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FINAL NOTIFICATION

No. FOR. 134/79—80/108, the 22nd. September, 1980. In exercise of the power conferred by section 14, 15, 16, 17, 19 read with section 21 of Mizo District Forest Act, 1955 it is hereby notified for information of public in original and all concerned in particular that the land specified below and approximately bounded by the features describe is the description below is hereby consituated as state Forest Reserve from the date of publication of this Notification.

TIANTE FOREST RESERVE FOR THE PURPOSE OF PLANTATION DETAIL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION

AREA — 560 HECTARES

- Location** : Left Bank of Kawnpui River within Tiante Ram.
- North** : From the starting point the boundary runs towards east following Laihlauhva luiyai stream into the point where first small stream meets. Thence it follows that small stream and along upstream side towards east crossing small hill lock and meets Champhasuri lui.
- East** : From thence the boundary follows Champhasuri lui and along the upstream side towards South Crossing the hill lock and meet Laihlauhva lui. Thence it follows Laihlauhva lui towards down stream till the stream takes aturn. Thence it runs at the foot hill of Tiante hill Range towards north and after crossing a number of streams and nallas the boundary meets Borsagojasora Dinglam lui. Thence it follows the Dinglam lui of Borsagojasora towadr the upstream the side up to the hill lock.
- South** : From thence the boundary runs towards west and crosses the Rural Link Road at about 1 Km from Khjoysuri G. C. and thence meets Leitesuri lui. Thence it follows Leitesuri towards the downstream till it meets R. Kawrpui (Theka).
- West** : From the meeting point of Leitesuri lui and River Kawrpui the boundary runs towards north and along the downstream of R. Kawnpui (international boundary with Bangladesh) and meets the boundary of Kamaphuly Riverine reserve

Forest. Thence it follows and runs along the boundary line of existing Karnaphuli Forest Reserve and meets the starting points.

Vegetation : The area is an old Jhum avaded by Sungrasses and small grasses not fit for any more cultivation (Jhuming) Trees of various species especially Eombe luen, Disierocarpus turbinates occurs here and there, about and there are about 2 sq Km. Bamboo Forest Reserve by Trpiraghat village inside the area.

Line of Transport : (1) The rural link Road (truckable) through the area from North to South.
: (2) River Kawrpui, Navigable throughout the year.

**LUNGSEN RESERVE FOREST
DETAIL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION
AREA : 570 HECTARES**

Location : Within the Jurisdiction of Lungsen Village Council in between Lungsen Village and Phairuang Village.

North : Pillar No RF1 is erected on BRTF Road at the jurisdiction with the P. W. D. (Chawngte) Road. From Pillar No 1 the boundary runs towards east to 56.31' and follows down stream as dry nala up to Pillar RF No 2. where nala meets Chhun Khum lui. From Pillar No 2 the boundary follows along down stream of Chhunkhum lui towards east upto Pillar RF. 3 from then it runs at 11.15' run along a demarcated line and meet Chauchil lui at Pillar No RF. 4.

East : From Pillar No 4 boundary run along Chamchil lui upstream towards South following the ame Chamchil lui upstream and meets Lunglei Chawngte Road (PWD) where Pillar R. F. No 5 is erected.

South : From Pillar No RF 5 the boundary follows PWD Road towards North and meet Pillar RF No 6, then turns at 275.30' towards West and run along the demarcated line and meets Pillar No RF 7 erected on Chawngte PWD Road.

West : From Pillar No RF 7 the boundary runs along a demarcated line are 349 towards North and meets Pillar No RF 8 on Chawngte Road. From then it turns at 338 and meets Pillar No RF 9 on the thence it turns at 313.30' and meets Pillar No RF 10 on the road. Thence it turns at 302 a at meet pillar No RF. RF 11 from this. it turns at 30. and cross P. W. D. Road meets the starting point Pillar No 1.

Vegetation : Almost the whole area is dense Forest except small portion of jhum area which are avaded by banoos and grasses broad leaves, deciduous of various species like Michiloa shorea (Thingsen) Chamalish Comari, Duabanga Jaman (Lenhmui) Hollong Chima Walichii, Lagerotamea species samul etc. Malveana Bambosoides Dendrp calamus species a good number of cane and Ferns.

Geological and Soil : Mainly Sedimentary Rocks like sandstone, Glaystone Split is red with rich humus.
Aspect : Mostly Northern aspect and small portion, Southwest aspect.

Line of Transport : Pacca Road (BRTF Road) Lunglei—Tlabung from east to west and Lunglei—Chawngte Road (PWD Road) at present Jeepable crosses from North to South BRTF and PWD Road and Chamchi lui entrangle the whole area.

Market & Marketable produce : It has market Centre Lunglei, Tlabung Chawngte as well as local Villages like Lungsen, Rengte, Phairuang, Hauruang. Moreover, its produces can be easily marketed at Aizawl through the main road. It has marketable produce like logs, sawn tibers, poles, canes and bamboo.

**HAULAWNG RESERVE FOREST
DETAILED BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION
AREA : 820 HECTARES**

- Location :** Lunglei to Thenzawl P. W. D. Road within the Jurisdiction of Haulawng Grouping Centre.
- East :** It starts from Chhipphir E. G. S. Road at Pillar No. 29 and goes South wards at 141 meeting Mauhak Nallah. Following Mauhak Nallah down stream meeting Thuruk Nallah at Pillar No. 31 following upstream of Thuruk nallah meeting Zobawk P. W. D. Road at Thuruk junction crossing the Zobawk P. W. D. Road continuing South wards meeting Chitelui at Pillar No. 38. Following Chitelui downstream 400 metres upto Pillar No. 39 then diverted from the Nallah at 222. Continuing Southwards to the east of Hruipui Hillock meeting starting Pillar of Southern boundary at Pillar No. 1.
- South :** Starting from the Pillar No. 1 following upstream Mausem Kawn nallah at 302. meeting Mausem kawn (sadle) at 500 metres continuing Westwards along down stream and meeting starting point of Western boundary at Pillar No. 3 at a distance of 500 metres from Mausem kawn.
- West :** Starting from Pillar No. 3 continuing northwards at 500 metres away from P. W. D. Road upto Hruipui and Melveng ramri kawn. Then continuing to the West Melveng hillock meeting Lungdai road at Kangh renkawn. Following Lungdai road towards Haulawng village meeting Hainam nallah, following down stream of Hainam nallah meeting Bangla nallah (Zobawk). Following downstream of Bangla nallah meeting Thlanmual nallah. It follows Thlanmual nallah upstream to a distance of 290 metres then diverted north west at 355. Meeting Tangkawng Kawng at Hmawngmual junction then continues northwards to the west of Tangkawng Hillock crossing Sesi nallah meeting Tiawng kawng at Sedai kawn at Pillar No. 20.
- North :** Starting from Pillar No. 20 it goes Eastward along nallah meeting other nallah at 175 metres. Then follows downstream and meeting Sikul tui nallah following downstream of Sikul tui nallah upto the junction of Rala pa lo kawr. Following upstream of Rala pa lo kawr and meeting Thenzawl P. W. D. Road at Pillar No. 24. Following 100 metres of P. W. D. Road towards Haulawng it diverted eastward following downstream of nallah meeting another nallah. Then following upstream of that nallah towards South east meeting Chhipphir E. G. S. Road at Pillar No. 29 and end.
- Vegetation :** The area is covered with dense Forest. There are various timber species bamboos and grasses the largest available species is Shima, Michilis champace, uercus species, Sastonopsis trubuloides Betuls species, saposir baccatum, Cudrella toona, Chukaras tabulanyes. Omelina aroorea, Shorea Assamica, Terminallia mycrocrpa etc., and bamboo i.e. Bambus pallida, melocana Bambussoides, Debdrocalamus strictus and dendrocalmus hamiltoni.

Geological Rock & Soil : Mainly Sedimentary rocks, soil is brown sandy loam.

Line of transport : Jeepable P. W. D. Road (Lunglei—Thenzawl) run through from South to North and another Jeepable P. W. D. Road starts from Lamthumthum towards east to Zobawk and Chhipphair E. G. S. Road run from Phunchawng peng.

Market and Marketable produce : The Market is at Lunglei town and there is no other Market Centre nearby. The marketable produces are timber, poles, logs and bamboos.

Aspect : The main aspect are Eastern and Western aspect which runs north to south. The small portions are Northern and Southern aspect.

**BUNGTLANG RESERVE FOREST : FOREST AT BUNGTLANG RAM
DETAIL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION
AREA : 125 HECTARES**

Location ;

South ; Station No. 1 is posted on an old P. W. D. Road which is at a distance of about 1 Km from the Aizawl—Lunglei Road. It follows a footpath to Mat River up to Station No. 13.

West ; From station No. 13 it turns towards Western side and it follows Selephawk stream upto Station No. 20.

North ; From station No. 20 it turns towards Northern side to meet Bentar stream near the confluence of Bemthar Stream and Selephawk stream and it follows Bemthar Stream up to Station No. 29. From this point it turns to the North—East cutting through a Jhum area and meet the Lungkawrlui at Station No. 31.

East ; It follows Lungkawrlui from Station No. 31 to station No. 34 from where it turns to the Eastern side to meet Station No. 1.

Vegetation ; The Forest composes mainly different species of trees and bamboos the dominant species in the Forest are Schima wallichii, Duabanga, grandilora and Terminalia mycoropa and the bamboos Forest is of Melocana bamboosiods. There are many species of climbers, herbs and shrubs in the Forest.

Geology Rocks and Soil ; Throughout the area the soil is sandy loam and a soft rocks expose some-where. The soil along the stream is fertile.

Aspect ; The aspect of the Area is North—East.

Line and Transport ; The boundary touched the old P. W. D. Road and also main road connecting Aizawl to Lunglei is running nearby it.

Market and Marketable produce : The nearest markets are Aizawl & Lunglei, which are about 160 Kms and 80 Kms respectively. A few numbers of timber and bamboos can be marketed although the return may be small at present.
