the extension work and the Contractors were simply doing the work according to the directions given by the Ministers concerned. The expenditure miy therefore become too high if this practice is allowed.

PU CH. CHHONGA, $\quad$ Docs not arise.
CHIEF MITSSTEA: $\quad$ The cost or additional alteration and repairs
wili be paid by Govt. The total expenditure up-tomate is Rs. 6,170/- and the ostirated cost of various works excluding the cost of retaining wall is Rs. 1,62,250/-. The estimate for the retaining wall is yat to be finalised and the estimate cost is not available. No expenditure hes hovever been incurred so far on this work.

SPEAKER: IIo:s answer to question No. 5 has been given by the Hon'ble Minister.

PU LAISANGZUAIA: ITr. Speaker, I have supplementary question. According to the estimate made by the PWD, the expenditure for construction of Ministers' Residence is Rs. 160,000/But Rs. 162,250/- had already been spent on extension work of two old bungalows. Tn addition to thesc, there will be expenditure on the retaining wall. Now that the work is now noaring completion, is not it unreasonablc to execute works without first having an estimate ?

SEEAKER: Is not that question already answered, when it was onswere that the Ministers did not give instructions to the Contractors?

PU CH.CHHUNGAY Ir. Speaker, the residences of the Executive Member CHIEF MINISTEA:
of the defunct District Council were in very bad
conditions andure nct fit for occupation by the Ministers. A great deal of oxtension works, including addition of more and larger rooms, ropairs to the floore and the verandahs wore necessary, for which Rs. 152,250/- had been spont. This amount is not vory big for the roconstructicn and renovation of the residence: for Ministors.

PIU IGUSATGZUATA:
Mr. Speaker, tho Hon'blu Ministor has misundere stood my question. If these two old buildingsware unfit for occupation by the hinistors, whe had they not reserved for Junior Ministors ?

PU J.THANGHUAMA: Mr. Speaker, I have never seen such magnificent bungalaows for Ministers even in other States. Since no estimate was prepared by PWD we cannot say that the PWD - knows of thlesextension works. Rs. 1,62,250/- has already been spent for repain works, what is the justification for all these when some lakh be constructed ?

PU CH. SAPRANNGA:

SPEAKER: - cost of various works cxcluding the cost of retaining wall is Rs. 1,62,250/- and the estimate for the retaining wall is yet to be finalised. I think the roply given by the Hon'ble Minister is clear enough. So letweroceod to Question No. 6da).

There arc only three boatmon who ply the boat with the aid of wire rope which has been provicod, during raing seasons. When the current is too strong the boat is mot used on account of risk involved.

We should always remember that this is a general discussion on the Budget and no Members should dwell on the p topics which are outside the subject of this discussion. Tinc will also be fixed for every Member. Parliamentary Chicf Whip and opposition Loader will be given 30 ni utes each rospoctively. And other Menbers will have 15 minutes each. The discussion on the Budget mat now begin.

## EU HRANGATA:

Mr Speaker, I have taken part for many years past whon we uscer to discuss the "District 'Budget" when we were under Assain. Thero asemore provisions for the development works of Mizorarn in conearison to thosc Budgets. We must but be grateful for this. But when I turn to Schedule for works, I feel very much disappointod. Tho Budgot itponars to have been prepared not for the development of the whole devare but for the Constituencies of the Ministers. Only vor: smell provisions are made for the Constituencies of otlor Members, Frer this reasom, I find it difficult to appreciate this Budget. At the cinc jits preparation, all member went to their respective constituencies to study the need of the people and prepare scheries of develonmont for inchusion in the Budget. Accordinely I also subait.ted sciemes to the Development Comissioner and the Dov. Minister. But toray I sce, to my utter surprise, that none of the schones I submittod appear in this Budget. In fact, it is a matter of sadness to we that such a huge amount of man.ey is going to be spont for develoment of the Ministers' Constituencies cely. Hence I find it vory difficult to approve this Budgat.

## EU LALSAGZZUALA:

Mr Spoaker, the cestiny of the people of Mizorom is in the hands. of this House. We have now before us two paths - the right path and the wrong path. If we choose the right path, Mizos will be crowned with high esteem. On studying the Budget, although the Buaget provisions may appers impressive, it tapers down to sraall anounts in oome cases. The reason for this, accoring to the Hon. Tinance Minister is shortage of fund, but the It. Govemor in his speech in the first Session pointed out that shortage of fund wiil not be allowed to stand in the way of our economic development. What will then be the meaning of the speech made the Lt. Governor.

Next, Flane and schenes which we fqund in page 2 of the Finonce Ministert's spech are too small and as such incomparable to those of other States. For instance, in the 4 th Five Year Plan, Budget estinates of Msan, Manipur, Tripura, Meghalaya, Armachal Pradesh and fizorim were 223.75 Crores, 40.00 Crores, 30.25 crores, 34.66 crores, 38.00 crores, 17.99 crores and 2.75 crores respectively. Is it not a matter of shame that such a large territory has soAI wonder if the inability of our leaders to attend the sitting of the Central Planning Board in time, when it met last May, has not resulted in this sad thing.

Para 4 mentions about taxation. It is wrong to coach the Mzos not to pay taxes. Fut we should not insist on the Low Incone, Group to pay them, since it is true that those who are able should pay taxes.

In para 5, we have creatcion of Aizawl District with four Sub-Divisions. Bitger acininistrative divisions have not been made, and this will create cisproportion.

In para 6, wo scc that to entrust the Circle Assistants with local administrative duties is not good. These Circle Assistants, beine folitically appointod, are never imparitial in their discharge of dutics. For instance, in a recent election of Village Council at Karglirun one C.A. presided over the election, which election was not "airly sonducter. I think a departmental action should at least be takon on this sort of affair.

A change in the Hoais of Local Administration Department and Administration of Justice is ajso a pressing necessity. Otherwise,

In para 10 mention is made about Hospitals. Needless to say the Civil Hospital at "izawl is too small. It is a great pleasure to me that one Hospitai is to be established in my Constituency and the site for this has also been sirve It is the right approach to have more specialists too. surveyed

Now para 12. I :ould like to request the Covt. of Mizorm to pay more attention to the Department of Soll Conseravation as we do not inake the full use of this Department $a l l$ these years. Some days ago, one English Daily released that a huge quantity of ginger produced in lizorat is to be bought by
U.S.S.R. When it is not known - yct the price at which this ginger is to. be sold, this news rather surprisca me.

Acain; provisions which we find in para 15 are too small. More provisions should be made for arrangement of conducted tours not only for Govt. servonts and studerita but also for politicians. This is essential if liizoran is to advance forward. Let us try to keep pace with cther doreloping natiens of the world.

With regard to F.W.D. Division, I would like to mention that ectivities under varicus sectors of construction have not yet been started till toflay. Tnis mav be, of course, due to lack of sufficient starf. Tc overcorie this, we need proper staffing in the administrative niachinery. Without adequate staff, mere availam. bility of huge amounts of money means nothing. It is apprehended that much of the fund will not be spent or they will merely be wasted.

A provision of Ris. 2 lakhs for Plant and Machinery is also too little for Mizoram. As the Hon bie Members are aware we have to buy tools and irmpements from outside. We should not feel discouraged when wo see difficultics in the way of development and plan sckemos. To citc an examole, during the Chinese aggression on the Indian territory, the Central Covt. ordered that no Jeep be released for anything than defonce purposes. But when an earnest appeal was racic to the Central Gort., 60 Jeeps were released for use in Mizoram durinc the torrible fanine. We should not therefore make crecuses but seek the assistance of the Central Govt. whenever such helf is required. The Oposition side will also be always ready to extend cooperation to you in this matter.

With rogard to Water Supply, I would like to point out that there arconly 5 weter points in my Constituency. This is too inadequete to mect the demands of the people. The Public Health Departrient should the? be immediately up-Eraded with meny more small branches.

Wo should aisc put rere attention to Supply of Electricity for if wo $\mathcal{G} 0$ as we do now, we will bo lagging behind the rest of other States of India. Lat us try tugive electric power to one village ev ry montil from 1973. For this is the very programe of other States in Incia.

It is ryy earnest dosire that peopie belonging to low-income froup shoula be given priority for rehabilitation.
loan which we have in para 10 of the Finance Minister's Speech. It is also quite deploralble that only very small provisions are made for low-income group whilc big provisions are made for middle-income group.

While admitting the need of accelarating industrial develoment of Mizoran, we have not paid full attention towards implementation of the report given by the expert toam. A few years ago also, a Study Tear: with Pu Lalkhana, our Finance Secretary as its leador, came to Mizoran to study the feasibility of starting. Industries in Mizorom and - we saw the report of the team in 1971. But till today we do not see anything anne to omplenent their recommendations. This means that our leadors do not pay heed to their reports. So even if new teams are invited, it will have no menaing at all. We must therefore try to implenent the reports of the team led by Pu Lalkhama.

> It is learnt that the Govt. of Mizoram intends to appoint a good number of persons as Frimary School Teachers. It will be hishly appreciated if the Govt. of Mizoram gives appointment to those who were once appointed as Primary School Teachers by the Congress Farty just before the dissolution of District Council. (Speaker : Tou tolso too much time. Is not it enough now?) (Pu J. Thanghuama : Mr Speaker, we have subritted to you a list of members who are going to make speech to-day and Pu Lalsangzuala is one such member. Pu Fi. K. Chekma will not speak)

I will cut short my speech. Many Co-operative Societies have been formed in lizoram but most of them failed miserably.

I would like also to say a few words on E.G.S. One Department under Govt. of lizoram issued orders that E.G.S should be given cri contract basis to Village Council or persons of . reliable character: Tor cxanple, irregularity happened in between Village Council and the me man to whom work was given on contract. I will make investigation on tiis matter in the Department concerned. The Govt. of jizoram should not tolerate such dirty things and actions should je taken accordingly. (Speaker: It is now quite enough. We shall ¿iscuss this ajain at some otier appropriate time)
PU R.ZOLIANA:
Mr Spoaker, Sir, I om glad to hear the speech nade by the Fon'ble Finance Minister. I want to say a few words on this' speech and request the Mon'ble Members to note it well. It is stated that "provided we can execute planscheme in time". This necds further consideration for the time at our disposal is very short.

Hany appointments have not yet been made in some Departments and I ara afraid, a huge amont or money would have to be surrendered. It js therefore necessary to execute plan schemes expeditiously. Statement about Local Administration is well and good but Town Senitadion should he made into a iigger Department.

Let is go to pae: 5, para 1 of the Finance Ministor's specel. There are many people in my constituensy who have
never seen Nurse with white head-dross. When we study the Finance Minister's speech, our Budget appoars to be meant for urban area and Doctors are to be provided for Alzawl, Lunglei and Durtlang only and pot for interior villages. In my constituency there are 23 villages with 3 Dispensames only. 'Fo meet the presidng demand of the peeple living in the interior villeges, I would like to mention that Ambulances Vans should also be given to these Dispehsaries.

It is a humiliation on the part of the Congress Ministry that tt foilod to shift Industrial Trainine Institute to Aizawi. This Tnstituto should be ahifted to Aizawl as soon as possible.

I would aiso like to mention that ginger should be included in BanglaJesh - Mizoran Trade figreement. We must always remember that money wili not be our problem provided we make reasonable plan zko schemes. This can be clearly seen from our Finance Minister's specch.

Tourism is very inportant for Mizoram and as such must be constitutod into a scperate Directorate. The proposal to start Information Centres at 20 important places is very inadea quate. Information Centre must be established in every village. Page 8 of the Firnanee Minister's speech does not include my constituency. Supply of safe and adequate drınlsing water must be started in the interior villages and must also be put under Block Development Scheme so as to rect the necu of poor vi.ilagers. Nothing had been done for surveying the feasibility of this scheme last year.

Page 10. Here ws sce "samll provision" again. If we want to develop Hizoran, should not big provisions be made for every plan? Many villagos wore burnt iow by the harsh and cmel Security Forces and house with bamboo posts are still standing there. It is therefore neccssary io give Hotoing Loan, also Relief and Rehabilitation loas to vinlasors whose house were bumt during the disturbances.

Again I would line to say a few wards on Council of Scientific ince. Industrial Rosearci: which we find in page 10 of the Finance Mivister's speech. A team led by Pu Lalkhame I.A.S. already cale to lizorm somo yorre aro and their report has to be ta-kon into consiemation insteac of inviting a new tean to study the fousibility of starting Industrics in Mizoran.

Thoro ars jomy wizncame plantations in Mizo ram. Jin my constituency alene thero are 104 sugareane crushing machines and if hundred more nschines are made aviliable, people will buy them off in no timo. .he staterent about Education Director which we find in potse 11 of the Finance Minister's speech gives me ereat delight. But wo must nou be satisfied trith this alone. Has this Department suffjciont nüber of cyporienced stafi ? Lastiy, I would like to mention that Pllct project in page 12 nas to be started as soon ns possible and inve Frimary School reachers have to be appointod so that tupil - veacher raiio may cone to 1:30 instead of $1: 40$ which we find in the Jinarce Minister's speech. Thank you.

RU R DOTINATA:
Mr Speaker, Sir, the Hon'ble Finance Minister has presented Budget of Mizoran. I an afraid that this huge amount of money and precious time would pass avay due to lack of sufficient daily labourour staff. Three Districts have sincé been created in Mizoram but this is not in proportion to the population of the area. Aizawl District is for greater in size then the - rest ard as such should be converted into two Districts. If not, it should rather be constituted, into 5 'sub-divisions so that development work for interior villages may be accolerated.

But the proposed salary of members of Village Council is too little. These rembers are working very hard for big officers and political leaders. They deserve special pay for meeting the expenditure on the reception they give to big officers who pay a visit ${ }_{A}^{\text {their }}$ their villages.

When we look at Schedule for works in our Budget, we see there are bit schenes for Mizoram. Trat their schemes do not include construction of Tuichang bride which roally is a pressing necessity for people living in m, constituency. I have already Informed the Dev. Commissioner about the need of the people there. These people have to buy essential comm dit,ies from N. Vanlaiphai for which good comunicetion is folt taperatire. To overcome such difficulty, a"bridge should thorof ore on constructed over Tuichang river.
N.Vanlaiphai. The present Loctor there is inefficient and inexperienced ans alwoys rolies on the compouncer under him. The building is in a dilapidated concition ard bady needs repair. But in our Budget there is no provicion for this work and this upsets me very much. I feel it is nocossary to extend the building so as to accomodate 30 to 50 beds. I request the Hon irie Minister to take note of this.

It is seen that only small provision is made for Tourism. In this conncotion, I waile like to say thnt the area sux around N.Vanlaiphai is suitable for a mounist Contte and I am sure its eacnic beauty will capture the cys of tourists.

Let ine also puint out sme difficulties created due to inefficient supply of water. Mny poople living in the outskirts of Aizawl town cannet gat supuy on water, and there is no fixed time for drawing this water. That is the case in Alzawl town and you can inabine what ciffinulties the viliage folks are facing regarding watcr supply. When will the: set abundent supply of safe drinking water:

It ir aiso learnt that the Covt. of Mizoram proposes to give free suppl- of safc trinking water to some big town in Mizoram. But this not onough, Small villages should also be provided with safe drinking wator. The Public Health Department had already stercos wark ir: N.Vaniaiphai but this work had to be discontinued due to the disturbances which broke out in Mizoram. It is now time that this work be resured since the dark clouds of disturba nces have takei a new colsur. Ange amount of money is in our hands and tho Govt. of Mizorim should employ as many hands as
as possible in order to make the right use of this money withdn the specified dpriod.

It is also a fact that the present system of $\mathbf{y}$ shifting cultivation in Mizuran has becil a failure and sugarcane plantation is a good means for earnine our livehood. But sugarcane crushing machines aro not within the reach of the poor people. Even the subsidised price is Rs. 400-500. It is therefore imperative to make necessary arrangenents so tint evon poor people can afford, to buy these machines. The jroposal to give Inans for 14 Rice Hullers is also not enough. The number should be increased to at least 40/50. Thank you.

## PO LALKUNGA:

Mr Speaker, Sir, we have our Budget session very late. In page 1 of the Finance Minister's speech it is stated that "the Govt. of India are fully aware of the peculiar circumtances prevailing in this area (Mizoram), and the need for special care and atterition in matters of development. I do not say that the Govt. or' India are not aware of the difficulties prevailing in Mizoram. But the fact that wo can have Budget Session only towards the end of October led ne to think that we do not yet know how to approach the Contral Governaent. Thoguh we have a huge anount of money in our hands time at our disposal is very short and If we connot spenc them properly in time, a big allount has to be surrendered. This will meen stiply mokinf us enviour of the huge amount of money in the hands of the Cintral Government. In my opinion, the people of Mizeran are not in a position to pay taxes. People should have to be cirein development works first before they are required to py taxes.

Let ae say $n$ few wrds on comunications. I cone from southern part of Mierram, so is Pu Nikhuma. Suppose we want to have a tour in our Constituencies, wo have to go on foot with a rucksack. This clearly illustretes the imperative need of good system of cormunication. But we sec the Budget provision made for construction of road in tizese constituencies are less than the provisions made for construction of road in Vairengte village. Let us therefore try to develof those undevelopece and more backward $\mathbf{z r}$ areas first.

For people living in southern part of M1zoram, Tlawng River serves as the main source of thier livelihood, so also Thut river for people living in my constituency. Good system of cormunication is therfore the urgent need of the peopie who are jiving between Vawngawn and Sabual along the Tut river.

I do not also consiter proper to praise the Director of Education so highly. People in many villages have no good schools and we, who come from villages have no acceds to our Director of Education, since eren the M.L.As find it difficult to meet hym.

Govt. employees in "izizoram are too over-burdened with works and this stands in the way of efficient execution of the duty entrusted to then. If we do not have adequate number of employees, provisions in our Budget will havo no meaning at all, however, big they are. Time is fleeting. It is now time to prepare Budget for 1973-74. So I am afraid thet this huge amount of money would have

- to be surrandered due ti indequate supply of eraployees.

Considoring the whole of Mizoram, it is seen that Hospitals and Primary Health Centres are concentrated in the eastern sector. Patients in the western sector have to be carried by the willage-folks for adrission into the Hospital. People in villages often die for want of good ruedicines. It is therefore not necessary to establish $2 / 3$ Hospitals in Aizavil town while people in the interior villages have to go miles to reach the nearest Hospital. In this connection I would like to montion that Prisary Health Centre at Kanghmun, demolised due to the disturbances in Mizoram, should be opened again and there must be gooc communication for people living in and around Lallen, Phuldungsei and Mexpara.

I wish that we make the best and most prifitable use of this Budget for Mizorom.

PU NGURDAWIA:
Mr Speaker, Sir, I want to speak after the Hon 'ble Member Pis Lalkunga because the Budget does not include Iniond Water Transport which is the special problem of my Constituency. The Finance Minister, in lijs speech has stated that Inland Water Tronsport is expected to bo transferred to this Govt. shortly. This appears to have also been intended for Tlabung and Kolodyne only. In my Constituency prople connot send hearry goods to the market. Concrete and extonsive plan sahemes hasp to be prepared for this puapese ant I.W.T. should also be mate into a bigger Department.

When I turn to "Sclledulo for Works", I feel very disappointed. It seens that the Govt. of Mizoran is trying to develop the devolopeci area while neelectaty the backward areas. I would like to point out that the area in and around Reiek needs development works. In our Buiget, provision of Rs. 75,00,000/- is made for the roconstruction and resabilitation of Aizawl Bazar which was destroyod by fire in 1966. We must not forget that people living in villages are also in need of this kind of assistance, , otherwise Govt. of Mizoran will look like evvernent for the urban people.

Ind Set.henent witich we find in the Finance Minister's speech has to bo macie for villages also and I request the Hon'ble Finance Minister to do so. Arain there is no concrete plan scheme regarcing Acrimulture. As has already beon pointed out by Hon'ble member Pu Lalsangwala, the L. Govomor in his speech, said that money will not a problem for the ceenomic development of Mizoram. We must alwsys remember tinis. Agriculture in lizoram has been a failure. Even if exlerianced ant expert persons are invited fron outside, I warraid the same roult wuld follow.

Lastly, I woulc less to nention that Tourism should be mad, into a bigger Dopertment with different smaller branches in order to attract yoro tourists to Mizoran.

PU SAITTAANYA:
Mr Spearer, Sir, I voulce aike to raise many points
on the Speech aivion by the Hon 'ble Finance
Minister on 20.10.72. As alreaty pointed out by the Hon'ble Members before, our Judget is contrary to the expectation of the village folks for only small provision is arde for thoir economic development. The provision is really sonewat too mall.

For illustration, let me give one example. Kolodyne, the bicgsest rivor in lizora: runs through S.Vanlaiphai Constituency and Trantinial-S.Vanlaiphai road crosses this river at point which is known as Darco Torry. Erery jear people living around here suffor antold misoly cue to l'lood. No boat can ply in this river as the current is vory strong. This yoar also the river remained unsorvicable for 15 days due to flood and the people were drawn on the brink of starjation, vory often this nearly drive them to comit unclesirdole actions.

Tn July last yoar poople haci to cross this river with head-loods and wefortinately scrin of thom got drowned in the river.

In May 1972, I subitited the Scoretarist a note regarding the importance of constumeting a bridge acrose this river. But the Buaget ontoins no morion fro bis scheme. I am very disappointer to-day.

We will resume dienssion on the Badget. This morning Pu Zalawn stood up to speak just before the recess, I will cal upon him first to speak.

RUZALAWM: $\quad$ ír Speaker, Sir, I am placi today to have discusssion on the Budget. But it is a bit too late to have Budget Session on which depend all the works of development in Mizoram.

Different Heads of liepartments have now started preparing Budget for 1973-7 and I am afrail that plan scheme might not be executed in time.

Provisions which we find in the Budget are too small. I say this because since disturoneces broke out in Mizoram, we lack oufficient fund for development works. People in towns and villages are facing the same type of Agriculturel and economic
problems. So I fecl vory disappointed when I sec that our Budget has only snall provisions.

Agricultural lands in Mizoran are becoming less unproductive every year and this invites land reclamation. But in our Budget only a small provision is rade for this purpose.

I think that our Hon 'ble kinisters do not know the importance of Aericultural Research Inctitute. We have to know what kind $\dot{\text { if }}$ vegetables should be grown, inow lying flatlands as well as in the hills. In nd around Zawlpui, in the southern part of Mizoram, there are about 1000 acreas of Land which can be easily reclaimed. The ministry is responsible for these lands still remaining unreclained. Our Devolornent Comisstioncr und thitef Seeretary may not know the problem of Mizoram in cletails. Now we have own Legislative and the linisters will worl very hard to develop Mizoram and her people.

Rownertion for rillago Suncil members should also be increasec for they are workin: as lare as the M. I. as. With regard to Medical Departmont, I wint to foint out that many people died for want of sufficiont supply of enc non-availability of medicines. As such better facitity should be nade.

Some days ago, onc coctor was transferred to on interior village but that roctor did not :nove, and rearins at Aizawl. I request the Hon'ble Ministar concernod to take note of this, Once again, I want to point out thot provision in this Budget are too small. The Mizos are socially quite different fron other tribes of India. I balieve that those Bergalis living in Tripura or Calcutta may not know the real proizeris of the kizo people.

Mizoran became U.T. on 21.1.72 and this $I$ hope will be an important stcp for the Mizos. I want the Govt. of Mizoram to leave so stones unturnod to attan'Lifacr levols of achjevement in the field of education. At the time Mizoram was under District

Council, we had the exact poruntion of Mizoran and we knew that at least 400/500 Prinary School I'eachers had to be appointed. But here in our Budget we see that the now Ministry intends to appoint only 200 new teachers. This looks quitc absarb. When we entered the U.T this Ministry took ovdr every property of the defunct District Council. When the Cogress Party was in ower, it confirmed 780 house sites given by the Union Panty. Inkewiso, I therefcre want to appeal. to this Manistry that all tiose Primary school Teachers already appointed by tho orstwhilo District Comeil should also be confimed In this connection I would like to say that I saw on the table of the Administrator his approval for senction of 100 new posts of I. P Feachers. But that letter has aince beon untraceable and the person responsible for tie loss should be found out.

We should learn to respect actions taken by the old Ministry, othorwise, tho hard labeur of the Ministry will have no meaning at all. Village people are in ereat need of good schools and we must always bear this in mind.

Provision for construction of LeglsZative Assembly Secretariat and liall is aisu too small. I wonder who has curtailsd this! Provision in the Budget is too siall for general administration when money is tic number one juportant thing. When we had UMPP we gave out that salaries of L.P. Teachers will be raised when we have U.T. The basio pay of I.P. Tenchers is only Ps.80/-. Thereforc, the provision made under Fları Schene is very inaclequate. A provision of Rs. 75 lakhs which we find in til Budeet will, trickle down to the Shopkeepers. Therefore, the muthoritios do not havo clear thoughts in regard to the requirments of funds.

Though we have U. T'. we aro still buying commodities, like petrol at the rate prevaline in assam. I do not know whether our leadors havo looked into this. sane time ngo, the price of C.I. sheets is Rs.200/- only; but, now it rose to $\mathrm{Hz} .400 /$. This necds further consideration.

Lastly, I worla like to request the Gevt, of Mizoram to open Tuirial Air Field 5 ecrly as possible. Thank you. PLC CiALRUATA: Mr Speaker Sir, I very riac to taire part in the discussion on the 5 unget irr 197e-73. The nenber who spoke before ne took much time. He mpere to be favourod, as he spoke for nearly*injef an hur theugh he was allowad 15 minutes only. Swe memors thought tiat provision in this Budget are too small. But I ar arnic inat evon tinis mall mount may not be spent. Wo cannot cit fill derej. omanit al. at once. Members of opposition Porty taught peomle that tie reason for delay in having the Buc.get Session is nevigence on the part of the Central Govt. towards us. I think they spreai such false teaching while knowing the roal roason oohind the dolay in the Bucget Session. Eut now I have core to the conclusion that they rid not loow the real roason. We have just finished foming the Govt. of Mizoram. Even those States with sufficient supplij or mployees usca to take much time to prepare the Budget. And I foel very hanpy to sed the Budget ready for discussion to-day. I want to expross ay thakfulness to the officers
and Govt. employeos and our leaders for preparing the Budget in so short a time.

Some of the points of criticisn reised on the Budget may be truc to some extent. This is also the case with my Constituency. At the tire of preparation, I submitted to the Dev. Comissioner some schemes far inclusion in the Budget. But none of these appear in this Buciet. As a nattor of fact population along Silchar-fizavl road is dense and this is also the Gateway to difterent States of India, we have to develop this side first and then more to nore interior villages. We must renember this. It would be wrong to give frportance to one's ow constituency, forgetting the need of the country as a whole. Once we reach sone measure of development perhaps there will be possibility for us to develop our respective constituoncies. We must remenber that we are just beginning.

In page 3 of the F n bl le Finance Mristers spech, it is stated that donestic receipts of our Govt. will have to be increased many-fulds. Will that be gooc? It is not a bad idea to increase taxes ; but judged from the present condition of the people, it is not yet time to do that. Feuple are not in a position to pay a anything other than House Tar and Land Rovenue. In page 4 , para 5 we sce creation of 3 Districts - 1) Aizawl District wdth four sud-di-. visions 2) Lunclei District with two sub-divisions and 3) Chhintuipul District comprising the three autononous regions of Paw , Lakher and Chakna. But why have not these District startafunctioning yet? I believe all are very anxious to knor the jurisdictions of these District, and what will be their respective Headquaters.

A provision of Rs. 0 lakhs as Fousing Lnon is too small and it is not clear whether it includes people who are in interior villages. Mortage will kave to be required for housing loan and this is impossible for four peoplo in villages. A provision of Rs. 75 lakhs is made for reconstruction and rinebilitation of Aizawl Bazar I think provision shuma also be aade for people in villages. House site and gardens alloted to the people by Village Council must be made accoptoble for :?rłgage for husing loans, since people in the village need special considaration.

I have no knowlodgc ab ut the Comitto which we find in page 8, para and T veru anxious to know their works in this regard because the A.R. aro occupying the heart of Aizawl town since a long tine, and we want to lnovif they are likely to move out.

> I consider Water sumply very impreant because doctors who canc to Mizoram recently in connection with the outbreak of dysentery hevo warnod thet unloss we take pure water for drinking purposes, the sare ind evon more catastrophic epidemic may break out in futurc. isut Public Healt'l Dopartment which has to supply pure and safe drinking vater to public is too slow to meet the pressIng need of the peoplo. In my constitucncy this Departinent has proposed to purip water frorl Lamte river. It has. already brought up three truckloads of pines, but this work is not nearing completion evon after many wnths have olapsod. The water pipes are
simply lying near the house of the V/C President. And it is learnt that the scheme has again been changed and new proposal is to pump -up water fror Mat river, abandoning the first scheme.

In 22 June 1972 tinis Departrient called interview for the posts of $\mathrm{Fe} \mathrm{g}_{\mathrm{n}}$ and Chokidar. But till today, appointments have not yet been madeftheso posts. And I believe that there may be some secret reasons for this day. So the Deparment has to be stirred up in order to make it execute its worl rroperly and expeditiously. -

Furget provisions are made for extension of Hospitals at Aizawl and Lunglei. While appreciating this proposal, I would like to point out that dispensaries at Champhai, Serchhip and Thingsulthliah havo to be extonced. And in this connection I will also mention that Medical Departm int is slow in execution of its work. At Champhai dispensary, within ry Constituency, necossary medicines like EPC are not availaisle $\therefore$ Whon I wenc there last, I saw that there were only 15 tablets of APC. The Civil surgeon is also very negligent in sending medicincs to healith Centres. That is why many boxes of medicines are lying hore and there in the verandah of the Civil Hospital. Once I askect him to send thom to the Health Centrea and why he could not send them out. He simply tiold me that these could not be sent out as the Pharmacist at Lungpho loft the village. Then I asked him to post ariothor pharmacist there right awoy. That is the position of Medical Doparthent and it needs be re-extablished thoroughily.

Drought as caused intold misory to farmers in Mizoram cannot this House declare Mizoran as drought-arfected area ? Recontly I wont to Champai and saw that nany rice plants died for want of water. Small brooise sot dry. is a result of this, poor formers could not expect gcod harrest this year. Drought has become a problem in Indier also and hinisters in difrecnt States are busy with relief measures for poople in drought-affoctac regions. A huge amount of money, was given for this puryose. Vill it not be goud to follow tho same example as is done in other steates sirce our crop prospect is quste dark.

ITcre we sec that inimal Fusbendry, Soil Conservation and Forest are wader one ar? the sare Directorate. As such, the Director will dave mony-flod dutics to perform which is hardly possible for a singlo porson: If the Dirsctor hes great interest in Agriculture or Forest, ho nar notlect ininal Tusbandry. Therefore separate Directorate s'ould bo created sor Anjal fusbandry and Veterinary.

Iastly, Jistrict Vetorinary Officer should be posted in each newly created distriets of fizarl, Lunclei and Chhtmtuipui respectively. Thank you.

PU CH, SAPRAWING:
Mr Speaker Sir, actuilly I an waiting for the opposition Leader to speak and say as much as he likes so that I nay refute the points ho raisc: But he does not like to speak before me. In casc he nay want to contradict my points, I woulcl request hin to listen attentively to what I an going to say.

We have been vaiting for our Buaget for a lang time and at last we con have it before lis. There are some persons who said in some quarters that the dolay in Budget Session is due to certain party's recomendations to the Govt. to create difficulties since that party is not in power. But since we are having Budget Session now, probably they have failed to maku their points.

The amount of moncy in our fudget is not very big. But I think we have to make the full use of it within this limited period. First of all, I would like to point out that we are spending too much for renovation of this Assombly Fall. We mant try to get a new Assembly Halll. As such it is not proper to spend too much for this ole building. A new Hall is urgently needed for there is accomodation for only 30 visitors nere, which is too little. Iet us therefore try to lave new Assenbly Iall which vill be able to accomodate moro visitors to witness Session.

As we know, time is very short. In order to execute plan schomes in tine, a strone administrative machinery will be very irportant. If we do not have strong and efficient staff, this Euciget will be of no use to us, however big the provisions may be. We must also take great, care in making appointments for different posts so that rioney me.y be spent for the right purpose. I say this because in the past fow years corruption is very rampant in Mizoran end people arc now keeping watch on us whether wo are going to do away with tris bact and dirty practicc. Some Departments are very corrupt. This does not mean that all Departments are involved in corrupt practices. Meney must be usea to serve the right purpose.
are good, some are bad, anci sonc aro cificient while some are not. Some are working very harch whils sone are sitting idle, and some are honest while some are dishonest. Good and efficient officers must be taken into consideration while naking promotion. With regard to promotion, efficiency must be the sole criteria instead of seniority. If we neglect efficiency, wo will not be able to execute plan scheries in tire. I bilicve that it may not be possible to drive away corruption completcly. But I think it can be minimized to a great extent. To do this we must have a good and strong Administration. And those who are in high offices should first set an exarnple. I roquest the Fin'ble Ministers to kecp this, mind.

It is also inportent for the Govt. of Myoram to have concrete schencs. The Govt. should know the importance of each schenc and what should be cons first, so that plan schemes may not ond in fiasco. When we wore under tho Govt. of Agsem, there was a Planning Bard which lobked aftor Mizoram from a long distance. Thedfan of the work of tit Ftampannot be seen even today. We have now our own Planning Board and lembers of this Board must not necessarlly be Minist,ers and proninent persons.x. These persons must be given top priority in the soleation of members of the Board.

Agriculture is the first important thing for Mizoram and from the spoches nade by the Hori ${ }^{\text {ble }}$ 位 Members bofore ne, it is seen that reople solely depend on the Agriculture Department. As we are passing through a difficult time in our history,
people are depending tro much on T.T. and G.R. These must be given up as soon as possible. It is necessary to open Research Institute as pointed out by Pu zalawan so. as to rraduce nore paddy and vegetables. If the Agriculture Departnent continues to go on as it does, we will never make progress in agriculture field. It is no longer necessary to teacl the people to grow crops. But we have to teach them what kind of crops should be grown in dry terrace. To grow rice and crops wherever we like is not good. We the Mizos cannot be forced do things; howevor, we could be taught things by proper, coaching. What we need is proper coaching, so that we may know the right type of crops to be grown in the right lancl, and how to grow them in a most productive way. In this connoction I would like to point out that sceds supplica $b_{\bar{y}}$ Contractors cannot grow well as these are not good seeds. Aronest the banana seedlings aro included many wild variaties, so also, in the supply of pineapple cuttings many of them have no heads. We are going to keep a closo watch on the progress made by the Arriculture Department $\therefore$. . We may not be selfsufficient in foodstuff ovoraight. But this Department must make every efforty to make Mizorn self-sufficiont in foodstuff.

Last year the price of singer, one kind of cash crop, was quite attractive and very encouraging. Once a man was sent to the plains to study the market for finger. But he said that big merchants in tine plains would not like to buy Mizo ginger and this statenent groatly discouraged ginser growers in Mizoran. But shortiy after this, ar. Jther porson can and said that Mizo ginger will fetch a good price. It is therefore my desire that enquiries must be made about this man who discourased gingor-growers and brought to book for his false stament.

So far, the PWD in Mizora has earned a bad name. It nay be difficult to be totally ree mrn criticism. Since it is not very difficult to carn apprecintinn by doing good, somo improvement should be ained, and the Depactrantal authoritics should work harder towaris that end. I would like to riontion that I am not satisfied with the replies given by the fon' ble Chief Minister regarding this Department. There are no wire ropes in Tuichang river and it is not good that 3 chowlidirs shoulo remain idlo there. Very wrone thing is done.

Tho Dopertent of Boil Consorvation seems to be a a great success in Mzorna Roir mublour juantations, Betelnut and Cocoa plantations aro flourishing ovon today. Those rubhers are examined by oxperts and it is learrt that they cre good enough for dole in outsice markets. This will be rood source af income, and deserves encouriagenent.

Socurity Forcos are posted in Mizoran to enforce law and ordor. But their bonavjours often appoar to be undesirable. Recently it wos publisied in News:upers tlat mer of the $19 t h$ Punjab Reginent comitted rape on thre $\operatorname{liz} z 0$ innocent girls, and $T$ consider this a groat insul!; to the Mims perple. I would impress upon our Ministers to tako note of this. Soin days neo onv nan suspected to be an MNF escaped from custody and the lit. Governor ordered one Battalion of Sccurity Forces to reeaptur: ilit. It would be interes-
ting to know the progress of the enquiry beine beld in regard to the elleged killing of another man by tie Security personels. If necessary, some arrest, चay be made, but why the indiscriminate beatings ? We hate our own Legislature now, and our leaders must see that nothing untoward happens again in future. Our poople have very high bopes in pur Lerislative Assenbly and I hope our Leaders shall take steps to fulfil the hopes of our people.

PUK_LROCHAMA: Mr Speaker Sir, we nre now having the nuch-awaited Bulact Seasion. I an very grateful for this. As aiready pointed out by the Chief Wia, though provisions in our Budget are srain, I 2 afraid a huge anount would have to be surrendered as tirae at our disposal is very short. Considering the linited number of staff and time, I meally hapy to see that the Budget is now ready for ciiscussion.

In para 3 of page 1 the Finance Minister states that the Govt. of India are fully awarc of the peculiar circuritances prevaling in this arca and the noed for special care and attention in matters of development. This ficlds one rith great joy. As the Gort. are fully avare of the pecullar circumtances in Nagaland, special care is given to the Naces. And we have no time to mention al facilities eiven to the M.I..As and developnent works done in $N_{\text {agaland }}$ by the Govt. of India. So I would Itre to request the Hon ble Ministers to demend speciel care for lizoran from the Central Govt. where necessary.

In para 2 of page 2 wo aee creation of a
Consolidated Func of Mizoran. It is also stated that shortage of fund will not be allowed to stand in the way of our development. There is also additional fund for plan scherne in addition to provisions in the Budgct. This siven ne great condidence in the Central Gout. regirding financial help for Mizoran. As we cannot have this Buagot Session carlier, this fanancial year will have to be devoted for making proper fomation of administrative machinery. As such appointilents for different posts should te nade as quickly as possible.

A terible farine visited Mizoran enly a few years ago and distarbances miso broke oub in 1966. Wo cannot have high m hope. We are donoralised ant many pooplo resorted to begging. As we try to get every thin frec of cost we do not strive to be self-sufficient-in focastuffs ancl daily necossaries of lifc. It is now tine we toach the people to work hard for their living. The practice of making false pronecande iy some politicians will surely be a stumbling-block in tho way of develoment. Rather, we should teach and eamestly persuade the joopic to work hard, to be diligent and sclf-supporting.

In para 1 of page 4 we have creation of three Districts in Mizora?. Fut these districts do not have the same size of population. Also Thenzewl and Dunctlang GC are included in Aizawl District though they arc supposed to bc included in Lunglei District. This may creatc sonc difficulties regarding distribution

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of lands for f hum cultivation. ic is therefore necessary to revise the boundaries of these three Districts while keeping in mind the size of population.

In para 2 of page 4 we see that Pillage Consul adrainistration is beine looked after by Local Adninistratigat Department; but no mention is made about town administrator. at least Town Committees must be formed in the two town of Alzawn and lungle1s

In para 4 of page 4 , we see lend reclamation. Suitable lance must be reclaimed as early as possible. But in the proposal, there is to much dupllation for giving grants for reclamation. Both Development Block Agriculture Department and Soil Conservation Department are going scants for reclamation. This poor formers to the ground of unhealthy competition. It is therefore necessary the only one Department should deal with grants for reclafnation.

In para 5 of pace 4 , we sec proposed acceleration in developenbit works."This is very important. the Development Blcoks are at a standi-still as a result of disturbances and we are now to start. We must try to open 10 now C.D. Blocks in the next fit uncial year.

In pars 1 of page 5, the Hon 'bile Finance Minister states that the Govt. have decided to enlarge the existing two hospitals at fizawl and Langley by providing more staff. Indead Iunglei hospital needs special care aw oonsiceration. When the Lt. Governor visited Jungle town, he ordered that the hospital should be repaired; but till, today no repair work has yet been done to this hospital. The hospital has two Doctors only. At present one of them is sick and the other. is and for notion e. The former has to hire private vehicle as there is no Ambulance Van in this Hospital.

In para 3 of jose 6 of the Finance Minister's speech mention is mate about Insiastrial Training Institute Aizawl which is now a guest Institute at Srikme near Silchar. This is very wrong. It is as wrong as fishin; in ...: led river wile expecting to collect the fish from Tuichaing rive. Ie t it therefore be shifted to Aizawl as soon 2 possible. It nay also be necessary to point out that the Industry Department constructed ore Institute to bo used as Production Contra at Jot lane before ilisturberocs broke out in Mizoram. But this Institute is still bine cocupied by the Security Forces. It is therefore rocossany to order the security forces to vacate this Institute so the it any be used f. re the right purpose.

In page $\%$ of ina 1 wo sec creation of Directorate of Information tote. As Mizoran attained a new ancigher status, this Department assume more responsibilitios. This Department deserves to be called inbassacior and Salesman, such being the importance of the Department, District Information Public Relations Officers should be poster in Inyglei and Bribe. In Lunclei there is no Publicity Officer for ra lone time and the Block Development Officer has simply taken over chare of Publicity officer. Being aware of the importance of this officer, tho Deputy Commissioner of Lunglei has already written a note to the authority to post one such officer and I would like jo request the Minister concerned to take.mecessary action on this nation.

In para 4 of pace $\%$, we see that residential accomodition for for . Officers and wimers of the Assembly an a priority basjs. This propos.I rukes nie very ikpy for residential accomodation is very inportant for chabers coming from diatant villages. The existing Member Ifo tel also needs rerovation so as to make it fit for the Hon wle fembers of the Assembly.

Mention is also medo about supply of safe and adequate drinking water to the populution in rara 3 of page 8 of the Finance fiaister's spech. The Gove. cannot give sufficient supply of safe dribitg water even in aizawl town. In lunglei people are facine more difficulties rojarding water supply and the Public Health Departent in very slow fin doing its works. This Departiment is excoutine its worl so siswly and juat as it is "PHE" (a short flash of lint), their ativities are hardly noticaable. The Principal Businem told us in the wonth of June that he would supply adequate drinking water to the neople within 3 months. But tili to-day, not evcri a drop is suppliée. This needs thorough probe now

In para 4 of page, mention is nade about Electricity. In Aizawl town electricity is available for 24 hours but in other towns w: do not get enough supply of electricity. The proposed electric power to be obtained from Unium Hydel Project may not be available for Luarlei and Cihintuipui. As we find in tour diary of our Lt. Gover:or, it wili be better if we can get electric powers from the K artai Dan in Bangladesh. Before we do this, it is also necessury to coristruct a dam to generate at least 100 KW of electric power for Lunclei.

In page 10 of the Finance 仿nister's speech, we see Renabilitation. We nust be thankful to the Central Government for giving aidijitation lóan for rehcilitation and reconstruction, B-ut no provision is made for people wase properties were also burnt to ashes and who now living in towns so that they may be rehabilitated. 'This should be considered again.

In pase 12 of the IIonble Finance Minister's x speech, we soc th, Guvt. proposal regarding Edication in Mizoram. As a whole it is bood proposal and we anst be thankful for this to the Goverrinent. Scidnce Doparinont has already been introduced in Lunglei College. But it seens that no provision is made for construction of science juilding oi this College. I reque the Govt. of lizzoran to do the reedful.
