*pU B.LALCHUNGNUNGA : pra Dy.Speaker, I am going to ask question at the end of my speech. as it is the wish of the people I think that the Division should be opened as early as possible. The Govt. also would do well in creating Soll Conservation Department as a separate Department. Its present strength of Staff is- 2 Agriculture Graduates, $4 \mathrm{DDR}, 6$ Diploma holders-civil Engineer, 8 trained forestry, 4 coffee cultivation trained. Besides having 2 Divisions with 11 Range offices they also have................


DEPUTY SPEAKER : Make it a question.
*PU B.LALCHUNGNUNGA : They also have persons trained in rubber cultivation, 7 trained in Forest school and 16 Soil Conservation Researchers. Though well-consolidated this Deptt. is not in a position to execute works. Its relationship with Agriculture Deptt. and the schedul.e of works to be executed by them should be differentiated.

DEPUTY SPEAKER : Make it a question. What you are saying now may be sadd when we have discussion on L.G's address. If you make a speech now, there will not be time for the remaining questions. Make questions if you wish.

*PU B.LALCHUNGNUNGA : Pu DY.Speaker, yes, I'll make question. Is there any difficulty in making soil conservation as a separate Department?

PU P.B.ROSANGA, MINISTER
: Pu Dy. Speaker, the matters relating to the opening of Soil Conservation Division in Chhimtuipui Dist. had $i \mathbf{l l}$ been processed. Creation of post had alwo been processed. As a matter of fact, we ure nnly walting for final decision.

Tho' our member had said many things, some of them were not relevant to our subject. However, for an infor metion to our member I would like to point out certain things regarding separation of Soil Conservation Department. Some of our neighbouring states have separate Directorate for Soil Conservation Department. During the earstwhile District Council
Mizoram Soil Conservation was one of the divisions under assam Gorrerment. But, after the formation of U.T., this was attached tc Forest Deptt. till 1974 after which it was again attached to Agriculture Department. Being aware of its close relationship

with Agriculture and Forestry, the Govt since the time of the previous Ministry sought a convenient Directorate where Soil Conservation Deptt. can be att ached. It is now attached to figriculture Deptt. So far, no inconveniencies have been found. Though attached to Agriculture Deptt. thoy make their own plans and proposals separetely. Hence there is no difficulty in their relationship. and there has not yet been consideration to create separate Directorate/Deptt for soil Conservation.

(b) No unless there is specific permission gi ven by the Government.

at regular intervals to the stall owners to:comply with the consilions incorporated in their stall passes with particular reference to condition No. 9 which prohibited the use of stalls for residential purpose with a werning that violation of the conditions would entail cancellation of the pass: Follow up action have also been taken and it is learnt that a number of stall pass holders have complied with the order issued in this regard.

PI K.THANSIAMI : PU DY. Speaker, though the conditions stated
by the hon! ble Minister was clear enough. I would but like to point out the reasons for my asking these questions.
as we may be awaee, tea-stalls in the mpper Dewrpui veng are the place where ali sorts of filthy lives are faund. Whether it is night or day we will find drinkard or persons indmiging in sex or other worldly pleasures. There are many bars having funny names like 'Luhthut Bar'. The place and the life here is so fillthy that it came' to be known as: $1 / 2$ 'fitta Lane'. Actually, it is neithar safe nor pleasant to ifver or go nearby.

While other cities are competing with each other: for cleanliness, we have a dirty lane at the heart of cur capital which had reelly blemished the face of the town.

Besides being the place of filthy lives; ' Atta Lane' is a temptation to persons particularly of character to drop in in those tea-stalls and indulge themselves even without having prior intension. On the top of that, while many persons who wish to run business do not have room to pursue theiry wishes, stalls at the heart uf market place are used for residential pueposes.

DEPUTY SPEAKER :'Make it a question.
PI K.THANSIAMI : Pu DY. Speaker, I was going to ask. If there is public notice/ order which prohibited the use of stalls for residential purposes, should not Govt. take stern measures for eviction of persons residing in stalls particularly in upper Dawrpui Veng.

PU LALHMINGTHANGA, MLNISTER
: Pu Dy. Speaker, Governmint is aware of the implatance of what had just been stated by our hon' ble member, Since 1974 to December, 1979, orders were is sued at regular intervals to persons residing in stalls.. But some persons are capable of doing things beyond the control of rules and regulations. However efforts are being made and spot-verifidation is also being conductud..

*PU J.THANKUNGA : Pu DY.Speaker, from what I gathered, it seems that Govt. had issued eviction order many times. But why had not those orders been carried through ? Was the authority whe issued the order compet ant to dc so ? I would alsc like to know the specific date on which stalis raxticularly in the upper Bazagr will be cleaned.

dnother reason is that tae pesple of Vairengte requested the Government to allow the pesple uf Beyha Bazaar to came upto Vairengte at least once a week to to trading with them. It may be notel that the people of Bagha Bazaar ane practically great nelp to the people uf Vairengre and the people living nearby particularly in times of crisis.actually wo wanteu to shift the gate still further towarus its southern tip near amy school which we pass beEore reaching vairenyte. But due to nonmavailability of lolying for our pulice wni manned the gate, it was shffted to where it is now. 50 far as checking of the inoming of unautnorisel peuple is ouncemed, the present site is quite suitable and cunvaniant. int zara 2 of the induress law and order situation was mentioned. Ihuuyh not to one's expectation, law and urder situation has improved a freat deal in retrospecting thie last jroceeaing years since 1966.

I am glad tu know that an appreciablammer , fine undoryround M.N.F. have come over yrund and jouned the meinstream of life. In the ountry: The Govt. have also given de impurtance to the problem of rehabilitation of these personnel and various loans extended under jifferent Departments. But naving left home and led a wandering life for a long time, our returnees have nu pemmanent settlement which is required For yetriny luan. It is therefure necessary fur the guvt. to pave the way fur them to get luan in an easier manner.

I am also nappy to nute adequate measures takon by the Goverment for strengthening the acministrative machinery. Bosicos finalising Recruitment Rules for a number of posts, pearly 7000 employees have been leakared as quasimpemanent and mote than 3800 temporary posts have been made permanent. I would like to mention some of the things omitted in the Address though Govorment may have considered them. It is the tining I have once mentioned in the previous sessioh.

Perhaps we are aware of the inmadequasy/shortage of DOIice officers in Mizoram. Haviny recognized this I made suggEstion to arrange training course for our Mizmo youth who yiven pro, er training, would be fit for police officer. Though it is not mentioned in the Aduress, I would stress the need to strengthen the position of our police officer.
at para 6, various hardships caused by famine and relief measures taken by the Government were mentioned. iowever, I rugret to say that measures to be taken to meet many difficulties caused by drought conditions were not clearly mentionad. Being the source of income and livelihood for many families, EGS can hardly be teminated at thila stage. There is provision of fund under che echeme which the A.Os in their jwn respective village deal. According to Govermment's instruction the in os are to make scheme on the basis of harvest result in the family concamed. But I am afraid that the scheme is not utilized as it should we. When I say this, I remember my constituency as there had been good harvest. If the scheme is made on the basis ofyharvest report, those who have good harvest will get less amount reyardless of the important developmental works to \(v\). For instance Darngawn Group Centre requiters 13 quintals of rice. But, fund sanctionecl under EGS may not even amount to Rs. \(1000 /\) thuigh there seems to be lots of works to do under the scheme in this cencre. Hence,


At Para \(Z\), it is stated that the untire activities of Agriculture department focussed on aid to the distress cultivators and settlement of Jhuming families to jomanent cultivation. Nevertheless, I feel that succesful cultivators shoula ne rewarded as well. It may be nowed that the Mizos like the rest of human raco favour a deed of honour since long past. perhaps it is because of this habitual deed of honour given to persons who leserve that there exist among the Mizos 'Tlawmigaihna' (accumulation of all kinds of eirtues) which us not found amony other human race but which makes social life pleasant. It is thorefore highly appreciating if saccesful cultivators are reuarded which on their part will be encouragement. In my constituency for ixample, there is one villaye named Dengaur in which the percen tage of harvest by standard measurement (populany used by the Mizos) is 525 tinfuls per family which woule last 2 years consumption. I feel that eamest diltivators who reap good harvest should be rewarded.
it para 9, developmental works are beins mentioned. May be I overlooked but it seems there is no mentioning about develupment of far and comer areas. Besides being our policy devilopment of interlor sectors is as much important as developing well-afvanced areas. Everyone as noted is interested in the cievolopment of the country. It is therefure necessary to toke up developmentel works according to the need of area and the ,eople ircessective of population.

FSpeech not corrected.

Ine activities of Rorest Department are mentyoned Tt para 12. as. stated, due impurtance is jiven to the development of protection and conservation of wild life. Besides pampa dill d life sanctuary there is pripusal for creation of Tawi wild life seactuary. I think I am not wrong to say that these sancruaries are meant for the louking pleasure of future jenetations. : If so, it is necessary to devise a way of uriving into these sanctuaries wila animals scatterec here and there, particularly those anim malsa found around Thenklura, which situeted in the westermpart of Buappui. actually, will animals in this area are vangerous to numan beings. Though I have sald this in the , ruvious session, I woul: once ayain like ta mientioned dio actually, the ruason for poor harvest in and around thenhlum and Denssur is active roundabjuts of wild animals which friyhtencal off the pejple from going to their pady-fields besides deatroying thelr Jhumhouses. I therefore suyfust that these wild animals be wriven into the sanctuacy or may be ariven away from tois area as they are yrave danger to the people.

Thougn I bel leve the Government ta have wall-laid policy th the field jf ejucation. I would but like to say certain things. according to my judyement, it sems that our arlucation in the present cundition has lust its policy. is in the present, our education solely aims to produce persons for jrofessioneal particularly in Goverment services. In actaal sense, it is not the main aims of education. Elucation is a life-longarocess which lues not end in schoul pr Institution anc its aim cannot be explatred in sahool. I think it is neae ssery to have.more omprehensive education either through social Welfare Department or Information Department to teach the Mizo people as a whole the true nature and aim of education so that we may group and unjerstand the significance of education besides unmrooting its true meaning. fhouyh, there is no such policy statedmentioned in the idedrass. I would but like to urge the Govermment to make endeavour in this reyard.

Hence, if we want pruyresst we will have to make more efforts for the imurovemant of james and sports. Mizoram as we know, is Union rerritory where dizawl is the Cajital. Yet, there is neither Induor Stadium nor is there proper playground. When I consiler as to what steps Govermment should takw for improvement in this rajard I have two sugyestions. other Departmonts, though may have envaigh funds, there cannot be impruvement if there is ni proper utilization of furis or if there is no implementation of schemes. However, it is iifferent with yames and sports. Here, if phate is fund, there is sure to de improvement. unfortunately, there has not ujiten baon enough provision in the budyet for fames and sports besides it is usually placed under the budyet head of Elucation. When the is larye budyct head like that, fund are uften slicel off for other purposes. I therefore suygest that lat there be Youth Welfare inctivities Department with separate Directurate as it is bue in other states. The Govt. may alsu make pruvision for early implementation of scheme for creation of such Department if evar we could have. If such Department is created, I strongly believe that our Youth would acquire fame in the field of games anc sports.

I am napuy to nute thet financial assistance is given to 225 handicapped students under the Departnunt of Social Welfare．I d not knuw what irfangement had bean made but there are many persunsechalcuren as well as jrownup who ne hendicapped and whu could not ，usane velucation beizides chose who had been fiven assistance．Is it nut pussible to jive financial assistance to handicapped jersons eather than tiuse whi had beern yiven ？

I am happy to nate that the Government has taken adiquate measures for the improvement of halath services in vizoram．It sesms that health servicas mentionel under para 1コ of the aduress have close relationship with rojriculturg． miio lowmying areas are best suited fomr ayrichlture，we＇he \(\therefore i=0\) whi used ta lime in nign attitude cannot stand the clinate tnuugh ajriculturists are forcedto live in such areas of climate to jursue their occupentan．Ttiougn they may be successful in evriculture，their health have yet sufiored．It is cinerefore ni inly essential for fealth Department to have tneir services in such areas where ajriculture Department take initiatives． To hive better procurement of mofe medicines is also hi．jhly こsふntial．

It is alsu leamt that there is provision fur toe construction of reB．Hosjital at Lumglei．But，no implomentation of the scheme hos qut tw ide seen till now thuugh it was already mentioned even in the previuus adiress of ur L．G．

I am slad that efforts are beins madu for land riforms．Nevetneless，I Feel that still jruater efiorts should se maue in this ruspect su that far and ourner arens may have mote benefits．

Thure is prupusal fur canstruction uf Tourist Loulye at rarious places．In 1978 ．Session，I propused construction Jf iourist Lulye at whawnyjui Mt．But haviny scen no dimpumon tation of the propusal，I woula unce ajain like to mention it． ahowngui，as we know，is the aiyhest mountain in Mizoram which witracts all kinis of tourist．But luc to nonmavailajility of Tourist Lodye or kest huse our tourists have difficulty in ioding and accomudation．Besides being a relief for tourists； Wurist ludja at wawnyoul will bes jne suurce of revenuc for tne Govermment when cunstructed．

Since the past few ywars, thu jesple in Mizoram aru encouragud to frow gingor which they dici enthusiastically. But due to nonmavailability of soud market for cispusal uf the pouducts yinyer jrowers nein in distressofs was the ondition alsu witn ther crops, it is mecessary to incurayje the people to jruw crops whicn nis juodmarket at all time. For instancenever a time in mizoram when there is nu acrket for sale uf rice as we uurselves are the consumurs. If we encuurayed growiny of millet, for example. its : こisposal will have tu be consiciered. and if Govt. fail tu obtain goud marker Eince will be a time when the jesple jruw tired of gruwing milict. inwever, if it can be turncd int oil, we surselves will be the consumers and if enough sil can be extracied from lodal, rujuction tj meet uur requirements, we will not have to import jil from otner states. Nevertinuless, the Industry Deptt. will have to allot macnineties to the frowers for rocession of millet seeds into uil. It will be highly ajoreciating if at Feast 2 Horsempwer machinery Can be alluter tj wach troup Centre. While ajeiculture Department encuureje jruwing af millet, the Industry Department should supply macnineries for jrucussion of the secus. Hence, the two uepartments have to work sicu by side.
as there is no proper division Jf wurks butween them, it is very cinfusing to differuntinte wurks dune Ly ayrim culture and soil Conservetion Departments and there can also cosily be duplication. Govermment wjuld tnerefore, do well in haviny proper classification uf works to be undertakon by ajriculture and soil Departments. It is not anly that, suil cunservation Department should be placed under sejarato Directorate and hav: It function as different/separate Dejprtaintis that tnere may de adequate staff for buth the Dejartments. The present strength of stafE in Sil wnsúrvation Department is 6 yazetced Of 三icers who have had craining and 27 Ministorial staff besides 226 staff. I believe taat the twu Devartments will function mure effectively if they have pladed under separate directorate.

In the fields of Education there has ieen satisifaccory proyress in various flelds. whthin the period of \(1979-80\) alone, the posts of 100 teachers have been created besides upmifting the position of Middle and ragh Schools. there is also proposal for impamentation of new pattem of education in primary and Middle schools selecting a number of schools for experinental schools. In Lunglei, there are schools which had been selected for experimental schools. But, new pattern of education cannot yet be introduced as the 2 teachers in primary schools werc umarr matriculate though they have had training. There are al so schools where there is only one teacher. Such being the onditions it is hardly possible to introduce the new pattern. I feel that schools selected for experimental school should be provided with well. trained and experienced teachers.

Last year, there was proposal for opening of new Girls fhgh school at Lunylei and the people were overjoyed to have been told of the upmoming of new school which they aspire after for a lony time as the only hiyh school was too conyested to cater the need of the rown. However, the proposal has not Yet been implemented till the present day. If there is no in cention to cancel the proposal, Elucation Department would do wil in implementing it as early as possible.

Besides this, there was also proposal for opening of Night College though it has not yet been finalised till date. Actually when the Goverment cannot fulfil schemes al resay claimed to have been made, the people lose hope in the Government. It will be highly appreciating if the woverment finalised the scheme for opeling of new Nigint Colleje and Garls Hiǵn school at Lunglei.

Due to much effort made by the Goverment there has beon condiderable improvement in health services. 92 submealth contres were opened. Nevertheless proposal made last year for oponing of T.B. Hospital at Lunglei is not yet finalised Jill today. It may be noted that there are many persons who suffured from T. \(\mathrm{B}_{\mathrm{o}}\) in Lunglei and the opening of T. \(\mathrm{B}_{\mathrm{A}}\) Hospital was a word of comfort. I used to say to the peoplu. I am afraid less the people lase hope in the ability of the Guverment if the scheme for opening of the said wospital is not finalised. I want the Govemment to take initiative at the earliest convineent.

As regards p.W.D. it is very pleasing to know that the Goverment made all out efforts to inentify and assess hydel patential in uur rivers. As statod by the \(L . G_{0}\). it is indued good tiding for all of us. We may nut live to see the day or time when our riversmiawng, ruivai \$ tuput (Kolodyne) Can supply 1400 MW power grid. Yet, I lony tu live to see the time when our grandsons and daughters make use of hydel power for running large scale Industiles and scientific agriculture wich the help of machineries.May be I live upto that time, if \(\overline{1}\), ana amitt Hospital for restoration of Heal the

As statea, finitiative steps are being taken when we have such grid power, our neighbouring states may bdt dare disappoint us any longer and we may also jet better treatment from them than we jet in the presant days. It is therefore very pleasing to know effurts made by the Govermment for improvement JE electrdo \(\mathrm{P}_{\mathrm{f}} \mathrm{wer}\) though it may take lony for completion of wo rik.
*PU J.THANKUNGA : Pu DYo, §peakers: I am giad to be able to par ticipate in the iliscussion of our Hon'ble LeG's address. Tha Adress as a whole is quite satisfactory. fowever, its implementation will, tell the true nature of the Address.

It Was stated tnat law and order situation has been impruving, Yet, law and order sitiation in Mizoram is deterior cating since the beginning of the year 1980. Many lives had been taken in the past few months. Govermment should therefore do well in taking stern meastires.

Inspite of thearitioal measures claimed to have been taken for rehabilitation of the M.N.F. Retumees, they have yet many uifficulties' in reality. They have also told us verbally the reasan why they cannot be included under normal scheme. Such baing the conlition, the Givermment may w well in making better amrangement for the retumees to enjoy in reality various facilities extendedby the Govermment and scheme already made may also be altered if "and when necessary.

For strengthening the aeministrative machinery the Govermment made many posts permanent besides declaring many mployoes as guasimpermanent. I do not know whother government is awabe of this that there are many posts lying vacant. I feul that these racint posts, should be filled up as soon as possible so that many probiems may be solved.

Particularly in Africulture Departments thens are many supersession cases which if not taken care of will, Cause disapointment in the minds of the ermployes, which at the same time will lue the cause of the weakness of the Govt. in the days to come. It is therefure haghy important for the Guvernment to consicer the matter with more , rofound thinkiny.

At para 6, measures taken by the Government to relieqe the people of famine and drought affected areas. we knowithat as a measure of relief EGS have been continuing under which large oruvision of fund was made. It may be noted that the listress and poor famers are truely in need of the fund right from thins momint. We shuukd therefore extend every possihle assistance to thum from the moment

むs regards departmental promotion in Ayriculture Dupartmont - I hope the Government would zoon fill up posts wnich are now lying vacant and the Minister i/c may kindly note that there are many persons in the Department who are due fur promotion.
at para 8, Vety Department was mentioned. It seams that there is also large provision of fund under the Dujartmont. We may be well aware that meawh a foodstuff in which it is easiust for Mizoram to attain spiln sufficiency. Hence while puoutry faminy and cattle firming are encuuraged, persuns who are engaged in these vccupations shoula be given more func.

As stated at para 9, Guvernment hal started works on construction of bridyes at variuus sectors. I thtnk we know that good road is a must in places/areas where we plan to oonstruct bridges. For instance there is \(=\) scheme for construction of brilyo on river ruival between Ratu and Suanypuikawn and tender had been called \(2 / 3\) times. But there is mo youd road in the qot. If no road is availaile. it is unlikely that the schome will be implemented in the near. future. Unlesenthore is FJod road there would not be possibility uf implamed ins the schome. such being the oondition, I think dalling of tender for this worte was a little too early, for, when, the echeme is implom muntud most probably next year or the year after there will be lifferente in the cost of materials and other necessary equipmunts which may cause some difficulties both for the Govermment ani the Contractors. Govemment should therefore take stips expeditiously for construction of Truckable roal in tnis area.

I am napipy to note that allout efforts male by the Government for power development. It seums that Mizuram has Irift into a new ara. ifowever, we swuld nut neglect triflé matters at the same time, while we make all out effurts for achievernent of yreater things. The Government may also note that whilu we alaim to faver more grid power, many df us do not have. thecric light. It is therefore highly necessary to mind even a trifle thing before we attain hisher thinys.

We know that many schouls hau been given grants in 3ii. Yet, I want the Minister to note that, Dawnpui schoul heis never been yiven any yrant on the gruund that it belongs to the Locality where rich peaple resides. Ithough the people rusiding in enis locality may be rich, yet it is not possible for an indivicual to rendvate or reconstruct the school. The school -s wa may be aware has been used of and on by different organisitiuns, associations and political parties for public vathering nnc: its condition needs repairiny Government wuld therefore b Well in making provision of fund fur thins school in the next Fopeech not corrected.
scheme since it will be made use of ayain by the puolic before the construction of community hall is completed.

I am glad that theme has been some improvements in health services. I believe the people would now have better supply of medicines shnce 92 new submeitith centres had been opened. However, I think the Government will have to consider the position of the people who are to . construct health centre building coluntarily. It won't be easy for a small hamlet for instance barely 60 houses to construct a building roofed with aluminiun sheet or corruyated Iron with a provision of only Rs. \(40,000 /\)-Rs. \(50,000 /\) - from the Government in addition to being affected by famine. Hence I suygest that Govermment provide at least materials for roofing of the building so that it may be easier for the people to complate the construction works.

Reyarding the service of transport buses we all know that the service of transport buses is very un satisfactory. I would like to know whether the time of departure dan be known at least one day in advance. Passengers in the hope of booking ticket for next day journey came to the bus station and waited the whole day for information as to the time of departure. But when evening oumes, they are tuld that theme will be no bus serviae next day we can imayine how disappointing it would be for them besides wasting tneir time. If there is yoiny to be Bus service at \(=11\), the would be passengers should be informed the time/date for departure and ticket also should be yiven in ad vance. 'For conclusion of my sppech, I would like to say that the L.G's Address as a whole is quite appreciating and I give thanks here-in.

PU ELLIS SAIDENGA pu Dye Speaker, I am ylad to have discuss ion on the LeG's Aduress today. I dont know whather to be surry or happy for not having our opposition mambers with us here. Nevertheless, it appears that we are joiny to have ample time for discussion. I request our Dy. Speaker, in advance to understand me if I take time while I make a speech.

In respect of law and order situationour L.G said that the improvement is still.far from the namalcy they aim at which may bo true. yet, no human being can attain what ever he/she wants. If we are capable of boing things is we wish, we will be equal to God. It is therefore impurtant to have good undertatanding of each other.

I am happy to nute that Government have various plans and policies to be pursued and which had been pursued. It is evident chat Goverment had mave all out efforts for improvement in various field.

We know that Government have givan Juc importiance to the problem of rehabilitation of MoN.F. Returnees. It is proper to be condiderate towards the retumees and they elso deserved. Nevertheless, I would like to point jut certain tinings in connection with rehabilitation measures takun by the Goverment. As we know, having led a wandering life for a ldng time, the returnees do not have permanent dwelliny okace due to which there always arise lifficulty at the time of allotment of luans or others nehabilitation grants. It is cherefore necessary to make things easier for them.

As in the current year, karge procision of fund is
made every Year for Industry Department. But chu Govermment will necd to see to the end how the funds are being used. In the past years, there were peesons receiving Rs. 80,000/- Rs.40,000/and Rs. 50,000/b as loan. While there are loanes who used the loan for its true purpose there are others who used Industrial loan for purchase of vehicle. Such being the conclition, Goverm munt should see to the end of the utilization of fund sanctioned as loans.

It appears that agriculture has been placed as one of the most important occupations in Mizuram. Perhaps because of this there is large provision of fund for the Department every year and their progress is also undeniable. Fur better iraprovement govertment should see to proper utilization of fund alloted to many Agriculturist for it is observed that in area. where Rs. \(5000 /\) or Rs. \(4000 /\) is clatmed to have been spent, only grass is found. Goverment would do well in making better Fggrayement for famers tid use fund more ugefully. For instance Guverment install power piller for hire and the farmers hire the Tiller the fare of which should be bome by the Government. It may be better if the cultivators received grants, in kind.

In the field of education there has been considerable srogress. we can believe that there would be still further iprogress. If I am not mistaken I think there was pruposal last year for opening of poly Technic. Institupe in Lunglem for which site also had been selected. Though our L.G also had mentioned about this in has address last year, the proposal has not yet win implemented till now. I feel that Goverment snould pursue their plans/schemes till its implumentation.

Though it thas been provincialized for 3 years now, thire has not been any improvement in Lunglei College. The strength* : :in staff in the college is oonsiuetably inmalequate evon ti, 's it is the only college we have besiles being a college for saionc education. I want the Goverment to take necessary action tw strengthen staff pusition in this cullege

Theree has been consilerable improvement in health survices. 92 submealth centres were opened in various places and my constituency was also allotted one subuhealth centre. But, as stated by me of our members, it will be a good thing if ine Govermmeat pruvide roofing materials for, I balieve the peo le out of zealousy will somehow manage to acquire Aluminium sheit or on rugated Iron sheet for mof which will again canse yreat problem to them. Hence, Governmemt should so well in providing roofing materials for \(u\) ur subnealth centres.

I am glal that govermment distributed a good number of musical ; instruments and other essential items like petromax to villagers all these items are essential for community clevelopTisnt. In view of their impurtance, I think govemment should senction mote fund for communty development.

As stated at para 19, fund is available for construc Cion Jf Rest House, Tourist Lolge and Bungalows in different druas uf Mizoram. But, I regret to note that there is no predsion of fund for construction of Tourist Lodge in Chhimtui. pui district arema. I tnerefure, suggest tnat Tourist Lodge be cunsiructed at phawngphui Maountain, for I know the place is much suitable for holiday resort.

There is proposal for cunstruction of Bus station and workshop. But I dont think single workshop alone will eater our requirements. I am of epinion that there should be another wirishop at Lunglei since it is alsu District feadquarter. of the buses placed at Luthinlel many of them are inservicable and it is a trouble to take them tu alzawl for repairing. Hence, Govt. would do well in constructing workshop there.
* pu Joe ngurdahl a : pu Dy. Speaker, I have founu many things In the Aduress for whila to give thanks. I am truely glad that there had been immense proyress in various falds inspite of a troubled atmosphere of the country. The condition of Mizoram in the recent past can bo seen in the second para of the L. Gis hddress. It is obvious so that Mizoram is \(\operatorname{still}\) far from nermaley so far as liaw and order situation is concemed. as atated.permanent peace is thes most important matter in mizoram but the 'quit Mizoram! notice and several other dases of violence aisturbed : the peace and trang uility eatising a-serious set-back to the pace of development so essential for prosperity. Inspite of the troubled atmosphere the authorities and Government officials made efforts for, further improvament besicies making large privision of fund ander the current buclget.

In" regard to rehabilitation of the MNF Ruturneds It seems that it-is not only Mizoram but also Nagaland who has difeiculty in haoing a clear-cut policy for rehabilitation. As it is a dlfsicult task govermment will have to give due import ance. I am of the opinion that there should be separate schme rather than nomal schare for rehabilitation of our returnees.

The planning Comission have allotted an outlay Jf Rs.95.09 crores for the sixth Five year plan against Rs. 46.58 crores for the 5th five Year plan. I am ylad that there was an increase of \(104 \%\) in the 6 th plan. Inspite \(u\) p party Eriction anu lisolution of Ministry for sometimes, our govermment officials and members af rhe Ministry who fomed the givermment dia the best in pressing central yovermment and planniny Commission to allot larger provision of fund fur acceleration of levulopmental works. Hence, the credit shouil be given to our government and owr enthusiastic officers. Other states budget may be inryer than that of ours yot, we can presume that there will be improvament if fund allotted is utilized.

There is a great dmand for better electricity in Mizoram. As we may be aware, prilindary survey of hydel potentiality on our rivers was asncucted uff and on since some times back. However, there was not any result to be scone In Eact, the survey seems to be ended in smoke and when I inquired about it I was told that hydel potentiality on our rivers par ticularly on river thawny was sight due to erosion. I beliave there will be many jifficulties in this case and I am not. surs rised that the previous goverment also could not make much hezdwey if; survet report was not encouraginy. Neverthelesis, due to strenous offorts maic by our Chief Minister and power Minister, it appears that there is going to be improvement in electricity. Besides obtai. ning services of power experts mure grid puwer will be mane avallable from other states, project in adution to popusal made for takiny up river investigations. It seams thint now is a new ora and powar Revolution in mizoram. Inere nau beon times when our urooqsalis. and what werse, saicd in the fouse endad up in moke. But now what we said are shopea in reality for winich I am thankful. I stronyly believe that what hid deen said rejariang puwar also will come tu reality.

I am also glad to note various relief measures token by the govermant for drouyht and famine affected area. But, we should be aware that reliaf work has not yet been completed. In fact, we have been hearing everquay the cry of distrass from the length and breadth of Mizoram. Actually there is no prper scheme under central ur lucal Goverment for relief measurcs. Under the present circumstances government will have to make personal verifieation of the famine affected areas for accelaration of relief measures. Last night, Radio broadcast famine and drought affected areas where the government aim to take relief measures. But, Mizoram was not included. fence, jovemment will have to take strony measures and they may ilso have to pursue Central Govermment, to acknuwledge the condition of Mizuramorif foil that we shoul tiont. forget the presence of a difficult task before us.

I think I am not wrony to say that Vety. is the Department who hal achieved most proyrss in Mizoram. Ihi achieve. monts made by the Department are to be even in remote villayos. Bisides offering soope for laryescale cattle faming there is incrense in the production. we may also be aware of the existenci دf grasslands suitable for cattle farming in the eastern range. For further progress, the Department shoula be strensthened:an office whth adequate staff may alsu be openec in other places rather than what we already had.

It seems that what was said of Mizoram by Shri Jajivanrem, the then Central Minister in the field of fishery was true. potentiality of Mizuram for fishing is un deniable. Gjvermment will therefore do well in making laryer schome for jetting up to fishing Industry in Mizoram.

What I want to saw in the discussion of L.G's dijless is the importance of implementing/finalizing scheme and эroposal which are sure to Ne successful for Mizoram, for echeme which had been a sucessin other states may not be succ issiul in Mizoram.
