## PU VAIVENGA MINISTER :

I move the Demand No. 15 for Rs. $1,64,78,000,1$ to mect the expenses Fun: during the year 1973-74 on Midicn, Fiblic Foalth \& Family Planning in the Fealtin and Foinily planning Department: Fhank you.

Flrstly, I would like to say about their discipline. These officers need to be real humanitarians phisically and mentally. Same days passed. I Udent to a Civil Hospital to pay visf.t to my friend, but as I don't know where he was, I asked some nurses. But, they replied me to search myself. Though they were doing nothing, some of them were cveh dressing.So, I sala to myself, "I wish those nurses of hospitals in other counm. tries are here even though they may not be Christians". But I don't disclose who an I. Hospital is meant for those who are sick, who need healing. So, I want the Mizoram Government to urge thase stiff to look after the patients with eare and zeal.

Next, I would like to say again about their discipline. Wc were short of medicine due to small supply, but even than, the use of it is improper.

I had alrcady pointed out in the last ycar's budget session that even a single tablet of a $\mathrm{F} C$ cannot be had from Lunglai Civil. Hospital anci many othor dispensaries. There may have been some truth in the jokes that melicines shall be more in the houscs of unhealthy families than hospitals. It is net doubt $k f u l$ that medicines are leaked out from the staff. It is also clear that the supily of medicines by the Goveriment are misused in this way. Medicines can be purchased frim compounders, pharmacista, \& nurs s while there arc no medicincs in the hospitals. So, it is nocessary to be strict bocause all this rumours are true to sume extent and I would like to take action to those who are well : rym canght.

In cas of administration, it is not satisfactory in our clealing with hosuital compound. Especially, site for tea shop was allotex near medical hospital at Lurfglei and was finishod and accupicd already. But though it is ordered to bresk it down, even today, it stand with more customers. IE thuse who does not obey orders would sharc bencfit, our adm nistration will soon fail;

Fnd I woult like to add in case of posting. In the last year's budget, there is a sanction for C.S. in the Civil Hospital at Bunglei and 11 (eleven) specialists' posts in Mizoram. It seemed the appointment of C.S. had been done alroaly, I would like to urge the appointment oforeennd lapeciaiist in the C.Hospital beforc the end of april. and I beg to request assurance from the Ministcr i/c for Lunglei \& Saiha.

PU R.ZOLIANA : Mr.Speakor Sirk I won't be able to say all thu Departments under Domand No 15 but taking generally. that Rs 20,000/- harl been sanctioned for stipend for medical student in the last yoar's budget but it is 'nil' in this years' burlgct. Horc in Mizorart, we are wanting of doctors, $\begin{gathered}\text { non } \\ \text { non Mizos because of unsufficient stipend. }\end{gathered}$ Therc is allotment for about Rs 90,000/- under Plam for medical traincss which is ton necessary to undergo several trainings. And I want the Goveriment to give even nurse in , rural arcas and Group Centres if dispensaries are impossible.

Wo have often sade a lot regarding water supply of the Public Health Dcpartment. It will be very good to complete those schomes which are prepared under the issam Government.

Specially, about Rs 10,0000/- has been alloted for Alzawl LungleiaddSaina uncler maintenance and repaik. I beg to ask the Minister Whozther there is allotment under madntenance and repairs, which are neither plan nor non-plan.

## PU C.LALRUËTA :

 Mr. Speaker Sir, As the honourablemermber who siukf before me, it
can be rejardcal as of threo Departments. And I would like to have nore time for it. However, according to Pu Rochama, Medical Department is a corrupted onc. and I would like to point out the corruptions of Civil Hospital. Though the Mizo Director seemed to be very strict it is dangerous to misguide. I used to be with the staff nurses, doetors, and sweepers as I often visit the place due to illness. So, from it, I came to know that the one who keeps adminstration fails to exercise pawers. The onc is $\mathrm{S} D \mathrm{M} \& \mathrm{Fl} \mathrm{O}$ before but now it aneared that C.S. hive aministrative power, and there is no co-oneration at all. It will be very good if there is an effecient loctor and 4/5 effecient nurscs. Therefore, it is: necessary to change those staffuif pue want the livil Howiritaj. A's Agood. It is so necessary for the favour of the ponr and the rural people because it is pleasont fior inc appular men and not for the poor. The responsinilisios iny not on the nurses but on the authority winc keiss ite aciministration. If we want the Civil Hosplt.it ${ }^{\text {to }}$ ge gion. I, would like them to have staff meeting oftom, irstrucinincs how to behave or so by the authority. So, I wule likr the ficeltin Minister to make note of it.

I am afraid to be true or parcels lying in the hospital compound are due to non availam bility of transport. It will be good for the Government to to consider these quickly.

As I have said in the last year 's budget session, in many rural areas there are only signboard in the dispensary with cut any medicines. If our new Government alloted $2 / 3$ IV Grade staff in an interior places, medicines can be transported smoothly.

I think that we might fail to get more doctors according tor the reily of the hon'ble Minister. As we are in need of more doctors, it will be good to increase their pay also. Let those doctors from outside Mizoram he given special allowances, if not in such interior placis

- could never get doctors. So, I beg to request the Government to put this in mind.

Though Pif works smocthly, but It is complaint in many places. During the former preperation of budget. I sukmittod prayer for water supply in many constituency. Fut they heptinel me in a negative due to unmotorabile roads. After this, I submitted again mentioning the people are willing to do the wark in self help scheme. But, as we look into the - budget look Rs 400,000/- is alloted for Serchhip and given again Rs 400,000/- below. In some place, though we asked very often Senction ia not given. So, I want the Govermment to give sanction on same equal basis.

PU VANLALHRUAİ: Mr.Speaker Sir, One thing which I hear in mind is that, same honorrable members want the swift development of Medicial Department. In comparision with the days while we are uncler Assarn Govornment. We have achieved lot of develorment in hizarl as woll as in rural areas. I would like to sey thet if the same coccor refused to sign his prescription, i= is tiis own fault regarding medical remimbursment.

In the Errmer inulget. I, myself
also spoke a lot for more purctiren if vehicie for smooth transport, but evon then, mention hes not been made in the budget. And $I$ would ifinc toc take load of medicine by Civil Supirly rate.

Further, I wovic ilike to korid
staff quarters in rural areas liy juca bilaincs not a mere huts as well as dispersiry and horpital. I'his year, mry constituency has in been included in the budget rcgercling PFm but $I$ : $\boldsymbol{i} y$ would like to fstow wheqther they really function.

Water Supply in A1zawl is not proper. The moluryir used to supply water while drunk. used to sell one Gailon by Rs 5/- and leave at half day. Therefore, for such water supply, ar efficient staffor are required.

The present $C_{\text {ivil }}$ hospetal is unable to lodge more patients. -10 , it will be very good to open on in the southern area which is said to be done. As Adzawl is now a blg town, only one hospital could not hold. Therefore it is very important to put this in mind.

Again, I would like to know whether the Government could manage medical relmbursment fndm Durtlang and Serkawn hospital. Thank You.

PU J.THANGHUAMA : Mr.Speaker Sir, It seemed that the Ruling Party moved no confidence motion, even though we
need not their help. As we are discussing budget today' I am not like, the Ruling Partt Chief Whip who said to speak few but spoke for a long timex, but $I$, would like to say as long as you can spare time for $m e$. I had been for about one week at Civil hospital. Though I find the stafep are good but it scemed that there is one thing improper in its administration, regarding the transfer of many nurses, and the promotion of many nurses. It is very hal that warm water can n: not be bod in the hospital. Only thuse who are in private ward and those known to kitchen yersonnels can have it.

And it is very bad that mention had $n$ not been made for blood transfurtion. Somedays back, one patient is taken to Zemabawk andi again to Durtlang due to non-availabllity of bllod transfution.

It is also very necessary to improve X-Ray and electricity supply.

The non-availability of modicine
In the dispensary is sometimes cuo to the changing into liquor. The distrimution of me?icinc by pharmacists need to be listed daily. So, I want the daily expenciture be recorded.

The patients in the dizawl Civil
Hospitals are given prescription ane neccl to purchase it. For the Government servants it is not elifficult as it $c$ an be re-imbursed from Goverument. But for the poorer classes, there is no way for re-imbursement. Therefore. I want it to be refunded for the poorer people.:

And it very had that there is
often no sugar supply in the hoapital while there is a lot in various tea stalls. If it is not supplied by the cintractor, let another contractor be cauled for it. If there is no stock, It should be considered specially. Thus though I have a lot to say more, there is no more time, so, let mo end up here.

We are facing various difficulties in the villages, but with the help of public, we are trying to construct a temporary houses for the Doctor \& Nurse Quabers.

In casc of the Medical supply, we did not have a firm from wherc to be bought, but now, we are having such and we also made.rules.so that it can be purchased also from our local dealers. A central store is proposed to be made.

It is rather difficult to send medical goods to the villages and we sometimes sent with the help of Transport Department. But now we are having our own Medical Vchicles and besicles we use civil vehicles aslwelldagrade IV is also added and they will do by a head load system where vehicles cannot be used.

Food supply in the Hospital has greatly improved now. Formerly, the rate was fixed at Rs2.25p for once, but it goes up now to a rate of Rs.4.00p per meal.

In the casa of posting, there arime a question whether the doctors from aoutside would like to come here and if we fill up all the oacant posts now. our mizo medical students will be unemployed. We are now having 16 doctors.

It is also proposed to put more dispendaries on different places. The rcason for the insufficiency : of Vehicles is due to the company who are very slow.

As the hon'ble mambers said, stipend is not included in a non-plan. Let all these be what we could say about the medical department.

Andi, $P$ H E is under our Medical

As a report that reached me, there was a great corruption in the dopartment of soij donservation. It is rather a miracle about a Range Officer at Lunglei who has lakhs of rupees. The wage was received uptill the $15 t h . J a n u a r y$, but thbse who received were very few of them. I want to know by whose authority this was ordered and by what rule it was done. And also why the wages were not given fully if it was ordered ?

Last year, there was a motification regarding the issue of seeds. Here, instead of supplying the seeds of bannanas, the plantain seeds were issued and I wish that this thing will not be repeated this year. A nd as such, the seeds of rice also stould be checked a carefully.

But due to lack of water supply, especially during the autumn, it may almost be impracticatio in our billy regions. I likes the Agriculture Department to think alout maling arains or taking by pipes in such places.

Treve are trictors and power tiller
besides buldozers. Buti the power tiliar coams to be advantageous for the recleimod vally. . fields. However, there are many ficlis which are alreaty reclaimed in our country anci for those who can not purchase power tillar will still be bencficial if we can give them for hirc.

Lastly, in cur Budget book of page 327, there appoars the case rojarding the Demonstrator. It says that they membered 35 altogether. There is a rumour about arialgamating some Gramscvaks in the Agriculture Department. There are various Gramsevaks and the sevikas as well. We all knew that the sevikas are facing much difficltics in particular. For they (Gramsevoks) were working in the Blocks, too, they are sald to be hanving trcubles in case of their services. I therefore like our ministry to pay attention when they are taken in the Agriculture Deprerment about their services.

PU R.ZOLIANA :
Mr.Spoeker Sir, I havo to say few worts on lemand 10.16: There are three तifferent ? epartment in the agriculture thouigh we lici ret yet give much noticc. Our Finance Minister sai: in his rpecch that this budget is prepared for the improvemont of our economy.

Hgriculture is quitc important for the development of our country, but there is not sufficient money when we look at it. The time had already
come to mechanise our acrriculture. If it is possible. I think it will be for better to buy rice out of the money we get from such agricultural crops like cauliflowers, etc.

I am alsc sugcesting to cipen a training centre in our country so that we can clearly study our soil.

> It is rather a surprise to me that even after spending large amount cif moneyrs it was not successful in the agriculture. We can be success fullto make paddy fields in such places like Champhal, Vanlalphai and the region of Mat river near Bawngchawn.

There is not any constituency that has no pases for purdy ficlis, rut there is none to be seon preparing pacy ficlas. Thorefore, rather than writing on the trble only, we must ? $?$ the recil work. Our peonie know well which soil or whith region will be suitable for the padics or rice, and so we can make the asriculturc success by lockinc those familles and by cxamining them from time to time who will work hardly. I think we can make a progress by doing as such.

Since the timi of the hssam Government we were doing only an experiment, and not the real work. We should practise the system if terracing or Dry terrace, if not a rice field. We should also havc a good road for the promotion of the Agriculture. Thank You.

PU C.CHAWNGKUNGA : Mr.Speaker Sir, In Demand No.16, its Budget is satisfactory and I am not going to criticize it. But
we are still practicing the same method in case of our Agriculture as our fore fathers usec to sractise whith they were seltling on the regions of Rûn and Tiay. Therefore, we must change our way of cultivation. We should consider the exact time when the seeds will be sown and so also the places which will be suitable for such seeds.

Certain experts had come out from Gauhati or Delhi and they advised of making a terrace. But that was failed.

I an sorry for we did not pay
enough attention upon the Agriculrure. We were under the Assam Government. for many years and what did we get in the Agricultural devolopment till now? It is next to non. The Agricultural Department must be careful in contiributirig grants. It must be given to those who are doing the real work. Let the Agrinulture Department teach the veillage fommers the right way of sowing aeeds and let good plants or sec?s be distributed among the cwltivators and so also the usage of fertilizer, etc.

PU 2ALAWM : Mr.Speaker Sir, When looking at the Budget Demand, I am afraid there may not be an improvement in the Agriculturc. It is also difficult for three departments are under one Dircctorate. There is not even a sufficient money to buy required-machinos etc.

Wg used to discuss durlay the time of $D / C$ too about building in Agriculture of Research Institutc. But there is not even a proposal and scheme uptil now. I think we can be successful as the other countries are doing by sendinc out trainecs etc. to foreign countries.

If we test our soils very carefully, we can locatc the suitablc places for certain plants. There are many flat lands to be explored like those places of Saikhawthlir and some parts of the wostern area, and also the area of Teirel. If tractors and bulldozers are put into service, there cin be a land of around 1,000 acres. to be utilisce which will benefit us to a great extent.

PU R.THANGLIANA Mr.Speaker Sir, when I learnt that MINISTER : our members afe having an interest upon the Agriculture and I am glad for $1 t$. When I listened attentively some of the members sald that rather than the experienced or educated persons, the local people have a better knowledge while some of us have a suggestion of sending out trainess to other countries.

You have said that since that period while we were under the Assam Government., we had reclaimed many parts and spent lots of money for that, but there was not much to reap and it is unsatisfactory: But what is to be certain is that as our members i sald we will not be going in time to come in our agriculture as we are now. Our present method of $j$ huming ia cutting down trees and burning up later on. We only spoil our soils in this way. In the future, as our population is increasing gradually it seoms that we will surely use the method of tecracinge anf w由 will also be mechanising our method.

In the case of Land recladmation
we are in recelpt of Rs. 5 lakhs last year, but they said land reclaimation will not be suitable on Agriculture side and it will rather be done onthe side of soil sotli" In the case of labour mechanisation, we are going
to buy 2 (two) bulldozers and we sru in roceipt of 8 (efoght) power tillers as woll which brua ht to merc than 20 power tillers totally with these which wie had already.

There is onc thin:; which must be considered carefully. We plece cur awor tillors in those places like at Bilkhawtriir and Vairentc. But cven for ploughing 1 Bi ha, there is much consumition of petrol and the Driver can earn Rs.21/- for ploughing 1 Bi gha. There arc some poople whe preferre? to draw in cash than using the tillcr. For such cases, we have varlous difficultics. It ajpoars that terracin; could be successful since it was done with success at Kolasib and Sinphir. Thercforc; wo made a suggestion to spend more money for the land reclaimation. We are now heving many flat lands that are not yet ploughod or tilled. If therc is not a flat land, we - suggest that it will be terracing hill side. For this purpose, we are spending large amount of money in many parts.

Anyway, as our member Pu Chawngkunga satd, the public must try to step forwarcl in the Development. There are ome people who would like just to araw out money but without showing any good result. If we are not trying to step forward, we will surely face varicus difficulties whether it is in the Agrim culture or Development. The people should not think only about the çrants or aids from the Goveinment, but they should do the real job without expecting only grants from us. The public will work, only after which the Government will give them grants and certain aids.

There might be some mistakes in the es. Supply of Agricultural seeds as you have already pointed out, it will bc fone this year more carefully. The question has arisen on the usefulnesses of the Demonstration Farm. For instance, the Bry Terrace had been done at Thingeawl to know whether it could be done without taking water, and this may fic used as an example for the aim of the Demenstration Farm.

When you asked about placing four seact departments under one Directerate, you may misunderstood the fact. It is only that such departments are looked after by one offecer (Director) and takes all the charges for we could not find on officer for each of those departments. Fcrest and Soil are treatcd as one Directorate while Agriculture and the Andmal Husbandey are having
the same Directorate. There are some of yoy who criticized the Director that he is not fit enougly for his post: but we did not find his unfitnesses so far.

When yoy have polited out about pending to locete eertain officers in the Department, the fact is thet the character roill 1 E vary important regarding officers. Now we've got that roll and it. will not be too long to. locate them.

If we have a confidence for the successes of terracing, we will be expecting some 1 amount of money from the North Eastern Council which has 50 croces. We will then make a scheme for $4 \pm$.
I. widilreply to what Pu J.Thanghuama said on miscellaneous parts that such orders should be given and they can order any person to do the work. But as our Flnance Mdnister said, Rs 25 lakhs had been drawn and for that, they might not be able to repay their commentments very soon.

We will place the officers at Lunglei and Alzawl sooner or later. We are not having large numbers of Forest Guard here at Alzawl for we seat many of then to do counting work of bamboos and we are employing many persons as a daily labour.

of the villagers. reason for its failure in our country. Our country is facing various difficulties due to disturbances and during those 7 years of troubles, many co-operative Societies had to be liquidated and our Minister i/c also informed the Housc last time that"they are liquidated! The man who made a sujgestion to liquidate without having any unclerstancing for the dieturbances is F.C.Deb, the Wissistant Registrar of Coroperative Societies, who is quite corrupted person.

Those who are having an interest in
the comperative Socicty knew very well. If we spare him too long. bewill, surely spoil the comoperative and we must try to chase him out, and I would like to suggest that.

I would further like to say that
large members of Grant-in-aic for different co-operative Socicties had been blockod by him (P.C゚Deb) faor the year 1972-73 ank I knew this very well. It is clear that he was trying to make the condition of Myzos as bad as possible.I want the Goverbment to consider his case and take the matter seriously.

I had also found that he despises
the Mizos very much. One of my friends who was registered at Comperative Society anrl also recommended even by the A.O. went to his residence. But the Assistant Registrar asked him whether he is trying to use unfair means. Therefore, I want him not to be at a key point for a longer period. I also like the duthorities to

PU C.LALLRUATA : Mr.Speaker Sir, I would like to say on the Community Development and also regariing the Comperative if there can ba a time. In page 411, it reads about Reclamation
 mation: But, I have found that the money which was sanctioned for 1973-74 for the reclamation is less than thejamount spent between May, 1972 and March, 73. We are depending upon those money of about $20,000 /$ - or so which we used to receive for the community Development. I want to suggest for the Health and Rural Sanitation to take higher step for the prevention such diseases like dysentary,etc. Which used to spread in the villagers and even at Mizawl.

When I visited the villages, the public requested me, and I think it to be quite importabt that for the better health of the public, those materials like D D T or Phyrncl etc. arc rcquired very much to be sprayed at public laborateries or any other places. I want thosc to je sont out to the vellages as much as possible.

I further would like to say on the money for the communicasion in the community Development. The provision for this year is less than that of last year and it is only Rs $2,00,000 /=$ while it. was Rs.2,86,000/- last year. Therefore, I would like to requested that can this be made into a bigger provision. Though there are lerge amount of money in this comminity Development, but large numbers of them will be spent for the salaries of the staff: so the remaining few will be spent for the real workd

In Crash Programme much money is
involved, about 12 lakhs of Rupees it is also utilised for construction of Pley-ground in this regard what 2 find I feel we need to eonstrutt Community Hall in Grouping Centresprin important places. Wc all know that our land is a land of Politics, we want to visit our raspective Constituencies, even during the interval period of election, our Government high officials, other important officers and leaders of our Government are travelling every now and then, but we don't have a good and suitable place to held public mecting. Hence I believe we need to have and construct suitable comm munity Hall in Villages; Grouping Centres if we cannot afford such, in important places.

I would like to inform our Ministry and workers/Government servants regarding the development and corruption involved in the Defelopment progm rammer what we take is obstruction in the progeess, and the cause of the difficultics of mlock functioning is that the Block Committee which nad been established Freviously is now defunct, I feel we urgently need re-establishment of this comaittee.

Let Block Development Committoo
De made in cach Block, with the membership of the constituency M.L.A., if possible, and giving special cofsideration to the $V / C$ and the Members; I think that will surely verify and cilakrall disagroments between the
public and Government Servants with the wadication of doubts, disbalilef and ndstrust, without proper reason thereof. between the two opponent groups.

Hence, I think it would be favoum rable to re-make Block Development Committee as soon as possible.

PU NGURDAWLA :
Mr.Speaker In, I would like to make Statement regarding Demand N 0.17. I wonder whether our Member who spoke before me is not so clear about it; I have once been in Comperative Society, like in Saitual'. Kolasib etc. which was profitable, so also in Thingaurthliah. We have made profit, and the time of seccess was the period of hardship in foodstuff and essential comoditles.

But In Comperative Society there are certain rules to be followed, like giving report each and every month, but if communication is not good, it may be difficult to follow every rules, hence it may be necessary to ilquidate to some extent.:

In Cownoritive soc: Sety manager's position is very impostanc: az the Department is in his own hands. But, if: ju: our Hon'ble Mcmber sald Grant was not senctiorcä Busing 1972-73, verification will be necessary.

Now : a car make the purchase in whole Sale, what has reen in :.inchar is now here in Aizawl, anyhow, we cannot say this eociety is a failure', fut if they had made unrar profet by corruption', it can make one a ricin porcon. Howerer, the Soclety needs examination ari vorification, there arise unfaïa, unproper tritncis lorause te cannot make preparation of Audit very smarily. if ve are to cohcentrate on it we shall have to deal with it in state Level. Besides, this Societ: is not of Government property, it is quite useful ift it is active, our land and Government needs to male this thing.

PU R.ROTINAIA : Mr.Speaker Sir; Hon'ble member Pu C.Lalruata proposed the reestablishment of Block Development, I support his proposal to re-maire j.t as was done previously, as it i.s probobic that it may be good for many people.

Bisides, the condition and position of Gramsevikas does not appear, as their conditions of previous time, they requested me to state it herei,' and I personally feel necessary to state it. I shall be thankful if the Virister i/c could inform... me the condition. I trink eacis and every block is of the Alw India Pattern, with Gramscvikas in such Block; previously, even there in our land, however, since the outbreak of disturbance the staffe pf Development Department are transferred to co ciffferemt works in P.P.V.Centres; Iikewisc, Grarisevikas are posted as Clerks', which are not their concern with the disappearance of their activities. ilitin cur coming to new Standard with many new officers and leaders, I wonder whether such officers and leaders, who don't know the detail condition and situation of ilizoram, think the activities and duties of such noonle are no longer. necessary for My zorim, since the activities of Gramserikas disapperied; I take this to appear as abolished. Besides giving employment to Employment Department
Stafferi there are our litzos who are undcr-taking or

going Gram Sevika training, some who have finished training and working, if they are to berdischarged What and how will be their position and conditions Suppose, individually they are to be given another work, if we are trying to let new 20 Blocks function who will perform the duties of the Gram Sevikas ?

We still have Women and childrem programme, who will perform such duties? It seems we are not going to employ qualified tralnoforson, I am sorry about this matter. Wherever there is Development Block; people progressed in moral standard and other standards. In this regard, Lady S.E.O., Gram Sevikas are very us eeful. I shall be very thankful if our $\mathrm{Hon}^{2}$ ble Minister if could tell me the details of $1 t$.

PU SAPLIANA :
Mr.Speaker Sir, on Demand No. 17 first of all I would like to make statement pegarding Co-operation
Society. Hon'Ble member Pu Saitlawma stated before me, according to what I have seen and learnt, I wonder what is the position and condition of Aizawl Comoperative Sociery Officers and staff, and I have invesm tigated about it to some extent. Iu Ngurdawla stated that he does not know non-release of money besides the period between 1972-73; I have learnt something which I shall say.

In the period tetween 1.970-71, the
Saiha ser*ce Co-operative society was cstablis ed, electing Members to it, but after the outhreak of disturbance it could fupction no longer. The Salha S.D.O., Rajkhowa, helped in the estabilishment, the old members were active in the new Society; after that the sanctioned money, $R_{3} 1,000 / .$. is still not released till today, as I have learnt. Tio recelve the sanctioned money Pi Darthankima, D.I.S. was selemeted, he came many times to Alziwl to. receive the money, but till today I don't know the release of the money.

I have enquired about it somedays back, they told me that the money is not yet within their power and catch, hence I support Pu Saitlawna's statement and point. I am not sure whether I am not clear about the co-operation, I feel the strength is Insufficient. Mizoram is now proceeding as under three District Administrations, I think in each Bistrict theee should be at least Gometing. In Aizawl District, Lunglei District and Chhimtuijui isistrict, there are many and sufficient service Comperative Society and different kinds of $S_{\text {ociety, }} \tau$ feel these dererve encouragement. Though one Hon' ble member said that Society did not come out successful in Villages, I think It is quite seccessful according to what I learnt and witnessed. They ake quite interested even by headload they would carry something from Lunglei and other places, and sell; in villages as there is hardships serviae 0e- operative society is quite successful. But. Instead, if:In Aizawl. Junglei and ehtimatipui Consumer stock had been opened, supplying articles to the village, making the strencth a strong one, J. think it is worth encouraging.

As our Hon'ble Ministers have told us, 20 Community Development lock ane to be ofened, in this ragard Development havennt functioned for a long time as they have had no proper function since the outbreak of disturbance, hencic our Ministry should make appointment and other thilgs as soon as possibke and post stefint in treir costinacions. In villages, in Developmental vur:: Tr nustrices should be opened and Graft should to given intorect, in some places there are sufficient an cuailalc matcrials where such kind of small ocmle Incustrian coulcl be carried out. For example, vill igeis axint much quantity of handicraft works and other of sucin small scale products, like latlice works an askets; by tiaking interest in these small scalc Inclusurios with encoum ragement much omployment can be ciiven to pouple In earning livelihood.

Previously, in Villages projoct concern was quitc useful in Santation, hence I feel our Blick Officers, staffs etc. should pay attention and help in gulding the people to he careful about treatment of Latrines, whether fublic or private,
forbldaing or prohititing people to pass waste- products near around sprtrigs and water-places, and tender care Of cemetry eticid villages, road radiether meass of $q$ commancation are the main hardshipt they hene previously received grants, Funds etc. From Community Development side; attention must be paid co InterVillage Path where communication by Motor Vehicles cannot, reach, constructing Motor-able road between one village and another, or P.W.D. road for communication between .illages. That is all I want to say regarding this Demand.

PU P. D.NIKHUMA
DY.MINISTER
Mr.Speaker Sir: on Demand No. $1^{\prime \prime}$ members said very interesting and important matters, especially regarding Co-pperative concern, I.feel quite informative and pieased to hear. Hon'ble member Pi Saitlawma stated his gin which is a probabletruth. In U.T. Government there are new, strenge things, and it is quite difficult to work and function to the satisfacs tion of people.

Regarding Grant-in-ald, the question of no-release of money during 1972-73 has been put to starred Question some days back, I think we have replied to it in this very House. As I have sald, there is intention to give Grant-inuald to 16 Society, besides; giving capital contribution to 20 socleties; there is something to say regarding the non-release of the grant till today.

This Co-Operative Society staff faced much trouble and difflculties as a result of disturbances, Inspectors and most of the staffik are appointed as A.O., this could make delay of works; regarding giving of grant money, it has been drawn. and shall be gicen after examination by the officers concerned.

In Society also, there is airule; by -
Law, if the Society to be assissted Dy-Law did rat mpt meet the requirement there cppid be difficulty and hardship', hence the grants should be given only after carenl consideration and examination.

We have also stated the difficulties met by this society in the 1 lust year Budget session, this Society met much difficulties even in Villages because of the outbreak of disturbances; besides our peopletstdit lack Co:Operative Rociety idea, hence, it is necessary to consider and improve the quality Instead of Registration of all the societies, so it is impossible to register all the applicants. After careful; and gradually ennsidering then, they: shall be registered. The question of while Sale-Co-Operative whether established in a state iovel or not is, it is established in a state. ievel.

Pu Sajiana's question regarding whether there is intericion to establish such society in the three District: Counciis is that, after careful consideration such socj.ety shall be established gradually', considering the standard and situation of the places. Anyhow, as we have said, our previous 19 Inspectors are appointed as A.Cs, so i.t is not easy to consider and examine the condition right away, however, these grant money shall met linse, and shall be gradually released.

However, if they say, keing a eran Sovika, they want 20 job other then Gram Sevikas: jomis, it is their own responsibility and concern. In case of trining, trained
persons acquired skill and knowledge, it is good to hear it, however, if Goyernment could employ then, s well and good, even if overnment cannot employ them, they cannot simply ciaim by right; the condition and process is that it is well and good if there is emm ployment of them.

They have stated the matters of Gram Sevikas, I did not reply then because now is the right moment to make statement regarding the subject matter, Gram Sevakap have good Training in Agriculture also, of 2 years Training period, there is no promotion channei for them. In one Block there used to be one senior Gram Sevak', therefore, having same Training course and period with Agriculture Demonstrators; putting then in one and same cadre, if they had been posted as Extention Officer in Block just as Agriculture Inspedtors of Agriculture Department are posted as Extension Officer in a Block, there is better chance for them; there is such consideration; otherwise, the possible inconvenience is that, Agriculiure Demonstrator who have had the same training period and course can become Agriculture Inspector after 10 years of servicif, while senior Gram Sevaks shall have to be under the authority and command of Agriculture Inspector Junior class, there is mistrust between the too and control of one over another is quice difftcult. Though this is not yet fixed and aoproved. there is intention to do. so, in fact there is entention to put them in one and the same cadre:

As I have previously daid, Gram Sevikas shall, have n8 trouble and hardships, if they had already rebdered service, as there are not many in member, some are posted as L.D.As and Typists in some offices.

There is meation fif insufficient sanction money for Land Reclamption, which is quite true, let us examing and $i \in v z e w$ our present year process, we decided to sanction some money for road construction, as it. is difficult to progress and function In Development like transportation of rice. Supplyt we sanctioned about Rs 11 lakhs for construction of road for Chhimtuipui District, besides these,
thinking that there is provisior for Land Reclamation and to increase Agriculture Product we hevc prepared much sanction for it. fs yc heve said, if prosent yoar's spending and utilization of noney is seccessful, it is probable that we may surcein more form Biock $k$ Fund for Land Reclamation, of contrilly sponsored seheme. Such is to be the procolure, however, if you say that, you should open Brock c-riier, if we say other things are not difficult, there is truth to some extent; we have stated it some days that ther is connection with Administration, this neers coreful consideration. Block Devclopment Committee can he made as soon as 20 Blocks are opened, thero is no difficulty and trouble involved; proviousiy, so to say, even till today, Block functions in name, bout to take caution there is no staffa to neme, we have te: go ron like that, it simply moeas that wo cannot yct follw the general precodure, to be followed, it is not that there is no intention te carry out.

PU R.ZOLTANA : Mr.Speaker Sir, as Hon' ble Finance Minister stated, the sanctioned money for the period 1973-74 is sufficientl', but I have one point which is doubtful. I would like to point out the matter of Grant-in-aid; in this Budget it is made to concern each Head of Department, arantw inaald in kind, any Cash to Mahila Samtti Industrial Institution is found. I find the procedure of giving Grand-in-ald to villagers improper. I think we paid to the wrong ones, not to the right ones. I think I would mention mechonery concerns, like saw mill. Mechanic Carpentry, and the requirements of toold for carpenters (Mistiri). There is Grant for Sugar manufacturing machine, saw mill and the timbers, of good quality, manufacture of Kapsari Sugar etc. I think Sugar is worth labouring and planting, in large quantity.

In Sialsuk village; there are good quality Sugar cape, which are not manyfactured into Sugar', we don't have the manufacturing machine, efen only in my constituency I thindi I shall need at least 100 maniufacturing machines, I think we can buy that much. We all know that we cannot be successful in our rice cultiyation, and in the mothodkif we had increased abd paid attention to Agricultural crops, like Potatd, SugatTo plant Sugar-cane but to have no manufacturing machine, to plant turmerle sut to have no manufacturing machine is not a good condition, because we still import then from other states, instead, if machines had been installed for Mizoram, as it is not proper to send it outside Mizoram. I want our Government to pay attention to this thing.

Now, let us mentión aloout labour. while we were under Assam Goverament in Employment. Exchange, two posts of Asstt.. Employment Officer $\cdots$

## FU Ch.sabrafinge: Mr.Spoeker $\mathrm{S}_{\mathrm{ir}}$, I would like to

 make short statemont but important and rel:want on mattors of Indus. trial grant, I would roquett our Minister and the Department concernei to see to it. If we look to our Budget, the previous procenire is repeated, it is good to some extont, as it is difficult to find out new method; only recently much machines have been distributed, like Rice Hullcr riachtrc, sewing machine and other machincs, along with loans, grants. I feel painful of it', as I think it loes not concarn and point devem lopment of our lanct, however, we all know that to think we need to.start from small scalc scherne. We nced to consider the suitability of the machines with our lands condition. What I think to so suitable and what should be good for our land is that any Incustry should be started on Forest or Agriculturel Ease, for example: if we arc to start on Forest beso, we should think what $c a n$ be useful, of forent materials, we can utillse, What appears in my mind is fibro, the most casily available thing in our land the matcrial, roselle, rosemallow, Indian or reci-sorrel which can grow everywhere abundantly, and the fibre is $r$ od and long lesting, mouh mor much morc long lasting than zize of the plains, I think it is high time we started to consider the development. Wc started sericulture long ago, I really
don't know whe Introduced sericuiture to our land, some say it is good bet I तon't bblect if he continues to labour for 1 t so long as he finiós it good, however, we need to condider what is suitrible for our lands' cllmatic conditiens, therfore I want cur Incustry Department to make roselle plantion just as $i \stackrel{\text { thas intwo- }}{ }$ duced seciculture farm. From that plantation farm, experiment could be carried out in the best method of how to take the fibew, from the fibremeterials, ropee carpet and other materials can be made from roselle. fibre, I belleve such could be made from the fibre, we just have to put colour to make it attractive; we 1 mported such materials from the platns at high costs. Likewise, we neglected other plants which may be quite useful, but these plants can be grown opplanted abundantly in any place. If we had cultivated, and thought of the improvement. I believe it can be useful for some purposes as the fibre is a bit thinner and smaller than roselle-fibre. Let our Industry Department spend much money for it, if wekan utilise our local materials and make successful result, that will be what the people have long waited for, and profitable for the people. I helleve we could carry out this experiment successfully, and installed the machines here in Aizawl it would be quite successful and profitable. If the Demand Increased, roselle can be taken from Vaphai, Saina without much difficulty, it is long lasting, people shall collect and stopk them, he may send to the manufacturing centre after stocking the quantity of some ouintals, it shall not decay or rot. Lilkewise, we need to consider other useful plants as it is going to be Forest base, we shall neerl to consider and think of the way to utilise our local materials for useful purposes.' I don't know whether there are Sago-Palmatrees origlinal of our land, in other states. We all know Sagompalm-trees of our land, these are worth cultivating and make plantation, the fibre is long lasting, it cannot decay. If we had extracted the fibre, we could have made Hand Bag, womens' shoes like slippers, and we cab make many other things from the fibre Sago-Palmtrees of our land original is valuable, but when the सorest catchtom fire they al ost died out, but it can grow in abundance easily and can be planted aasily. Hence, if we don't try to utilise it as local material
instead of sending and suppring the motarials to other factories and Incustrics, like sewing machines and other machines, I think it is not the man for development of Industries for, ir lan? Thereforc, I wart the conderne? Department to take interest and pay attention to this, I belicue we still have to find out other things useful for revelopmerit of Misoram, besides what I have statod above, ani. I wint to propose such development.

PU C.LALRUATA :
Mr.Speaker Sir, it is Aifficult to make progress in Iniustry, and also difficult to do things faster, hence I, have nothing to criticise on the Budget, however, I would like to make statement of the past thing for the easy preparation of plane for the Department concerned. The first point is the distribution $\phi f$ Rice Huller as Loan to public $\begin{gathered}\text {, if } I \text { remember it right, the }\end{gathered}$ machines of this Rice Huller Company, who supply us the machines have lower quality therc is better quality machines with not much higher cost. Our Ministcr i/c sated yesterday that we are going to repeat the process, if that is true, we need to contect. bettcr Company to give us good machines.

The present supply madhines are not satisfactory, with the dcmand of Rs 900/- as depogsit, whlle the real cost of machines is ahout Rs 6,000/- and the company cannot makc or Supiply the complete parts; it seems those who are allottcre the machines have to purchase the main belt, the husk winmowing parts at their own expenses. About Rs 2,000/- is needed for the deposit ancl actual price, it scoms nut so profitable and worth the trouble to try to get the Loan of Rs 6,000/m

It seems the Heahines Agent should have provided machines to put the parts tegether, as there is provision that mechanic shall assemble the parts when the owner brings the machine to his chosen place to let it function. Thercfore, it is one year guaranctec, if it breakd before the expiry of the guarantee the company shell the loser, it will be like frec service of the machinc. One Ratu villaged was alloted
the machine and took it to his home town yesterday, but he was not provided a mechanic, yet he was not allowed to hire anotherimechanic other than the Company mechantic, 1年 such is the comalion it is quite a problem to think how long the cormany shall not be able to provide a mechanic ? If one year, the quarartee perioa had expired, It shall become trouble-some if the compony could not yet provide a mechandc, if the company could allow the owners of machlne to live mechanica other than the company mechanics, as they have ong waitcd for this impatiently. As it seems thin machines, long waited for shall have to lie unable to function, I want to point out this matter.

The seven (7) weaving employecs of Industries Depadtment could not get pays since April, last year, they are still erployed till today without getting the pays of seven or eight full months; they brought the difficultics they fored to the notice of Industilies Minister the Asstt.Diredtor, Cottage Industries stated that 'We are going to consider your matter', but there is no result yet to be found. Again, they went to the Finance Minister to inform him of their hardshipsty on hearing thetitak, their Officer, warned them like', 'Why have you informed the Minister of this; $t$ e Man Minister is goling to pay you your salaries, why do you bring this mattor to me. In such manner, the few women criployees and workers are made in such a critical condition, somedays ago after they approached the Industries Minister, they ere paid their (8) eight months salaries. These employees are employed at the rate of Rs $5 /-$ per day', but their dally products are. worth Rs. 10/-, if so, if they cannot be paid salaries worth their products, at least $\mathrm{Rs} 8 /-$ is to be their rate per day. I feed it is unfair improper to pay and employ adult people, who have the still and experiences.

Our Chief Whip has stated about sericulture. I feel that Sericultare is useless, as it seems simply wastage of money, one housewife of Ramhlun Veng was entrusted by Serivulture Department to care and look after the (Caterpillars), bilk-worm, but she declared that she 'don't know how to lie, it is quite un-profitable, but the staffis and officers of Sericulture Department entrusted and requested her to care and feed the silk-worms, may be the Demonstrator'. The entrusted housewife don't know how to tell a lie cheat, she declared it to be useless. When we look to the Budget, it seems we are going to pass much money for the expenditure on this Department I feel we need to find a why to utilisc the money, for useful purposes.

PU K.SANGCHHUM : Mr. Specker Sir, according to news-. papur roportk this Department recepived the prize in the Asscm Farc, it
is a happy, goed news.
In our land, cone Industry seems a suitable and practicable onc, I fincl it worth deve-
loping to make th successful. Due to scarcity of sugar, and with the absence of gocid roed Communication, Sugar is not available for villagers, hence I believe if we had paid much attention to manufacturo of Sugar Canc into Sugar, it shall be the moen to be successful to cover the scarcity of sugar in villages.

Thircily, only rice is no longer profitablc and worth the trouble, so we must cultivate corn is abundance, making it fit to eat as food stuff; corn can grow abundently wherever grown, in any village, and we can make it as the main food stuff. I think it shall be setisfactory if you oould supply the grinding machine to Chhimtuipui District, in my constituency corn is pienty, hence I think it is worth the troutble = and make it a.successful one.

PU HII PHEI DY .SPEAKER :

Me.Speaker Sir, I believe, if the Hon'ble Members' statcrnent could come true!, it will bu very good and useful, as the reasun is thet corn is the mein stapple food of those regional poople; corn is much more there and (easily) available in pionty, if such could be successful it shall bo a gow provision. In Industry Department Blacksmiths holp wach othcr, but I have never learn of it, only last your I new that they could be supported, but villagers depencecl mainly on Thum cultivation. Hocs (Kodali), lace etc.have to be made a new every yoar, such instrumonts nedd to be made fanw many times within no year; however, since the blacksmiths have no finc quality instruments, they cannot be successful as they are supposed to be, I feel-fuch
blacksmiths daserve comoperation and support. I contacted Industry Deportment, Officer, I am ignorant of other constituencies cascs, in any constituency there are expert blacksmiths who can make even the trigger and i lock of a gun. If I ask whether Government could relief
and support such expert blacksmiths, we have an officer to deal with such matter, he said he cannot belleve If he does nat glve repott of the matter, I don't. know what the Roliticians may or have said, I shall do only whet my (superior) officer tell me to do. I sald suppose your superior Officer don't know the names I mentioned? He said Advertisement shall be made. I further questioned suppose the villagers know nothing of your Advertiscment how and what shall then it be? He said spot Verification shall be made by the superior Officer, but the officer concerned has not made an on the spot-verification, I know he has not made the spot verification, how shalifbe able to go round and visit villages, when roads arc not motor- able, the officer may not be ready to visit villages.

I replice that the officer mentioned
never go out to visit villages under his authority, I however left a notewith the names I have mentioned to be dispatchedm but they have not received the answer whatsoceer. I throught that the villagers will never enjoy the relief and support from Induatry Department through they neadsuch holp badly. Suppose the Government is not to belicve and pay attention to the Politicians, whose power is to control them, how shall they know of good thing and advice, it can be learnt; whether they are going to obcy those who know of the truth, if they are not tiving to obey those who knew of the good, and Instead be able to learn information from here, the Centre, it is not necessary to interfere for us. hof them to ${ }^{2}$ Ienm things of other place, from here; when we make statement of what we clearly knew, I enequest our Hon' ble Ministers not to think of us as telling lies and of showing favouritism to some few persons. May be it is not Government policy, even then, in order to know the fact they have not made an on the spot verification, otherwiee I believe the ignorant, poor-illiterate fillagers know only of the method of yearly Jhuming cultivation they don't know what is Advertisement and what is being idvertised they even don't know that such grant, rellef, loan ctc. sould be taken from the government as a means of support.' Hence, I beldeved that they shall be deprived of these things for longer time, I therefore, want oir FHon ble Ministers to know and understand the condition and situation of the people.

Mr.Speaker Sir, I would like to make short statement on Demand No. 18; I support Hon'tle momber Pu Ch.Saprawnga's point of view, not only tho fibre of roselle, it we make and treat the Eruits also, with some chemicals, we can utiliso it for useful purpose. The fult of moselle is quite sour, in villages, the villagers boil the fruit mixor with sugar and keep it in a bottle, it secms quite practicable.

In ereter thet Industry may bo success-
ful, 2ike pu K.Sangchhum has statcd, the location and site or site for Cottage Industry of igrickleurè: should be made clear and fevourable. I also would like to mention*" Chamaur situated :in the southern side of Mizoram, of my constituency area, on the Tuichetrg Vabley, wherc there is plenty of cane. Suppose, we are to enploy it on Agriculture side, many things shall come out of it; therc are Palras of Mizoram origin, in large quantity, which were sent or exportect to Pakistan previously. This material is e useful onc, I requcst our Hon'ble Ministers io make something out of this matter for development.

The Industry Superintendent of Saiha is transfered to Lunglei, what is the roason thereof ? What is Government Bolicy ? This particular Department is still under issam Government, if so, how is Incustry Department going to start work and function therc ? This particular Officcr was posted there whilc under Assam Guvernment undertaking, and Iived in Saiha, Bora by namc; he left for his native home because of poor-health.

I request our Hon'ble Ministers to consider and devolop our regional arcas to visit and sec the ways to look at her problems; I request them tn come and see for themselves how to dovelp the area. It is not uasy to vorfy and consicler any matter if we do not witness the situaticin of a particular place I request them to consider and yey visit and attention to us.

At present we need 3 Assuistant Employment Officer, in the thrce Districts, we caquired how many of our Mizo applicants appeared the examination of the advertised vacancies under Assam Governm ment, 12 applicants of Mizo appearied, out of which only 4. appeared the Interview; 2 out of the 4 (appeared) came out, we wondered whether we hould bring them (the 2) home to employ or not, but long time has passed since then, about one whole year, we proposed to readvertise the vacancies herc. The complaints raised on the not good quality and no regular function fo Ryce fullers; Maize Crusher, Oil Expeller etc. may be because the Company, who supplied these, is not a big onex it may also be because we have not yet racticed and let them function for experiment, wo shall see therresults after sceing the results. (Pu Ch.Saprawnga: What and where is the Ricc Hallers supplying company situated?). Thesc Rice fullors are takon from Mar Stcel

- Industry, figency \& Branch, Gauhati.
(Pu Ch.Saprownga: Is thore any p proof that the machines are goocl? This Kirlosker Co product is godd, but there is a rumour that the present new-type is not good, if the rumour is true, it shall be a rogretable thing.). The mothoe of seleation is; Tender was called, which many $p \in O_{i}$ le Kendered for, therefore, the applicants with the lowest rate are gbven the Rife Yullers, Oil Expellor, Maize Crushers contractr woìk. Though Tender is called, the applicant with the lowest rato is accoptor? and alloted the contract work prior to knowing the quality. Since it is tho first practice therc may bo mistakcs.

If we hipucn to be the one who bought the had quality Rice fullers, it might be necessary to change the supriying company.
(Pu C.Lalruata: It seams that the machines receiver hive to rijay the actual price and the profit, the machines Aogent, from the Company should get; is this a truc Eact ?) We have no such knowlerle of the question.

The Rendicr was callen to make delivery here at inzawl, if I remurnber it Correct, the lowest rate was acconted for Delivery. (Pu R. Dotinaia : For Foint of Information, Lalliana s/o Darzike of Lungctar (E) who aplich for Rice Hullers machinc, enquired from Enquiry Officer, Pu Chowra of Bara Eazar, Aizawl, the Enquiry Officer recommenm ded him, which the Boars passer and accepter? but when wo madc enquiry, Pu Lalliana, s/o Darzika is found to be of Nopa villaje, as we havo come to leam from Pu Chawra's relatives. Pu Lalliona s/o Laithengm vunga Lungclar (E) did not apily at all for the machines, there were two applicants from Lungder, Pu Derogliana, V.C.P and Rombluna, the onc who made verification of the two applicants aicl not make an on the spot

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However, there are machines, in other plain-states also, by which they manufactured sugar, which is fit for eating but not as white as the one we get from the supply, of the company product, it is fit for making tea; we decided to import such mill or mechine for experiment.

As we belicved that we can manufacture sugar from the sugaracine and because of insufficiency of sugar in Mizoram, we clecided to instali this one for Mizoram to conduct experiment on :menufacture of sugar from sugarmane to supply Hospitals and for treatment of children.

On the question of posting of Employmrny Quflcer in Lunglei, there are 3 vacant posts of Assistant Amployment Officer, which are meant for Lunglei and Chhimtulpul District. Onr previous AssisErrployment Officer was ufyred dictornamal lifted to Erployment Officer, hence Assistant Bmployment Officer are to be posted to fill up the vacancies.

It is high time to conseder Forest Base Industry, decission is made to make Paper Pulp Mill successful, though we cannot say and predict the future, what shall tecome of it?

The proposed to utilise and conduct experiment on roselle and Sago-Falrn i fihres, of M1zoram origin, for Industrial purposes is quite a good proposal; it shall be gond to send these fibres to the plam-states to conduct experiment, whether these ate usefyl for Industriad purposes, after the results are out the Industry Department shall find a way to inplement in Industries.

To conduct experiment on SagoPalm, fibres, (Thangtung), first we should collect abundantisago-Palm fibres and send it to experts for examination, if it comes out worth utilising and serve any good purpose, we should conseder its implementation on our level and install machines to menyfacture anything which can come out profitable from the SagomPalm fibres. As our Industry Department Officers are prewent here, they better note the points and consequently consider the matter.
verification, though the Hon'blc Minister concerned stated that verification was macle through ancl from Villagc Councils, which is'not truc. Hence, I believed that as Lalliane s/o Dirzika is not a Lungdar Villager and because he lied to our Officcfs, he should not be allote? fuch what ho a,silicat for. In such casc arise, the Department concerncr Officers shell have to sce whether the Board made mistakc in recommenclation or the verifying officer merte mistake, we have no such information no yct. If cascs arisc in this matter, re-verification should be made as the allotees have not yet taken the machines.

If the company alone is to provide mesheris, there may he insufficioncy, the machine allotecs c an and shoule live mechailes other than company mechanics; cornsicicrinj the concijtion and availability of mechanics, the casc shuid be taken under consireration.

Ther is ne reof one information regarding the daily pey of Haniloam weavers as Rs 5/per day, an? their daily ruchet worth about Rs 10\%/por day, if it is truc that their daily rrotuct is worth Rs 10/- per day, we shall verify from the officers concerner, it is proberne that they may carn more than the prosent iaily ratu.
(fu C.Lialructe : Will the Hon'ble
Ministor i/c be nleasc-? indurn me whother it is a fact that the machine allotece have te purchase the main fanbelt ane chaffurs of crain of Rice Hullers at their cow expenses?) I have learnt thot our Director, who is present here, statei thet, 'the machine atlotees should be providecl all necessary spare jarts, if not possible prosently, they shoula te providediziterron; if on the other hand, I have ro such information and
knowledge'. Asiaur Director stated that the maxhine allotees need not purchase such necessary spare parts, the question needs remexamation and verification.

There are Sericulture Farms in Rangramual and Chite Lui (river) Valley, respectively, for experimental purposes, meant for preservation of seeds distributed. If we think this to be unfit not profitable for Mizoram, te shall make decịission to drop it. But considering the whole India, silk export is our main mcans of Foreign exchange; this Department is proposed to be made profitable in India.

Industry Dcpartment should pay attention and be active in Cane Industry. However, the condition of sodl is not favourable for cane in the northern part of our land; there.is no good forest for cane cultivation; there may be plenty of mamerincaouthesn region, but as the major consumers shall be of northern region', it is a probable question whether it shall be profitable. It may not be profitable if we usecthe cane of Chamdur area; We shall have to consider this matter together, with all interested persons.

Chhimtuipui District badly needs Malze Crushers, which shall be considered later on. Generally, Industry Departmentiis investigating whether we could have $2 / 3$ mill. I request yoy to kindly pass this Demand.

PU CH.SapRiNNGia : Mr. Wpoaker Sir, It is unplcasant to mention particular Officers and actions name in this House, however, these is inevitable circumstance to mention some important Officers namos; as it is of Public intereststiou though it is unpleasant to mention I fool I should do it. We have heard of our Principal Engincer.'s eases, Yet I have some points tc: raise, as these are some unfair actioms of our p.E. The first point is when the P.W.D. calls Tender, after aponing the Tender, he made private negetiation, reancgetiated with the contractors. He enquired and cxamined the contractors' conditiens whother one cortain contractire could. take the work or not, he would auction the work, but this secms the improper, unfair channet.

If such is the channel, why does
he have Scaled Tender? Contractors spend money for

Seal Tender, but he should have auctioned the work in open competitive, but he would not do so; he called some certain contractors "privately, and allot the worts to them. To suspect a man from the very beginning is not good, but I. dare - Frankly say' 'I. suspect him'. The P.t.D. has been suspected from many years pass, we know there are good Officers/ but the wrong doings of 2/3 Officers defame the whole, as such is the position of the PiW.D., being suspected and mistrusted, the P.Rs' auction of works and private negotiations with contractors are too much, I sus-pect and mistrust him. I shall mention his tactic of auction of works; Tender was called for Aizawl-Thenzawl Road, which when opened brought (3) three-would toi contractors into light, but I shalI not mention their names, if necessary to mention I am ready to do so. One contractor applied at $: \$ \%$-schedule rate, while the other applied at $10 \%$ below schedule rate. The contractor with $10 \%$ below schedule rate was not a Registered one hence the P.E decided to favour to favour the 2 Registered contractors; one applied at $5 \%$ schedule rate, and promised to allot him the work, but inspite of such promises, may be the contractor did not do woll, the P.E. alloted the work to the other one. The P.E. negotiated by $10 \%$ below eckedule rate, we wonder and belleve how much unfair, easy-money have been involved, it is quite regretable.

In other case, Tender was called, the P.E.invited one contractor to come to his house and promised to allot him the work at the Tendered schedule rate; the invited contractor visited him and tazedi, : about the matter, which made the one satisfied, but the P.E., alloted the work to another contractor. Such are the actions of the P.E., it is inevitable to suspect him, it is very regretful that a high officer should act like that: some of our Hon'ble Members sald the P.E should go home, $I$, in my opinion, also support their point and he should go home.

An Enghneer, when to construct a building should'see from the bottom to the top, finishing point, but our P.E. though an lengineer, seems blind to these things. He changed his orders very! easily', whenever he visit he would alter his ordeq, and make the workers mindless and they don't know what to do. Hence, he seems a man without an idea.

Eesides, he would go by himself, without colling Quotation, and purchese C.I.Shect, Cemont ctc. by his iuthority. Heve our Ministors acknowledged such matturs ? Wc may understand if he did such thinge bectuse of emergency; ho should heve called Quotation for Comant, C.I.Shert ctc, as there are some who can hande such things hery, and he should leave such things to their hanus, which shall make cmployment for the local people. Whether he laboured himself and get the profit, and that he purchasod such mentionod matcrials, of the cost of about ne:inf5 lakhs by his own authority ? Such are quito a problem and a topic debetable.

WAnother thing is that wo have gone 15 per cont below seredule rate previously, howover, $\therefore$ : since he hold this post is P.E, the genoral rate; I wonder how fraf he shall be responsibit in in all these actions, as he is the hoad of his particular Depart-ment:- I fool he should hold rcsponsibility of it. This practice is en unfair, unhealthy racc, because the contractor with the lowist rate is not alloted the work, but somowherc around, thure romoured that the lowest ratc is accepter and alluted the work. Therefore, corruption margir increases in size gradually; when measurement is made, the contracior make the rate as 10 per cont below schedule rate ind the measurcment too, but we know thore are many gending Bills at prem sont. Why the pending? When i.hey tike miasuremont, in some far off place, so to say, sumi contractors with below scherule rate, after taniac: 1 asuroment, mande the rate as above schciule :ate, which effects the estimate, ancl results in gricaccs. May be not onlwi becouse tho Estimate is act corrac. anyhow, corruption Is incroasing. Wa upar $\therefore$ dorur Ew- corruptiril For cur Officors which is regretibl', nowev $\because, ~ I ~ f o l$ wo better not employ our P.E. any longur.

PU LALKUNGA : Mr.Sprikur sir, P.W.日. is not proper in gueril scinse. ìs it is gatting latc, it: socms oven our Ruling Party Chfof Whip shall turn into the Opposition Member, I fael safy and further hope we shall be able to overthrow our Minister ky 8:00 P.M. or round about.

According to Lt.Governor's Speech, B R T F constructed 483 miles intAl Weather Road, with 240 miles under construction. Wth the introduction of BGS, during this year in Falr Weather Roado 399 'miles is completed, with 511 miles under construction. Though pWD have functioned long time ago, however, therc is too little 'Presently work is in progress on seven roadst heavey controlling of $355 \mathrm{KM}^{1}$ there is no work done yet, cobsidering the amount of money consumed by the Department', I feel it is quite shameful; I feel it deserves abolition. What is wrong with our Government, though presenting the Budget, Mr.Speaker, through we have repeatedly expressed, here a leaflet or pamphlet is distributed, which had been placed for correction? It is difficult to make comparison, our Budget is disgraced and our Ministey is disgrace

Previously, they have placed or ladd a leaflet pamphlet, which even Chief Minister said not the proper channel, but done because of emergency, at the same time the Members did not object to ft, ' and was done unproperly. As the same kind is repeated here, shall we do in the previous manner? No, It should not be, I say it is too shameful and disgraceful for them. I say our Budget after studying the full contents, is rull and void. I feel shameful to be the Ministry who is responsible, even the House is disgraced; I want no similar kind to happen again.

While the Pd.D. is in general
fogus, we criticise only the P.E., one particular E.E. appointed or employed a certain person in work charge', 8n 1.6.72, and posted him under alzawl Sub.division, Let our Ministry mark this. The E.E. employed tilm Private Car Driver. He then transfered this Workcharge man on 3.8.72 to kizawl East Sub-division. I feol our Miristry ow $t_{\text {: }}$ set good examplos hore, for ethurs to ory, and conc to follow its own Rule, so that, I fecl thoir rospective Departments shall focl shanciful anc sinw respect to thom.

Mr.Spoolar Siry F.W.D. io a vory imprart Doprorment fartiond and the pe.jla; at prosent we still follow the ale isssam proceourc sr ruic, I wula like to montion some points befure our Guveriment propare our own Codc. Registere? C.ntractors anc. Trate Licence Holders face many difficultics in regnac to Sccurity Deposit; it is nocessary ti. iceroset 2p.c. as it is contract work, it shoulc? bo medc 1 p.c. bocausc 2 p.c. is heavy. Wen-Tribals without Trade Licence should not be registered as Contractors.

Next, Tho Housc Tax payee'certifim cate doed notiseem necessery anymore for the Non-tribals if they are registered Contractors mind I wisin cur Government followed this policy. Twe estimated amount for the Thenzawl Road was only about Rs 40000/- while the new estimate amounted to almost to one lakh. Besicles', The A.T.Road Allotment of 197,-1972 was cone by fi. Ateen contractors without countersjignaluive.

There aro about ten posts of S.D.Os
which mere not yet filled up and the matter of which was not mentioned in the Buclget. I want to fill thesc up under an emergency case if they are badly needed. The Principal Engeneering combined the work of P.H.E. which makes him very busy. Besicles, the contractors $x$ and his staffe could n thern come to term nor deal with him for his harshness and stern behavicur towards them. hs Mr.Saprawnga has mentioned before, the only works which can be done under him are scheduled rates and Workoble rates. He only ruins the ecomomical condition of Mizoram. It is clear that the government of Mizoram does not need his services for Mizoram anymore since he is only after PowER without any feeling for the betterment of Mizoram. Mr. Thangthuama Once repalred his residence, but he could neither bear the sound of hemmer nor did lie likwd to see the workers. This clearly proves that he-despises the Mizos. The two Executive Engenecrs could not co-operate with him for his harshness and unfeclings towards them, for these they could not show their respects to him but only lost their interests for the promotion of Public Interests, He treats his subordinates as if they were doge. The way he looks after the Department of P.H.E. is too pour. He appoints the plains people to many important posts instead of the mizos saying that the plalns are better than the Mizos. All these are reasuns enough to drive him away from Mizoram. Soi for tiesc matters I request our ministry to consider his case and take actions where ever necessary.

PU K.L.ROCHAMA :
Hon' ble Spenker, many Hon'ble members have spoken about Demand No. 21 and the activities of an individual person. I want to lay down some points regarding Demand No.21. The first is that we have a
small staffo in this Depertinert whereas the works ase of different kinds. Though there is large amount of money suctioner to mect the expenses there is little time left for them to start moving dur to the occurence of the Budget Session. are? zrt, r the Eudget Session and with that little tirm luft, orily the, outstanding works can be donc ant now we are hore. So, It seams we blate them (F.W.D) muri than is needec. Bisides, the ministry should be praisod insteral for their efforts.

The second is that while the
P.W.D staffs are being premotet to Execqutive Engeneors. or Sub-divisionel Officers. The uncrained Mehurrirs and the non-matriculete Mi,hurrirs are left behind without fromotimg them to any hicgher posts. Only the trained matriculates are promoter tu Overseor Grace II. We can mee with our own eycs that cven a mohurrir can do the works of an Oversecr. But unless and untill they are trained and given them ciplomas they romain the same. It is natural that Patriatism can bc hed only if there is some hepe for the future in the mind of $\operatorname{man} . S_{0}$, I earnestly request our honcuroble Minŝster to verify this case and help thim remeve then wretched conditions. Thirdly, duc to the inadcquacy of staff:and officer s, there is not en ugh supervision of works and over whore the suporvisors re sufficiont in numbers, the works are still unsatisfactory. In the casc of Road construction too, the uravels attatched with sir soil are mixed up with tar which could not stick up together for long: After a short time this turns out to be a hoap of dust and the word is then undone again. Again, there must be gord rolations and understendings betweon the officers and his staffs like Ovorsecrs and Mohurrirs in supervising the Lebnurers ancl their works. Further, there is onething which occurs in my. mind and theimatter ef which had acon speken last yoer in this vory House. I have come acrise some womon picking up the already laid gravels from the road betwoon Babu Tlang and Zarkawt. When I asken thom of what they wore doing. I was tole that theso grevols worc sold $t:$ the contractors for .75 paisa a tin. mhat makes it cloar that we havc to pay again fur the so grovels which wo have already paic for them. I: wish wo could stop this doybse payment.

The last but not the least is about our P.E. When the Chief Secretary come to Jungle, he scolded the executive engenecring blaming him for Public grivances over the P.W.D works. But the E.E said to him "Sit, The eighty Schemes I have submitted for the administrative approval dicks not come beck yet from the P.E is office, So I could find no way for work order". Such is the way the P.E is dealing with his officers. So, it is not a surprise to us when our hon'ble members have spoken about their dislikes for him. I think then that it is bettor for our state and the P.W.D. if he is removed from Mizoram.

STRIKER :
The Statement given by the members against our P.E suited me very well and I do hope that it is carried out, bout we should not forget that time is very short now.

PU C.InTRUATA : Honourable Speaker, Regarding Demand No.21, I would like to put forth some points to show the meknes of our P.E though we have just spoken about it. When we (Estimate Committee) requested? the P.W.D to give us the general information before fifteen February, giving them one month preparation,. But they could only give us a vague Information on the first wack of March. For this vague information we had to sum up ursclyes to make it clear and that troubled us very much. That clearly shows the weakness of P.E., being the Head? of Department.

For the construction fo Rowels
and buildings too there arc inly Low lunpmesumprevisions. so most of the works had to be done without lurnjsum provisions and that creation difficulty. Since I am in favour of Lump-sumaprovisions I with our ministry would bear this case in mind.

Again, It is said that the 103
capital outlay is the capital (Money) wo received from the Central Government as a 30 an and if this is really so. I wish we did not follow this policy any more, that all.

## PU LALRINLIaNA : Honourable Sicaker, I would like to lay down a fow points in regard to the Demand No. 21 and of which I

 have spoken about last year. Whan we spoak of the wakness of the Principal Engincer we dirl not know the mistake we have committed firct. Jor irstance, wo have a Joint Director to assist tho Dircut.ir as and when noeded in the Educational Dopartmont. But in the case of the Principal Enginceryay we co net hero the Superintonding Engineer to assist him. iogin, in the case of promotion too, how could the Executive Enginecr hold the post of the Principal Engineer if he has not served the post of Superintending Engincer. I an very sorry to see that we have not created the post of Suporintending Engincer which is very important to suporvise the works of the Executive Engincers and those ther staff who are subordinate to him. There must be at least one who could take the charge of Principal Engincor in cesc of his absence.SPESKER:
Now we shall call upon the Minister-in-charge an? from now on each member will be given five minutes and that
they should try to finish speaking within that time.

PU CH.CHHUNGA
CHIEF MINISTER : Honourablo Speaker, many of our honourable members have spoken about Demend No. 21 and the suggestion and recommendations made by them on this subject are all achievablo and that we should make an effort to carry them put. In this Budget session, it appears that almost all the members have souncted the caso uf Principal Engineer while only one of us stands for him (P.E.). (Pu Hrangaia mentioncd that ceven in the Eclucation Department also there is insufficiency of staff). But now, with the enlargement of this Dopartment we can have the post of Superintending Engineer. Any how whet the honourable mombors suggested and racommenclec? will be given an effort to achicve it.

It has also boen mentioned that the work of the P.W.D. is very unprogressive and this can be
true to some extent. We are now under the Union Torritory, beginning its life and activities: Many importiant posts are now being filled up and New Livisions are. behmg opened upin different places. When all these arrangements are oompleted. I hope then that wean face our problems and achieve more improvements better than the prevlous year. The Policy of Abolition of House Tax payee certificate uits me very well in the case that if they have security deposit . But the problem of how to abolish this have now sprang up. Now-riribals have to sukmit there tenders on payment of Rs 7.50 p while we are allowed to submit them with our House gax payee certificates. Anyway, are can make some change here by the introduction of Stan insted of House Tax Payee certificates. ( Pu Ch.Saprawhga:It is not the house tax payce certificate that matters here if it is a sealed Tender, but the way they are dealt with.) (PA Zalawna :- Therc is no Exxed rule as to what I have done with that House Tax Payee certificate, we realised it from the local Fund since we were short of cash. But now Under the Blew Government we can take up that Tribal Facility for we have more money. But as we have attatched them when registering ourselves it seems to me that it does not necessary any more to increase the fee. It is just like Tax payment and this) (Pu Lalhmingthanga :- There are professional Traders and calling Traders who have much more money and these men should attatch their professional Tex Certificates)

Hon'ble Speaker, The important points mentioned by Pu Ch. Sciprawnga in this regard should be realised - (Pu Vanlalhruaia:- only one Question please ? These had never been any selection of Tenderers for any Tender) so will these he any cran co chance for the interested persons if they could deposit earnest money even if they are not registered?

## SPEAKER :

That will be considered and if there is no difference between the regis-
tered contractors and non-regostered
contractors that means there is no necessity for boing registered contractors.

Well, the request of our hon"ble.
members will be put for consideration.

Honourable Spaker, There is Fund allotment for the Ko-lasib Division whimbinamounted to cleven Laks. Of which 5 lakhs were released enc the E.E is now working with that money giving tenders to the Contractors. But now there is nothing the E.E can do since the P.E has not released the other 6 Lakhs rupess and the contractors had to stop working for this. So, I was requested to pload for the other 6 Lakhs in this House. Besicdos, the P.B said that the post of P.E here is not h s choice but asked for it by the Gdvertment of Mizoram. So I do not like the meen words he had spoken in this matter.

But he was told that there was no onc for Mizorem and so Mr.Robula was the acting P.E. Meanwhile, this P.E wo have now came up and hold this post till now.

PU 2ALAWMA：
Honourable Speaker ．The I W T Organisation is very important for the western Mizoram，we
have some rivers there in the wost and the cleartings of those river manks are also importanc．This i $\%$

Organdsation has one relation in regards to the Sunfien IImbers. The Tress on these river banks are cut down and Sunken in the rivers which create difficlculties in nevigation. If this Sinking-Timber is stopped it would be a great help for the oreanisation of the I W T. If we have more Pool cars in the state Transport Department, The State income vould also be increased a little. There is no place for boxes and Lunggage in the Minitus, so Bedings and suit.cases had to be kept inside the Bus and these make the passengers very uncomfortable. Again the mentioning of these Pool Cars reminds me of the needs of Members of L.A for Pool Cars to roan about in the strocits and to making concession to the fare.

PU LALHMINGTHANG : Honourable Speaker, I want to point out the importance of site for the state Transport Department there at Silchar and $I$ want to request our ministry to take necessacy steps fer this as soon as possible.

PU SAPLIANA :
Honourable Speaker, I would like to point out two thines regarding this Demand No 22. The first one
is about the Inland Water Transport, and for this, there is only an cstimatca amount of ks 58,000/-. There are many rivers which arc navigable and if these rivers are carefully surveytd, I min sure that they would be more importent for thi trinsportation of goods in different places. Wheve the river of Tlawng Tuirial river, Chhimtuipui river, Khewth benetuipui and many others wich arc all novigable. But the estimated amount of money does not secm likely to include the expenses that would be incursed when surveying these rivers. So, $\mathbf{x}$ request our minirter to explain this matter more precisely.

The acxt thing is robout the Department of State Transport. As our hon'Ble Niember Pu Ch. Saprawnga has mentioned before I went to request our ministry to provide the means of transports for Tlabung and the Southern parts. Again, I want to romind you of the difficultics we (in.L. in) always met due to the unavailebility of Pool Cars when toing for the Budget Session and some important Comittees.

PU SAITLAWMABi Honourable Speaker, I would like to point out a fow things regarding this Demind No.22. In regard to the Road Transport (State Transport) from filawl to Silchar and Aizawl to' Lungloi I want to know just how much our ministry pay attention to the selling of Tsckets and the arrangoments mi $3 e$ by the staff there at the station and whether cut Government is goining or loosing in this transaction. In the rivers of Phairuing and Tuichang there are places where the vater is shallow and big stones to be found. But, with the expenditure of a smell amount of money we con turn these rivers into natrigable rivers.

that the office of the S.D.O at Silehar is now transfered to fizawl. is we are only the beginnere we have a small amount of money for this and for the establishment of the officers and the staffs pay there is Rs 58,000/-. sgain, for their travelling expenses there is an arocunt of Rs 5000/- which is already sunctioned. So, altogether it comes up to an amount Rs 90000/-. In arswer to the question about the engagement for the IW T there are rivers like Tut, Tuirial, Tlawng and many other rivers which are all navigable, now the establishment for this I W T also likely to be enlarged. Now. we have six Buses at present and another fifteen Buses are being sond for. To own these Buses it is very difficult for the government for there are many things to be tackled up. If we can get.those Buses we will run them from Aizawl to Champhai and Demagiri. Besides, there will be some reservations for Buses for the Private owners. It seems thet to many of us the fares for these Buses are a little high and I hope an arrangement will be made soon to lower the fares.
