DEPUTY SPEAKER : Many of the plans in the mind of a man, but it is the purpose of the Lord that will be established.

What is desired in a man is loyalty, and a poor man is better than a liar. The fear of the Lord leads to life; and he who has it rests satisfied; he will not be visited by harm.

FU H.THANGKIMA : Mr Speaker Sir, does the Government intend to appoint a Doctor at Chhipphir Hospital immediately ?

FU C.CHAWNGKUNGA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, Dr. Vanlalsiamk is appointed at Chhipphir Hospital.  
MINISTER

Dr R.LALTHANGLIANA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, our sound system is very poor, and this creates problems specially during question hour.

As far as Health Department is concerned, this Ministry fails to make any remarkable achievements. For instance, shortage

of Doctors and the poor facilities in various hospitals of our state had been pointed out every now and then. Is the Ministry aware of this matter? If so, what steps will be taken up for its improvement?

FU LALKHAMA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, recently new Rules were framed in our country for establishment of Medical College. In our State, if an individual or society aspires to set up the said institution, can the Ministry offer assistance for relaxation of the said Rules?

FU C.CHAWNGKUNGA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, matter concerning the building is not included in the question, so, I am not prepared for it.  
MINISTER  
Besides the Hon'ble Member Fu Lalhmingthanga's question has no connection with the hospital of Chhipphir.

FU LALHMINGTHANGA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, it is quite relevant to raise question concerning the names and numbers of the various departments in the civil hospital as well as the numbers of full-fledged departments. If we are not certain of this matter, no steps could be taken up for upgradation of our hospitals. Can clarification be furnished now?

FU C.CHAWNGKUNGA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, a written answer will be provided for the question of our Hon'ble Member.  
MINISTER  
Regarding the Hospital at Zawlnuam, in spite of limited funds at the moment, Rs. 4200 lakhs will be obtained as loan from the World Bank. As such, all the Primary Health Centres will be renovated.

Coming to the question of our Hon'ble Member Fu Zathuama, the Fara Medical is being set up now and we received tremendous help from Dr C.Silvera, and for the Chairman of the Board, the centre appointed our Hon'ble Chief Minister. Besides, with the assistance of the Hon'ble M.P. Dr. C.Silvera, COBALT will be installed soon.

Regarding the question of our Hon'ble Member Dr R.Lalthangliana, considering the limitation of funds, the Health Department has achieved tremendous progress. In fact, the ability to have a separate Directorate building is a great achievement. Regarding the question of our Hon'ble Member Fu Lalkhama, I have no knowledge of such matter, concerning relaxation of Medical College's rules.

FU LALHMINGTHANGA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, matter concerning Cobalt Therapy had been pointed out by the Hon'ble Minister. In this connection, I would like to mention that in order to utilise the said therapy, an expert technician is needed. As such, prior development and upgradation of the Radio Therapy Department by the Government is extremely necessary. If not, the Cobalt Therapy will be of no use. What is the preparation of the Government on matters concerning the training of technician, expert and purchase of the required tools ?

FU LALSAWTA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, in the supplementary demand, large amounts of additional requirement is sanctioned by the various departments, but unfortunately, there is none coming from the Medical Department. While the demand for funds is immensely high, the said department is faced with financial crisis. Can the Hon'ble Minister i/c be responsible ?

Dr R.LALTHANGLIANA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, supplementary questions. Three years had already passed, but the Director is not yet appointed in the Health Services, which clearly reveals the poor administration of this department. I demand an explanation for not making the said appointment till date.

Further, the Hon'ble Minister has assured the House that there would be adequate supply of medicines in the Civil Hospital, Public Health Centres, Sub-Health Centres and various other Dispensaries. However, his assurance has not yet materialised. What is the reason ?

Moreover, the X Ray Machine in the Civil Hospital cannot function most of the time while the same at the Private Clinic functions regularly. What is the reason ? Finally, can the diet of the patients be improved in the said hospital ?

FU K.ROKHAW : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, shortage of specialist in the Saiha Civil Hospital creates immense problems. So, can specialist in medicine and surgery be appointed in the said hospital ?

Another point I would like to mention is that there is only one Doctor in the Tuipang Hospital although there are two posts. Can another Doctor be appointed to fill up the vacant post ?

FU H. THANGKIMA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, it is quite doubtful that in the maintenance of hospitals, Mizoram stands second in the whole of India. On visiting the various places of our state, one can easily realise the poor administration and maintenance of hospitals. In a year, every department has an excess expenditure of more than 100 crores, but no excess expenditure is seen in the Medical Department. As such, the condition of the Isolation Ward is extremely poor and unhygienic without proper toilet and sanitation. Can this be improved immediately?

Finally, can a conveyance be arranged for the staff who are duty in the House for days and nights? Will it be possible to grant a 13 months salary to the said staff?

FU B. LALTHLENGLIANA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, supplementary questions. Firstly, the bed-clothes used in the hospital of Sialsuk are bad and tattered. In spite of my earlier request, no improvement is made so far. Can assurance be given by the Hon'ble Minister to bring immediate improvement?

Secondly, as requested earlier, has the X ray machine been installed in the Civil Hospital?

Thirdly, as done in the Health Multi-Purpose, can the Mess-allowance be included in the salary of the Nurses? Lastly, will immediate steps be taken up to improve the diet of the patients?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : We shall call upon the Hon'ble Minister Fu C. Chawngkunga.

FU C. CHAWNGKUNGA  
MINISTER : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, at the cut set, I would like to remind the House that new bed clothes are being supplied to the hospital of Sialsuk according to necessity.

Regarding the question of our Hon'ble Member Fu Lalhmingthanga, I would like to clarify that Cobalt Therapy is usually given to the states having Medical Colleges. However, in our case, with the sincere assistance of the Hon'ble Health Minister, Dr. C. Silvera, the said Therapy is installed in our state although Medical College is non-existent. Presently, we are looking for experts and training is being conducted.

As far as the diet of the patients is concerned, the Consultative Committee fixed the rate at Rs. 28/- per individual, which brings additional requirements of 75 lakhs. Finally, the points raised by the Hon'ble Members Fu Rokhaw and Fu Thangkima will be taken into consideration.

FU F.MALSAWMA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, the Civil Hospital, Aizawl has only one Incubator, which is not functioning properly. Is the government aware of this fact? Why do the Nurses have night duty after every 19 days? Is there a way of granting 13 months salary to the Nurses as they are on 24 hours duty? Is there any intention of upgrading the Library of the Nurses Training Institute and increasing the stipend of the Trainees? Why a Director is not yet appointed in the Health Department? Next, I would like to know why the Generator at the hospital cannot function till date?

Further, at the T.B.Hospital, Rs. 15/- is charged per head/per day, while it is Rs. 12/- at the Civil Hospital. Is there any intention of reviewing this matter? Is the government aware of the fact that operation is often put off due to shortage of gas? Is there a way of providing more gas cylinders?

At Lunglei, a building worth Rs. 9 lakhs is being constructed. I would like to know the name of the contractor? Is it a fact that students recommended only by the VIP and the Ministers get admission in the Para Medical Institute? Is it true that a written examination serves no purposes in the selection of students? Another question is whether the cost of repair and maintenance of private vehicles is met by the Health Department? Above all, is the Hon'ble Minister aware that the economically weaker section of society can no longer bear the expenses at the Civil Hospital? Lastly, is the Health Department solely depends on the funds of the centrally sponsored scheme? Will the government sanction additional grants for the said Department?

FU LALSAWTA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, supplementary questions.

DEFUTY SPEAKER : Before you raise further question, I would like to make it clear that after answering the question of the Hon'ble Member Fu Lalsawta, we shall proceed to our next programme.

FU LALSANTA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, if Rs. 400 lakhs is sanctioned without any difficulty for purchase of materials in the F.W.D. Why the Hon'ble Minister fails to make any provisions to meet the needs of the people? Does it mean that the Minister is inefficient?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : We shall call upon the Hon'ble Minister in-charge.

FU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, the Hon'ble Member Fu F.Malsewma has raised numerous questions which are quite informative. All his questions along with matter concerning the appointment of Director will be taken into account. Besides, in matter of Radio Therapy, Experts like Medical Physicist is already appointed and various other questions will be duly verified.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Starred question No. 62, Fu B.Lalthlengliana.

FU B.LALTHLENGLIANA: Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, I ask my starred question No. 62. Will the Hon'ble Minister i/c Home Deptt. be pleased to state.

- (a) Whether the Police Truck is utilised by the Police Officers of Mizoram on a rental-basis.
- (b) What is the hire-rate?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : We shall call upon the Hon'ble Minister i/c Fu J.Lalsangzuala.

FU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, the answers of starred question no. 62 are :-  
(a) Yes  
(b) The hire-rate is 25p per Km.

- FU LALSAWTA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, I request the Hon'ble Minister to furnish a detailed copy including the name of the hirer, number of vehicles and the rate of hire.
- FU LALHMINGTHANGA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, Will I be allowed to hire the same vehicle on the same rate ?
- FU B.LALTHLENGLIANA: Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, supplementary question. What is the amount of revenue collected by the government from such services ?
- FU F.LALREMSIAMA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, supplementary question. Matter concerning the hire rate had been questioned and widely discussed in the House. It is extremely ridiculous to follow such a low rate till date. On the basis of which Rules was the rate fixed ? Can copy of the rules be given to the Members ? Can the Trucks of other departments be hired on the same rate ?
- DEFUTY SPEAKER : Let us call upon the Hon'ble Minister Fu J.Lalsangzuala.
- FU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, regarding the question of our Hon'ble Member Fu Lalsawta, a copy will be furnished later. Next, coming to the question of our Hon'ble Member Fu Lalhmingthanga, as the vehicle belongs to the Police Department, it cannot be hired by the outsiders. Regarding the amount of Revenue, a detailed. List will be furnished later, as far as the hire rate is concerned, it is fixed in accordance with the Assam Police Manual, Part III, Rule 363. I would like to remind the House that the Mizoram Police Manual is being framed and verified at the moment, copies of which will be provided to all the Members.
- DEFUTY SPEAKER : Fu John Rotluangliana.



PU F.LALREMSIAMA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, while the higher rate of Transport Department's Truck is Rs. 6/- per Km. why do the hire rate of Police Department's Truck remains as low as 25 per Km. Why did the Hon'ble Finance cum Home Minister did nothing to increase the rate? Is the Government aware that the particular Rule 363 of Assam Police Manual could be amended? If so, when will the same be amended?

PU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, we do not  
MINISTER recommend a piece-meal amendment. Our aim is to chalk out our own Manual.

PU R.TEANGHMINGTHANGA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, did the Assam Police Manual mention the possibility of hiring the Police Department's Truck by its staff at a rate of 25p per Km? If so, kindly inform us of the chapter and the verse. Will the staff of other Department's be permitted to hire their departments' vehicles on a similar rate?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : We shall call upon the Hon'ble Minister.

PU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, as stated  
MINISTER earlier, the Assam Police Manual, Part III, Rule 363 clearly defined the possibility of hiring the Truck at a rate of 25 p per Km, copies of which will be furnished later.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Let us now summon the Hon'ble Member Pu John Rotluangliana.

PU LALSAWTA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, the Hon'ble Finance Minister claimed that piece-meal amendment is not recommended. This is not so,

recently, the piece-meal amendment of the Mizoram Revenue Assessment Act 1956 was undertaken by us. If the same amendment was done in the Police Department, we would have obtained large amount of revenue. It is extremely disgraceful for the Hon'ble Finance Minister to furnish wrong information.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : We shall now call upon the Hon'ble Member Pu John Rotluangliana.

PU JOHN RCTLUANGLIANA : Mr Dy.Speaker Sir, will loan be granted to the fish farmer Co-operative of Kanhmun ?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Let us call upon the Hon'ble Minister i/c Pu C.Vulluaia.

PU C.VULLUAIA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, the NECC MINISTER granted Loan and Subsidy to the fish farmer cooperative of Kanhmun.

PU JOHN ROTLUANGLIANA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, supplementary question. It is learnt that Rs. 6,44,600/- was granted to the fish farmer society of Kanhmun on 5:7:1995. However, the sanctioned loan failed to reach the hands of the said co-operative. Is the Hon'ble Minister aware that the said loan was diverted to a certain person named Pu Z.D.Saikapthianga.

PU C.VULLUAIA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, as far as MINISTER this loan is concerned, Pu Z.D. Saikapthianga was authorised to withdraw the said loan. However, as soon as it was learnt that the loan failed to reach the rightful hands, Pu Saikapthianga and other society's leaders were immediately summoned to the office where Agreement was made to deliver the said loan by 20.1. '96.

However, as Pu Saikapthianga could not make the payment within the appointed time, another Agreement was made on 15.2.'96 where he promised to clear the loan by 29.2.'96 and which he has not done till today. So, our society has not yet received a single rupee.

PU LALSANTA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, the need to grant an additional sanction of Rs. 220,21,000/- to the MIZOFED and the Co-operative Union is highlighted in the Supplementary Demands. I would like to know the amount of embezzlement in the Co-operative Union and the amount of additional sanction for MIZOFED ?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : We shall call upon the Hon'ble Minister i/c.

FU JOHN RCTLUANGLIANA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, it is learnt that Fu Z.D.Saikapthianga is residing at Chaltlang, Aizawl. At the same time, Fu F. Thanglunga is the Secretary of the Fish Farmer Co-operative Society, Kanhmun. As the financial assistance in the form of loan, sanctioned by the co-operation Department has not yet reached the hands of the Fish Farmer Society, who is the loser, the farmer society or the co-operation Deptt.?

Dr.J.V.HLUNA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, I would like to know whether the missing fund is recovered or not.

FU F.LALREMSIAMA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, we have learnt that the loan sanctioned for the Kanhmun Fish Farmer Cooperative Society is misused and diverted. Recently, a similar incident occurred in the Sericulture Department where Rs. 10 lakhs was diverted elsewhere. Under such circumstances, will a criminal case be filed by the Mizoram Government? If not, the Government will not solve any offences.

FU F.MALSAWMA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, firstly, I would like to assure the House that Fu Z.D.Saikapthianga does not reside at Chaltlang. Secondly, in the previous year, the farmers at Serchhip were granted a loan of Rs. 2000/- each for plantation of tapisca, where their products were to be procured by the government at a cost of Rs. 2/- per Kg. However, the said plantation became a complete waste as the government failed to make any procurement. In such cases, will their loans be written-off by the government? How will the sanctioned loan be settled?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Question hour is over. We shall now call upon the Hon'ble Minister i/c.

Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, the Loan sanctioned for the Fish Former Society of Kanmun has failed to reach the

rightful hands. However no criminal case is filed because the responsible person promised to repay the whole amount.

Regarding the point raised by the Hon'ble Members Pu Lalsawta and Dr. J.V. Hluna, this matter is being investigated and the person who withdrew 26 lakhs from the Banks had been suspended from his job.

As far as MIZOFED is concerned, whenever there is prospective source of revenue, the MIZOFED is often entrusted to undertake the task. If things go wrong, all the burdens and problems fall in the hands of the MIZOFED. Presently, the government is rendering sustained efforts to settle all the outstanding debts.

Coming to matter concerning plantation of tapioca, no profit is gained owing to failure of machine. The planters are in great trouble, because in spite of their heavy loss, the Apex Bank demands payment of loans. So, we are likely to seek the assistance of the government.

This Motion was presented to the Speaker on Tuesday after our session was over, and the date for its discussion was fixed by the Hon'ble parliamentary Minister, Speaker and myself, which is approved by the Hon'ble Chief Minister. If it is subjudiced, why no mention was made at that time. This is difficult to accept. (Pu Lalthanhawla, Chief Minister : If the speaker admitted the Motion, I cannot go against his decision and I simply mentioned that if the speaker wishes to discuss the same, I agree to it. But it seems that the speaker is not satisfied).
- DEPUTY SPEAKER : Since this is sub-judicial, it cannot be discussed.
- PU LIANSUAMA MINISTER : It is right to proceed with our Business. Mr Speaker Sir, you have admitted the Adjournment Motion which is against our Rule 62 and thus cannot be discussed.
- PU R. TLANGHMINGTHANGA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, you pointed out that the Motion cannot be discussed. Does it mean that the date of discussion is further delayed ?
- PU C. CHAWNGKUNGA MINISTER : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, if no respect is shown to the Chair (Interruption).
- PU LALSAWTA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, if it is unpleasant to take the Chair, we have Panel of Chairman who could take the chair.
- PU R. TLANGHMINGTHANGA : Mr Dy. Speaker Sir, this is not MISORDERED and does not concern with subsidy.

PU ZCRAMTHANGA

: This concerns our community which is discussed even in the Parliament, so why should we avoid the discussion ?

DEPUTY SPEAKER

: If we cannot take up our other Business, I shall adjourn the House, and our session will resume at 2:00 P.M.

: The Hon'ble Speaker is the highest authority here. Hence, the programme laid down in the House should go on.
