One is to see whether the laws . \({ }^{*}\). . made by the legislators have been followed and the second is to cheok whether the existing rules in their respective departments are sufficient enough. I would like to emphasize these two points as the 'Rule of Law' are being by pass nowadays in administering the Govt.

In a Socialist country Iike India, cooperative sector has been given high priority. In Mizoram also, the Govt. has long been tried to introduce ICDP. The executive Agency for this programme is known as Programme Implementing Agency, that is the Mizoram sooperative Apex Bank in Mizoram. This Agenay cannot function properly, and therefore failed to achieve anything due to the pressure from the Minister. The Minister has even made up an "Administrator" instead of the Presiding Officer of the Board of Director of the Apex Bank. The name "Administrator" is not found in the contents the Byolaw of the Agency. Even in appointing the staff and members of the A cency, the Minister is rather involved deeply. I have mentioned this point as I think the Minister has by pass the rule of Demon cracy. How-ver, as this site had been occupied by J.B.College formany years, they want to have it now and I told them that it will he settled when Polytechnic is shifted to Hrangchalkawn which had not been shifted till today. In the meantime as there is too much private pressure we decided that it is good to make pass for J.E.College whether Polytechnic is shifted of not, so the officers in-chargehad surveyed the site and the file had been put up with proper procedure. Meanwhile, Bazar Veng YMA wanted this site for Community Hall and at the same time they want it for Anganwadi Hall, even Vety Dent. wants to have dispensary. As mentuoned by the Hon'ble Leader, as there are many who applied gor land/site for various purboses and since our lands/sites are very limited we proposed to divide this site and the students of J.B. College did not want our proposal so they had a procession. As that is the case, we had a meeting with the Principal of J.B.College and their representatives. Even the Hon'ble House Leaderfelt that th is matter needs raonsideration so an order had been issued to reconsider this matter. So let us hope this matter will be settied soon.

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Dr.J.V.HLUNA : Thank you Mr Deputy Speaker sir, for admitting the incident which took'place at South West of Mizoram for short duration discussion. The incident had been mentioned by the hon'ble members Pu Foralsawma and pu Thangkima and J too, had said during Zero Hour and the hon!ble House Leader also had answered our questions in brief so it may not be necessary to take such a long time.

In the statement made by the hon'ble Hone Minister it was stated that a report had been received that 10 houses were set ablage by some persons at Natesera and Samusuri on 30 th November and 13 persons wers arrested on 5th Deceaber in this connection. Tt is heard that Lungson 300 Laizika said thet those persons who burnt these housos ware IDP. But IZP did not reach these two villages on 30 th Fovember but reached on 2 nd \(\operatorname{Dec}\). and they were oot 13 but 15. So they can not burn wile they were not in the village and it is wrong to blame ZZP. I therefore, would like to point out that the Culprits wore not MZP.

It was also stated that at Deplubagh an old Chakma lady ii Raja Lali was raped on 2nd December at 1 PI by MZPs but on this day PRPs went to Samuksuri and returend in the evening at Deplubagk and went to Tlabung after dinnar by boat. As that was the case, it is clear that there was somone to instigate this dild ledy.

The hon'ble Yome Minister also stated that 21 ZZPs were arrested by 35 at Khojoisuri on 5th December. on this day 24 ZPPs and 2 objectors went to Khojoisuri by bus singing happily. Then the 3ST heard them they came to encuire them but the \(\quad \geq \mathrm{Ps}\) told them politely that they were student that they came on duty for electoral roll hearing even the BSP were very polite. However, they were tild to wait while they inform Tlabung O.C. Then the BSE robbed them off and made them stay that night in the kitchen of thoir camp without giving them nothing to eat. Tlabung OC Liantlunga S.I reached Khojoisuri the next day at 6 Am with 3 izo const bles and 10 CRP and the 10 CRP started beating then. Then the CRP started beating them even the \(3 S F\) started beating them. At this moment Liantluanga went away. As the hon'ble Home inister did not mention in his statement that they were beaten, I would like to mention this. Tt seams that the main objective of the beaters, Liantluanga and BDC was to prevont the VPs and other objectors from thoir duties in the alectoral roll hearing. After this, all the ZZPs, even those who had minor injuries were taken to Tlabung just like animals. At Tlabung they had - modical check up so Lalnmachhuma Zora, Rodinga Unahthial, Lalchhurnawma Tlabung, C.I.Chhunga Aizawl, Lalnunhlima Aizowl Funthar Veng and T.C.Lalzuala nohthial were admitted in the - Hunthar Veng and \(\quad\). C. Lalzuala nosthital wore admitted C.Lalbuatsaina thahthial, Joldingliana Saitual and
H.D.Lolthankima Enchthial tore admitted at Lungloi Fospital As we all know Lalhmachuana and I Inunhlima wore token to Aizawl by holicopter as they had serious injurios. mruly speaking 2RFs wont to various places on duty at summery Covision of lectoral roll to delato forejeners from Blectoral Roll, they moant it to fulril Government policy and as that was the case they ovon had done it peacefully. on the othor hand they were charged that they carriod explosive materials but it was heard that these were plonnod by somoone else. It is sure that thore is some one who instigate Liantluanga to behave like this. It was pointed out during our Monsoon Session that he had tortured Block Vice President Pu H. Tgunkhupa still no action had been taken against him. Zven the hon'ble Chief inister sair in this Rouse that let no one tries to win foreigners votes, but his speech and his action is cuite difforent. To used to use force either in tho preparation of lactoral Poll or in the Eloctoral Roll intensive revision? Thy do our Government use BS and CRP to include Chakmas in the Rlectoral Roll particularly in Chakma villages ? Thy did these innocent students were beated up? T, therefore, would like ti urge the Governent to Pulfill various domands made by ZP in this connection. Thenk you.

PU LALSATA ; Thenk you Ir Dy. Spomer sir, first I rould like to point out that the statement made by the hon'ble Gome Minister was too bias, it is cloar that he made the statenent from inflated roport. Fe stated that in one village 10 houses in another village had bea buant down. According to the report of Lunglej D.C stated by Pu T. Vals sma one house each from these two villages had boen burnt and these too were not occupied. Therefore, it can be said that the statement was ment to exagger te the inciaent. Secondly, though we can not dany the report that an old lady had boen raped.

According to the report there were no
other persons in the village other then about 15 : 2 Ps on that day, so it is clear that these zps were accused and this proves that the ropert is too bias.
Thirdyy, the PPs wore accused and
arrested by DS for beating the Chokmas. Jut in 5 paragraph some of the injured porsons wene carried to Atzawl. The strange thing in this roport is that those who were accused as the beaters got injured. Therefore, it can bu said that there is portiality inthissstatement. I, therofore, would like to suggest to anend this ostatement.

Deganding rovision of 7lectoral
Roll every party is taking seriousily and even Tloction pept+. invited other organisntions. So that we can have good glactoral Poll. Fow those who rasponded this invitation are getting
injurod. I am afraid this will loavo bad precodent in future cvon if the covt. invite other voluntary organisations on good grounds.

In the proparation of alectoral Roll objectors had ben appointed from the parties and in some parts of lizoran those objectors had no guts to object and that is the case the population of Chakmas had beon increasing rapidly. At prosent according to A.". Agerval Neorain is the socond in Thdia in the incroment of population. As the number of Chokmas in Imizorem is rapidly incrossing two objectors had boon apoointod from those constituoncy with the permission of dioction Comission but they were beaten up. If wo 30 on like this, the number of Chaknas will be increasing. There ore, Mr Speaker si, as the statement made by the fon'ble home finister and the hon!blo momber from Aizawl Morth Pu onalsawa are contradicting, I would like to urge ou to form Joint parliamentary bacuiry Comittee to enquire this matter and to reveal the truth to the public. They were also accused for burning down some houses. We, therefore, want to know whether these accusations were right or wrong. Hence, Mr. Speaker Sir, I would like to supnort to form Joint Parliamentary Encuiry Coumission in this regard. Thank you.

PU E.LALZUALA
: Thank you Mr.Speaker Sir for giving me this opportunity. Te can say that there is a change in every ten years since 1945. Then peace accord was signed in 1978 and 179 there was nationalism in the minds of our younger generations and students. Meanwhile it is sad to know about the incident which we are discussing now. In my opinion let the innocent notion of nationalism be advocated. If that is the case, we shall not hate foreigners personally but they should be placed in their right place. Regarding the present situation, I appreciate the steps taken by the Governmegt for taking those seriously injured to Guwahati by helicopter and for other efforts. I feel it is not good to take this situation as a political game. We should rather take steps together. Thank you.

PU F.LALREMSIAMA : Thank you Fr. Speaker Sir, in our current session our main subject is about the foreigners. As Chakma foreigners. As Chakma foreigners are considered as 'thorns \({ }^{1}\) for Mizoram, we submitted a resolution in the last Monsoon Session which had been rejected. The present subject arose because of foreizners. Even the Centre is facing this problem and it came into the notice of Election Comissjon. As pointed out earlier it is dangereous to be an objector both in the preparation and revision of Slectoral Roll. Since Election Cormission allowed to designate objector in constituency way we can take more steps and as a result we could detect many Chakma foreigners. But according to Zlection Rules, those who had been deleted from Electoral Roll gan have a chance to complain. Hence, while we expect to do things smootbly, it seems the Govt. is having two faces as pointed out by the hon'ble member from Aizawl North because most of our Ministers are absent today while we are discussing an important subject. In bad administration it is easy to break out insurgency. Therefore, Mr.Speaker Sir, we need a strong Govt. who dare to say foreigners are foreigner:
foreigner, why did the 357 detain these 26 NPS in their camp for the whole night. Is there atrocity in a peaceful State ? Did the Buddist Association forget about Human Pights ? During our short sessjon what I rould like to know is about the condition of B.Lalnunhlime wh tealth Pinister is about coday to inform the fouse about the condition of Lalnunhlima.

Secondly, the SPs attack
only ono Police officer but \(I\) foel it is not nourh becausc even Gome inistor is responsible in this issue as Police administration is under his portrolio. Since mantenence of Law and Order and Police Administration is vory bad ho must resign. I strongly damend his resjomation as the proper and eminent citizens are not safe in our own State.

Desides these, as pojnted
out by other members I feal it is a must to rom Joint Parlinmontery mouiry to oncuire this mattor.

DR. R.LALTHANGLIANA : . Mr.Speaker Sir, a special Mition concerning this matter which I presented yesterday was rejected as a magisterial enquiry is going on at the moment. However, we have learnt many things from the statements of the hon'ble Home Minister as well as the Mover, As such, the setting up of Joint Parliamentary Comaittee who will carry out a spot verification is greatly needed here.

Further, matter concerning the Tlabung 0/C had been widely discussed in the House. As stated earlier, Pu Ngunkhupa, the Vice President of MNF Block, Tlabung was cruelly assaulted by the O/C named Liantluanga. The said V/C suffered serinus injuries and I have produced a Nedical Cortificate to prove the extent of his injury. In spite of that, the Government has not taken up any actions till date. Morenvor, from the statement of our hon'ble Home Minister, this appears to be a pre-planned incident, which cannot be neglected. Therefore, the need of the hour is to set up a Joint Parliamentary Enquiry to onnduct a spot verification. Thank you.

: \(\quad \operatorname{Mr}\) Spoaker sir, this matter should not bo delayed any further. As a matter of fact, a Gupta Comission was set up to investigate the untoward incident that occured at Aizawl in the month of October. A year hod passed but no concpete actinns had been taken up till today. Today, I would like to pnint out that we, the Legislators are willing to ronder active involvenent in the investigation of this case. Besides innocent pepple and students are simply arrested and it is wrong to naglect and ignore such innocent victims. Abrve all, tho sincere and active involvement of the olected inembers will have for reaching effects.

Further, the last date frr Iinalisation of Electoral Roll is 5 th Docember, 10 days had passed since then and those deleted from the Eloctoral Roll sinculd be departed by now.

PU ZORAMTANGA : Mr Spoaker sir, a detail statement of this incident is not necessary. Thile actinn was supposed to be taken against the said \(O / C\), the situatin went from bad to wrose. The innncent students were beaton up and arrested by the Police. Yet nothing is done for the safety of our students and the penple. The Ministerial Enguiry can no longer be trusted to verify and solve this problem. Therefore, a Parliamentary Tnouiry is ontroncly noedod to save the face and roputation of this Ministry and to clarify the confusing statement of nur hon'ble Home Minister. In this connection, I would like to point out that list of names excluded in the Electoral Roll se being collected by the Government we hope that the said List is deleted for gond in the 玉loctoral Roll. At the same time, I recuest that a copy of the said List be provided \(\triangleq 0\) us. Morenver, in determining the Electoral Rolj, the Government should take up steps in accordance with the Rules. So, to take up an enouiry, Mr Speaker sir, we request you to select representatives from each Party and in that way, fur penple will be satisfied. Thank you.

PU C.CHATMGKUNGA : Mr Speaker sirg at the outMINISTER : set I would like to inform the House that the two injured
persons were left in the hends of a Mizo Dnctor on their own choice.

Mr Speaker sir, in general, the way we attack the Chakma is quite meaningless. Infact, the Chakmas are of Mongolian origin, and since India is the birth place of the Buddha, their faith and allegiance ate firmly established in India. As such, way back in 1946, the Cakma's Raja had already opted to rule and settle in India. As a matter of fact, right from the pre-Independence period, the Chakma's Chiefs already prevailed while the Sailo Chiefs were non-existent. Therefre, it is wrong to treat them as complete strangers. On the other hand, we sfould be able \(\bar{t}\) distinguish between the rightful citizens and the foreigners. If not, this could turn intc a comunal issue, Hence, we have to follow a systometic procedure, and do away with violence and disturbances. Fjnally, we should not froget that the Govornment is taking up meaningful steps in this field and we request the opposition Members to give thetr full support.

Truly speaking from 1966 Mizoram was declared as distrubed ared and from that on Indinn Policy wns divide and rule. One of our IGPs instigatod Prihtos to ask soporate District Council and thot idea is still going on. Thnt I am nfraid is that some of us may also be used in this and that we may also be holping in the inclusion of proignors in the Elcctornl Roll. Thile we are discussing nationnl issue why does the Home Minsiter hide away, To provont tho entronce of foriegnors in Mizoram I suggostad to our Chief Minister to crente Mizo Police Out Post in the oostorn Belt. But Contral Govt. said its the responsibility of BSF and at the border of Burmo its Assam Pifle. Sn with the help of BSp and Shonti Bohini mony foreignors ontorod and stoyed in Mizoram. I therefore, would like to urge tho Govt. to trke steps with all its mights, Fegarding the presont incidont I would like to suggest to arrest those who tortured tho MZPs first. Lastly, in order to protect nur land and our socioty from foreignors for our noxt goneration it will bo good if the Govt. moke proper guidelinos so thot even the opposition, MZP and other orgonisations con work togethor but no one should try to take the credit.

rul towneds the hon'ble members for previding monningful suggestions and advices. As far as our poople is concorned, wo are not in danger or foar of assimjlation becouse, the Almighty God, who discovered us will guide and help us to rise above all others. As such, oven non-Mizos will live pencefully in aur lands while we faithfully serve and preserve our lind.

Coming to mattor concorning
the Electornl Roll, we have complete trust on our Government Employees, and there is a Election Commission to
administer the day to day activities. I would like to remind the hon'ble members that the List of names excludnd in the Roll crillected by the Task Porce will not be enlisted agnin, but will be utilise for a gond couse as the Revision poriod comes to on and. I would also like to mnounce that there is nothing to doubt in the actinn of the Govt. Another boint I would like to mention is that matters concorning Entitloment of vehicles and facilitios for the Gurkho Community are under consideretion.

As mentioned by the \(h o n^{\prime} b l e\) member Pu Lalkhann, the deployment and control of the BSF is not on our honds. Infact, we hove made a omplaint for the ir misconduct in the border oreas. Similor is the case with Shenti Bohini.

Further, we also learnt that our people in Tripura stite were grontly nppressed and prevented from celebrating the festive cocassinn of Christmas. Being our own flesh and blood, we assured them that we would do anything to sofeguard their welfare and interests. Accort dingly for maintenance of Lew and Order in the Mestern Belt CRPP and our Police were transforred in the soid aros. Besides as far as detection of foreigner is concerned, mre then 8 thousand had been delcted from the Eloctoral Roll, which is a great acheivement for this Ministry.

Regarding the incident at Khojoysuri, we are rondoring ur best efforts to safeguard and : take care of the victims, provided that the Tlabung O/C L.T. Murns had been pasted elsowhere.

However, Mr Spenker Sir, I
think it is reasonable for you to admit short duration discussion on this subject and it is also rensonnble for the mever to move it. I would like to soy that as this matter is natinnal issue we want to oncuire about it to find out the truth and take nocessery nctions. As pointed out by Some of the hon'bla mombors I feel that we put the blome to Choknas whonever we tolk obout foroigner issue. There are varinus Acts in connection with the foreigners like The Foreigners Act 1946, Farejgners Exemptinn Order 1948, Foreigners Exomption Order 1957, Rogistration of Foreigners Bangladesh Report of Dolice Order 1971, Foreignors Tribunnl Order 1964, The Registration of Foreigners Act 1939, Ragistretion of Foreigners Exemption Order 1967 and Others which are to be studied carefully. Therefore, we, the members of this House heve to consider this matter very carofully for the survival of our nation and if it is necessary for the Govt. to initiate, we sholl do it. Regarding the present incident we feel very sorry and there is nothing to worry in the action taken by the Govt., thet is why we formed a mogisterial enquiry and if we are not satisfied with its finding there is way to do necessary things. In forming this enquiry we did mot hove in mind as a dolay tactic or to dic down the incident as such we cen take necessary actions.

Lastly, I appreciate the active participation and sincere efforts of the nembers and steps will be taken up as found necessary. Thank y y u.

Mizoram (Narket) Regulation (Amendment) Bill, 1995.

PU LALSATTA : Mr Spenker sir, with your permission I beg locve of the House to ensider The Mizoram (Market) Regulatinn (Arendment) Bill, 1995. Thenk you.

SPEAKER : Th we agree ? Then move it.

PU LALSADA : Thank you Mr Speaker Sir, I hope that for the first time in the history of Mizoram Legislative Assembly a private bill i.e. The Mizoran (Market) Regulation (Amendment.) Bill 1995 is being passed unanimously.

The Mizoram (Norket) Regulation Bill had been made in 1954 but thero is no amondment during these 50 rears. There are still only 9 sections and that is why it is time to amend it. Oar market where meat and other vegetables are sold is vory untidy and only bocause of this it is necessary to amend this Bill. Another reason why it is necessary to amond is that there is no uniformity in the measurcment of our virious itoms. I think it will be good to do in kilogran and litre basis as far as passible. Anothor roason is that prices of varicus itoms are fluctunting so it will bo gond for the Govt. to fix the rates and these aro the main foatures of the Amendment Bill which I have moved.

Though I know that there may be many limitrtions as iny resuurces are vory limit. I request all members of this August House to consider and pass The Mizorm (Market) Regulation (Amendment) Bill, 1995.

SPEAKER : PuT.Hranghluta.

PU T.HRAMGHLUTA : Vr Spenker sir, Thave studied this Bill since it was introduced in the House. I think it is not a gend inos to pass this Bill unless altoration is made in somo rospect. The name of the Bill itself, is wrong. It should be Mizo Narket Regulation Bill, 1995.

The wording a A bill to further Amend" has also to bo altored into" A bill further to Arend"

Also, in the Bill, wo find "Bara, Choma and Pawi". This should also be chonged as Lai, Mara and Chokmas".

The suggested penaly to be imonsed is also rather sovere. A fine of Rs. 1000/- and six months imprisonment is rather sevore for the majnrity pople. Thorefore, I suggest that the Bill be referred to the seloct Committee.

SPEAKER : After we have comploted that the discussion of this Bill, Touse will be adjourned.

SPAAKPR : As ngreed by the mover the Bill, "The Nizorom (rarket) Regulation (Amondmont) Bill, 1995"will be hand over to the seloct Committee and the Committoc will also be constituted right away.

As alr ady practised the concornod Minister, that is the Revonue Minister will beome the Chairmen. I will also susgest the mombors. Pu Lalsawta as he was tho mover of the Bill, Pu malremsimm, Dr J.V.Hluna, John Rotlung linna and Pu Hranghluta will bo the nembers of the Soloct Comittee.
