## NOTIFICATION

No. H. 12018/55/95-LJD, the 7th April, 1995. The following Act of the Mizoram Legislative Assembly, which received the assent of the Governor of Mizoram is hereby published for general information.

The Mizoram Act No. 3 of 1995 The Mizoram Appropriation (No. 3) Act, 1995.

Received the assent of the Governor of Mizoram on the 30th March 1995.

### AN ACT

THE MIZORAM APPROPRIATION (NO. 3) ACT, 1995 (As passed by the Legislative Assembly on the 29th March, 1995)

BE it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of Mizoram in the Forty Sixth Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be called the Mizoram Appropriation (No. 3) Act, 1995.
- 2. From and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Mizoram, there may be paid and applied sums not exceeding those specified in column 3 of the Schedule amounting in the aggregate to the sums of fifty crores ninty three lakhs forty seven thousand and ninety eight towards defraying the several charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year 1986-87 (for Union Territory and State Period) in respect of the services specified in column 2 of the Schedule.

Short title

Issue of Rs. 2193,79,771/- for Union Territory administration and Rs. 2899,67,327/- for State Period Total Rs. 5093, 47, 098/- from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Mizoram for the financial year 1986-87.

3. The sums authorised to be paid and applied from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Mizoram by this Act shall be appropriated for the services and purpose expressed in the Schedule in relation to the said year.
