We should also remember that the welfare of our country wis and our people is depending on this House. We should not be selfish and pompous but we must serve our people and that wo mint remember that our people lower to us to represent them.

We are now in high offices, and as leaders we tho ld serve our people. While other places have their assemblies for years together ours is bergen only We have si visited our constituencies and also those oj others, each of us have seen the poverty of our people, we must therefore wot for then. The starvation of mann g of our people, aud we nest the evefir do oast beat for them.

We have been under disturbed condition for a long time now, as such we need to have peace and tranouility. To realise this end all of us heve our dutios and we mustion so remember that loose tad talkw con oreate misunderstanding. We have freedom of speech in this House, which could not be taken to Court. But we must be very careful in the exercise of this frecdom. What we say inside here could create bad feelings outside, as such we must be pery careful in what we say. Mere arinments without dorn rhyme or reason will be of little help. Proper care in our speech could go a lone way towards peace and trenouility. We must behave respectully desorving the dignity of this House.
is the Bible I have read out we should not try to rely on our own wisdom but we must always rely on God. We mant learn this lesson and iff the responsibilities placed on us become too henvy we should God to help us. Solomon also prayed to God asking for wisdom, we should do likewise.

SPEAKER ELECT : I JOuTd like to address the House on having bein melccted as Speaker. This Mizoram Legislative Asscmbly is our cirst and this august office has fellen upon my shoulder, and I volild specially thank the members who proposed my name and who scconded the proposer.

I must say that I am a fresh man as also this Rssembly is new. In the past we had the D/Council but in this Vew set-up I would request all the members to $\mathbf{z}$ assist me and help me in the discharge of the responsibilitics that have been laid on my shoulder.

This Zoram Assembly will reflect what happens in Mizoram. The Speaker protem had told us in the morning of the futility of senseless and noisy arguments. There is a saying that a good beginning is a work half-done. The respectable members should thercfore do their best to make our government a success.

I must also mention that rose of us are new but there are amongst us a few senior and seasoned politicians, who had been H.P., Chairman of the $D / C o u n c i l$, and who have had extensive experiences, whose nrosence here is a matter of assurance to me.
