DEPUTY SPEAKER : " Asoft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger the tongue of the wise dispenses knowledge, but the mouths of fools poured out folly. The eyes of the Lord are in every place, keeping watch on the evil and the good" (Proverb 15 : 1-3)

Now, we shall take question and call upon Pu Lalrinchnana.

PU LALRINCHHANA : Mr. Deputy Speaker Sir, will the Hon'ble Minister i/c Transport be pleased to state - whether Bus fare is collected from pupils wearing Uniform ?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Let us call upon Mr.Zakhu Hlychho Minister to answer the question.

PU ZAKHU HLYCHHO MINISTER : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, the answer is that no exemption is made against the pupil wearing uniforms regarding Bus fare. The Government too does ignore whether Private Bus collected Bus Fare from students wearing School uniforms.

DR J.V.HLUNA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, has MST intention to give concession to students in Buses ? A Bus met an accident near by Nisapui Village a few days back what is the reason ? Does the Government take any action in this regard ? Please indicate the number of dead and wounded. How many compensation is issued by the Govt. and also total amount of compensation. Is there any remedial measure ?

- PU LALRINCHAMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, Supplementary Question In other State concession is is given to students in all means of Transport including Air Transport. Is there any concession to the students here in Mizoram ? If not is it possible to make proposal for the same ? The pupils from Primary School are especially important, does the Government could grant free Bus ride ?
- PU ZAKHU HLYCHHO MINISTER : Mr Speaker Sir, MST gives Travel concession but no student made a claim and reasons of Bus accident a few days back is under examination. No report is received till date. And number of Bus accidents dead and wounded is already answer in the answer of unstarred question of Pu Lalsawta and regarding its remedial measures all Drivers including two wheeler Drivers are given training. After this, private Vehicle Drivers are also given the Training Besides these, Road Safety year is declared and pamphlet is issued through News papers. Moreover, State coordination Committee is set up and the Committee listens to any advice from abroad and take necessary action for the same.
- PU LALKHAMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, does the Hon'ble Minister know that an MST Bus always carry a Central School Students from and to Zemabawk ? will you give Bus to the other School children ?
- PU F.MLASAWMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, does the Hon'ble Minister talk to the Town Bus Owners Association regarding carrying of pupils ? Secondly, a Driver of MST, born in 1942 is recorded as 1938 in a file. Does the Hon'ble Minister know the matter ? The current file is moved outside the Department without through the Secretary, does the Minister know the same ?
- PU R.TLANGHMINGTHANGA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, the Hon'ble Minister informs the House that reasons of Bus accident are under investigation. What does not the Government employe an expert or a team of officers to investigate ? Have they found any reason for the accident ?
- PU ZAKHU HLYCHHO MINISTER : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, answers to the Hon'ble Members question - Firstly, Pu R.tlanghmingthangas question - one man Enquiry Commission is set up.

Preliminary Report is submitted and detail report is not yet submitted till date.

Secondly, Pu Lalkhama's question - one MST Bus is detailed for carrying contractors of Chaltlang and Bawngkawn, the Bus is free at day time hence it is detailed for the pupils of Zemabawk Central School. But since the time is so tight, it is now stopped.

Thirdly, Government give ears to the problems faced by the pupils and issue Bus permit but no problem is reported till date.

Fourthly, the Government does not know about Pu Sawma's question and we shall look into the matter.

PU F.LALREMSIAMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, Supplementary question just before I use to hire Transport Truck its concerned Minister use to hire it to carry sand stone at Sairang. What is the reason? Does he pay charge for the same?

PU F,MALSAWMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, 50% of promotion chance is provided for Asst. Transport Officer in the Recruitment Rules before. But now no promotion chance is provided. Will the Hon'ble Minister be pleased to look into the matter? For only matriculation the promotion chance is made.

PU R.TLANGHMINGTHANGA: Mr Speaker Sir, the Minister hire truck from Silchar to Aizawl and Aizawl to Saiha for carrying Road and Cement and paid for Silchar to Aizawl only. Does he paid for Aizawl to Saiha?

PU LALSAWMA : Mr Speaker Sir, Truck and Mail van are used many time. Does the Minister know that only a small amount of hire purchase is only paid when the Assembly Session is at hand.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Now, let us call upon Mr Zakhu Hlychho, Minister.

PU ZAKHU HLYCHHO : Mr Deputy Speaker, Sir, regarding the said promotion when Recruitment Rules is completed, amendment is generally

difficult even for the Government but if there is which we wanted to emend, the rules will be re-examined.

Secondly, MST Vehicles are ready for hire. Even private could hire it. I also hire now and then and paid for it. If I have any left out for the same. I shall repay it as early as possible. Lastly, regarding overtime allowances the Government is now sanctioning HonOrarium, as such proposal is made for them.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Now we shall proceed to the next starred question. I request the Hon'ble Members to raise a relevant supplementary question. Starred question no.102, Dr.R.Lalthangliana.

DR R.LALTHANGLIANA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, will the Hon'ble Minister be pleased to state - Total expenditure already incurred on L.T.Road from 1989 till date.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Lets call upon the Minister incharge.

PU NIRUPAM CHAKMA MINISTER : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, the answer is that Rs. 7,03,27,143/- from 1989 till date.

PU LALHMINGTHANCA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, this Road is one of the eldest road in Mizoram I also asked a question in a Budget Session we had. The Minister gave me an assurance here to look into the matter, due to weakness of culvert and small curves, State Transport Bus could not service and the people met difficulties on this ground. Is there any intention to repair Lunglei to Thenzawl Road ?

DR R.LALTHANGLIANA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, a supplementary question- Firstly, in about 1993 the total expenditure for the year 1989-93 is about Rs 10/- crore. I think that the answer given by the Hon'ble Minister be pleased to clarify his answer ? And the road is shorter and spends a lot of fund for this road and unfit till date. Will the Government repair the road in order to have transport Vehicles ply ?

And I want to know the name of this road whether it is a State Highway ?

Lastly, the reason for this road seem to be that there is no Staff to look after it. i.e. No PWD Sub-Division is stationed there. Is there any intention to set up PWD Sub-Division at Haulawng or Mualthum Village ?

PU B.LALTHLENLIANA : Mr Speaker Sir, what I want to ask are - 1) How can the Hon'ble Minister gives wrong information to the House ?

2) Aizawl to Thenzawl widening road is under construction by contractor especially between Hualngo Melriat Village. The work is very very bad. Its more dangerous during the rainy season. I therefore, request the Hon'ble Minister to make necessary repair. And Melriat to Sialsuk road is specially bad and not fit for vehicles. Is there any intention to maintain the said road ?

3) More than 300 lakhs of rupees is spent under Aibawk PWD Division but no work is found there. In what ways the funds are spent ? Is there any bill drawn without work ?

PU H.ZATHUAMA : Mr Speaker Sir, a supplementary question. I know that black topping is done between Lunglei and Thenzawl road, when shall the work be completed ?

PU H.THANGKIMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, It is unfortunate to know about the construction of State Highway from Haulawng about three years ago. The Highway pass through private land and an agreement was made but the road has not been materialised. After this, contractors work with higher rate but failed again. Now 3 PWD labourers work there. Besides these, the approach road to the Church of Jesus is broken the Church Building is nearly falling down. In this regard, I ask a question and the Minister inform the House that the agreement was already made. But the information is proved to be false. I received a letter about the matter and nothing is known about it by them. Moreover information is given to the House as being issued compensation in that regard but not in reality. Why did the Hon'ble Minister always give the Members false informations to the House ?

Dr J.V.HLUNA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, How many Kilometer is the L-T Road ? what is the expenditure per kilometer ? What amount of money is spent in another Road ?

Rs.400/- lakhs of University fund is received by the Government. How much is given to PWD ? For what purposes the fund is used ? who is responsible for the very bad road of Bawngkawn ? Does PWD could take it over the work ?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Let us call upon the concern Minister.

PU NIRUPAM CHAKMA : Mr Deputy Speaker, Sir, widening and black topping of road is undertaking with culvert. Fifteen culverts, Eight kilometres widening and a number of retaining wall is done. Five kilometres black topping is undertaken. Regarding these work, we inform our officers to finish their work within the dry season.

DR. R. LALTHANGLIANA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, we know that the Ministers have difficulties, but we cannot catched up what he said from this side. Will the Hon'ble Chief Minister be pleased to answer on his behalf.

PU R. TLANCHMINGTHANGA: Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, Republic to Venghnual approach road was damaged more than seven years ago. Approach road to Republic veng Funeral place is too cut off from main roads will the Hon'ble Minister be pleased to take up construction work for these roads during the coming Financial year ?

PU LALKHAMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, it is heard that NEC engineer (experts) said that the PWD Road in Mizoram covers not more than 20000/30000 cubic metres of the total topography of Mizoram. Does the Hon'ble Minister know that the Bill for earth work of road construction by Mizoram PWD is more than 50000/60000 cubic metre per Sq.K.M. To check such work it is said that CPWD code is followed. But no CPWD code is followed in this connection. If so, is it possible to set up a committee in order to examine their work ?

And does the Government know that the widening of Kolosib-Bairabi road is very bad ?

PU NIRUPAM CHAKMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, regarding  
MINISTER figure. I had never furnish incor-  
rect figure into the House.

Secondly, the L.T. road is a State  
Highway. Improvement is made as in other State. Thirdly,  
I was accused of furnishing in correct information to the  
House. But I had never furnish incorrect information from  
the year 1989.

Aizawl-Thenzawl Road widening is  
going on and shall be completed very soon. Regarding Fu  
Zathuama's question, I had already replied that 5 kms is  
left out, the black topping work is going on and will be  
completed by April this year. In regards to compensation,  
I will look into it, And about the University, I think it  
is not relevant here. If he wants to know, let him ask me  
in a separate notice. Regarding Bawngkawn Area I know the  
situation, I will look into it. Regarding Republic Veng Road  
I shall be very glad if the Hon'ble Member give me in writing.

And regarding the question of Hon'ble  
Member Pu Khama about the Constitution of Committee to check  
PWD work in Mizoram I shall look into the matter and, regard-  
ing Bairabi Road, work is in progress very shortly, I think  
by this Financial year we will know the actual progress, I  
have made proposal to have spot visit to see the work.

DR J.V.HLUNA : Regarding Aizawl Road system, does  
the experts of central road Research  
institute being consulted in order  
to repair the roads ? please indi-  
cate its time and its succesfullness ? Besides this, the  
Minister did not answer rate of expenditure per 1 km for the  
construction of metal Truckable Road in other State ?

NIRUPAM CHAKMA : Mr Deputy Speaker, Sir, any other.

PU F, MALSAWMA : Mr Deputy Speaker, Sir, what I want  
to ask is that - 1) Is there any  
intention to construct Bridge over  
R. Tuivawl between Suangpuilawn and  
E'Phaileng Village ? Secondly, will the PWD take up DRDA  
Road between Khawlian and Phuaibuang Village of Phullen  
side ?

PU F. LALREMSIAMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, will the  
Hon'ble Chief Minister also i/c  
PWD be pleased to answer our

questions since the M.O.Ss, answer is not clear enough ? Secondly, the Minister always gives in correct answer in this August House, we may not be respectable but as we are the representative of the people he must give correct answer to this House, regarding DIPR Auditorium, I was given false information by the Minister that the contractor of the Building given up his work. Will the Hon'ble Chief Minister be please to state the true answer ? Thank you.

PU LALRINCHANA : Mr Speaker Sir, what is the design of Chief Minister Bungalow at Mc.Donald Hill ? who is the contractor ? How for does the engineer look after it ?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : We shall call upon the Minister in-charge to give answer.

PU NIRUPAM CHAKMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, there is lot of question, it shall not be relevant with this main question. That is why under Rules 41, 1 insist that Hon'ble Member gives me separate notice. I cannot answer now since they want list of specific answer let them give me separate notice. That's the Rules.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Now we shall proceed to Starred question No. 103 let us call upon Pu F.L.R.Siama.

PU F.LALREMSIAMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, will the Hon'ble Minister i/c Revenue be pleased to state my Starred Question No.103.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Let us call upon Pu P.C.Bawitluanga the concern Minister.

PU P.C.BAWITLUANGA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, answer to the question are as follow -  
(a) Government issued seven LSC within the tea garden Hill at Zarkawt, Aizawl. (b) The names and address of LSC owner of standing Government quarter Area are - 1) Zoramchanga, Boxer, 2) Lalremsanga Archer, 3) Lalrinchana M.L.A. 4) Lalkhawnglinga, ex-MLA  
(c) The Government gave no one any LSC during the last year ?

DR.J.V.HLUNA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, supplementary question. Why did the Government issue LSC to private(Individual) within the area of Government building while Government could not have enough area to build govt. Houses ? Secondly, does the Government know that the area of Government quarter are issued to Pu Liansuama, Pu Rokamlova, Pu Lalthanzawna and Pu S.Rolianthanga.

PU B.LALTHLENGLIANA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, is it true to say that the propose site of Higher and Technical Directorate is to be given to two young widows ?

PU R.TLANGHMINGHANCA: Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, will the Hon'ble Minister be pleased to state why the LSC were given to the said persons ? please inform the reasons ?

PU P.C.BAWITLUANGA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, regarding the question raised by PU J.V.Hluna the Government quarter site may be disposed of by the Government as the Government deems fit as per the Revenue Rules 1957 (Sec.8) It is unauthorised Building and we know nothing about from what fund this quarters were made there. Besides, no House number or no quarter number is inserted. That's why the site of the said quaters are disposed of by the Government as it deems fit.

Secondly, regarding the site of Higher and Technical Directorate, Government knows that the site is too small for them. Besides these it is crushed from different angles, moreover, someone earnestly request this site. of which one is recommended by the Governor that's why the Government thinks that it is reasonable ground to have it allotted to the said persons. But the site is not yet process till date as you know.

Thirdly, regarding the site of the House given to the said 8 persons. Some of them have no House site, some others House site was damaged by natural calamities and some others are given as reward. That's why, the Government considered for them and deems fit for the ground are reasonable enough.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Let us agree to ask the reasons.

PU LALSAWTA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, if so, kindly allow me to ask Supplementary question. Firstly, is it possible to apply the site of Government quarter where no LSC is held ? And is it possible to issue LSC to the applicant ? Secondly, answer to any question, the Minister inform the House incorrect answer regarding HBA loanee. I want to inform the House that Mr, M.N. Omar Director Soil Department has taken HBA twice during the calender year 1995.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Question hour is over.

PU H,THANGKIMA : Mr Speaker Sir, I also asked this question in this Session and I was unanswerd that there is no LSC issued for the same How can the same question has different answer in a Session ?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Question hour is over any Hon'ble Member wanting to raise supplementary question may contact the Minister.

PU B.LALTHILENGLIANA : Mr Speaker Sir, Starred question No. 104 will the Hon'ble Minister i/c Industries Department be pleased to state - How far does the Inquiry of Industries Department has progress in regards to the long absence of an Officer ?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : All the important questions should be noted down by the Minister i/c.

PU F LALREMSIANA : Mr Dy.Speaker Sir, I will raise just one more question and I do not mind if the answer is not furnished.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Question/Answer hour is over.

PU F.LALREMSIANA : Being a representative of the people, I would like to make statements or raise question concerning our community.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Before proceeding to our next Business...(Interruption)

PU F.LALREMSIANA : Mr Dy.Speaker Sir, before the commencement of Zero Hour I would like to raise Point of Order regarding the Finance.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : The Motion of our Hon'ble Member Dr J.V.Niluna should be clarified.

PU F.LALREMSIANA : Mr Dy.Speaker Sir, I have a point of order regarding our Budget.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : We still have the remaining questions concerning such matter. There will be time for it tomorrow.

PU F.LALREMSIANA : Mr Dy.Speaker Sir, regarding the Budget passed by the House and approved by the Governor, I questioned if there would be increment or reduction, but no answer is furnished. What is the reason? How does the Hon'ble Finance Minister see the Members? After all, you occupy the chair to keep up the prestige of this House and to safeguard the interests of the Members. Why is my question not answered?

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Now, let us turn our attention towards the Motion submitted by the Hon'ble Member Dr.J.V.Niluna, and I would like to make brief clarification as this is an important information for all the Members. Besides, the admission

and rejection of the previous Resolution, rejection of the Hon'ble Member Pu H.Thangkima's question and Pu Zoram-thanga's Motion are all highlighted in this Motion. Besides, we have instructed the Assembly Secretariat to verify all the complaints and do the needful. Further, this Motion is meant to settle all the complaints that arises out of the rejected Resolution and question. Nevertheless, as there is certain order from the court, I request Dr.J.V.Mluna to withdraw his Motion.

Dr.J.V.MLUNA ; Mr Dy.Speaker Sir, let me read out my motion (He reads out his motion).

As provided under Rule No.121(1) of Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in Mizoram Legislative Assembly, I submitted a private resolution on 26.2.96 in a prescribed form. My motion was in connection with allegations made against the Hon'ble Chief Minister as receiving kickbacks from some non-Mizo suppliers which was published in some Newspapers. But, in the letter No.MAL.56/94/269 of 9.3.96 of the Under Secretary, Mizoram Legislative Assembly, it was stated that my motion was not admitted on ground of the subject being sub-judice. However, in the Annexure-I & II of the letter submitted to the Hon'ble Speaker by Parliamentary Affairs Minister yesterday i.e. 18.3.96, it was shown that defamatory case filed by the Hon'ble Chief Minister against 'Ajir Batori' Newspaper was admitted only on 15.3.96 by the Calcutta High Court. This indicates that my motion was rejected on ground of the subject being sub-judice before the Court admits the defamatory case. So, today i.e. 19.3.96, I submitted Adjournment Motion not to reject Private Resolution or questions submitted by any member on false grounds and I do request you to admit my motion for discussion. As pointed out by the Hon'ble Dy.Speaker, Pu Thangkima asked question about this subject but that too had been rejected and the reason for it had not been communicated till today. I think this is the first time that the question and a Resolution had been rejected without any proper ground. Therefore, I will be very glad if you could give us time to discuss my motion so that there will be no precedent in this House.

Thank you.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : I have requested you to withdraw. As I had said earlier there will be no such thing in future. The matter had been discussed with the Secretary and even the Hon'ble House Leader had informed the Speaker. So, kindly let me know whether you can withdraw or not.

PU LALHNINGTHANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, the motion submitted by the Hon'ble Member Dr. S.V. Hlunz is very important. truly speaking when you reject his resolution saying the matter is being sub-judice by quoting rules but in your letter issued yesterday it is clear that at that time there was no case in the Court. And it will be difficult to prove bad this letter not been issued. Besides that a letter received by Parliamentary Affairs Minister from the lawyers shows that leave had been permitted only therefore, it is shameful for the House to reject members resolution with no, g<sup>rown</sup>.

This motion is required to be passed in order to keep up the truth. It is proved that we always recieve wrong information in this August House. Some answers given by the Minister always differ now and then. That's why, this motion is needed to be passed by this House in order to safeguard the truth.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : I do hope that Hon'ble Members have good understanding that the motion to be considered admitted or not is sub-judice the court, the Hon'ble Speaker had put up the same for reconsideration. But after the motion is not fit for consideration in this House.

PU H. THANGKIMA : Mr Speaker Sir, it is clear enough why we take up this motion in this August House. I cannot understand what you use. To object our motion if you could not admit your own wrong full deeds.

PU LALSAWTA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, you have power to admit or reject the Hon'ble Members motion. But your request to withdraw the Resolution is not decent.

PU P.C. ZORAMSANGLIANA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, the Hon'ble Members Motion to aims at the Chair which is unconstitutional. By looking into our Rules, Members should not charge the Hon'ble Speaker Ruling.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Keep silence, please. We only request the Hon'ble Members for, its our own concerned and be carefull in the future. ..208/-

PU LALHMINGTHANGA : The Hon'ble Members claim their rights and request you to safeguard our dignity Mr. Speaker Sir, Beyond this House, we are the Members who are the symbol of our state since we are the representatives of different people. Its is not good to reject the motion without any sub-judicial proof. If we are defamed, the people is defamed. Therefore, I earnestly request you to safeguard Member's dignity and not to reject the motion.

PU LIANSUAMA : Mr Speaker Sir, decision is made  
MINISTER by the Speaker in regard to this motion. The Hon'ble Member only argue the decision. That's why, the motion could not be regarded as public importance and they could not argue the Hon'ble Speakers decision.

Dr.J.V.HLUNA : Mr Speaker Sir, Where does it is provided that ?

PU LIANSUAMA : Mr Speaker Sir, you could not  
MINISTER challenge against the Speaker's decision.

PU LALHMINGTHANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, It is a place to be spoken.

PU LIANSUAMA : Mr Speaker Sir, you could not  
MINISTER challenge the Speaker's Decision with the adjournment motion.

PU SAIKAPTHIANGA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, you only  
MINISTER speak your grief against the decision. It could not be public importance.

PU LALHMINGTHANGA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, You said that it was due to sub-judication there can not be more misleading the House than that. It was not sub-judice on 9th day.

PU LIANSUANA  
MINISTER : Mr Speaker Sir, It is clear that the reason of your move of the Adjournment Motion is that you challenge the Hon'ble Speaker's Decision. It is clearly provided in the last paragraph.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : It appears that the matter is concerned with the House. I want to request the owner of the motion to withdraw his adjournment motion. Even if he could not do so, the motion shall not be discussed in this House. From this side, it looks as if you move no confidence motion against the Speaker.

DR G.V.HLUNA : Mr Speaker Sir, I could not withdraw the motion. I dont mean to challege Speaker's decision or move no-confidence but I mean that no one should gives false information to the Hon'ble Ministers, Speakers and the secretariat itself. I am very sorry for someone give wrong information to the Speakers Office and the Secretariat.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : If you could not withdraw it, I also could not admit the motion for it is equal to the no-confidence motion against the Chair, Now, its 11:30

PU LALHMINGTHANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, you put up this paper on the Table of the House. But no signature is inserted. If so, the paper has no legal validity. In the paper, a fax copy of parliamentary Affairs Minister or a Lawyer of our Hon'ble Minister is included. Looking into the letter Head, it's the same person. But the signature has a great difference. This proved that the letter is too doubtfull. And the letter shows no sign from High Court nor Judicial hand out. It is only a lawyer hand out. But you accept it and lead the House in accordance with it. You therefore, could not admit the adjournment motion of the Hon'ble Member Mr. Zoramthanga which the people want to know about.

Therefore, I want to suggest that such doubtful information may not be accepted in future. I also want to point out that the House may keep and safe guard it dignity, but doubtfull information should not be accepted.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : A letter from High Court comes here as we desire which Hon'ble Members speak informative speeches.

PU LALSANTA : Mr Speaker Sir, let me speak a little within Zero hour. I want to speak about the matter why you had intended to reject the motion, yesterday, In fact, Mr Jain's letter which you laid on the table of the House is not fit for the House. Any Lawyer may produce such letter. But you simply lay its copy on the table of the House, for you accepted as document of the House. The letter informs you that the motion was sub-judiced. In admitting such a motion the House loses, its dignity. If the House acts like this we shall lose the importance of democratic institution and the dignity of the House. Its very shameful. That's why, I urged and request you not to admit such document any more in this House.

PU P.C.BAWITLUANGA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, I want to clarify about the said letter. It is fit for House document. The letter is not accepted in its own. But it is produced by the Hon'ble Member of the House. He himself is Parliamentary Affairs Minister. The Minister accepted it. He produced it to the Hon'ble Speaker for House Document and laid on the table of the House. If you produce the same letter it shall be accepted. That's why, it is acceptable and fit for House Document. Not only that but his hearing is also Admittable for the House. Therefore, Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, your Chairmanship is trustworthy and is keeping up the dignity of the House. The letter is also valid and acceptable to the House.

PU F, MALSAWMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, the Hon'ble Minister should submit documents that are worth consideration. Such kind of meaningless things will only make him lose his dignity.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Before we call upon the concerned Minister let me kindly clarify why the letter is admitted by the House. We have no right not to accept the letter of Advocate. Government too accepted it. Besides, we trusted the Hon'ble Minister i/c Parliamentary Affairs it was High Court too admitted to be trustworthy the case as it was moved to the High Court, and even injunction order was issued by the Assistant Registrar. Now, let us call upon Mr J. Balsangzuala Minister.

PU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Deputy Speaker, sir, the letter  
MINISTER received on 14th & 15th come to me  
as I am the Parliamentary Affairs  
Minister in-charge. I submitted  
to you as it deems fit best for the moment. Besides this, I  
also received a letter from Calcutta High Court. The letter  
is thus submitted to you. Thank you.

PU ZORAMTHANGA : Mr Speaker Sir, when the day for  
discussion of Adjournment motion  
was fixed on Thursday, the Hon'ble  
Chief Minister hinted his agreement  
to the proposed date even if it is fixed for Monday or Tuesday.  
We discussed and fixed the day on Monday with the Hon'ble Speaker  
and Deputy Speaker. The Motion is not included in our business  
and the Speaker too declare it from the Chair.

What I want to speak is that Chief  
Minister is Leader of the Government. If the Motion is sub-  
judiced he should speak about it the moment we discuss the date.  
But he says nothing about it. Why he did not he speaks out which  
we were discussing it if it was sub-judice, we suddenly come to  
know the matter. We all regarded that it is not sub-judiced.  
If I were the Chief Minister and commit the same I will resign  
at once.

Besides this, the signatures contain-  
ed in it are different. It seems that it's not one-hand out.  
We know that one can never sign without any difference. But this  
signature is different. The first one is like 'Sanjay Jain'  
but the letter seems to be 'Sanjai'. It appears that the Hon'ble  
Chief Minister committed to doing thing unbecoming of Chief  
Minister I regarded the Hon'ble Chief Minister over-rieling the  
House. It is very very shameful.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : We have two Minutes more.

PU LIANSUAMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, I will  
MINISTER spend not more than two minutes.  
I wonder how can you admit the  
motion in the begining. Rules  
62(2) of our Rules of Procedure provides that the motion must  
be restricted to a specific matter of recent occurrence. 'Recent'  
means before apperance in the News Paper as provided in the  
Parliamentary practice.

We too have always been rejected  
earlier. It seems that you are too liberal which shows that  
you maintain justice in your ruling.

Secondly, it is not always taken  
up even if it was admitted in Parliamentary Practice. Injunction  
order is never issued easily that is Court's Procedure. That's  
why, the Member had not to speak about its time and admission.

Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, the Rules too bind you. We all know if Court takes up the case we have not to speak. Other's will say that although it may be unanimous desire of the House to discuss, the matter is subjudice, the Speaker is bound to forbid it. That's why, you are praiseworthy in this regard.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Now, Zero hour is over. As the Hon'ble Minister i/c Parliamentary Affairs stated about the letter he received from High Court. It is furnished here. As he said the case is registered. It is admitted and moved an injunction order is also issued from Assistant Registrar. The latter satisfied information we seek. It cannot be admitted since it's against the practice of Parliament as well as our Rules of Procedure Now, we shall call upon Hon'ble House Leader if he has to speak about it.

PU LAL MANHAWLA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, regarding CHIEF MINISTER the Hon'ble Minister rejecting this Adjournment Motion in the beginning, I told him about the approach I made to the Court during my last visit to New Delhi I also give the Speaker the Admittance card of the case. But he does not admit as it is not satisfying itself. I therefore, regarded I should question if the Hon'ble Speaker admitted the Motion. Then, the opposition Leader raised a question about it and I also agree with the Discussion, If the Committee has agreed with it, I also agree to discuss even on Monday for the same.

After that the Hon'ble Minister of Parliamentary Affairs received those letter. I want the Minister to scrutinise the authenticity of the signature too. I want him to inform the result to all Hon'ble Members. It is not good to be in doubtful position for it gives us misgiving. I think that's why, the Hon'ble Speaker has not admitted the Adjournment Motion.

PU ZORANTIANCA : Mr Speaker Sir, It is noticed from the Chair. If he said in time it shall be better.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Now, Zero hour is over.

PU F.LALREMSIAMA : Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, you had admitted the Adjournment Motion you should carry out if the Motion is admitted in the beginning.

I have feared that we would be just like a man and women who use to practise adulteration. For the House to take appropriate action, the letter/document should contain stamp and specific signature.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : This Budget Session is for the people. Although M.P. Election is at hand this Budget Session is summoned. After M.P. Election we have to have full Session for the same. If we do not pass our Budget we may meet difficulties from different angles. As the Hon'ble Minister i/c Parliamentary Affairs has asked we must seek for the best but not for trouble. If all Members seek for the best it shall be the best for all of us. We shall now proceed to our business.

PU C.VULLUAJA : Mr Dy.Speaker Sir, this Adjournment motion which we keep pending is the defender of this Assembly against its defamation. If we have done unlawfully will be charged as contempt of Court. It is very good. All of us should be happy.

PU ZORANTHANGA : Mr Dy.Speaker Sir, we have not had any happiness. We should discuss this Adjournment Motion before proceeding to our business. It is admitted. I cannot accept such different signature. I think it should have been posted at Aizawl.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : The said chapter is closed yesterday.

PU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy.Speaker Sir, with your kind permission I beg to lay on the table of the House Report on the comptroller & Auditor General of India for the year 1994-95, Appropriation Account 1994-95, Finance Account 1994-95 relating to the Government of Mizoram. Thank you.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Now, its copies be distributed to all Members. If its done, we shall call him upon the Minister to introduce his demand.

PU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy.Speaker Sir, I beg to submit the vote of the House various Demands for the regularisation of expenditure of the Government of Mizoram for the year 1987-88, 1988-89, 1989-90, 1990-91, 1991-1992 and 1992-93.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Please take your seats. No one should stand up. We should not disturb the House. It shall be better if I were to stand here. We shall carry on our business. The supplementary Demands should be passed. Can we pass this Demand ? (Members said 'Yes'). (The Demand was put to vote and passed). Now, we shall call upon the Hon'ble Finance Minister to introduce the Mizoram Appropriation Bill, 1996 (1), (2) and (3).

PU J.LALSANGZUALA : Mr Dy.Speaker Sir, I beg to leave of the House -  
MINISTER (a) to introduce  
(i) The Mizoram Appropriation (No.1) Bill, 1996. (ii) The Mizoram Appropriation(No.2) Bill, 1996. (iii) The Mizoram Appropriation (NO.3) Bill, 1996. (b) to move that the Bills be taken into consideration. (c) to move that the Bills be passed.
