PU MAISNGZULDA:Mr.Speaker, Simplementary question - Ire Co-operative Socicties in Mizoram functioning only in name or with a jiew to achieving real success?

PU P.B.NIKHUMz: Mr.Speaker, Ne desire that Cc.operative Societies DY.MINISTER. function successfully in Mizoram. Some of the oId socretles are to be liquidatect.

PU LALSANGZUALi: Mr.Speaker, Supplementary question - Co.Operative Societics are vory important and they arc to be constituted into a bigger nepartment. Nevertheless, an Officer who is a Director of three different Departments is working as Registrar of Comoperative societies. Will the Socicties function successfully in this way? Does it not mean that they are neglected by the Governmont?

PU R.THANGLİNR.
MINISTER. Mr.Speaker, this is not due to negligence of the Government.Rather, it is rlue to lack of suitable officer for the post. The Govt is trying to find a suitable Mizo officernoftisirle to hold this post. That is the reason for delay in filling up the vacant post. Ono Secretary has to perform the duties of two or three officors for the time being.

PU C.INLRUATA: Mr.Speaker, the number of Co-operative Societies registercd is stater to bc ${ }^{\prime \prime}$, then what is the total number of Socictice now?

PU P.B. NIKHUMA: Mr.Spankcr, I cannot say now. Some of them are DY. NIKIETER. to be licuilater but have not yot been liquidated. I can toll the Momber of this later.

PU P.B.NIKHUM, Mr.Speaker, I qannot say whether the Govt. DY, MINIETER. will give grants to all of them. However, 21 of them"will. be given working capital and 16 others a subsidy grant each.

PU SAPLIANA: Mr.Speaker, last year, there was a proposal to give a grant of ps 1 in $n=3 /-$ to Service Go-Opermtive seciety at Saiha? But it is learnt that the Government have not yet released the sald fund. Is thil really so?
du P.B.NIKHUMA: Mr.Speaker, I cannot say the particular case DY, MINISPER. of Co.Operative Society at saiha. However, some fund's have not yet been relcased as the defferont' Co. Operain tive Societies could not function properly due to the disturhances and also duc to the shifting of Assam Co-operativeplank at Silchar on which depend all the Societies in Mizoram. Apex

[^0]Mr.Speaker, Point of order . Officials from the Department concerned must be present in the Official Lobby. But nobody is present today. This is very bad.

OU SAITEWMA: Mr.Speaker, Supilementary question * Here is a truc copy of the letter sent by issistant Registrar, Co-Operative Socicty, hizawl to his counterpart at Lunglei - it is stated "The Dcvelopment Commissioner, Mizoram is also against mushroom growth of Co-Operative Societyes, He had advised not to register too many Societics but only a successful few". Is the Development Commissioncr a policy maker ? Why is he against the mushroon growth of Co-Oporative societies? Is this the policy of the Government?.

PU LTESNNGZUNLi: Mr.Spcaker, Supplementary Duestion: It appears that only successful Co. Operative Soeieties are to be given registration. How can we know whethor they are going to be successful or not before they start functioning?

PU R.THINGLIANA Mr.Speaker, that is true to some extent. Most MINISTER. people appliec for registration with a view to getting grant-in-ald from the Government. is such what the Hon'ble Member has said just now is true. However, ir may not be good to 1 t down those people who would apply for rcgistration.

PU LNLSTNGZUnLu: Mr.Speker, supplomentary questions I cannot agree with the statoment that Co-Opcrative Socictice depend too much on the Government. They were given grant-in-aid after they had been functioning for a long period. Will it not be good to liquidatc thom if they are fanid ineffective cven after they were given grant-in-aid?

PU R.THiNGLINNA Mr.Speaker, that is true. Many people applied fore MINISTER. rigistration only because they cxpect to get grant_in-aid. It might not, however, be good to let them down when they applied for registration. Those who applicd for rogistration in the past expecter to get grants from the Government immodiately.
PU NGUPDAWLA: Mr.Speaker, State Co-Operative unions are found in other statis. For instance, we sce state sponsored Comprrative societies in Assam. These unions cellect differcnt instructions from cther states. Is there any proposal to constitutic such Jnion in Mizoram?
P.B.NIKHUMA: . Mr.Speaker, a Mizo Wholesale Co-operative Soctety EY. $X$ INIETER. hes already bcen constituted in the state level and it has also started functioning. This Society will supply materiais to the different Societies in Mizoram.

The question hour is over now. The next item is Obituary Reference on the comise of Rajaji. I will call upon the Hon' ble Chief Minister, Mr.Ch.Chhunga to give us a speech on his life-sketch.

PU CH.CHHUNGA Nor Soeaker, hore is the lifensketch of Rajaji CHIEF MINISTER. Enti -ajariopelachari, inc of thi great sons of India, the first and the last among the Indians who became Governor-General of Indie, rccipient of the Bharat Ratna, the highest National iward (1954) and one of the eninent ix freedom fignters of India died on 25th December,1972 at General Hospital in Madras at the age of 95.

## Following is a brief sketch of his life:-

He was born in 1878 and practised law from 199?. Then he gave up his profession and entered politics to fight for independence of India. He \&dited Mahatma Gandhi's "Young India" * during the latter's imprisontment. He was elected General Secretary, Incia National Congress in 1921 and Imprisoped 5 times during 1921-1924. He served as a member of theAWOrining Committege of during 1922-24. He was Prime Mirister of Madras during 1937.39. He left the Congress Party in April,1942 on account of differente of opinion. However, he assisted Mahatma Gandhi in the Gandhi-Jinnah talks in September, 1944. In compliance with the invitation of M.K.Gandhi, he returneत to the Congress Party in 1945 and became a member of eovernor-Gencral's Council. He was a member of Interim Government ?uring 19/6-47. After his retirement from the office of Covernur of West Bengal, he was appointed to the rank of Governor-General of Inclia 1947, and served as central Minister for Home Affairs in 195a. As one of the three members of Incian Delegation from the Gandiri Peace Foundation, he visited many countries to canvass support for the prohibition of nuclear tests. He founded the Swatantra Party in 1959.

Hc was also a top-ranising literay genius. He translated into Engilsh and Tami the Mahabharatta, the Ramayana, the Upanishads and many other wellmknown books. Iifter his dead body was wrapped in'the National Flag and laid in Rajaji Hall to enable the people to pay their last homage to the great leader. Rajaji was cremated in the morning of 27th December,1972. It is indeert a profounc loss for the whole of India.

Is therr any other Member who wants to make a short spcech on this? (Mombers kept silent) As we have heard just now, India lost a great man in Rajaji. We have no control over his soul. But it is our duty to follow his foot-steps and copy the examples ire set before us; we must also try to continue the works he had already started. This issembly will observe onemirute silencr as a mark of our heartfelt sympathy and homgge to the receasec Leaier whilc making exaltation for his invaluable works (Members rose up from their seats and observec? onc-minutes silencc) That will be enough. Please take your scats now.

Let me make an announcencint. In accereance with Article 9 of the Rulcs of Proce?ure and Conduct of Business in Mizoram Legislative Jssembly, Pu Lalkunga, Pu Sapliana, Pu Ngurdawle and Pi Pu Vanlalhruaia arc appointer to serve as Panel of Chaimen during this Session.

I want to announce also that we cannot follow our programic because the Business Arlvisory Commit,tee have to make some alterations in the programme already chalked out. The Budget is supposed to be presenter on $2^{-t h}$ March,1973. But the Government have some difficulty in presenting it on this date. as some new schmes are proposer? to be included in the buderei. We have received a letter this morning conveying the information to us tiat the Buaget will be ready for presentation on 24 th March,1973. The Chief Minister also apprised me carlier of this position on 14th March,1973. In view of their difficulty, we cannot but uncherstanc? their position.

Pu Saprawnga will not also move the adoption of the Business iskisory Committce now. The Committee will sit agrain at 12:35 in the afternoon after this meetinç is over.

Now, we will take ujp item NO. 5. In accorcance with the Rulcs of Procedlure ank: Conduct of Business in Mizoram Legislative Juscmbly, Rules Comnittac with 9 Members had been constituter last year. The speaker was tho ex-officio Chairman of the committee. The Cemuitt:ce sat oight times to prepare a draft on the Rules of procedure and Conduct of Business for this As sembly. I think all the Members have a copy of the Rules. Now, let Pu K.L.Rochama, a member of the Rules Committce place the Recommentations of the Committec on $T$ able of the House.

PU HRANGAIA: - Mr.Speaker, Sir, I beg to move that the Members of the kizoram Legislative Assembly asserubled in this third Session are depply grateful to the Iieutenant Governor, for the address which he has been pleased to dellver to this House to-day, the 15 th March, 1973.

SPRAKER :
Now, the motion of thanks on the Lt. Governor is Address has been moved. Let Pu Vanlalhruaia, the seconder speak on it.

PU VANLAIHRUAIA: Mr.Speaker, I second the motion of thanks noved by Pu Hrangaia.

SPEAKER :
The motion has been moved and is seconded by Pu Vamlalhmaia. We will have a debate this motion. We will call first Pu Hrangaia, the mover to speak on it.

PU HRANGAIA: Mr.Speaker, there are nany good tidings in
the Lt. Governor's Address. He told us many schemes which are already ivplenented but not the plan schemes for the future. Frox his address I know that we have many works to do in the programie he prepared for the administration of this land.

SPEAKER:

PU LALSANGZUALA: Mr. Speaker, there is no good tiding in the
Lt. overnor's Address. He mentioned about division of the Stete into 23 Police Stations. We passd.ademand for recruitment of Police last year; but. no appointnent was nade, though selection had already been aade.

Looking at para 3 of nis address, we can see that the Govt. did not pay attention to the special need for developnent of this region. According to information received by me, grants were not released in tine.

Para 4. R 18 crores were not spent fully last year and this shows defect in the adrinistrative machinery. I think we will have less provisions in the next Budget : I prepart many plan scheraes for ruy constituency wich has a population of $3.33 \%$ of the total population of Mizoram. Considering the whole plan schemes for the cointry, what I prepared constitutes only $.43 \%$. But no sanction was siven to these (Plan) schemes. While appreciating redemarcation of Mizoran in 20 new C.D.Block,
jurisdiction of Reiek C.D.Block.
State Transjort his not been a success in Horth Eastern India - eg., Assan and Natialand. The State of Assam incurred a loss of Rs 1.07 crores in a year in State Transport while the State of W. Bengal loses lakhs or rupees in Mini-Bus servire. If any person want to ran State Transjort as private enterprise, let then do so. We have purciased vehicles for State Transport but they have bocome unfic for use in no time. We have Taxi Service but there is no rogul jety in service. I have therefore no confidence in a State Transport.

Tho statement in para 5 seens tu be very impressive; but it is just like "Tell me the old, old Story" We have to do everything in the Secretariat level. Partality is also present in the implenentation of EGs scheme.

Para 6: It is quitc surprising to see that PWD has not yet constructed one mile $x$ an 212 wother road! while there is proposal for creation of 3 additional divisions, we are discussing Budset for crontion of 2 Divisions. We discussed Water Supply scheme last year. If the scheme is not implementod, things will not be becter for us.' It appears that peopie in ny constituency cannot get water supply regularly oniy because it is a constituency or a Consress Meriber.

I ana bit ashzied of self as I did not know that a new electrical division is created in P.W.D. We are now depending an Bangla Desh and Moghalaya for supply of electricity. So we must have our own Filectricity Board.

In Parn 8, we see programe for connecting zir-fed centres with roads. In the enstern side of the country, there are no air-fed centres. As such good systen of commuication by road has becone a pressing rocessity.

Para 9: reveals the Failure of the Government in maintaining 12 w and order. Iis a country where insurrection took place, such incident shoild nominlly be expected. To sum up, this aidress simily exyones the finilures of the Government this is ar attermpt made by the Lt. Governor hinself to cover it up.

PU LALKUMA: Mr.Speakor, tiis aidress deserves no motion of thans. I sue that only the most inportant plan sche ve: are to bu inimentod vile it is necessary to inplement all doveloy iantril :cho es. This should not be continut j.ir future. Mary 2 tine I pinted out scarcity of water for drinding purjoses ind inioraed the Chief finister that a file of the publie foaid Bninur has not yet reached the table of the p.if.E.Secretary. In, ite of all these, things reiain the sarle.

Nesity it lis very surpirising that we ran onort of sugar even 1 in Alzawl town, not to speak of the villages. This may be due to lack of sufficient number of staff in Bupply Offices at Silchar and Aizawl respoctively.

I therefore appeal' to the Government to look int this. With regard to Head Load Schene, I want to point out that the rate is very low in my Constituency. People would not be able to do this work. At present, there is no stock of rice at Kanghrmun and Phuldungsel. I approached the Supply Director and made some suggestions for speeding up the implem mentation of schemes; But many of my guggestions have not been given due consideration. It is my desire that alr droppi of rice should be done again to all air fed Centres before we can have good system of commundcation.

PU CH.SAPRAWNG : Mr.Speaker, I want to say a few words here regarding agricultural department. Great strees had been laid on the importance of agricultural depelopment in the first Session. Mizoram is an agricultural country and we have to give priority to agricultural development. In the past a huge amount of money had been spent for land reclamation and irrigation. In spite of the big figures we had in regard to lan?s reclaimed, we could not produce more foodstuffs. I am therefore afraid that money sanctioned for agricultural development will be spent for nothing again.

Besides, in order to improve agriculture in Mizoran we have to adopt Scientific methocls and mechanisc labour. Without these two itemf, mere bigger provistons will have no meaning at all:

Next, I want to mention that I agree with what Pu Lalsangzuala has said about bomb explosion at the Alzawl. Power House. The M.N.F. Hostiles had earlier announced inu the local newspapers that flags would be displayed on their. Indtondence Day. Such incidence occurred in the past alsor. I wonder why only one Sentry was put to guard the Power Howsc on that night. The Sentry sustainci bullet injury and the Hostiles also snatched away h1s Rifle. However, fortunateily, the main generator did not exploie. If it did, many lives would be lost. Where cioes the failure lie? The C.I.D. or the Police? Investigation should be made on this because it is very risky for the people.

PU 2ALAMMA: Mr. Speaker, I would like to change the motion of thanks on the Lt.Governor's Address to " a motion of Disappointment". We know the need of Mizoram in the field of development. The nascent State of Mizoram is underdeveloped and ladly needs good system of communication.

Out of the total provisions in the Buaget, only Rs 6 crores is to benefit the people. This is too insignificant compared to Rs 5 crores which is sanctioned for construction of a temporary capital of Assam State.

The spirit of the address is also vaque - is this due to negiigence of the Lt. Governor about developmental schemes for Mizoram or is it due to ineffeciency of the Government officials. The fact that we have only small provisions in the Budget indicate the failure of administrative machinery in Mizoram.

Where will 23 new Police Stations be located? Had those who were already selected las year join service? There is a proposal for re-organisation of Police set up, since nothing can be cone without seeking first" the Kingdom and his righteousness" 71 new appointments of Administrative Officors had already been made. Here I want to say a few words on their recruitment. Why die they call inverview only? Certainly" favouritism prevailed in the method of reruitment... I think no discipline will be maintained among them for they woull easily get protedions from the Ministers. Let us consider how other states are doing to bring about development. It is . also sad to note that many non-Mizos have been appointed as Head of Departments. Let us fight togethor forgetting the party foclings!

Only Rs 5 crores is proviclec for Plan Schemes. hs already pointed out by Pu Rawnga this is just enough for aŕ figriculture Department: We have many plan schemes. We have not yat built our own secretariat an", hizawl town requires super plan. While consulting Plenning Cormission, we must not depenil on plan schemes alrcady prepared by the Committec.

Tho provisions in this nuilget are too littlc. Hact Pu Frangaia known the real meaning of "Vote of thanks", he would not have mover. this moticn. amongst the different kinds of communication, great stri.ss shouli be laid on road communication.

If Rs 3.7. crores .nily is tio be ciotributed among 6 Divisions of the Public Works Department, the share of each Department will be very little. While works on buildings were executer? expeditiously last ycar, only small provisiort is made for these schemes in the curront Iu-fget. It seems that we are merely wandering in the desert of Paran!
ippointment of Frimari School T'eachers had
already been discusseci in the last Budget Session. What isi the meaning of "recruitment of another 2". L.P. Teacher is in progress?" (Pu Ch.Saprawnga: He meant what had been fone list Year) That is why I could not uncerstand:

Para 8: We need food to eat. The order requiring poor people who have no food ts repay the agricultural loans they had taken from the Govt. hould be withdraw immediately. While intwoducing head-load y oter by the Government, I want to mention that the cupervising authority must be persons of the same Blood. Tho e money which flowed ints the pockets of IVS K.K. Guha and Clihota Lal Seth would be enouph to make ten men of dizawl " born again".

One Officer at silchar who was working under the Gove. of ifzoram was instructed to buy a houre for use of inizoram House at, salchar. Knowing that this rould be for the Govt. he fixed the price of the houre as he pleaced.

We should maintain liw and order in the Country. I am very dienojointed to see the filure of the Government with ragard to pecirity meisuros. I have many di aopointments in the Lt.Governor' ${ }^{\text {a }}$ addrese.

PU S.THANGHUAMA: irr Speaker, the Honible Lt. Governor delivered his addrese to the rruse ye terday. In his addrese he mentionod plan schemer erecuted by the Govt. lant year and its future prosrames. I im opnosed to the " moti n of thanks" moved by. Pu Hr'angia, a merlber from the Ruling Party. To mo it is a "mation of face saving device". Lat ne tike voint by puint.

When recruitment for the ports of 71
