O/C named Liantluanga. The said V/C suffered serious injuries and I have produced a Medical Certificate to prove the extent of his injury. In spite of that, the Government has not taken up any actions till date. Moreover, from the statement of our hon'ble Home Minister, this appears to be a pre-planned incident, which cannot be neglected. Therefore, the need of the hour is to set up a Joint Parliamentary Enquiry to conduct a spot verification.

Thank you.

SPEAKER : The Joint Parliamentary Enquiry is set up by the 2 Houses. In our case, it will be a Parliamentary Enquiry as we have only one House.

DR. R. LALTHANGLIANA : Mr Speaker sir, this matter should not be delayed any further. As a matter of fact, a Gupta Commission was set up to investigate the untoward incident that occurred at Aizawl in the month of October. A year had passed but no concrete actions had been taken up till today. Today, I would like to point out that we, the Legislators are willing to render active involvement in the investigation of this case. Besides innocent people and students are simply arrested and it is wrong to neglect and ignore such innocent victims. Above all, the sincere and active involvement of the elected Members will have far reaching effects.

Further, the last date for finalisation of Electoral Roll is 5th December, 10 days had passed since then and those deleted from the Electoral Roll should be departed by now.

PU ZORAMTHANGA : Mr Speaker sir, a detail statement of this incident is not necessary. While action was supposed to be taken against the said O/C, the situation went from bad to worse. The innocent students were beaten up and arrested by the Police. Yet nothing is done for the safety of our students and the people. The Ministerial Enquiry can no longer be trusted to verify and solve this problem. Therefore, a Parliamentary Enquiry is extremely needed to save the face and reputation of this Ministry and to clarify the confusing statement of our hon'ble Home Minister. In this connection, I would like to point out that list of names excluded in the Electoral Roll are being collected by the Government we hope that the said List is deleted for good in the Electoral Roll. At the same time, I request that a copy of the said List be provided to us. Moreover, in determining the Electoral Roll, the Government should take up steps in accordance with the Rules. So, to take up an enquiry, Mr Speaker sir, we request you to select representatives from each Party and in that way, our people will be satisfied. Thank you.

PU C. CHAWNGKUNGA : Mr Speaker sir, at the outset I would like to inform the MINISTERS House that the two injured persons were left in the hands of a Mizo Doctor on their own choice.

Mr Speaker sir, at the outset I would like to inform the House that the two injured persons were left in the hands of a Mizo Doctor on their own choice.

Mr Speaker sir, in general, the way we attack the Chakma is quite meaningless. Infact, the Chakmas are of Mongolian origin, and since India is the birth place of the Buddha, their faith and allegiance are firmly established in India. As such, way back in 1946, the Chakma's Raja had already opted to rule and settle in India. As a matter of fact, right from the pre-Independence period, the Chakma's Chiefs already prevailed while the Sailo Chiefs were non-existent. Therefore, it is wrong to treat them as complete strangers. On the other hand, we should be able to distinguish between the rightful citizens and the foreigners. If not, this could turn into a communal issue. Hence, we have to follow a systematic procedure, and do away with violence and disturbances. Finally, we should not forget that the Government is taking up meaningful steps in this field and we request the Opposition Members to give their full support.

SPEAKER : According to our Rules its 'not excluding 211'. Now we have only 5/10 minutes left. In our List of Business, we have The Mizoram Market Regulation Bill to be considered which had been introduced in our last Session, so if this House agrees to sit beyond 4:00 P.M. it's up to you. Now I shall call upon Pu Lalkhama.

PU P.C.ZORAM SANGLIANA : Mr Speaker sir, our rules says
MINISTER 'not beyond 2 hours'. So may I request the hon'ble member from Aizawl West I to take just 5 minutes.

PU F.MALSAWMA : Mr Speaker sir, we must have a short break before we take up the Bill.

PU P.C.ZORAM SANGLIANA : Mr Speaker Sir, there is no
MINISTER more time. So it is better to stop this discussion exactly at 2 hours.

SPEAKER : Now Pu Lalkhama will speak and after that I shall call upon our House Leader.

PU LALKHAMA : Thank you Mr Speaker sir, The Hon'ble Minister Pu Chawng-kunga said that Buddhists are loyal to India as they were favoured since at the time of Pu Nehru. What I would like to add is that the Buddhists at Chittagong District were included in East Pakistan and the matter was left in the hands of Racliff to be settled and I would like to add this in his speech.

He also said that they used to have their own chiefs which means that they were not under the Mizos and that is very sensitive because their areas were within Mizoram. Truly speaking from 1966 Mizoram was declared as distrubed area and from that on Indian Policy was divide and rule. One of our IGP's instigated Paitos to ask seperate District Council and that idea is still going on. What I am afraid is that some of us may also be used in this and that we may also be helping in the inclusion of Foreigners in the Electoral Roll. While we are discussing national issue why does the Home Minsiter hide away. To prevent the entrance of feriegners in Mizoram I suggested to our Chief Minister to create Mizo Police Out Post in the Western Belt. But Central Govt. said its the responsibility of BSF and at the border of Burma its Assam Rifle. So with the help of BSF and Shanti Bahini many foreigners entered and stayed in Mizoram. I therefore, would like to urge the Govt. to take steps with all its mights, Regarding the present incident I would like to suggest to arrest those who tortured the MZPs first. Lastly, in order to protect our land and our society from foreaigners for our next generation it will be good if the Govt. make proper guidelines so that even the opposition, MZP and other organisations can work together but no one should try to take the credit.

SPEAKER : Now I shall call upon our House Leader.

PU LAL THANHAWLA : Mr Speaker sir, I am grateful towards the hon'ble members for providing meaningful suggestions and advices. As far as our people is concerned, we are not in danger or fear of assimilation because, the Almighty God, who discovered us will guide and help us to rise above all others. As such, even non-Mizos will live peacefully in our lands while we faithfully serve and preserve our land.

Coming to matter concerning the Electoral Roll, we have complete trust on our Government Employees, and there is a Election Commission to

administer the day to day activities. I would like to remind the hon'ble members that the List of names excluded in the Roll collected by the Task Force will not be enlisted again, but will be utilise for a good cause as the Revision period comes to an end. I would also like to announce that there is nothing to doubt in the action of the Govt. Another point I would like to mention is that matters concerning Entitlement of vehicles and facilities for the Gurkha Community are under consideration.

As mentioned by the hon'ble member Pu Lalkhana, the deployment and control of the BSF is not on our hands. Infact, we have made a complaint for their misconduct in the border areas. Similar is the case with Shanti Bahini.

Further, we also learnt that our people in Tripura State were greatly oppressed and prevented from celebrating the festive occassion of Christmas. Being our own flesh and blood, we assured them that we would do anything to safeguard their welfare and interests. Accordingly for maintenance of Law and Order in the Western Belt CRPF and our Police were transferred in the said area. Besides as far as detection of foreigner is concerned, more than 8 thousand had been deleted from the Electoral Roll, which is a great achievement for this Ministry.

Regarding the incident at Khojoysuri, we are rendering our best efforts to safeguard and take care of the victims, provided that the Tlabung O/C L.T. Muana had been posted elsewhere.

1973 However, Mr Speaker Sir, I think it is reasonable for you to admit short duration discussion on this subject and it is also reasonable for the mover to move it. I would like to say that as this matter is national issue we want to enquire about it to find out the truth and take necessary actions. As pointed out by some of the hon'ble members I feel that we put the blame to Chakmas whenever we talk about foreigner issue. There are various Acts in connection with the foreigners like The Foreigners Act 1946, Foreigners Exemption Order 1948, Foreigners Exemption Order 1957, Registration of Foreigners Bangladesh Report of Police Order 1971, Foreigners Tribunal Order 1964, The Registration of Foreigners Act 1939, Registration of Foreigners Exemption Order 1967 and others which are to be studied carefully. Therefore, we, the members of this House have to consider this matter very carefully for the survival of our nation and if it is necessary for the Govt. to initiate, we shall do it. Regarding the present incident we feel very sorry and there is nothing to worry in the action taken by the Govt., that is why we formed a magisterial enquiry and if we are not satisfied with its finding there is way to do necessary things. In forming this enquiry we did not have in mind as a delay tactic or to die down the incident as such we can take necessary actions.

Lastly, I appreciate the active participation and sincere efforts of the members and steps will be taken up as found necessary.

SPEAKER : Now I shall call upon Pu Lalsawta to beg the House for consideration of The Mizoram (Market) Regulation (Amendment) Bill, 1995.

PU LALSAWTA : Mr Speaker sir, with your permission I beg leave of the House to consider The Mizoram (Market) Regulation (Amendment) Bill, 1995.
Thank you.

SPEAKER : Do we agree ? Then move it.

PU LALSAWTA : Thank you Mr Speaker Sir, I hope that for the first time in the history of Mizoram Legislative Assembly a private bill i.e. The Mizoram (Market) Regulation (Amendment) Bill 1995 is being passed unanimously.

The Mizoram (Market) Regulation Bill had been made in 1954 but there is no amendment during these 50 years. There are still only 9 sections and that is why it is time to amend it. Our market where meat and other vegetables are sold is very untidy and only because of this it is necessary to amend this Bill. Another reason why it is necessary to amend is that there is no uniformity in the measurement of our various items. I think it will be good to do in kilogram and litre basis as far as possible. Another reason is that prices of various items are fluctuating so it will be good for the Govt. to fix the rates and these are the main features of the Amendment Bill which I have moved.

Though I know that there may be many limitations as my resources are very limit. I request all members of this August House to consider and pass The Mizoram (Market) Regulation (Amendment) Bill, 1995.

Thank you.

SPEAKER : Pu T.Hranghluta.

PU T.HRANGHLUTA : Mr Speaker sir, I have studied this Bill since it was introduced in the House. I think it is not a good idea to pass this Bill unless alteration is made in some respect. The name of the Bill itself, is wrong. It should be 'Mize Market Regulation Bill, 1995.

The wording " A bill to further Amend" has also to be altered into" A bill further to Amend"

Also, in the Bill, we find "Mara, Chakma and Pawi". This should also be changed as Lai, Mara and Chakmas".

The suggested penalty to be imposed is also rather severe. A fine of Rs.1000/- and six months imprisonment is rather severe for the majority people. Therefore, I suggest that the Bill be referred to the Select Committee.

SPEAKER : After we have completed that the discussion of this Bill, House will be adjourned.

PU F.MALSAWTA : Mr Speaker sir, as suggested by Pu T.Hranghluta, it will be the best to refer the Bill to the Select Committee.

SPEAKER : I may invite the mover of the Bill, Pu Lalsawta.

PU LALSAWTA : Mr Speaker sir, as mentioned by the member of Lawngtlai Constituency, I have admitted that the Bill is not perfect. As he has suggested, I agree to hand over the Bill to the Select Committee.

SPEAKER : As agreed by the mover the Bill, " The Mizoram (Market) Regulation (Amendment) Bill, 1995" will be hand over to the Select Committee and the Committee will also be constituted right away.

As already practised the concerned Minister, that is the Revenue Minister will become the Chairman. I will also suggest the members. Pu Lalsawta as he was the mover of the Bill, Pu F.Lalremsiama, Dr J.V.Hluna, John Retluangliana and Pu Hranghluta will be the members of the Select Committee.

Out of the 119 Starred Question entered 112 are admitted and 7 of them are rejected.

All the 36 Unstarred questions entered were admitted out of which only 12 replies have been received from the departments.

Three Parliament Bill and 3 Resolutions were received and 7 were admitted and 2 were rejected.

PU F.MALSAWMA : Mr Speaker sir, the Resolution, "The Drug and Cosmetic Amendment Bill" was already admitted by the Assembly Secretariat in the previous session. However, as it is within the Concurrent List, it was decided to consult the Central Government. But, the case was left undone till date and no action was taken. Therefore, I would like to urge the department to make prompt action on this matter.

PU LALRINCHHANA : Mr Speaker sir, I would like to know the reason why some of my starred questions were converted into Unstarred questions.

SPEAKER : In the case of Starred questions mistakes could be made and I would like to request the members to understand.

Unlike the previous years we have 3 sessions this year and the actual sittings was 22.

PU LALRINCHHANA : Mr Speaker sir, I would like to make one suggestion in regard to the duration of budget session. It seems that the duration of the budget session always been rather short. Therefore, it may be suggested that longer period of days be allotted for budget discussion.

PU LAL THANHAWLA : Mr Speaker sir, I would like to inform the Members that the next budget session may be conducted as a Vote on Account.

PU F.LALREMSIAMA : Mr Speaker Sir, I would like to suggest once again to have a Subject Committee to examine and scrutinize the budget provision.

SPEAKER : In this session a very important bill, "The Mizoram Liquor Total Prohibition Act" is passed by this House. However, some of the questions and Resolutions submitted were rejected. In this regard, I would like to express my gratitude to the members for your understanding.

The House adjourned sine die.
