to authorise payment and appropriation of certain sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Mizoram for the Services of the Financial Year of 1998—99.

BE it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of Mizoram in the Fiftieth Year of the Republic of India as follows :

Short Title 1. This Act may be called the Mizoram Appropriation (NO. 1) Act, 1999.

Issue of Rs. 268,81,81,000/- out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Mizoram for the Financial 1998-99. 2) From and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Mizoram, there may be paid and applied sums not exceeding those specified in Column (5) of the Year Schedule, amounting in the aggregate to the sums of Rupees two hundred sixty eight crores eighty one lakhs eighty one thousand only for defraying the several charges which will come in course of payment during the Financial Year 1998-99 in respect of Service specified in Column (2) of the Schedule.

Appropriation 3) The sums authorised to be paid and applied from and out of the consolidated Fund of the State of Mizoram by this Act, shall be appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the Schedule in relation to the said period.
