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#### **NOTIFICATION**

No. LJD. 207/83/6, the 30th September, 1983. The following Act of the Mizoram Legislative Assembly, which received the assent of the Lt. Governor (Administrator) of Mizoram, is hereby published for general inforantion.

Mizoram Act No. 3 of 1983. The Mizoram Appropriation (No. 3) Act. 1983.

(Received the assent of the Lt. Governor (Administrator) of Mizoram on the 24th Sept. 1983).

to provide for the authorisation of appropriation of moneys out of the Consolidated Fund of the Union territory of Mizoram to meet the amounts spent on certain services during the financial year ended on the 31st. day of March, 1975, in excess of the amounts granted for those services and for that year.

BE it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of Mizoram in the Thirty fourth Year of the Republic of India as follows:

- 1. This Act may be called the Mizoram Appropriation No. 3) Act, 1983.
- 2. From and out of the Consolidated Fund of the Union territory of Mizoram, the sums specified in column 3 of the Schedule to this Act amounting in the aggregate to the sum of one crore three lakhs ninety four thousand and seventy five rupees shall be deemed to have been authorised to be paid and applied to meet the amount spent for defraying the charges in respect of the services specified in column 2 of the Schedule during the financial year ended on the 31st. day of March, 1975, in excess of the amounts granted for those services and for that year.

Short title

Issue of Rs.. 1,03,94,075/from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the Union territory of Mizoram to meet certain excess expenditure for the year ended on the 31st. March, 1975.

3. The sums deemed to have been authorised to be paid and applied from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the Union territory of Mizoram under this Act shall be deemed to have been appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the Schedule in relation to the financial year ended on the 31st. day of March,
