The Mizoram Appropriation (No. 1) Act, 1996

Received the assent of the Governor of Mizoram on the 9th April, 1996.

AN

ACT

to authorise payment and appropriation of certain sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Mizoram for the services during the Financial Year of 1987 - 88 to 1992 - 93.

It is hereby enacted by the Legislative Assembly of Mizoram in the Forty Seventh Year of the Republic of India as follows : -

Short Title

1. This Act may be called the Mizoram Appropriation (No. 1) Act, 1996.

Issue of Rs. 6,78,88,234 for 1987—88, Rs. 1,96,42,98,770 for 1988—89, Rs. 1,00,69,28,431 for 1989—90, Rs. 13,39,64,762 for 1990—91, Rs. 60,48,59,743 for 1991—92, Rs. 1,36,89,58,977 for 1992—93, Total Rs. 5,14,68,98,917 from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Mizoram during the Financial Years 1987—88 to 1992—93.

2. From and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Mizoram, there may be paid and applied sums not exceeding those specified in Column 3 of the Schedule amounting in the aggregate to the sum of Rupees five hundred fourteen crores sixty eight lakhs ninety eight thousand nine hundred and seventeen towards defraying the several charges which come in course of payment during the financial years of 1987—88 to 1992—93 in respect of the services specified in column 2 of the Schedule.

Appropriation

3. The sums authorised to be paid and applied from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Mizoram by this Act shall be appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the Schedule in relation to the said years.
