

PREFACE

This publication contains brief biographical sketches of Members of the Second Mizoram State Legislative Assembly constituted after the General Election held on 21st January 1989.

Mizoram Legislative Assembly has a strength of 40 Members. Pu Lalthanhawla who won from two Constituencies vacated one of the seats-Lokicherra Assembly Constituency.

Out of 39 (thirty nine) members, one member, Pu Hiphei from 1-Tuipang Assembly Constituency resigned his membership on 7.7.91 to facilitate his candidature for Member of Parliament, Rajya Sabha. Two members, namely Pu Laldenga from 40 Aizawl South-II Assembly Constituency, and Pu J. Thanghuama from 37 Aizawl West-I died on 7th July, 1990 and 5th January 1991 respectively.

Bye-election to fill up three Constituencies I-Tuipang, 37-Aizawl West-I and 40-Aizawl South-II was held on 12.6.1991. Pu B. Tevo for 1-Tuipang Assembly Constituency, Pu T.C. Pachhunga for 37-Aizawl West-I and Pu Sainghaka for 40-Aizawl South II were declared to have been elected. Election for 25-Lokicherra Assembly Constituency could not be held as it is under adjudication by Court of Law.

The particulars given in the biographical sketches are based on the information provided by members or that contained in the previous edition, "Who's Who" of Members of former Mizoram Legislative Assembly.

Any suggestion for improvement of this publication will be gratefully received by this Secretariat.

Son of Chhuzika and Khuangi. Born on 18th July, 1940 at Zawlsei Village. Passed Pre-University Course from the Aizawl College in 1963, Headmaster, Khawzawl M.E. School 1961-66. Join the MNF underground in 1966 and in 1973 he was caught and imprisoned till 1979. He was released for sometime and again imprisoned one year from 1982-83. Was also Emissary to President MNF from 1980 to 1986 till peace accord was signed.

Elected from the 23rd Kolasib Constituency and sworn in as Minister in-charge Power and Local Administration Department in first Mizoram State Legislative Assembly.

In the General Election held on 21st January, 1989, re-elected from Kolasib Constituency on MNF ticket, defeating nearest Congress (1) rival by margin of 296 votes.

Son of Luaia (L). Born on 7th October, 1939 at Chhing Veng, Aizawl. Married to Smt. Rualchhingi d/o Rev. Saiaithanga and has two sons and two daughters. Passed HSLC Examination in 1963 from Govt. high School Jowai (Meghalaya) and graduated in 1966 from Pachhunga Memorial College, Aizawl. Resigned from Government Services and entered politics and joined Indian National Congress in 1972. He contested the Second Mizoram State Legislative Assembly election held on 21st January, 1989, as Congress (I) candidate and elected from Lungpho Constituency nearest P.C. rival by a margin of 169 votes.

Sworn in as a Minister of State on 20th November, '91.

PU CHAKMA, HARI KRISTO

Only son of Late Patanga Mohan Chakma, born on 14th April, 1932 at Kalapani Village in Mizoram. Married Stm. Kunja Lata. Having two sons and two daughters. Educated up to High School Level. Took up a job in the Government as Gram Sevak, 1957-6. Thereafter joined in the active politics and was elected in the Mizoram District Council, 1962-1970. Represented the Chakma Buddhist Community Conference at Sarnath in 1964. Was elected in the first General Election to the Mizoram Legislative Assembly in 1972 from the Demagiri Constituency in 1978-79, appointed as Protem Speaker on Legislative Assembly on 9th May, 1984.

Won Assembly election held on 21.1.1989, defeating nearest MNF rival by a margin of 1851 votes served as Vice Chairman, Mizoram KVI Board. He has been Continuing to represent Tlabung Constituency without any break from 1962 till date.

PU CHAKMA NIRUPAM

Son of Sneha Kumar Chakma, Ex-MLA, was born on 16th December, 1958 at Tipperaghat Village. Married to Sacharika of Puankhai Village in 1986.

Passed B.A. from the St. Anthony's College Shillong in 1985 and B.A. Political Science Honours from the Aizawl College in 1986.

While studying at Shillong he was the President of Mizoram Chakma Chattna Parishad for one year 1981-82. From 1982-83 he was organizer of the All India Chakma Student and Youth Convention. He also organized the Mizoram Chakma Student Union for 3 to 4 year'; an active member of the Central Young Chakma Association.

In 1987 he contested form 5-Chawngte Assembly Constituency and won the election uncontested. As a MLA from the Chakma Autonomous District Council he was one of the delegates who fought for the Amendment of the Sixth Scheduled in the Parliament; and adhoc President of the Chakma District Congress (I) Committee form March 1987 to April, 1989. In 1989 he again contested from the same 5-Chawngte Assembly Constituency and won the election polling highest numbers of votes in Mizoram defeating nearest independent candidate by a margin of 3220 votes and sworn in as a Minister of State on 25th January, 1989 being first Chakma Minister in Mizoram.

General Secretary, Mara Freedom Party from 1970-73, Chief Executive Member Lakher District Council from 1972-82 (ten years two full term). From 1983-89 January President. Lakher District Congress (IO Committee, MDC upto 7.2.1989).

Member of Regional Council in 1970 uncontested Member of District Council in 1972 from Chhualung Constituency, won the election on 1977-85, elected MLA from 2-Saiha Constituency in 1987 re-elected from the same Constituency in 1989 on Congress (I) tickets. PU HIPHEI

Only the son of Zahtia, (L) and Rochei (L) born on August, 1938 at Chapui Village, Matriculate from the Government High School Lunglei in 1963, served as Headmaster in Middle School from 1964-69. While studying in Shillong College in 1972, requested by the Mara Student Organisation. Shillong to contest the First General Election to the Mizoram Legislative Assembly.

Earlier involved in politics, elected Vice-President of the Mara Freedom Party in 1963, one of the first delegates to the Government of Assam to demand a separate Autonomous District Council for the Lakhers, represented the Lakhers to the Pataskar Commission Aizawl in 1966. Member of the erstwhile Pawi Lakher Regional Council, resigned in demand of a separate Autonomous District Council for the Mar (Lakhers).

Won the Assembly Election in 1972 as an Independent candidate from Tuipang Constituency, unanimously elected Deputy Speaker of the Mizoram Legislative Assembly on 12th May 1973, till 1977 again elected in the First Mizoram Legislative Election from the Tuipang Constituency as Congress Party Candidate.

Visited other States of India, used to attend the Presiding Officers Conference held every year, represented the Mizoram Legislative Assembly to the Commonwealth held in New Delhi in 1976, won the 2nd election to the Mizoram Legislative Assembly in 1978 from the Tuipang Constituency.

Member of Estimate Committee, Deputy Leader of the Congress Legislature Party, President Lakher, District Congress Committee (1) from 1979-83, elected from the same Constituency in 1984, appointed Minister of State on 16.6.84, was one of the Minister who stepped down to vacate seats for the MNF Leaders, re-elected from the same Constituency in 1987, returned in 1989 General Election from the same Constituency for the sixth time defeating MNF rival by a margin of 1137 votes elected as Speaker, Mizoram Legislative Assembly on 30th January 1989. Held office of the Speaker upto 14.7.1990.

He had also visited different countries while attending the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association Conference held in Barbados in 1989.

An elder of Independent Church of Maraland, married Sathli, three sons and two daughters.

Son of Pu Selthuama (L) (Headmaster Thingsai Middle School) and Pi Saihnawli. Born on 26.1.1943 at Serkawn, Lunglei.

Married Dengthuami in 1980, have two sons and two daughters.

Joined Congress (I) Party in 1968, was Joint Secretary, Lunglei District Congress Committee from 1975 to 1984 became the President of LDCC (1) from 1984 to 1986.

Elected as member of Village Council Zotlang from Congress (1) ticket for three consecutive terms, became President of Zotlang Village Council. Elected in the First Mizoram State Legislative Assembly Election in Congress (I) ticket in 1987 from Buarpui Constituency, re-elected in the Second Mizoram State Legislative Assembly Election from Congress (I) ticket from the same Constituency. Scoring the highest poll defeating nearest MNF rival by a margin of 132 votes, actively took part in Social Works, President of Branch YMA Serkawn for two consecutive terms.

PU LALDENGGA

Son of Pu Liantlira and Pi Darchhungi. Born on 11th June 1927 at Pukpui, Lunglei District. Married Lalbiakdiki at Aizawl on 5th Nov. 1954 and had two sons and two daughters.

Joined British Indian Army in 1945 and fought in Burma front. Left Army in 1953 and joined as Accountant-cum-Cashier in the erstwhile Mizo District Council.

Became the founder Secretary of Mizo Cultural Society in 1958. Left his service under District Council and found 'Mizo National Famine Front' in January, 1960 and became the founder President, also published and edited the first Mizo daily paper in 1960 which he named 'Mizo Aw'.

Mizo National Famine Front was converted into a political party on 22nd October, 1961 and was renamed the Mizo National Front and continued his post as President. When the MNF movement was started on 1st March, 1966 he went underground and let the movement till June, 30.1986 when the peace accord was signed with Government of India.

Was sworn in as Chief Minister of Mizoram Interim Government on 21st August, 1986.

Elected from two constituencies Sateek and Aizawl North-II in the First Mizoram State General Elections in February, 1987 and was sworn in as the first Minister of Mizoram State in February, 1987.

Again, elected MLA from Aizawl South-Ii Constituency on MNF ticket in the Second Mizoram State Election held on 21st January 1989, defeating nearest MNF 'D' rival by a margin of 106 votes.

PU LALHERLIANA, ANDREW

Born on the 7th October, 1951 at Aizawl Civil Hospital. The second child of Mr & Mrs K. C. Lalvunga, passed HSLC in 1970 from Canberra, A.T.C. Australia. Graduate with Hons. in History in 1974 from St. Stephen's College, Delhi University, got his Master Degree in History in 1979 from NEHU, Shillong, Meghalaya.

During his year in the post graduate studies, involved in student politics, and got elected as President of Mizo Post Graduate Student Union in 1977 and elected as President of Post Graduate Student Union NEHU. In 1978 elected President of Historical Association, NEHU. Being involved in the University Welfare and a member of the Academic Council and University Court.

From 1979, involved in Mizoram Politics as Prominent Student Leader, and took part in various student movements and agitation in support of MNF. Peace negotiation with Government of India. In 1982 when negotiation broke down arrested with other student Leaders detained under NSA at Silchar Jail. In 1983 after released from Jail, he and his Colleagues formed a political party called the Mizo Peace Forum. In the 1984 Assembly Election, contested from Saitual Constituency but defeated. In 1986 when peace accord was signed. Joined MNF Party elected from the Saitual Constituency in the First Mizoram State Assembly Election of 1987.

Again elected MLA from Saitual Constituency on MNF 'D' ticket in the Second Mizoram State Legislative Assembly Election held on 21st January, 1989. Defeated nearest MNF rival by a margin of 17 votes.

Married and had two sons.

PU LALHUTHANGA

Born on 8th October, 1948. Parents are late Pu Daia and Pi Liantluangi.

Graduated in Art from St. Edmund's College. Shillong in 1974. Worked as Headmaster Rawpuichhip High School till March, 1977.

Entered politics from March, 1977 and joined Congress Party, became the General Secretary of Mizoram Youth Congress and Secretary of Aizawl West Block Congress Committee. Elected Vice-President Mizoram Youth Congress and Executive Member of Mizoram Congress Committee in 1979 and now General Secretary, Mizoram Congress Party.

Won Assembly Election in 1984 from Sairang Constituency on Congress Party ticket. Again elected to the Second Mizoram Legislative Assembly in 1989 from Mamit Constituency. Defeated nearest MNF rival by a margin of 326 votes and is now Minister of State.

Married Laldawngliani, had two sons and two daughters.

PU LALRAWNLIANA

Son of Lalhnuna born on 25th August, 1945 at Arro Village. Married Lalthangmuani and had two sons and one daughter.

Joined the MNF on 1.3.1966, eventually commissioned and passed adjutant Staff Officer and Quarter Master's courses successfully completed courses on Foreign relations, Sabotage and guerilla warfare tactics and defence strategies. In 1967 commissioned as Second Lieutenant from which he rose upto the rank of Full Colonel subsequently in the MNF organization. While in the underground set up; mostly worked in the Tactical Headquarters and functioned as the Commander. Worked as the Adjutant General in the MNA General Headquarters.

Written a book on Guarillas Warfare and this was used as the main text book on Guarillas Welfare tactics by the Mizo National Army. On the signing of the Peace Accord between the Government of India and the MNF come overground and won the Assembly Election in 1989 on MNF ticket from Sateek Constituency. Defeating nearest Congress (I) rival by a margin of 635 votes.

PU LALRINCHHANA

Son of Lalrawna (L) born in 1936 at North Serzawl passed P.U.C. and joined politics in 1966 while working as Headmaster Khawruhlian M.E. School. Joined the MNF Underground and was designated General Secretary of the MNF Party since 1979 till 21.2.1987.

Defence Minister of the erstwhile MNF Government from 1971 to 1978 and Minister Supply till 1986. Come out from the underground when peace accord was signed in June 1986.

Elected in the First Mizoram Legislative Assembly Election from MNF ticket with absolute majority from the 21-Ratu Constituency. Sworn in as Health Minister on 27.2.1987.

Won again the Second Mizoram Legislative Assembly Election from the same Constituency as MNF Candidate defeating nearest Congress (I) rival by a margin of 214 votes. He is married and have three sons.
