ANNEXURE

The various terms and conditions governing the deputation of State Government officials to the State Bank of India will be as under. These are subject to the concurrence of the deputing agencies.

1) Scales of pay : as drawn in their parent department. We are not in favour of the appointments on

deputation basis on our "Scales of pay"

2) Deputation allowances : 20% of the basic pay.

3) House Rent allowance : As applicable to Bank's Junior Officers.

4) Medical benefits : As applicable to Bank's Junior Officers.

5) City Compensatory : As applicable to Bank's Junior Officers.

6) Travelling Expenses, halting allowance, transfer allowance and joining time.

: As applicable to Bank's Junior Officers.

7) Bonus/closing allowance: At the rate applicable to the Officers in the bank.

8) Leave : As per rules of the perent department.

9) Leave fare/home travel : If due on the terms and conditions of the parent department, cost will be paid to the parent department.

10) Retirement benefit, (provident fund, pension cribed by the parent department. fund etc.)

11. Mid Academic allowance: As applicable to bank's Junior Officers.

12) General

In respect of all other matters which are not specified, parent department rules will be applicable.

In this connection, by way of clarifications, we furnish brief particulars of some of the above allowance/facilities now enjoyed by Bank's Junior Officials so that the Government officials willing to come over to the Bank might have a better idea of the terms and conditions. These are, however, liable to change, from time to time, depending upon service conditions.

(i) House Rent Allowance:

- (a) Where an Officer is provided with unfurnished residential accomodation by the Bank, the Officer shall pay to the Bank every month 10% of his basic pay or the standard rent for the accommodation, whichever is less.
- (b) Where an Officer is not provided with residential accommodation by the Bank, the Officer shall be eligible for a house rent allowance being a sum equivalent to the excess of the actual rent paid by nim for his residential accommodation over 10% of his basic pay, such sum subject to a ceiling of 15% 10% of the revised basic pay or Rs. 250/- whichever is lower, depending upon the place of posting.

(ii) Medical Aid:

Full reimbursement is allowed for self treatment and 75% in respect of family. Family, for this purpose will include dependent parents provided they are residing with and are wholly dependent on the Officer and either of them is not having an income of over Rs 200/-PM.

(iii) City Compensatory Allowance:

No city compensaroty allowance will be payable to Officers posted in places classified as Area 11 places i.e. the allowance is payable at appropriate rates at metropolitan cities area 1 places.

(iv) Halting Allowance:

An Officer in the pay scale set out to column 1 of the table below shall be entitled to halting allowance at the corresponding rates set out in column 11.

The Lt Governor (Administrator) of Mizoram is pleased to grant adhoc recognition to the formation of Mizoram Subordinate Finance Accounts Service Association under the terms and conditions laid down in the Annexure appended below till finalisation of fresh Recognition Rule by Government of India.

F. Pahnuna, Secy. to the Govt. of Mizoram

- 1. The Primary object of the Association/Union shall be the promotion of the common services interest of its members;
- 2. The Association/Union shall not be based on any caste, tribe or religious denomination or on any group within or section of such caste, tribe or religious denomination.

- 3. The Association/Union should have as its members, not less than 15% of the total number of staff of each category/categories it purports to represent.
- 4. No person who is not a Govt. servant shall be connected with the affairs of the Association/Union;
- 5. The executive of the Association/Union shall be appointed from amongst the members only;
- 6. The funds of the Service Association/Union shall consist exclusively of subscriptions from members and grants, if any, made by the Govt., and shall be applied only for the furtherance of the objects of the Association/Union;
- 7. The Association/Union shall not send any representation or deputation except in connection with a matter which is of common interest to the members of the Association/Union;
- 8. The Association/Union shall not espouse or support the cause of individual Govt. servants ralating to service matters;
- 9. The Association/Union shall not maintain any political fund or land itself to the propagation of the views of any political party or politician;
- 10. All representations by the Association /Union shall be submitted through proper channel, and shall, as a normal practice, be addressed to the Secretary or the Head of Deptt. or office;
- 11. A list of members and office bearers, an up-to-date copy of the rules and an audited statement of accounts of the Association/Union shall be furnished to the Govt, annually through proper channel after the general annual meeting so as to reach the Govt. before the 1st day of July each year.
- 12. Any amendment of substantial character in the rules of the Association/ Union shall be made only with the previous approval of the Govt.; and any other amendment of a minor importance shall be communicated through proper channel for transmission to the Govt. for information;
- 13. The previous permission of the Govt. shall be taken before the Association/ Union seeks affiliation with any other Union, Service Association
- 14. The Association/Union shall cease to be affiliated to a Federation or Confederation of service Associations whose recognition is withdrawn by the Government.

- 15. The Association/Union shall not start or publish any periodical magazine or bulletin without the previous approval of the Govt;
- 16. The Association/Union shall to publish any periodical magazine or bulletin, if directed by the Govt, to do so on the ground that the publication thereof is prejudicial to the interests of the Central Govt.; the Govt. of any State or any Govt. authority or to good relations between Govt. servants and the Govt. or any Government authority;
- 17. The Association/Union shall not do any act or assist in the doing of any act which, if done by a Govt. servant, would contravene any of the provisions of Rules 8,9,11,12,16 and 20 of the Central Civil Services (Conduct) Rules, 1964.;
- 18 The Association/Union shall not address any communication to a foreign authority except through the Govt. which shall have the right to withold it and;
- 19. The Communication addressed by the Association/Union, or by any office bearer on its hehalf, to the Govt. or a Govt. authority shall not contain any disrespectul of improper language.
