M.R W rkers have been asked to quit since the arrival of Chlof Engencer: If the workers are not retrenched, should they not receive their sulary? And if they have been shifted from one place to another. Why have they been asked to step working? According to the Industrial Dispute jet, a person should be given one menth's notice prior to the retrenchment. If not, those who have sarved make than a year, should be given their salary. Now they have stopped working for more than two months Can they not be shifted while working?

PU LAHMINGTHANGA,

Pu Deputy Speaker, The Industrial Dispute Act of 1947 can not be applied to Muster Roll Workers. We must

not forget that M.R Labourers are employed according to the amount of works in the Department. This is the procedure all over India. Regarding shifting of Station; it is often the case that the worker himself is not willing to shift to another Station when the work in his present Station is finished. This capacitated him to continue. Muster Roll worker do not have scale of pay and if they are not present at Roll Call, they are not given their wages. Some of the M:R workers are cold t at they would be given work again. But if they do not report themselves, it is difficult to contact them. Adjustment are going to be made and there is no intention of retrenchment.

PU SINGHAKA:

Pu Deputy Speaker, the Hon'blm Minister in-charge has stated that the Muster Roll labourers are being re-organised at present and I think it is very understandable. However, it is reported that sime Divisions have list of Muster Roll labourers who are not really engaged. It is a fact that the Govt. maney is wasted on such things?

PU LALHMINGTHANGA, MINISTER ... *

Pu Deputy Speaker, the Hon'ble Minister' has pointed out a very important matter.

H wever, the Govt has not yet proved the excistence of such things up till new. The Govt. is taking every step possible to check such misuses.

As a result, the exiting Pachhunga Memorail College was then given ever to the University. Locking back upon this mot, it does not seems to be an error in handing over one of the best college in North East India. No one could foresee the problems that were yet to come. Provisions for this Collage was not available from the 5th Five Year Plan, this meant that provisions were to be made from 6th. Plan.

19 of the teaching staff have opted for Mizoram. One of them me has been appointed as Principal in Alzawl College and another as Deputy Director. How are we to absorb the rest of the teaching staff? Those with ten years experience may be appeinted as

Principal in some of court colleges. Cam Mr NEHU give assurance of fulfillment of the Head of Department? If not, there may be no profit in being affliated to the University. If provisions are not made in the 5th, Five Year Plan, will it not be possible to propose a Revised Budget? And if assurance cannot be given by the University, it would be wise and important that knews their House voices its desire to take back the constituent Call ge and placed it under the Govt. of Mizoram.

FU K.BI.KCHUNGNUNGA: Pu Deputy Speaker, I do not think we need to elaborate the facts regarding Pachhinga University College, it could be summed at a up in a simple way. Once It was a Govt. Coll ge but hoping that it would be for the best, it was given ver to the University as a constituent College. And now that problems have arisen, it is proposed to take back the College and place it under the Govt, of Mizorum.

We may consider the problems in two ways. Firstly, the proposal to take back the Collège itself should be examined carefully. It seems that inspite of some lecturers who have opted for Mizoram, there are quite number who still prefer to stay in NEHU. It would have be disastrous to take their steps without prior provisions made in the Budget Plan. And as no provision has been made in the 6th, Five Year Plan. I consider it is unwise to take their step. On the other hand, NEHU itself has promised to show more progress and it would be fair to give them a chance to prove their worth. However, if they is fail to make any progress then it would be proper to act and take up the challenge on our shoulders.

Secondly, there could be some other motives behind these words. There could be personal glory in championing the cause. Although I do not mean to say there is any such thing in this matter. However, the Govt. will see what can be done about the matter as it is not too late.

PU LAL THANHAWLA:

Pu Deputy Speaker, I believe that
this is a very important issue which
needs to be discussed with definite
i.es and not with a prejudicial mind.

I am sorry that the Member who stood before me seem to have a conturted view of the matter. He also seemed to have a notion t at Members are at the book and call lecturess. I am glod that the Hn'ble Member Pu C.L.Ru la has xmanaged to give his valuable time to study about the ndition of Pachhunga University College, and of its possibilities to be handed back to the Govt. If Mizorah.

I do not think there is any ulterior motive behind their matter on anything when reading between the lines. It is learnt how that majority of the Lecturers have opted for Mizoram. There is also difficulty for the Mizo staff at NEHU owing to the petty rivales and sulfish intersis and communual feelings.

the way Therefore, in leu of Pachhunga University College, the Goot. may establish a new Colf yet be . affiliated NgHU as a constituent College.

I therefore wish that this Resolution may be discussed and considered without prejulibeer foultfinding. If however, be do not find it agreeable, it would be far better to oppose it frankly, instead of beating about the bush. Not forgetting that we will soon be needing a University of our : wn, let us all strive for taking back one of our best College eputur en from M NEHU.

F. K.L/LS/NGA:

Pu Deputy Speaker, if-we study the resolution carefully, there is n appeal to the Govt. to take steps for the welfare of the College. It is rather an expect appeal to take back Pachhunga University College and place it in the care of the Govt. of Mizoram.

It is therefore wrong to find foult with the Govt. regarding the wolfare of this College. NEHU has Flready made provision for P.U College in the 6th, Five Year Flan and if the College is taken back, there would be not covisions for it in the Govt. of Mizoram. It may not wisest thingto to do, considering that the constituent Collage vas established only in 1975. I fear that in our attemp to I live the priblem we may only create more problems than we can cope with. Presently, I think we should give more time to the University to imprive the conditions of the Collage. If after that they should soill fail to do so, then we should take up the cause in the next session.

NGURCHHINA:

Pu Deputy Speaker, I do not think there is much to be said in this matter. Right from the start, I did not think handing over to NEHU would be a very good idea. As we have experienced (EITU) Eastern Kokk India Tribal Union was a failure and so was und mill State. Mizes were always out cf it, and now we have NEHU very much pulled back by A litics. It would also be good to know that taking back the Collage. itself will not be very easy. Therefore if we pass it now, the earliest date may not be before August, which mexica means that a revised budget would be possible to prepare. Provisions for P.M.G Collage could be included in the Revised Budget. Personally, I feel that it is the best thing to stay separate from NEHU with its party politics among various tribes of the North East India. It is clear from our discussion today that we need a separate University of our own. I think it is time the Govt. thinks in terms of a seperate University.

PV P.LALUPA:

Pu Deputy Speaker, as we consider this resolution I feel that it is necessary to set aside our party feelings, and put our heads together to discuss this important issue, which holds one of the major keys to the future of education in Mizoram. I think that there is a more important need to consider than just the pour administration and maintenance of the Collage. I think the Member who spoke before me had hit the point. NEHU had become a hot bed of politics. It does not seem right to have our best College involved in the atmosphere. If my source of information is correct Arunachal Pradesh is also now processifor a University of their own. And if they can do that, I am surit would not be too difficult for us, as we have more Collages than they have.

I am the refere of the pinion that we should persue this important resolution.

PU LALHMINGTHANGA: Pu Deputy Spe ker, this is a res luti n which needs careful consideration. I will like to point out a fewpoints for MINISTER . consideration in this respect.

It is a fact that Pachhunga University has not progressed since wit was taken over by NEHU. There are tow or three reasons for this. Firstly, NEHU is not so well established as it appears to be. The initial zeal at the time of its establishment back in 1961/62 has note been carried on wing to the interference of politics. The buildings are also wing to the interference of politics. hired although a good amount of land has been purchased from Mrs. Elgin. The impression which the University had first made has not been met by NEHU not only in Mizoram but also in Nagalona and other places.

Secondly, from the viewpoints of the centre and the U.G.C. Development on the whole appears to be going smoothly. If a hasty decission is made concerning our local area alone, it may not be the viwepoints f the centro. A separate University for Arunachil, Mizerum, Nagaland etc. would be immature from their paints view.

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Therefore, it would be import nt to make a eccission without getting our amotional feelings involved in it. The fact that Shilleng has been chosen for the location of the University is not a surprise. Shilleng has been the centre of clucation in the North East area since many years back. That clone is the point of justification all was with a great expectation that NEHU was established. However, this expectation has not been fulfilled in Mizoram and there is a sense of despair concerning this Constituent Collage of the University. Therefore, the Foundamental issue is that NEHU is supable to meet the need of Mizaram and therefore it is felt that Pachhunga University. College, which is the hard-earned contribution of the people of Miz ram, should not like wasted in NEHU. The main issue is whether or not it should remain in NEHU, Otherpoints like delay of salaries, poor administration are etc. are only secondary issues. He wever, enven if this August House may pass to take back the College, I feel that financially it is the wrongtime to make a decission.

If we make a hosty decission now, it may only be for the profit of NEHU. The most import no thing is to pave the way for a sure sucess. Presently, I feel that even if P.M. College is taken back by the Govt. of Mizoram, thore should still be one constituent College of NEHU in Mizoram. A new constitution may be established for this purpose.

An amendment could be made from what we have discussed so far which may be adapted by the House.

PU S. VADYU:

Pu Deputy Speaker, what the Harble Minister has just sta-ted is very much in tune with the resolution which needs: - 'necessary steps be taken by the Govt. of Mizoram' I think that sime of the Members have everlocked the needs 'necessary steps'.

I think it wild be suitable to process it a supplementary Demand in the Revised Budget.

PU BUALHR NGA:

Pu Deputy Speaker, it is a good thing that summe Members have given the full background of the Callage. The main question is whether or not we should take back P.M Callage. It is clear that we want the best for this leading Colloge in Mizeram. It is also alear that the mover of this resolution have moved it with a desire for the botterment of the Collago. According to the runours, the reason behind the Metiric ration of Pachhunga University College is that NEHU did not notify the University Grant Comission when it decided to take over Pachhunga Collage. Ix on of the opinion that NEHU be urged for the immediate all round improvement of the Collage. As amentmentment be made thus:

Pu JOE NGURDAWLA:

Pu Deputy Speaker, our main concern is the
detiricration condition of Pachhu ga University College. Leaking back at the time of
handing it over to NEHU, there was also a suggestion that a new
Collage be set up for a constituent College of NEHU. Inspite of
the high expectation, NEHU has failed to meet the need of Mizerm.

I therefore think that the form of recolution is not a require I therefore whink that the form of resolution is not very wisc for the present stage. The amendment as propossed by Pu Bunkhrang seems to be very appropriate for our immediate stage. I therefore second the propossed amendment which reas:-

> "This House notes with graye concorn the detiricrating condition of Pachhunga University College since it was handed Therefore, this House is of the opinion that NEHU be urged to make immediate improvement of Pachhunga University College."

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PU F.MALSAWMA, Pu Deputy Speaker, regarding the absorbtion MINISTER. of the staff, we should know that a sudden and total absorbtion of the lecturers would not be possible. Even if it were possible, it would not beathe , best thing to do. The studentd will suffer and the Collage will suffer as well. However, the immediate problem is the welfare of the Collage. The Govt. howevers taken steps towards this and the Pro.V.C of NEHU has also talked to the URG.C Chairman in Dehli. in reply, Mr. Mathuri Shah wrote as follows:-

> "Kindly refer to your letter No. so and so addressed to the Union Minister Education Minister regarding Pachhunga University College which has been taken over by the NEHU and a copy to me. I have locked into the matter cand found that the grant of Rs.14 Takhs for 1979-80 and 1980-81 has already been taken to NEHU towards the expenditure for maintenance of the Pachnung: Collego. The University has been requested; to indicate the actual expenditure incurred so far against this grant to enable the Commission to see if my further grant is payable to the University for the purpose. In xixx view of the fact that University has been over the Collage, I agree with you

that it would be the responsibility of the University that the construction of the buildings which had been taken up on sharing basis of the Collage, when it was an wasks of the affiliated College of the University if taken over by the University itself and I am asking the Vice Chancellar, NEHU to let us have the full details of an early completion of the buildings. I am scrry that the College is facing some difficulties regarding the non-fulfilment of the agreement which the University had entered into with the State Govt. regarding the taking over of this Callege and I propose to convene a meeting of the representative of the University and Mizuram Guvt. and the University of Education to settle all Mizeram Govt: to perticipate in the Meeting".

This shows that some progress has been made. Therefore, it is time to set aside all proposed party politics and consider this issue together. I therefore think it would be bost to go according to the proposed amendment of the resolution.

In the mean time, the Lecturers of the College submitted their memorandum to the L.G and myself. I wrote to the Education Minister while I was in Dehli and told him about the urgency of the matter. I r west him to convene a meeting whiler his chairmanship with reprisontative of NBHU, Mizoram Govt. and the Ministry of Education as their matter would no longer be solved through more correspon-Cencer

The L.G. has also given the matter a very serious thought. He too brought the matter to the authorities in Dehli. The Education Minister was informed for the first time about the problem and thus a meeting was called as suggested to him. The U.G.C has also for the first filme realised the situation and the urgency to tackle the matter as soon as possible. However, if we pass this resolution and let the authorities know of our decission to take back the College at this crucial stage, it would be most contradictory to the function we have sent to them and well, they would feel that if that is the way we want it; they had nothing also to say. This resolution is more critical in amended form. We need to know the opinion of various depurtments concurned.
