PRESENTATION OF VOTE ON ACCOUNTS

10. Pu J. Lalsangzuala to present to the House the second Vote on Accounts for 1996 - 1997.

Speaker :- Those who trust in the Lord are like Mount Zion, which cannot be moved, but abides forever.

As the mountains are round about Jerusalem, so the Lord is round about his people, from this time forth and for evermore.

Psalm 125 : 1 - 2

Now, let us call upon the Hon'ble C.M. Pu Lal Thanhawla to make references on the demise of Shri Neelam Sanjeeva Reddy, former President of India and Shri Hiteshwar Saikia, former Governor of Mizoram.

Pu Lal Thanhawla :- Mr Speaker Sir, today it is most unfortunate that references

have to be made on the demise of the two great and prominent Leaders of our country.

Shri Neelam Sanjeeva Reddy passed away at 7 P.M. on 1st June, 1996 at Wockhardt hospital, Bangalore at the age of 83. He was the son of Shri Chinappa Reddy and was born on 19th May, 1913 at Illuru, Anandpur District, Andhra Pradesh. He attended Theosophical High School, Madras, but gave up schooling to participate in the freedom struggle of India and was failed a number of times.

Shri Neelam Sanjeeva Reddy was elected as President of India on July, 1977, and he held this office till 1982.

He was the first uncontested President to be elected.

He made his mark in the field of politics in 1946 when he was elected as Member of Madras Assembly. In 1947, he was a Member in the Constituent Assembly, and in 1949 - 51, he was a Cabinet Minister of Madras State.

In 1951, he was elected as President of Andra Pradesh Congress Committee, and in 1953, he was the Deputy Chief Minister and Leader of Congress Legislature Party. In 1962, he was the Chief Minister of Andra Pradesh. In 1964 - 1966, he was re-elected as the Leader of Congress Legislature Party and he was sworn in as the Union Cabinet Minister, from 1966 - 67, he was a Minister of Transport, Aviation, Tourism and Shipping. In 1967, he was elected as Member and Speaker of Lok Sabha and remained in the Speaker's Office for 2 years. In the year 1977, he was elected as Member of the Lok Sabha from the Nandyal Constituency and was re-elected as Speaker of the Lok Sabha. Four months later, he resigned as nomination file had to be made for election of President. Eventernally on July 1977, he was elected as the President of India.

Shri Neelam Sanjeeva Reddy is survived by his wife, 3 daughters and one son. In his last hour, all his family members were by his side. As stated earlier, he passed away at 7 : 00 P.M on 1st June, at Bangalore. He was a great and considerate leader, who had deep eonsideration for the under previledged section of society. His death is a heavy loss for India.

Mr. Speaker Sir, Shri Hiteswar Saikia, the Chief Minister of Assam passed away on 22nd April at New Delhi at the age of 60.

Shri Saikia was born on 3rd October, 1934 at Bogaghag Tea Estate, Sibsagar District, Assam. In the field of Education, he attended Nazir Higher Secondary School and graduated from Cotton College, Guwahati and St. Edmund's College, Shillong. He obtained M.A. Degree from Lucknow University.

Shri Saikia was one of the pioneers in the establishment of

Gurgeon College and was a Vice Principal in 1960.

In the year 1961, he was elected as Vice Chairman of Nazir Town committee and retained this status till 1967. Besides, he was also a Secretary in the Bortola M.E. School and President of the Nazira and Dendugar M.E. School. Later, he was appointed as President of Nazira Town Committee.

From 1960, he started getting involved in active Politics and joined the Socialist Party, but later joined the Congress party. In the election of 1972, he was elected as Member of the Assam Legislative Assembly and he had been a Minister of State for Home, Information and Public Relations, Health etc. In the year 1980, he was a home Minister in the Cabinet of Syed Amuara Taimur and resumed this status in 1982 in the Cabinet of Keshab Gogoi. During his tenure as a chief minister in 1985, the Assam Accord was signed after which he resigned from the post of Chief Minister as Congress lost the election.

Shri Hiteshwar Saikia suffered various illnesses but his ailments did not bar him from exercising his public duties and responsibilities. When the M.P. Election was just in the corner, he suffered and succumbed to a serious illness on 22nd April. Incidentally, he was the last Lieutenant Governor of Mizoram in 1986 and the first Governor of Mizoram State. In 1989, he was elected as President of Assam Congress Committee and retained this status till his death.

Shri Hiteshwar Saikia was a man of strong determination, whose main ambition was to upgrade the economically weaker Sections of society. He was cordial and thrustworthy, undoubtedly, he was a renown and outstanding figure in the North Eastern regions of India. In his demise, India lost a great leader. Today, it is a privilege to be able to have a condolence meeting for the two departed leaders in the House. Thank you.

Dr. J. V. Hluna :- Mr Speaker Sir, Shri Sanjeeva Reddy visited Aizawl in 1978 when Mizoram was under the President's Rule. At that time, the UPSC issued a new order recommending the adoption of only major languages of the 8th Schedule in all the Civil Services examination. To show their grievances, our students received him by turning their backs to him, which immensely surprised the President. Later, when the students had a talk with him and submit a Memorandum, he assured them of his due assistance in this matter.

After returning to Delhi, he was a Chief Guest on the foundation day of Jawaharlal Nehru University where he delivered a speech in his mother tongue which was not comprehended by many. He, however continued his speech in English stating that our excessive fondness of mother tongue could hamper the National Integration provided that English should not be discarded by the UPSC. Consequently, till today, Mizo and other minorities are able to give the said examination in English. In fact, this is his remarkable achievement for the Mizo Community.

As stated by the Hon'ble House Leader, Shri Hiteswar Saikia was a man of poor health. He was the last Lt. Governor and the first Governor of Mizoram. During the President's Rule, he took up the entire administration of our state. Owing to his illness, he went to Buffalo, U.S.A for medical treatment. During his stay there, the Hon'ble Prime Minister and Home Minister requested him to resign from his present status and to rejoin active politics only after he gets well. Complying to their request, he filed nomination for the two vacant seats of Rajya Sabha as soon as he returned to Assam, and he was declared elected. However, as demanded by the AGP, Vote was recounted to which Shri Saikia was declared a loser. He filed a case and duly won the case. Later, at the request of his party, he was made Leader of the Assam Congress and then became the Chief Minister of Assam for a second time.

Above all, Shri Saikia was a leader who bravely followed Democratic values and Principles. A remarkable incident that still remains in the history of Mizoram is that during his time, the then Ministry was at

stake and there was internal troubles to change the Ministry. Even in such crisis, Shri Saikia rendered sustain efforts to keep up democracy where President's Rule was declared. In his own Statements, he made it clear that he was against formation of Ministry by defectors. He was extremely cautious as far as formation of Ministry is concerned. In fact, Shri Saikia was one of the most prominent figures among the politicians of India and there is a great demand for his Biography at various Libraries.

Pu P.C. Zoram Sangliana :- Mr Speaker Sir, as mentioned earlier, Minister Shri Sanjeeva Reddy had left behind

a lasting impression not only in Mizoram, but in the whole of India. He visited Mizoram during the time when a Bill called 'Anti Conversion' was introduced by the Janata's MP Shri O.P. Tiagy, which was strongly opposed by the students, political parties and various Christian denominations. In such a situation, Shri Sanjeeva Reddy took up effective steps and rendered his energy and power to protect the rights and interests of the Minorities, which was a remarkable achievement that will be remembered in the year to come.

As we have heard earlier, Shri Hiteshwar Saikia was a great politician, who had deep concern for progress and development of his people. I had personally met him several times during my tenure as Chairman/President of the North Eastern youth Congress co-ordination Committee, and each time, he offered valuable advices for settling the problems of Youth and insurgency in the North East. As such, he was honoured and respected by the youths. further, when he was the Governor of Mizoram, he took up several steps to upgrade our State. His death is a tremendous loss for the entire nation.

Speaker :- Let us all stand-wise and observe a minute silence for our two great departed leaders. (A minute silence was observed)

We shall now move on to our next Business, starred question No - 1 Dr. R. Lalthangliana, Pu Lalsawta, Pu F. Lalremsiama and Pu F. Malsawma.

Dr. R. Lalthangliana :- Mr. Speaker Sir, Starred question No - I

(a) On the basis of Notification No. A. 12017/2/91 - P & R (GSW) dt. 20.5.96, why did the Mizoram Government snatch away the authority from the MPSC to make appointments ?

(b) Whether the concerned Minister and the State Government : have any complaints on the performance of the MPSC ?

(c) Whether the MPSC is offered any assistance in the task of appontting Civil Service's Personnel ?

Speaker :- Pu Liansuama, Minister.

Pu Liansuama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, the MPSC was constituted on Minister 19th May, 1989. Right from the initial stage, the

functions of the said Commission was clearly defined in accordance with the Indian Constitution Article 320. There is no such deprivation of power, we merely amended the limitation of the functions.

Coming to question (b), the concerned Minister or the State Government have no complaint on the performance of the MPSC.

Regarding Question (c), we do offer assistance in the said task.

Pu F. Malsawma :- Mr. Speaker Sir, is it always necessary to offer assistance to the MPSC while their responsibility is only 8% in terms of percentage. If so, what is the reason ?

In matter of regulation, the Cabinet held informal meeting on 17.5.96. The Memorandum was signed by the Cabinet's Secretary on 20th May, but Surprisingly, the same appeared on Gazette on 20th May. As far as MPSC is concerned, in the Annual Report 1994 - 95, it is written on Page 3 that forty Candidates recommended by the Commission for appointment had not been given appointment and the Commission had not received any information regarding non-acceptance of their recommendation. Regarding financial problems on Page 4, we see statements such as; 'It is regretted that suggestions made to the Government : to this effect have fallen on deaf ears; In Article 323, clause 2, it is written that if the same is not accepted, Explanatory notes should be furnished. I would like to know whether the same is furnished or not. Being a statutory body, matter concerning MPSC is extremely important. Though the Regulation is to be laid down within 14 days, our sitting is Scheduled for only 2 days. So, Mr Speaker Sir, the Government has certain points to clarify.

Pu Lalsawta :- Mr. Speaker Sir, Supplementary Question. The statements of our Hon'ble Minister could mislead the House. As stated by Article 320, all the Civil Service's posts and Civil posts should be in the hands of the MPSC. However, as a rule, the Government, could impose certain limitations if so desired. Accordingly, posts with monthly salary of below Rs. 2900/- and recently, the same is done with the Non Gazetted Officers. As such, the MPSC is deprived of its duty and constitutional function,, which is denied by the Government. Can clarification be furnished on this point ?

Pu Liansuama :- Mr Speaker Sir, as far as the Indian Constitution Article 320 is concerned, the statement of the Hon'ble Member from Aizawl South II is quite true.

However, the Government is of the opinion that only Gazetted post would be taken up by the MPSC as it is a Constitutional body, provided that such responsibility is more agreeable with its dignity and status. Hence amending of Rules does not mean that the MPSC is deprived of its rights. Further, there are at times when we have to lend a helping hand to the MPSC

particularly when the non-Gazetted posts are in their hands. In matters of fund, the MPSC is under the control of the Finance Department. Besides, the responsibility of the said Commission will be more heavier when matter concerning promotion of Gazetted officers is in their hands. Next, matter concerning laying of Report is highlighted in our Programmes and the concern department is instructed to promptly pursue the task of publication in the Gazette.

Dr. J.V. Hluna :- Mr Speaker Sir, why direct appointment of MCS is made by the D.P.C. on 11th MAY 1989 after the formation of MPSC ?

Pu F. Lalremsiama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, at the out set, I would like to point out that during my tenure as Member of the MPSC, we neither set the questions nor corrected the answer - papers. Besides, as far as the task of the MPSC is concerned, the Chairman himself admitted that their task is not too heavy and no assistance is needed. At the same time, I would like to remind the Hon'ble concerned Minister that there is certain criticisms on the performances of the commission, particularly on matter concerning promotion of Gazetted officers in various Departments.

Regarding limitation of functions, in the month of January 1993, the function of the MPSC to appoint High Schools' Teachers was taken over by the government, and the same was restored on July 1994. In spite of that, in the appointment of 10+2 Teachers, why do we fail to have complete trust on the MPSC, which is a prestigious constitutional body ? Another question I would like to raise is why the Hon'ble C.M. is always away whenever crucial decision concerning the welfare of our State is to be made ?

Pu Lalsawta :- Mr. Speaker Sir, if the Ministry is able to take up the functions of the MPSC, why do we bother to set up the MPSC with a huge expenditure.

Pu F. Malsawma :- Mr. Speaker Sir, if the Hon'ble Minister is not satis-

fied with the achievement of the MPSC, he should be courageous enough to admit the same as the House is the one to take action. Moreover, regarding appointment of Teachers, do we have more trust on the department than the MPSC ?

Speaker :- The Hon'ble Minister has answered all your questions. However, if there are more supplementary questions, the Hon'ble Minister will furnish clarifications.

Pu Liansuama, Minister :- Mr. Speaker sir, regarding the question of our Hon'ble Member from Aizawl 'W' II,

appointment of MCS was undertaken by the DPC before the MPSC could functioned. The point raised by the Hon'ble Member from Aizawl 'E' II will be duly verified. Besides, we do realise the necessity of streamlining the ACR and we hope to finalise the same in the near future.

Further, there was a debated issue over the function of the MPSC when there was simultaneous appointment of 10+2 and high Schools' Teachers. However, by assigning the C.S, IAS and the Head of Department for the said appointment, it does not mean that the MPSC is not trusted. We do have full confidence on the MPSC, and we are satisfied with their performances.

Coming to the question of our hon'ble Member from Aizawl E - II, it is quite difficult to present in all the Cabinet meeting. Whenever the Hon'ble C.M is away, he hands over the changes to the Hon'ble Finance Minister. As far as fresh employment is concerned, it is not appropriate for a constitutional body to get involved with a lower posts.

Pu Lalsawta :- Mr. Speaker Sir, what is the use of setting up the MPSC if the same task could be undertaken by the Government ?

Pu Liansuama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, only Gazetted posts will be undertaken by a Constitutional Body, such status deserves huge expenditure.
Minister

Pu F. Malsawma :- Mr. Speaker Sir, I ask my starred question No - 2,

(a) Is the Government aware that the economic conditions of Government employees enjoying the same Pay Scale differ considerably depending on their Department ?

(b) If so, what action is taken up by the Government ?

Pu Lal Thanhawla :- Mr. Speaker Sir, the Government is not officially aware of such matter.
Chief Minister

However, report on properties/assets is verified by the government

Pu F. Malsawma :- Mr. Speaker Sir, earlier our hon'ble House Leader has pointed out that about 14 persons have cases on Property - return. Have the cases been settled ? Does the Government simply accept whatever is written or returned ? Can a List of Property - returned be shown to the Members although this is confidential ?

Pu Lal Thanhawla :- Mr Speaker Sir, though the List is Confidential we will find a way of showing the same to the
Chief Minister

Members. The case on Property-return is still going on. The returned properties or assets are not merely accepted by the government. Doubtful cases are duly verified.

Pu F. Lalremsiama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, the Vigilance Department appears to be ineffective in probing and solving corruption, which is the main problem of our State as well as the whole of India. Is there a way of strengthening the said department? If not, the Ministry will face humiliation in future.

Pu Lal Thanhawla :- Mr. Speaker Sir, I strongly support the statement
Chief Minister of our Hon'ble Member .

Speaker :- Question no - 3, Pu F. Lalremsiama.

Pu F. Lalremsiama :- Mr Speaker Sir, I ask my starred question
No - 3.

Will the Hon'ble Minister i/c Vigilance Department be pleased to state -

Number of B.D.O. facing Vigilance Enquiry .

Speaker :- Pu Lal Thanhawla, the Hon'ble House Leader.

Pu Lal Thanhawla :- Mr. Speaker Sir, presently there are 3 B.D.O.
Chief Minister facing such enquiry. The first case is possession

of assets disproportionate to their income, second is mis-used of government's funds and the third is to do with compensation. All the cases are under verification.

Pu F. Malsawma :- Mr. Speaker Sir, I would like to know whether there are any newly appointed B.D.O., who are facing corruption charges for the fault of others.

Besides, prior to distributing the Block-fund on March, 1995, a certain B.D.O. suggested ways of diverting the fund for personal benefits to the villages representatives. Apart from that 10% is cut from the said fund for the BDC's fund. Will the ministry have the courage to detect the responsible B.D.O. ?

Pu Zoramthanga :- Mr. Speaker Sir, Supplementary question. Apart from taking vigilant enquiry on the B.D.O and other government's servants, does the government intend to carry out a similar enquiry on the leaders of this Ministry whose assets are not proportionate to their income ? Can the services of Lok Adalat be availed for detection and removal of corruption ?

Pu Lal Thanhawla :- Mr. Speaker Sir, I do support the points raised by the Hon'ble House Leader. It is our desire to actively pursue what we consider is best.

Coming to the questions of our hon'ble Member Pu F. Malsawma, it is possible that certain B.D.O could be charged for the fault of others. However, being the Head of Department, they have to take the responsibility and verification will be undertaken in accordance with the Law. Finally, I hereby instruct the concerned Minister to find out the B.D.O. who made a careless and wrongful suggestions.

Pu R. Tlanghmingthanga :- Mr. Speaker Sir, apart from the B.D.O, are there any other government's employees facing a vigilant enquiry and against whom action is taken ? During 1991 - 92, there were 83 B.D.O. and officers who were charged with misused of government's funds, does the charges affect their promotions ?

Pu Lalrinchhana :- Mr. Speaker Sir, in the utilisation of fund under the B.D.O how many percentage is cut by the B.D.O. for enrolment of Muster Roll ? Is the said fund submitted to the government's revenue ? For how long does the fund remain in the custody of the B.D.O ?

Pu F. Lalremsiama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, as far as Property-return is concerned, can the properties/assets of all the Members, Ministers and the House Leader be verified from now on ?

Pu Lalsawta :- Mr. Speaker Sir, kindly give us information on the location of the Vigilance Department.

Pu Liansuama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, at the out set, I would like to remind that Hon'ble Member from Aizawl North II that the government is fully prepared to detect such B.D.O.

However, we should not forget that the task of the B.D.O is quite heavy and various developmental funds may be in their hands, but on several occasions they have to entertain and look after the visiting VIP's which involves huge expenditure. So, it is necessary to arrange additional fund for such purposes.

Next, emphasizing on the question of our Hon'ble Member from Ratu, owing to limitation of Stationaries, certain amount of fund is cut by the B.D.O in order to make up for the said limitations. In doing that, certain B.D.O. might have gone too far, but we should understand their difficult position. As far as custody of fund is concerned, the cash is not drawn as soon as the sanction is made. Lastly, the Vigilance office is situated at Republic locality. The names of the 3 B.D.O's mentioned earlier will not be furnished as it is not insisted by the Members.

Pu R. Tlanghmingthanga :- Mr. Speaker Sir, I would like to know whether the said case of the B.D.O is settled and whether the case bar their promotion ?

Pu Lal Thanhawla :- Mr. Speaker Sir, number of such cases had been detected and solved by the government, while some were acquitted by the court and thus did not bar the promotion.
Chief Minister
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Pu Lalkhama :- Mr Speaker Sir, I would like to know whether the suggestion on Property-return involving the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Ministers and the Members is accepted by the government.

Pu Lal Thanhawla :- Mr. Speaker Sir, I personally accept the suggestion, and I presume our State is able to do the same.

Pu P.C. Bawitluanga :-

Mr. Speaker Sir, the answers of questions raised by the Hon'ble Member from Vanva area as follows ;

Rs. 6000/- each was given to 21233 families, the total is Rs. 12,75,98000/ Presently, 13543 applications are being reviewed and payment will be made as soon as possible.

Pu H. Thangkima :-

Mr. Speaker Sir, the insurgency started way back in 1966 and the compensation was sanctioned to the Mizoram Government, a

long time ago. Yet, the Ministry is unable to make the payment till date. This is unfair to the people which had witnessed immense sufferings during the insurgency. Hence, the Ministry should give us an assurance as to when compensation will be granted.

Pu F. Malsawma :-

Mr Speaker Sir, regarding compensation, the judgement of the Ministry is quite biased. Some are benefitted while others gain little or nothing. Can this be re-examined ?

Secondly, according to the terms of the Peace Accord, signed between the MNF and the centre, damage of properties should also be included in the compensation. But this is not so in the present situation. Can the Hon'ble Minister assure the House that damage of property will be included in the compensation ?

Pu R. Tlanghmingthanga :-

Mr. Speaker Sir, supplementary questions. If the Hon'ble Minister had already learnt the number of families who are yet to receive the compensation, what is the use of making verification ? Besides, apart from the remaining families, fresh applications for compensations keep com-

ing in . Will the present sanction be sufficient for all ? If not, what steps will be taken up by the Ministry ?

Dr. J.V. Hluna :- Mr. Speaker Sir, as per the instruction of the government, I carefully choose certain names within my constituency. However, the V/C was again ordered to re-check all the names, which mean I am not trusted for the task. This is quite disheartening.

Speaker :- Pu P.C. Bawitluanga, Minister of Revenue.

Pu P.C. Bawitluanga :- Mr. Speaker Sir, as far as re-checking is concerned, the V/C have better knowledge of the Communities. Hence their opinion is often sought. This does not mean the MLA's are not trusted, and this time, instead of the V/C, the MLA's are entrusted for the said task, while the B.D.O. are instructed to carry out spot verifications. However, this procedure fails to produce fruitful results. Hence, re-Checking is necessary. After its finalisation, the remaining families that are yet to receive compensation will be known.

Coming to the question of our hon'ble Member from Aizawl 'N' II, the present sanction is solely for uprooted families and if damage of property is included in the Accord, the matter will be duly taken into consideration.

Further, it is difficult to furnish the exact date for disbursement of compensation, because there are many confusions to settle. For instance, the names that appeared both in the 1987 and 1995 list are grouped under the Common List. At the same time, certain names are omitted by mistake. So, checking or re-checking is needed every now and then. Moreover, after the List is assessed by the Revenue Department and the Government of Administration Department issues order for its disbursement, things come

to a standstill owing to non-availability of cash in the Bank. We should understand that our employees have several other urgent works other than this particular task.

Pu F. Malsawma :- Mr Speaker Sir, will the Hon'ble Minister take up steps to settle the grievances of the concerned claimants of compensation from Bawngkawn area ?

Pu R. Tlanghmingthanga :- Mr Speaker Sir, Can payment be made if the 13543 applicants are already verified ? What will the government do if the present sanction is not sufficient ?

Pu P.C. Bawitluanga :- Mr Speaker Sir, the 13543 applicants are being verified now and after its finalisation, the remaining recipients will be known. Depending upon the number of recipients, the sanction could be either sufficient or insufficient. This will be taken care of by the government.

Regarding the points raised by the hon'ble Member from Aizawl N II, the government is not blind towards such matter. A decision is already made by the concerned Committee.

Pu H. Thangkima :- Mr. Speaker Sir, can the hon'ble Minister give an assurance that payment will be made by the year 1996 in order to ease the sentiments of the people ?

Speaker :- We have an Adjournment Motion.

Pu Zakhu Hlycho :- Mr. Speaker Sir, the answers are as
Minister follows ;

- (a) The Government has no such intention.
- (b) The expenditures incurred for purchase of plots at Silchar in 1993 is Rs. 62,18,812/- Along with the plot, 3 buildings were purchased and the total expenditure is Rs. 69,18,812/-
- (c) The Plot A at Konakpur Part I was purchased at a cost of Rs. 30 lakhs per Bigha, while the cost of Plot B at Uttar Krishnapur is Rs. 6 lakhs per Bigha.
- (d) The purchase was not made in accordance with the Land Acquisition Act, 1894. however, as suggested by the Site Selection Committee, formed by the 3 departments such as the Finance, LAD and the PWD, the plot was purchased through the Purchase Advisory Board (SPAB)
- (e) The assessment of the DC Land Acquisition, Cachar is not yet obtained. In spite of our repeated request, no answer is received from the ADC, Silchar till date.
- (f) The Government has such proposals.
- (g) Various steps had been taken up by the Government to reduce or avoid accidents, most prominent ones are as follows :

(7) Breath Analyser was purchased to detect persons consuming alcohol

(8) The public is requested to report such matters concerning drunken driving and mis-behave drivers.

(9) A one-man commission is set up to investigate the cause of accidents.

(h) In order to help the drivers of private Buses, the following steps were taken up by the Government;

(1) Training was organised for the drivers.

(2) The Hon'ble Chief Minister and the Minister of Transport gave speeches on the importance of safety and cautious driving in the A.I.R.

(3) Inviting experts and specialists, Panel Discussion was held at Doordarshan Kendra.

(4) Copies of Appeal made by the Hon'ble Minister of Transport were distributed to all the drivers in each District.

Speaker :- The Mizoram Public Service commission limitation of function Amendment Regulation 1996.

Pu Liansuama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, with your permission, I lay
Minister on the table of the House copies of the MPSC
Limitation of function Amendment Regulation,
1996.

Speaker :- Please distribute the Copies.

Pu Zoramthanga :- Mr. Speaker Sir, the arrangement of our
Business is not satisfactory. We should
follow the Time Table laid out by the BAC.

Speaker :- This will be taken up before others.

Pu Lalsawta :- Mr. Speaker Sir, the Indian Constitution, Article 320, clause 5 specifically stated that the present Resolution is to be discussed, amended or altered after 14 days. As our present Session is only for two days, can arrangement be made to discuss this Resolution tomorrow ?

Pu Liansuama Minister :- Mr. Speaker Sir, we have an executive function similar to subordinate Legislation. The Constitution requirement is only a formality. Hence, discussion of this Resolution could resume in the next Session.

Pu F. Malsawma :- Mr. Speaker Sir, the Constitutional requirement of 14 days is quite significant as Members can have ample time to study and discuss the Resolution. We do not insist that the same should be discussed in the present Session, but arrangement should be made for the next Session.

Pu Lalrinchhana :- Mr. Speaker Sir, regarding formation of Rules & Regulation, will it be more wiser and efficient if we refer the same to the Subordinate Legislation and then publish it in the Gazette ?

Speaker :- Rules framed by the government should be forwarded to the Subordinate Legislation, where the same is reviewed and verified.

Pu Liansuama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, according to our Constitution, the Executive has certain Legislative power. Hence the said copy was laid to enable the house to function as a Legislation.

Pu F. Lahremsiama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, the provisions of the Constitution 320, clauses 3 and 5 should not be ignored. Besides, no one can rise above the executive authority of the government. As such, copy of the Resolution should be laid on the House to be discussed, repealed or modified after 14 days. However, provision is not made to enable the Executive authority to function as they please. As suggested by the Hon'ble Member from Aizawl South II, I request the hon'ble Speaker to make the final decision so that this Resolution could be discussed in our next sitting.

Pu Zoramthanga :- Mr. Speaker Sir, kindly spare the time for Subordinate Legislation.

Pu Saikaphthianga :- Mr. Speaker Sir, as stated by the hon'ble Members, it is quite meaningless to simply distribute the copies. As envisaged by our Constitution, it is necessary to follow a systematic practice on this matter.

Pu Lalkhama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, as the present Session is only for few days, the discussion, amendment or modification of this Regulation should be left for the next Session, for which I seek your permission. If not, we are likely to violate the provisions of the Constitution.

Pu Saikapthianga :- Mr. Speaker Sir, as suggested by the hon'ble Members, the said Regulation should be left aside for the next Session as we have limited time today.

Pu Liansuama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, after our List of Business we can still have time for discussion of the Regulation.

Speaker :- Complying with your suggestion, this Regulation will be left for the next Session. At the same time, I remind you all to closely review and study the same.

We shall now move on to our next Business by inviting the hon'ble Member Pu Lalkhama to lay on the table, the statement of Action taken on the Action Taken Report of P.A.C relating to Sericulture Department, Power & Electricity Department, P.W.D and L.A.D.

Pu Lalkhama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, with your permission, I beg to lay on the table of the House a copy of the Statement of Action Taken on the Action Taken Report of P.A.C relating to Sericulture Department, Power & Electricity Department, P.W.D. and L.A.D. Thank you.

Speaker :- Let the copies be distributed we shall now call upon the hon'ble member Pu F. Malsawma to lay on the table a copy of the statement of Action Taken on the Action Taken Report committee on Estimate Relating to G.A.D.

Pu F. Malsawma :- Mr. Speaker Sir, with your permission, I beg to lay on the table of the House statement of Action Taken of 4th Report of Committee on Estimate pertaining to G.A.D, Mizoram House, Thank you.

Speaker :- Please distribute the copies. We shall now invite the hon'ble Member Pu Lalhuthanga to present to the House the 2nd report of the Committee on Subordinate Legislation.

Pu Lalhuthanga :- Mr. Speaker Sir, with your permission, I, Chairman on Subordinate Legislation, as authorised by the Committee present this 2nd report of this august House. Thank you.

Speaker :- You may distribute the copies. Now, we shall call upon the hon'ble Member Dr. R. Lalthangliana to present to the House the fourth Report of the Committee on Government Assurance.

Dr. R. Lalthangliana :- Mr. Speaker sir, prior to presenting the Report, I would like to point out that the P.A.C, Estimate and other Committees cannot function effectively due to poor respond from the Departments. So, the House should remind them to be more prompt and effective. Next, Mr. Speaker Sir, with your permission, I, Chairman of the Committee of Government Assurance, having been authorised by the Committee, present the fourth Report on Government Assurance. Thank you.

Speaker :- Please distribute the Copies. I would like to remind the hon'ble Ministers to closely observe their Department. The Assurances you gave in the House should be followed by prompt actions.

Pu F. Malsawma :- Mr. Speaker Sir, if the Reports are not approved by the Government, the reasons should be duly furnished by the Government for instance, the Report of the Action Taken by the Estimate Committee was not accepted by the Government and the Committee was directed to review the same. So, there is still room for improvement in this process.

Speaker :- Now, the hon'ble Minister Pu J. Lalsangzuala to make a statement on the rule 60 of the Rules of Procedure regarding recent incident in eastern part of Mizoram.

Pu J. Lalsangzuala :- At the out set, I would like to thank the hon'ble Speaker for giving me an opportunity to make statement on the recent incident in eastern part of Mizoram.

Since, the previous times, a border trade was carried on between Myanmar and Mizoram. But recently, the said trade came to a standstill as the Government learnt that tax was collected from the traders by the Myanmar Underground Militant. In the Border-Trade, Animal -trading was most prevalent. So, our Police were notified to prevent and curb such thing from our state.

On the 8th July, 1996, Pu Nangkhadawng, S/o Pu Damdawnga, Ramhlun 'N' Aizawl was kidnapped at gun-point by the CNA army from his home at Leisen Village. The next day, he was rescued at 11 a.M with a ransom - payment of Rs. 1000/- . As a result of this threstening incident, the Mizoram Arm Police were sent to the border Area on 9th July, 1996. while patrolling, the Armed Police were ambushed on 11th July by an unidentified persons, among whom one was shot dead and 4 others were injured. Besides, one AK 47 Rifle and 3 communication sets were seized from them.

Further on the night of 12th July, 1996, 3 unidentified gunmen threatened the Village of Khuangleng, who screamed and shouted that they feared nothing, not even the Indian Government. Hearing this, Pu Zodina tried to calm them down. As a consequence, the 3 gunmen tried to break in to his house. At this, Pu Zodina's wife sneaked out of the house to seek the assistance of the YMA's President, Pu C. Lalmangaiha. when the said President arrived at the scene, he was instantly shot by the gun-men. Apart from that, they also triggered several shots in the air to frighten the crowd. Pu C. Lalmangaiha was immediately taken to Champhai hospital, but unfortunately, succumbed to his injuries on 13th July. The brutal incident was registered at the Champhai Police Station Case No. 41/97 dt. 12, July 1996. under Section 3/107 Indian Penal Code read with Section 25, Sub-Section 1-B of Section 'A' 27/ Arms Act. Presently, this case is being investigated and number of Armed Police were sent to offer help.

The Mizoram government is in deep shock and anguish at the cruel killing of Pu C. Lalmangaiha, who lost his precious life for the safety of others. His courageous service for the people is highly appreciated. We deeply mourn his death and offer our deep sympathy and condolence to his bereaved family. The Mizoram Government is regretted to see that such an untoward incident occurred in the most peaceful State of India, and hope that the same will not be repeated in future. At the same time, such act of violence against the Rules will not be ignored by the Government. Finally, to have peace and harmony in our State, the Government seeks the support and co-operation of the people. Thank you.

Pu Lalkhama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, our State is situated in a border area, which is quite sensitive. Hence, the need of the hour is for our Ministry to take up some measures for the safety and security of our entire State.

At present, the BSF is posted at the border area. During my tenure as a C.S of Mizoram, a proposal was made to establish a Police out-post in the border area, which was declined by the Home Ministry. In view of the recent incident in our State, I would like to put forward certain suggestions for the security of our State. Firstly, the Ministry should be well informed of the identities of each and everyone. Secondly, the V/C and A.O should be instructed to furnish a quarterly report of new settlers or strangers of their respective areas, and a proper record of such issue should be strictly maintained. If not, there is and will be a great influx of outsiders in our State. Further, the Identity card proposed by the Government is not reliable enough. By maintaining the said Record, many untoward incidents could be prevented. So, I request the ministry to adopt a systematic procedure for the safety and security of our State. Thank you.

Pu F. Lalremsiama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, according to our usual practice, List 8 should be followed by 9. Is there a change in the way you conduct the House ? If so, you should inform us before. If you open an opportunity to make a complementary speeches on the statement of our Hon'ble Minister, I too would like to speak on this subject.

Speaker :- We shall proceed in accordance with our List. The statement of the Hon'ble Home Minister will not be followed by the Discussion. We shall move on to Item No. 9.

Pu Liangsuama :- Mr. Speaker Sir, the point raised by the Hon'ble Minister member Pu F. Lalremsiama is quite correct as far as the procedure of the House is concerned. No questions or discussion are entertained in the Minister's statement. As such, the speeches of the Hon'ble Member from Aizawl 'W' I should not be recorded.

Pu Lalaswta :- Mr. Speaker Sir, there are many points to be expunged from the statement of our Honble Home minister. To furnish ambiguous Report is humiliating for the House.

Speaker :- I fully support the points raised by the Honble Member Pu F. Lahremisama. so, the Speeches of the Honble Member Pu Lalkhama will not be recorded. As far as Item No 9 is concerned, there is nothing to clarify and the copies are already provided to the Members. In accordance with the programme laid out by the B.A.C, today i.e. the 16th is scheduled for Presentation of Vote on Accounts, while the 17th is reserved for discussion and voting of Vote on Accounts. There is an usual procedure for our List of Business, which is likely to occupy the first part of our programme. For this, the approval of the House is required. So, what is the decision of the House?

Pu Zoramthanga :- Mr. Speaker Sir, I presume the House should give its approval. At the meeting of the B.A.C, the Session was arranged for 2 days, i.e. 16th for Presentation and the 17th for Discussion and Voting. the Report of the B.A.C was presented as it was learnt that there was no Government's Bill or Resolution. However, after the final decision, the Government's Resolution, Bulletin Part II concerning the expansion of Assembly's seats suddenly appeared. This necessitated the need to extend the days of our Session, but our Honble Speaker assumed that the said Bulletin would not be included in our programme. It was decided that such official Resolution will be taken up in the next Session if found necessary. In spite of that, the said Resolution was submitted again after fixing the Session for 2 days. This creates a great confusion. the B.A.C should be informed earlier if the Government has any Bills or Resolutions.

Pu J. Lalsangzuala Minister :- Mr. Speaker Sir, I would like to offer certain clarifications. According to our usual practice, the Allocation of Plan-fund is reflected in the Budget Session of March. However, as the central election falls on the 8th May, the Plan-Allocation is left in the hands of the new Government, which was expected to be formed by the month of June. Hence, we sought the approval of the House for the 'Vote on Accounts for 4 months (April - July).

Presently, hoping that a full Budget-Session is a possibility, arrangement was made till 31st July. However, our plan and arrangement failed owing to lack of proper Government in the Centre. As such, a full Budget Session is scheduled for the month of September. Finally, the said official Resolution will be taken up in the present Session. Thank you.

Speaker :- Let us now call upon the Hon'ble Minister Pu J. Lalsangzuala to present the Vote on Account.

Pu J. Lalsangzuala :- Mr. Speaker sir, as you know, I had on the 14th March, 1996 presented to this august House an Interim Budget for 1996 - 97 and sought a "Vote on Account" only for the first four months of the year, April to July, 1996. That was necessary because of the ensuing general election at that time in the country, the Central Government had deferred finalisation of Plan outlay and the Central support for 1996 - 1997. This was very vital for a State like Mizoram whose budget is very heavily dependent on the Central Support.

2. Under the circumstances, I had tentatively assumed the outlay on the State-Plan in 1996-1997 and assistance thereof at the same level as the normal dispensation in the preceding year. Unlike in 1995-1996, no provision could be made for additional schemes like Capital Project, State University etc.

3. I regret to inform the Hon'ble Members that due to unforeseen political developments at the centre, the reconstitution of Planning Commission has got delayed and consequently, the finalisation of the State Plan is likely to take some more time. I am, therefore, not in a position to present the final budget, as promised earlier, and am constrained to seek another "Vote on Account" for two months, August and September, 1996.

I hope the House would appreciate the position and give its approval to the "Vote on Account" proposed by me.

Thank you, Sir.

Speaker :- You may distribute the copies. We shall have the discussion and voting on Account tomorrow. Our sitting for today is over. Our Session will be resumed tomorrow at 10 : 30 A.M.

Meeting Adjourned at 3 : 00 P.M.
