Mr. Speaker Sir, owing to diverse systems
of cultivation, it is quite difficult to have definite target as far as

Mizoram is concemed. In the previous years, it wno quite meaningless to have target while various system of cultivations were adopted. However, as the people are more advanced thesedays even in their method of cultivation, I think we should now have some targets.

Mr Spenier Sir, what is the reclaamation rate per acre ?. And since when Agricultur Deptt. do not have target and they do not maintain achievement record ?. In previous years, I think they use to have target and abevement reports on annual, quarterly and monthly (If Information wing does not heve such informations, it means that the Govt, employed them for no work.

Mir Speaker Sir, according to Govt's fixation rate, it is ks 550/- per acre on an average. However, for the 5464 acres of av Ne have reclaimed, the rate must be around Rs 615/- per acre as there was some additional work like minor irrigations.

As regards Pu Dotinaia's question -
I do not know since when the Agriculture Deptt. do not have targ. or the time when they havetarget. During the years 1974-75, 1975-76 they did not have.

I do not know how far it is true, but according to our record book, about 8465 acres of land were reclaimed before the 5th Five Year Plan with 52700 hectar $3 \mathrm{sim} \mathrm{F}^{*}$ din have yet to be reclaimed.

Besides this, there are many persons who have no house site in Aizawl Town. These are the main reasons why there was proposal for handing oter the area to Kevenue Deptt. Ha there been no difficulty in maintaining and protecting the whole area we would not give away even a sincle portion to Revenue Deptt. (Pu C. Lialrua -ta - Mr Srenker Nir, Of the whole area, we know that some portions cen be and rere being protected. What our membr rants to know is the number of plants planted in the protected area). It is quite difficult to know the exact number of plants planted here. I only know that there are some. (Pu C. Lalruata - Mr Speaker Sir, what is the total are which hes to be given away ?) I do not know the total a of of this forest plantation. The area includes all the places lying below Armed Police Veng upto the banks of Chitelui. Area which we intend, give to Revenue Deptt. is northern side of plantation area below Armed Police Vene Field, prectically Dawrpui Veng area.

PU R.DOTINAIA: Mr Spenker Sir, I am alad that ynu allowed me to move my resolution in the House todny. This is my reselution:
" This assembly is of tho opinion thet the Gcvt. of Mizore". shruld purchase the procuces of cash cres narely Gincor, Haldi etc. at rensonablc prices at difforent Grouping Centros to uplift the conomy of Mizoram within the noxt finncinl yeari.

I think wo all know the importance of this resolution even from its woring alone. If the Government Iaunch large-scale purchese of cash crops at Grouping Centres whore motor road punetrates, the econofic condition of the poople will grontly be liftea up.

In lockine bock to the pest toars while jiozrer wns still undor the Autonowous Iistriot Council, we might remember tret thero mins speody prorress mat olmost all the important Tillages were onnected by Jeep rond. Thore was also means for easy Tisposal of one's nm procucts. Rut, since disturbnces broke out in 1966, the ononcic condition of pizorom hes greatly sunk dom.

On security reason, people cannot settle where they want to settle and they could not have jhums in fertilo arens. Curfew was imposed overynow and then which ereatyy slackens the pace of development besides hamperines tho ceily futine work of the poople. As jhuns and fields can not properly tended to, there was nn gond or h.aper harvest due to which the economic condition of the country greatly suf"ers. Poverty prevails everywhere, bengers and robbers which we have never had before wore to be found. Our belles hove to sell their bodies in ordor to earn a living. To sum un the conditions of Mizoram after disturbances broke put, we may say that there was $n \subset$ freedom of rovement, speech end of living. Barring the Grvt. servents and contractors, $80 \%$ if population in Mizoram were still depending on Asriculture. Owing to the prevailing circurastances, there whs failure if crops everywhere. However, after the formation of U.T in 1972, the economic condition of Mizorn beca, se sliphtly better. Larger amount of moncy was sonctioned by Contral Govt. for the development of the country which preatly oncourages the people to take vigorous steps for the improvement of their econory. Plantation and cultivation of various cash crops were being encouraged. Inst year, cosh crops yielded by the people worepurchased by the Co-operation Deptt. which stirs their mind to grow more cash crops. Actuslly, this was only the beginning. The people do not have to be told the kind of crops theyw would grow or fertile areas where they would grow crops. The main difficulty is marketing for their products. In vier of the quantity of ginger seed distributed to the poople, it is expected thet there will be high ytulding of ginger in afow years. Co-operative Deptt. alone may not be in a position t? purchase all the yieldings as thero ere other high yielding cosh crops besidus singer. As such, Govt. would do well in egtablishing Trade and Comerce Department to purchase and to dispose of these cash crops in wider markets. If not, they might do well in enlarging the esteblistnent of Agriculture Department. If the people are nscurer thet there will bo and market for their products, they dill have more enthusinsm for hard work. Besides opening purchase centros, we might also do well in ollocating Machine Processine Units or Industries, for, the time may come when CO-merative Department could n? lnnger purchase all the cash crops yielded by the poovlc.

We have often heard and talked abcut T.G.S sponsored by the Central Govt. to offer employments to poorer section of the people who have no occupation to eari a livine. It is a fact that many perple could, for the time being, earn a living under this scherne. Hovover, it will hardiy be possible for them to $d$, end solely on the scheme in the long run. As such, they should be encouraged to grow cash crops. Wo should also make them realise that in Mieoram
rice cultivotion can no more be as suceossful s it was:\% the past years. Under the present circurnstances, cultivation of cash crops will bo more recomenaable thon rice cultivation if Govt. could arrange good rarket. Personaliy, I think that priopity should be given to the consalidetion of the economic condition of the people. Only then, other developments will
tine plice.
As I have said beforc, ry resnlution is
really important resolution as it concerns ench and every person living in Mizorm. I therefore request the members to agree to pass it todny.

CHATRMAN:
(PU C.LALRUATA)

Well, the resclution has nor been mover. Is thero any monber who wants to say certain things in regerd to this nesolution?.

PU SANGKHUMA: Mr. Chairmen, I an glac thet there an be an opnortunity to discuss this immotent resnlution torny. It has been since sonetime back that the people want the Govt. to murrhese their cash crops at reasonablc price. It seems that urchase made by Co-operative Deptt. last year reatly encarmged the people to grow mor : cash crops for which I am thankful.

Mizoram, sine all know is fairly rich in natural vegetation. In fact, almost all varicties of crops can be grown here. It seems, however, that no pne can make use of this nature's blessing to enrich Mizoran's connomy, for which the people blame the Govt. while the Govt. on the other hand blames the people. As all sorts of difficulties encircled the poople, everyone tries to put the blame on the other.

Since the sutbreak of disturbances, the economic condition of Mizoray has sunk - very low. Our jhums could no longer yield sufficient food to meet the requirements of the people. At the same time, the people also do not have proper guidelines to improve their economic conditions. Whete our Ministers or other high ranking officers went to villages on tour, they delivered goor lectures on the necessity of heri work for rumbal of poverty. They said thet our poverty is the result of our nwh idloness which to gree extent pight be true. However, I think we shouic not put the mame solely on the people. Actunlly, they do not reman idle and we, the Mizo as nwhole are not idle tribes. The fact is that. we do not kn where to begin or wht particular crop will be grown. As such, it is not the people whor to blame, it is our leaders who fail to give proper juidance to the people in regare to quriculture. If the people aregiven proper instructions as t^ what crops they rill grow, they would willingly do so. It is the respunsibility of the Govt. to suide the people in the ray they want the to gh. Our Ministers when on tour make promises to the peonle non soy that they would urrange employments for them , to tile pople were employed under EGS as daily vago labourer. Snretimes the Ministers gave money to the people for purchase ford corocities. However, if we seriously consider what hod been done by the Ministers plense the ponple, ve may soy that such ensy menns of earning $m_{\text {. }}$ living led the people towards idleness. Instend of looking for permanent occupation the reople who used to work as daily wage labourer are rore inclined towards finding on easy means to earn 0 living where the work is light with Rs 10/- et the end of onch day. Actually, it is the Ministers who drive then towards idloness ne poverty, is they do not have definite policy for the penple to follow. As the labcurers do not regird the works as their own they become more and nore nerligent -and instend of concontrotin on their work, they play with e?ch othew while they yet expect to earn at least Rs 10/-. This way, they loose their dienity and lnose their rorals. Unless the Gove. have definite fildeline for the people, our oconomic enditira will not improve. 10 remomber thet in A.I.C.C. ceeting Fond Minister seic to Wheat growers that the Govt. would purchase wheat produced by them at reasonable rate. Eesides havin祭dolij. the Govt. would do wall in tendine fortile rens where Paddy can be frow. As stated, there are many other crops that can be gro $n$ in Mizoram. Growing and tonding are the roles of the penple while Govt.'s role is to armano gind warket for these products. Actually if the peaple are enccuraged to erov more such crops for their cecupations, it rieht not be necossary to often talk about E.C.S. It is the resprnsigility of the Govt. to arrange occurations for the people instend of driving them to depend on E.G.S. As a matter of fact, I want the Govt. to stop sanctioning fund for $\mathcal{E} . G . S$. funt if they enula arrange occupations for them.

Regarding rarkets for the produces of our cash crops - I felt that they should find a eans for wider warkets. They should also try to find a weans for trace and commerce with our neighbouring countries lige Bangladesh and Burma. Have they taken steps in this regard?

I once again want to thank the Cheirman for allowing me to deliver speech on this resolution. I hope that we will all agree to pass tho resolution today.

CH. SAPRAMNGA Mr Speaker Sir, let ru suy a few things WINISTER: before the Minister stands ug.

I first of all wuld like to say that $I$ am going to oppose the resolution wove by Pu Dotinaia, for, I found no good reasons to suprort it is therc ir no clear cut policy or ides in it.

In his res lutirn, Pu Dotinaia said that he wants the Govt. to purchnse cnsh crops from the people at reasonable rate. Yet, he cid nct mention who would fix reasonable rate or the rate whech he thinks reasonable or . which others think reasonoblo. If we pass such an ill definë resmlution, we will agoin blame the Govt. Consh crops he odvertised are Giner, Haldi etc. But, there is no market for Haldi and spices outsice Miz ram. It is not thet govt. is not making effort to dispose of Haldi anc Spices vielded by our people, but, no one wants to buy it. As such at what price the Govt. wuld purchase such cash crops from the people and whot will become finem if the Govt. do not know where to dispise them of. I think Ginger is the only crop which hos arrot ot present. As fres aldi and Spices are concerned, Govt. cannot as yet make large scale purchase as there is no maket for them outsicie Minorar. Hence, I cannot accept Pu Detinain's suggention to purchise these cosh crops from the perple while we do not even know who wold determine the rate.

Scoondly, I fund this resolution impracticable, for $I$ hove nover kn wn $\because$ Govt. or a State who readily purchese any cash crop yielded ly their penple.

Our prosition nerber said that at A.I.C.C. peeting the Fond Ministcr promisor whent gromers that the Govt. will rurchase their yiolds. Yet. whent ricc on? any staple food are quite dicerent from eash cripe you hat. riontioned. These are nut ensh crops: Thoy aru stople food
when stople food growers hato sur lue violdings Govt. used to buy them at supporting price tor vont low rate solling in loonl markot. As guch, Govt. in not ordinnrily have Inrge scale rurchase of cash crops.

As for Gingor, thoro is ane hos been goos rarket for it. Howevor, due to tronaport difficulty wo have some difficulty. But, our Govt. in co-cperstion with NAFET made efforts which rakos thing easior for Ginfor growers to sell their yieldincs at reasmanle rato. At present, Govt. purchase rate is Rs 125/- per quintol. But, ns wo do not know whother our Ginsor on be sold nt highor rate in e " $\because+$ Dalcutta Market it is harily rossiklo to toke risk in lounching large senl: purchosc from our erowers. This is one of the reasons why I connot support this ros lution.

Anther reason tor not supprting this resolution is thot I think our rover risson hjs min target. Ho seie thet the pergle wuld he wre encrurarget to erow. oash crops instond of rice which I can nevor nccept. Mizoram, as we know is a lone ihere rajority of woulntin denends on rice cultivatinn. Besias this, paces crons onn be srown better in noor sail thon eash crops. In somo ensus, cosh cenos connot bo successful in areas where pady crops ore successful. As such rice cultivation should te more encouraped, the noccssity of which he hirself hod stated. To some extent, wo shald also encurase coshorops cultiva; tion. Yet, it is rico we mostly buy with the mon wo nequired through cosh crors. As such I connet surpret our romber's rosolution to encurare cultivation at more esk crops thon rice dultivntion.

Eut, I think wo should craidor the troubles invoived in this trode. The mangerent is not taken up by the Govt. O-oper tive Nocicty is sot up through which the sale of brom is conducter. is for ns Mizoron is ( concerned, I den't think the pooplo will profer enthoring 1 brom frass which con $k=1$ minly the thetce of 25 paise or 15 paise $n$ bunch to wrking ns dinily who lowouror. $\bar{I}$ feel thet the mather relatine this ausortion whuid bo re-considered.

Pu Sengkhume mato on nllantjon thet tho Arri. Minister disenuraged tho penle torn more Gined
by saying that the Govt. is not bound to purchase all the

- Ginger yicled by the people. But, whet he snid was not a fact, for I nover said like thet. And there is no time for saying such thing. It-is only this yerr that people began to grow more Ginger toking loan from Agriculture Department. -As such, his allemtion ageinst ne was not a fact. I can also believe that he Misunderst. d what I saic. As I have said before, Gingor is the most valunblo crop we have at present. But, ns it couses erosion, it will bo neeessary to grow ther in terraces. One of the disadventrges of growing Ginger is that if the pecple pay their ettention only to Ginger plentation, they would not have rice to harvest and who would rive rice to thom? As we know due to bad communcation many villages could notheve their share of Govt's rice. As such one crop plentation/cultivation would be dangerous for Mizoram. So frir as Mizornm is concerned rice cultivation should be oncournger. One may bo rich in
- cash crops but, what is the use of them. if there is no rice to purchase ? In view of all the things I have saic. I think our mover missed his main torget in the rescluticn. I therefore connot support it.

CHAIRMAN (C.LALRUATA) If our merbers have nothine more to soy regarding our resolution we will call unon the ministur Incharge.

IALSAGGZUALA MINISTER:

Mr Speaker Sir, I think nur Agriculture Minister har given clenr explanation regarding the resolution. However, I would like to explain some of the things stated by our Tinosition nembers Pu Dotinaia ans Pu Sanrkhumn.

Beine aware of the necessity of consolidating the eornomic condition, the Govt. since lnst year made efforts in arragging market for Mizoram Ginger through Apex Merketing Socicty. Procurenent is being done in the current yoar and will also be done next year. Though Pu Dntinaia said Lsmall quantity of Ginger, Ginger $L$ abd purchased by the Govt. is but 11715 quintals for which Co-operative Society spent Rs 14,36,814.37. If ait not mistaken, alrost all the quantitios of Gincer yielded by the penple living in Aizawl - Silchar Rance were purchased by the Govt. I think Pu Dotinaia mede aristake in saying that

Acriculturc Depnrtrunt distributos 20,000 quintals of Ginger soods on lon. Gineer segrg aistrjiutod by hrriculture Doptt. were not oven half nf 20,000 quintnls.

Acorrin ti our orculatim, the curront productirn coes butwon $n$ "n" nan half lakh quintals. It is also 7 foct that Gove was lato in aking procuremont which has beon a son lesson to us. This yonr, prouronont will be done from tho month of Decerder. Hnwovor, div; to henvy rainfoll in the months of ify and June, there was delny in obtainine procuremint and thore was clan heavy loss in Co-oporotivo Socjuty Dopartwont.

It is a foct thot Giner ? wicer market thn othur sash orop. As stoter by our dreicilture Minister, grices, Soy? bonns, lillot cte are tor choap in other markets men there wuln horely bu profit in this. If wo are willinc to sell at low moti, morket con be orronged.

Raprocine Inpse $x$ fund rontionol by Pu Jntinain whon there is hapse of funr providec ir the budset, it is n-t surrencored to Control Tressury. It is credited to conschinted fund whioh is for our use. is such there is no loss to our Gott. even whon there is longo in the budrets.

One ff cur difficultjes in the meremont of cash crops is fixation of rate. Boin* merishnule rost, rate for cash crop has t: be rixed every now rad thon accordine to their yorlet value. Th yenr bifere Irst cinger had eood rorkot in Calcuttr. Gu, the Govt. :if Mizorari in co-nporation with NAFET fixad tho reti at kis 125/-per QtI. At this ratu, Gineor mas ?urchosuc from tho mrows. But, unfortunatuly the rate of inerer has remer in celcutta merkets duc to incronso in the production of rur noishbourinp states like itarhiny ne Manipur besiras North Boneol.

I think Fotroto business in Morhalays
Whs nlso mentinnot As strtor by cur Arriculture Minister Merchalnyn Govt, an not trex un its wanreaunt. Moriotins of Pototo is cone through Co-rormtive Departront.

As rugras the alincotion -1 rrecossine Plant efforts made by the Givt in this rererce bue not been successful till torey innet we noed ie frohine for
 reried in tho sun.

But, the same methor can not be epplied to Mizorar having no intense heat from the Sun. However, persons from Cnonperative Society Deptt. are detailed to conduct experiment.

Foinc awore of the difficulty faced by the growers of North eastern arcas of dizorar in finding markets for their ensh crops, the ovt. opened out-agency office at Silchar through which they can dispose of their products. Some quantity of cingex was also purchased by the Government from the growers of North-western regions. Besides this, there is a proposal for the establishment of Four (4) Godowns at Silchnr, the construction of which has alreacy been started. Arrangement is nlso made for hiring private houses for godowns before the construction is corpleted.

It is not thet the Grov. is not making effort to procure wider markets for cash crows yielded by the people. But, so far ns ginger is concerned, there is hardly a means for export unless it is dried. Some quantity was exported to Malaysia anc Sincoppre for experiment. Yet, it $\ddagger$ d doubtful that there will be feans for larger export as China have better quality of gincer which they export. OP our eash crops, red-pepper enn bo exportce and there is also a good market for it. However, we will have to consider whether Mizoram is capable of producine: surplus for export. So far as ainger is concerned, there is ereat demand for dried ginger which we can not yet produce. Anyway, we are maner afforts to finc a way for dryine our ginger.

I also wint to inform our merbers that twice the Govt. of IMizoram hove noproacher Janclaresh thre: Central Govt. for the estejlishment of Trate relatio. between the two countrios. But, there has not beon any result till today.

I think I havo gaic enourh rogarding this resnlution. In my ninion, it is better that the Govt. handle the manarenent of our cosh crops throurh Socicty and Agencies instead of directly hancline it. So, for better manasement of our onsh crops raxkots in tho some manner, I request nur member to with m raw his resnlution.

In insm-rradesh for instance, rice cultivation maj be oncourase to consolidate.. their eononic concition, whilc in Mizom, onsh orop cultivntion is meournead. Forhops it is truo that our spiod have no market outsia, but I con ery that spios sold in our Bazars are not spices yielded ty rex mole. I strongly believe that if the Incustry Deptt., ownerative Society or any necency sponsored by the Govt. purchase 50/ 70 quintels of locel spices to be processer lonlly, this would to some extent moct sur requirements.

Our hon ole inister fu Barmagn alleGed my resolution as bein one sincd ne stetud thot I was totally discouroine rice-cultivation which $I$ think wis e great mistake on his mart. I think he risunderstond what I said. How could we totally neclect cultivetion of rice whilo it is our staple food ?. Whet I said was thet in orecer to prepare ourselves for the comind foine, I want us to grow more cash crops so that with the moncy acquirce through ther wo can buy Govt. rice on which rost uf us dopend. It îs not that I do not encourare cultivation of ricu. In fact, it is my desire that Mizoram produce surplus. Rut havine bown th some aroas where dry terrace systor. af cultivation is beinc ndontor, I have doubt that Mizorn rill produce sufficient rice to meet the requirenents of the whe populntion.

It is not only fizmor, but ost of the countries in the orld mkine rect fuss over oconomic prormmac. It scoms, howuer thet lor bors who come th this House today to represent tho people do not renlizo the importance of the subjoct mattor of this rosolution. I feel sorry to see that may of us are not intorester? in discussing our own econsmic programme, for only fow mombers remain in their sents.

I do not know what will the people whom we represent think of us had they seen us today. Spmetimes I had a feeling that Central Govt. knows better our conditions than our own Govt. did. As stated by the Arriculture Minister of Central Govt., if Miozram is well-त aveloped, it means that Indir is cleveloped. I wonder why our senior mombers could not understand my resclution. It is a fact that aizoram do not have separate Deptt, for Trade and Corrorce, yet if necessity arises in this regard, other Deptts. like Supply, Co-operative or Agriculture can do the wrat. And, the Govt. boing the highest authoritative body will determine prices of cash crops. Wo rust know how to maine use of ur Linison Officerswhom we placed at Aifferent places/centres to look after transaction of trade and commerce. Lict me re-read my resolution. "This Asscmbly is of the opinion that tho Govt. of Mizoram should purchase the preruces of eash crops namely ginger, haldi etc. at reasonable prices at different grourine centres to uplift the oconory of lizorn within tho next finencial year". I think it is clear onoug. I think the meaning is nlso clear enough without my axplon tion. If I mention the names of all the cash crops, my resolutior will be too lengthy which is not very advisable. is the Minister concerned had stated, the Comperative Deptt. conducted large-scale purchase of cinger for which I am thankful. I believe that if we pass this resnlution, thero will be greater improvement in the steps nlrendy token by the Govt. to uplift our econny. I think Centril Govt. would also appreciate nur attitude towarls Tonomic Programe when they sce this resolution. It seems, however that we are not going to pass it todny. I will be truly sorry if we do not pass this important resolution. Poreonelly, I a of opinion that Mizoram will be moro benefited if rore ocsh crops are grown instead of concentretine on Dry-Terraces which cannot produce sufficient foct for all the reople. But, this does not mean that wo will fivo up dry-torraces we have had in faveur of cash crops. $\mathrm{I}_{\mathrm{s}}$ a matter of fact, lands which have not yet beer reclaimedshould be brought under Reclamation Procrame. In viuw of all that had been stぁted by us, I sincerely wish that ur members will agree to pass this resolution of rine.

That isthe most importent soctor. Bcing igriculturi Ninister, I thought Fu Rawnga will support me as he knows that this sector produces variety of cash crops. Fersonally, I thought that wo would all be in accord with coch othor even if we belone to different Parties, if what wo want to do is for the betterment of the country and the porplc.

I do not think there is much difficulty in executing works, the ostimate of which har beon prepared. If we know that we cannot take up the work, why at we spend so much money for survey ?. Even when it was constructod under E.G. ${ }^{\text {, }}$, the road is not pliable by vehicles.

That is how it is in a confused Govermment. Fu Ruat: said that it is not necessary to mention in the Fouso works that should be done if we know we cannot as yet do it. Iot, ifecl that if the works that should be done are not mentioncd in the House, there would hardly be speedy exocution. is $a$ matter of fact, it seems that the Government rive more priority to the things said in the House than those whioh are not nentionor.
