ORDER

No. C. 18014/1/86-HMJ, the 10th August, 1994. Whereas in commemoration of the ensuing 47th Anniversary of the Independence Day 1947, the State Government have decided to remit the sentence against certain categories of Prisoners who have been convicted by the Courts (other than court martial) having criminal jurisdiction in the State of Mizoram and sentenced to rigorous imprisonment.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section 1 of section 432 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (Central Act No. 2 of 1974) read with rule 17 of the Assam Jail Manual as applicable in Mizoram (Amendment) Rules, 1986, the Governor of Mizoram is pleased to grant remission of sentences for different categories of the prisoners as specified below now lodged in the jails of Mizoram and outside other than those in respect of whom the sentence is inflicted for an offence against the order referred to in sub-section 6 of section 432 of the said code in passed under any law relating to which the executive powers of Union extends.

The scale of remission of sentence for different categories are specified below :-

CATEGORY	SCALE OF REMISSION
1. Prisoners with sentence above one year	30 days
2. Prisoners with sentence above 6 months upto 1 year	15 days
3. Prisoners with sentence above 3 months upto 6 months	10 days
4. Prisoners with sentence above one month upto 3 months.	5 days.

The aforesaid remission granted under the order shall not be admissible to the following categories of prisoners :—

1. Prisoners sentenced for simple imprisonment or imprisonment in lieu of fine.
2. The Foreigners Act.
3. Passport Act.
4. Foreign national convicted under any Act.
5. Section 3 to 10 of the Official secret Act, 1923
6. Prisoners convicted for offences againsts the State under section 121 to 130 of IPC.
7. Prevention of Corruption Act.
8. Section 107/109 Cr. P.C.
9. Offences to which executive power of the Union extends.
10. Prevention of Food Adulteration Act.
11. Suppression of Immoral Traffic Act.

This remission order will take effect from 15th August, 1994.
