NOTIFICATION

The Rules of the Gauhati High Court (The High Court of Assam, Nagaland, Meghalaya Manipur, Tripura, Mizoram and Arunachal Pradesh) (2nd Amendment) Rules 1994.

1. (1) These rules shall be called the Gauhati High Court (The High Court of Assam, Nagaland, Meghalaya, Manipur, Tripura, Mizoram and Arunachal Pradesh (Amendment) Rules 1994, hereinafter referred to as "The Amending Rules".
- (2) The amending Rules shall come into force with immediate effect.
2. The Rule 6 under Chapter V of the Gauhati High Court Rules shall stand amended as follows :—

" 6 (1) A memorandum of appeal to the High Court against the decree or order passed in appeal by any Court subordinate to it shall be accompanied by (i) certified copy of the judgement and decree or order appealed from; (ii) typed copies of the judgements of the trial court and appellate courts below and (iii) typed copies of the pleadings with English translation, if necessary.

Provided that in case of urgency the memo of appeal may be filed with the leave of the court without the typed copy of the pleadings. But the typed copies of the pleadings shall be filed within the time as may be granted by the Court.

(2) If a memorandum of appeal is filed by an Advocate of the High Court, it shall bear a certificate under his hand at the foot of the memo of appeal in the following form :

"I, A.B. advocate of the above named.....do hereby certify that, in my judgement, the ground (or if there be several, each of the grounds) of appeal in the above petition presented by me on behalf of the said.....is a good ground of second appeal.

Dated, the day of"

Provided that in the case of an appeal against a decree or order passed after remand by this Court, copies of judgement or decree of the lower courts passed before the case was remanded need not be furnished."

3. The Rule 50 occurring under part III of Chapter IX of the Gauhati High Court Rules for preparation of paper-books in appeals from appellate decrees and orders be deleted.
