PRIVATE MEMBERS' RESOLUTIONS PASSED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY DURING ITS THIRD SESSION ON THE 29TH FEBRUARY, 1980

Sl. No	Name of Members	Resolution
1.	Pu Ngurchhina	"This Assembly is of the opinion that a separate Service to be known as Mizoram Police Service be created in Mizoram."
2.	Pu C. Vulluaia	"This Assembly recommends that the Community Hall now under construction on the site of the Aizawl Theatre Hall be called after Vana Pa, one of the most honoured heroes among Mizos and henceforward be named 'VANA PA HALL'."
3.	Pu J. Thankunga	"This Assembly is of the opinion that Phaitlang Ram be taken up by Agriculture Department under Integrated Rural Development Scheme for permanent cultivation from 1980-81 financial year."
4.	Pu Lalthanzauva	"This Assembly resolved that construction of Hospital buildings be

		taken up with immediate effect at Kulikawn, Aizawl, on the site acquired for the purpose by the Govt. of Mizoram.”
5.	Pu C. Vulluaia	“This Assembly recommends that a special fund under a separate head be made available for meeting the requirements of youths, for eg. Recreational halls, purchase of musical instruments, Petromax, etc so that their leisure may be utilized for creative indoor and outdoor activities for the gifted youths to improve their talents further.
6.	Pu J. Thankunga	<p>“This Assembly is of the opinion that whereas, under Article 46 of the Constitution of India, the State shall promote special care, among other matters, the economic interest of the weaker section of the people and in particular of the Schedule Tribes;</p> <p>And whereas, the Govt. of Assam had been allowing certain concession in regard to the settlement of contracts, permits, fisheries, ferries, forest mahals, tolls etc. to safeguard the economic interests of the Schedule Tribes;</p> <p>And whereas, the Govt. of Mizoram has in their Order No. HG. 61/73/12 dated 5th Dec, 1973 continues such concession with certain modifications;</p> <p>And whereas, the said order is not very clear in certain respects;</p> <p>However, therefore, this House resolves that-</p>

		<p>(i) The existing concession by which the Schedule Tribes are required to deposit only 50 percent of the prescribed Earnest money will continue.</p> <p>(ii) (a) In respect of work contracts when they are settled on the basic of the tender/quotations they should be settled with candidates belonging to Schedule Tribes upto a limit of 12 percent above the lowest tender/offer in any such case, subject to suitability of the person and his ability to perform the task satisfactorily.</p> <p>(b) In respect of permits, fisheries, tolls bridges, forest mahals etc, when they are settled on the basic of bids whether in auction or by tender they should be settled with the candidates belonging to Scheduled Tribes upto the limit of 12 percent below the highest bid offered in any such case, subject to suitability of the person and his ability to perform the task satisfactorily.</p> <p>(c) In case of carriage contracts the limit of preferential treatment as stipulated in (ii) (a) above,</p>
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		<p>will be 10 percent.</p> <p>2. All person who are not permanent resident of Mizoram will be required to have a registered office/sub-office in Mizoram and the person in-charge of the local office will have all the necessary powers of attorney from the proprietor so that in case of any legal dispute, it is settled in the local court.</p>
