PRIVATE MEMBER'S RESOLUTIONS FOR THE SEVENTH SESSION OF THE THIRD LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

Ten Private Members' Resolutions have been received and admitted by the Hon'ble Speaker. These Resolutions have been allotted as required under Rule 122 of the Rules of Procedure. The following is the relative precedence of the Resolutions.

1.	Pu B. Lalchungnunga	"This Assembly is of the opinion that in view of the day-to-day decrease in monetary value, the rate of compensation in respect of lands Houses, Crops etc which was fixed some years ago become incompatible with the present monetary value. This House, therefore, resolves that the existing rate of compensation in respect of lands, houses, crops etc be revised

		immediately.”
2.	Pu K. Lalsanga	“This Assembly is of the opinion that Censorship be imposed on publication of Books, Novels, Comics etc. published in the Mizo language other than those books published by the Church Authorities.”
3.	Pu Ellis Saidenga	“This Assembly is of the opinion that the Govt. of Mizoram feels it desirable to establish a Police Outpost at Cherhlun Grouping Centre which is situated at the Burma Border.”
4.	Pu V. Lalnunzira	<p>“This Assembly is of the opinion on that REST HOUSE at Aizawl may be built purely for the protection of minorities’ interest of Mizoram.”</p> <p>Minorities group within Mizoram shall have the right to enjoy the REST HOUSE for the improvement of their physical needs.</p> <p>Eg. Riang, Hrangkhawl, Sakachek.</p>
5.	Pu Joe Ngurdawla Pu Biakchhunga Pu Bualhranga	“This Assembly is of the opinion that certain area of land be allotted for graveyards in all the protected area, in Mizoram.”
6.	Pu C.L. Ruala	“This Assembly is of the opinion that Every recognized village should have a reserved cattle grazing ground.”
7.	Pu Sainghaka	“This Assembly is of the opinion that the

		District Industries Centers in Mizoram be organised and established in all India Pattern as is done in other States.”
8.	Pu Bualhranga Pu Biakchhunga Pu Joe Ngurdawla	“This Assembly is of the opinion that Fire Control Act be made by the Govt. of Mizoram for protection of Agricultural Land form devastation by Fire.”
9.	Pu B. Lalchungnunga	<p>“Whereas population in the fowns area is increasing rapidly; and whereas may families have been on the look-out buildings for hire as they have neither land nor houses in the Towns;</p> <p>And whereas many individuals have been holding permits for Agriculture land within the Town areas but not looking after them for the purpose for which the permits were granted;</p> <p>Now, therefore, this House resolves that no permits for land holdings for Agriculture purposes within the Town Areas should be granted in future.</p> <p>This House further resolves that permits for Agriculture lands issued to individuals within Town areas but not utilized for the purpose for which they are granted be cancelled and allotted as house sites to Landless persons.”</p>
10.	Pu Ellis Saidenga	“This Assembly is of the opinion that the Matriculate Middle School Teachers should

		not be dismissed from service simply because they do not possess the required educational qualification; but such teachers should be given a chance to pass the Pre-University Examination within three years.”
