THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1996.

No. 21 of 1996

Promulgated by the President in the Forty-seventh Year of the Republic of India.

An Ordinance further to amend the Representation of the People Act, 1951.

where As Parliament is not in session and the President is satisfied that circumstances exist which render it necessary for him to take immediate action.

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (1) of article 123 of the Constitution, the President is pleased to promulgate the following Ordinance:—

- 1. (1) This Ordinance may be called the Representation of the People (Amendment) Ordinance, 1996. Short title and commencement.
 - (2) It shall come into force at once.

Amendment of section 60.

- 2. In the Representation of the People Act, 1951, 43 of 1951 in section 60, after clause (b), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:—
 - "(c) any person, belonging to a class of persons, notified by the Election Commission in consultation with the Government, to give his vote by postal ballot, at an election in a constituency where a poll is taken subject to the fulfilment of such requirements as may be specified in those rules"
