NOTIFICATION

No. A. 22020/9/90-S&WC/108, the 26th March, 1993. The Governor of Mizoram is pleased to order creation of a new Soil & Water Conservation Division at Kolasib with the three existing Soil & Water Conservation Ranges at (1) Vairengte (2) Kolasib and (3) Zawlnuam.

The Headquarters of this newly created Division will be at Kolasib and that of the three Soil & Water Conservation Ranges will be as in the existence. The boundary description of this newly created Division with the boundary description of Zawlnuam Range will be as per enclosed Annexure 'A' 'B'.

ANNEXURE—'A'

BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION OF KOLASIB SOIL & WATER CONSERVATION
DIVISION

Headquarters — Kolasib

Area — 2517.32Km.Sq. (Approx)

GEOGRAPHICAL POSITION: It lies between 92° 16' to 92°56' East Longitude and 23° 46' to 24°34' North Latitude.

BOUNDARY DETAILS

1. **NORTHERN SIDE** :- The boundary line starts from the crossing point of inter-state boundary line of Tripura, Assam and Mizoram in the North Western corner near Kanmun Village and then it follows the Inter- state boundary line of Assam and Mizoram till it meets the Tuirial river.
2. **EASTERN SIDE** :- The boundary line then turns towards the Southerly direction by following the Tuirial river upto the confluence of Tuirial and Damdiai river.
3. **SOUTHERN SIDE** :- It then turns towards the Westerly direction by following the Inter-sub divisional boundary line of Aizawl Sadar Sub-division and Kolasib sub-division upto the confluence of Tlawng and Tut river and then it follow the Tut river in Southerly direction upto the confluence of Tut and Daplui river near Tuaizawl Village. Then the boundary line follows the Inter-Block boundary line of West Phailen and Mamit in Westerly till it meets the Inter-state boundary line of Tripura and Mizoram.
4. **WESTERN SIDE** :- Lastly, the boundary line follows the Inter-state boundary line of Tripura and Mizoram in northerly direction till it meets the starting point.

Kolasib Soil & Water Conservation Division consists of the following Ranges.

1. Kolasib Range
2. Vairengte Range
3. Zawnuam Range

Sl. No. 3. Boundary description of Zawnuam Range only is attached because some part of it is bifurcated from W.Phaileng Range which is under Aizawl West Division.

BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION OF ZAWLNUAM SOIL & WATER CONSERVATION RANGE. (Under Proposed Kolasib S&WC Div).

Headquarter - Zawlnuam
Area - 840 Km Sq. (Approx)

GEOGRAPHICAL POSITION: It lies between 92°16' to 92°31' E. Longitude and 23°46' to 24°16' North Latitude.

BOUNDARY DETAILS

1. **NORTHERN SIDE:** The boundary line starts from the crossing point of Inter-state boundary line of Tripura, Assam and Mizoram in the north western corner near Kanhmun village and then it follows the Inter-state boundary line of Assam and Mizoram till it meets the confluence of river Tlawng and Teirei.
2. **EASTERN SIDE:** The boundary line turns towards the southerly direction following the Tut river upto the Inter Block boundary line of Zawlnuam and W. Phaileng.
3. **SOUTHERN SIDE :** Then, it turns towards westerly direction and it follows the In er-Block Administrative boundary line of Zawlnuam and W. Phaileng.
4. **WESTERN SIDE :** Lastly, the boundary line follows the Inter-state boundary line of Tripura and Mizoram in northerly direction till it meets the starting Point.
