PRIVATE MEMBERS RESOLUTION

As required by rule 131 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in Mizoram Legislative Assembly re-balloting of Private Members Resolution which has been listed for discussion on 14.3.86 but not discussed on that day, along with other resolutions was held. The following is the relative precedence of the Resolutions.

Sl. No	Name of Members	Subject
1.	Pu J. Thanghuama	"This Assembly is of the opinion that any further delay in solving the 20 year long political problems of Mizoram will only create more problems. This Assembly therefore earnestly requests both the Central Government of India and the Mizo National Front delegates (who represent Mizos) to resume their talks immediately and thereby arriving at an honorable settlements before the Parliament Budget Session is adjourned sine die."

2.	Pu K. Biakchungnunga Pi K. Thansiami	“This Assembly resolves that water supply by trucks carriage should be distributed at all public points in the following towns namely Aizawl, Saiha, Lunglei and Lawngtlai.”
3.	Pu R. Lalawia	“This Assembly is of the opinion that Loyal citizens pushed into the few grouping Villages by the Security Forces in the high of disturbance had suffered huge losses and damage of properties, livestock, etc., during the transshipment, the compensation that has been long neglected may now be released to the deserving families.”
4.	Pu Zosiana Pachuau	“This Assembly resolves that the Govt. of Mizoram should procure Ginger, the most successful cash crop grown in Mizoram at a more profitable rate than last year for the grower and also establish easier process of selling for the growers.”
5.	Pu F. Lalchhawna	“This Assembly is of the opinion that General Nursing Service Training Centre of Aizawl be transferred to Lunglei for the upliftment of both Lunglei and Chhimtuipui Districts during 1986-87.”
6.	Pu Lalhmingthanga	“This Assembly resolves that the present peace talk between the Govt. of India and the MNF which is being unduly delayed by the Congress (I) Govt. should be successfully concluded without any further delay.”
7.	Pu F. Lalramliana	“This Assembly is of the opinion that the Members of the three Autonomous District Councils in Mizoram should be given a pension by the Govt. as is given to the Members of the Mizoram Legislative Assembly.”
8.	Pu Lalhmingthanga	“This Assembly is of the opinion that all the non-Tribals staying and carrying on business/trade without Trade License in

		Mizoram should be traced out and identified and should be pushed back to their original places.”
9.	Pu Zairemthanga	“This Assembly resolves the liquor permits both wholesale and retail issued by the Congress (I) Govt. of Mizoram should be cancelled with immediate effect in compliance with the popular feelings of the people of Mizoram expressed through the voluntary organizations like YMA, KTP/TKP and Church Organizations.”
10.	Pu R. Lalawia	“This Assembly is of the opinion that for the development of Industries the Central Government be moved to make special provisions for Duty-Free import of Foreign made Industrial Machineries and Equipments for Mizoram.”
