# AN ACT

to authorise the appropriation of certain sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the Union territory of Mizoram for the services of the financial year 1979 80.

BE it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of Mizoram in the Thirtieth Year of the Republic of India as follows :-

1. This Act may be called the Mizoran Appropriation (No. 3) Act, 1979.

From and out of the Consolidated Fund of the Union 2. territory of Mizoram, there may be paid and applied sums not exceeding those specified in column 3 of the Schedule amounting in the aggregate (inclusive of the sums specified in column 3 of the Schedule to the Mizoram Appropriation (Vote on Account) Act, 1979 (Central Act 13 of 1979) to the sum of seventy-one crores, the Consolitwenty-three lakhs and fifty-five thousand rupees, towards defraying the several charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year 1979-30 in respect of the services specified in column 2 of the Schedule.
